Note 1: Description of the Plan

The following description of Marrs Electric, LLC 401(k) Plan (the Plan), provides only general information. Participants should refer to the plan document for a more complete description of the Plan's provisions.

General

The Plan is a defined contribution plan sponsored by Marrs Electric, LLC (the Company) for the benefit of its employees who have at least one year of service (defined as 1,000 hours of service) and are age 18 or older. Marrs Electric, LLC of Arkansas is a related employer who also participates in the Plan. The Plan is subject to the provisions of the *Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974* (ERISA). Minnesota Life Insurance Company (Minnesota Life) is the custodian of the Plan. The Plan's record-keeper is Securian Financial.

Effective June 15, 2023, the Company elected to merge the Plan with Marrs Electric AE of Securian PEP and Trust (a plan sponsored by the Company's parent). Approximately \$8,762,000 of plan assets were transferred out of the Plan on June 20, 2023.

Contributions

The Plan permits eligible employees through a salary deferral election to have the Company make annual contributions of up to 100% of eligible compensation. Employee rollover contributions are also permitted. Participants who have attained age 50 before the end of the plan year are eligible to make catch-up contributions.

Employees are eligible for the Company's safe harbor match immediately upon enrollment in the Plan. The Company matches pre-tax contributions up to a maximum of 4% of eligible compensation. The Plan also provides for discretionary matching contributions and profit-sharing contributions. No discretionary contributions or discretionary profit-sharing contributions were made during the period ended June 20, 2023. Contributions are subject to certain limitations.

Participant Investment Account Options

Each participant has the option of directing their contributions into any of the separate investment options offered by the Plan and may change the allocation daily.

Participant Accounts

Each participant's account is credited with the participant's contributions, the Company's contributions, and plan earnings and is charged with an allocation of administrative expenses. Allocations are based on participant earnings or account balances, as defined. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant's vested account.

Vesting

Participants are immediately vested in their voluntary contributions, safe harbor matching contributions, and qualified nonelective contributions plus earnings thereon. Vesting in the Company's discretionary matching and profit-sharing contribution portion of their accounts plus earnings thereon is based on years of continuous service. A participant becomes vested after three years of continuous service.

Notes Receivable from Participants

Participants may borrow from their fund accounts a minimum of \$1,000 up to a maximum equal to the lesser of \$50,000 or 50% of their vested account balance. The loans are secured by the balance in the participant's account. The loan interest rate, determined monthly, is set at either 2% or 1% above the prime rate, as defined, based on the type of loan issued. Principal and interest are paid ratably through weekly payroll deductions for hourly employees and bi-monthly for salary employees.

Payment of Benefits

Upon termination of service, a participant may receive the value of the vested interest in their account as a lump-sum distribution or monthly, quarterly, semi-annual, or annual cash installments over a period of not more than their assumed life expectancy or the assumed life expectancies of them and their beneficiary. In-service distributions are allowed if an individual has attained age 59½ or has become disabled.

Plan Termination

Although the Plan was not terminated, the Plan was merged into Marrs Electric AE of Securian PEP and Trust (a plan sponsored by the Company's parent) on June 20, 2023.

Note 2: Summary of Significant Accounting Policies

Basis of Accounting

The accompanying financial statements are prepared on the accrual basis of accounting.

Investments held by a defined contribution plan are required to be reported at fair value except for fully benefit-responsive investment contracts. Contract value is the relevant measure for the portion of the net assets available for benefits of a defined contribution plan attributable to fully benefit-responsive investment contracts because contract value is the amount participants normally would receive if they were to initiate permitted transactions under the terms of the Plan.

Use of Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of net assets, changes in net assets, and the disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities at the date of the financial statements. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

Investment Valuation and Income Recognition

Investments are reported at fair value except for fully benefit-responsive investment contracts. Pooled separate accounts are valued at estimated fair value as provided by the custodian.

The fully benefit-responsive investment contract is valued at contract value. Contract value represents contributions made under the contract, plus interest at the contract rate, less participant withdrawals and administrative expenses.

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Net appreciation (depreciation) in fair value of investments includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold as well as held during the year.

Notes Receivable from Participants

Notes receivable from participants are measured at their unpaid principal balance plus any accrued but unpaid interest. Delinquent notes receivable from participants are reclassified as distributions based upon the terms of the plan document.

Payment of Benefits

Benefit payments to participants are recorded upon distribution.

Administrative Expenses

Administrative expenses may be paid by the Company or the Plan at the Company's discretion.

Note 3: Certification of Plan Custodian

The plan administrator has elected the method of annual reporting compliance permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) pursuant to 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. Accordingly, Minnesota Life, a qualified institution, has certified the following investment information included in the accompanying financial statements is complete and accurate:

- Investments and notes receivable from participants as shown in the accompanying statements of net assets available for benefits as of June 20, 2023 and December 31, 2022

The Plan's independent auditors did not perform auditing procedures with respect to this certified investment information except for comparing such certified investment information to the related investment information included in the accompanying financial statements.

Note 4: Related-Party and Party-in-Interest Transactions

Party-in-interest transactions include those with fiduciaries or employees of the Plan, any person who provides services to the Plan, an employer whose employees are covered by the Plan, an employee organization whose members are covered by the Plan, a person who owns 50% or more of such an employer or employee association, or relatives of such persons.

Certain plan investments are units of pooled separate accounts and a guaranteed return account managed by the custodian; therefore, these transactions qualify as party-in-interest transactions. Certain fees incurred by the Plan for the investment management services are included in net appreciation (depreciation) in fair value of investments, as they are paid through revenue-sharing rather than a direct payment. The Company directly pays any other fees related to the Plan's operations.

The Plan paid administrative expenses of approximately \$600 and \$2,900 to Minnesota Life during the period ended June 20, 2023 and year ended December 31, 2022, respectively. The Company provides certain administrative services at no cost to the Plan.

Note 5: Disclosures About Fair Value of Plan Assets

Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. Fair value measurements must maximize the use of observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs. The hierarchy comprises three levels of inputs that may be used to measure fair value:

- Level 1** Quoted prices in active markets for identical assets
- Level 2** Observable inputs other than Level 1 prices, such as quoted prices for similar assets, quoted prices in markets that are not active, or other inputs that are observable or can be corroborated by observable market data for substantially the full term of the assets
- Level 3** Unobservable inputs supported by little or no market activity and significant to the fair value of the assets

Following is a description of the valuation methodologies and inputs used for assets measured at fair value on a recurring basis and recognized in the accompanying statements of net assets available for benefits, as well as the general classification of such assets pursuant to the valuation hierarchy. There have been no significant changes in the valuation techniques during the period ended June 20, 2023 and year ended December 31, 2022. The Plan had no liabilities measured at fair value on a recurring basis. In addition, the Plan had no assets or liabilities measured at fair value on a nonrecurring basis.

Investments

Where quoted market prices are available in an active market, investments are classified within Level 1 of the valuation hierarchy. If quoted market prices are not available, then fair values are estimated by using quoted prices of investments with similar characteristics or independent asset pricing services and pricing models, the inputs of which are market-based or independently sourced market parameters, including, but not limited to, yield curves, interest rates, volatilities, prepayments, defaults, cumulative loss projections, and cash flows. Such investments are classified in Level 2 of the valuation hierarchy. In certain cases where Level 1 or Level 2 inputs are not available, investments are classified within Level 3 of the hierarchy. The Plan held no Level 1 or Level 3 investments.

Note 6: Investment Contract with Minnesota Life

The Plan has entered into a fully benefit-responsive investment contract with Minnesota Life in the form of a group annuity contract that offers a guaranteed return account. Minnesota Life maintains the contributions in a general account. The account is credited with earnings on the underlying investments and charged for participant withdrawals and administrative expenses. The investment

contract issuer is contractually obligated to repay the principal and a specified interest rate guaranteed to the Plan.

The investment contract is fully benefit-responsive; therefore, contract value is the relevant measurement. Contract value, as reported to the Plan by Minnesota Life, represents contributions made under the contract, plus interest at the contract rate, less participant withdrawals and administrative expenses. Participants may ordinarily direct the withdrawal or transfer of all or a portion of their investment at contract value.

There are no reserves against the contract value for credit risk of the contract issuer or otherwise.

Certain events limit the ability of the Plan to transact at contract value with the issuer. Such events include the following: 1) amendments to the plan documents (including complete or partial plan termination or merger with another plan); 2) changes to the Plan's prohibition on competing investment options or deletion of equity wash provisions; 3) bankruptcy of the plan sponsor or other plan sponsor events (for example, divestitures or spin-offs of a subsidiary) that cause a significant withdrawal from the Plan; or 4) the failure of the trust to qualify for exemption from federal income taxes or any required prohibited transaction exemption under ERISA. The plan administrator does not believe the occurrence of any such value event, which would limit the Plan's ability to transact at contract value with participants, is probable.

The investment contract does not permit the insurance company to terminate the agreement prior to the scheduled maturity date.

The carrying value of the guaranteed return account, considered a traditional investment contract, was \$0 at June 20, 2023 and \$1,181,957 at December 31, 2022.

Note 7: Tax Status

The Plan operates under a nonstandardized adoption agreement in connection with a prototype retirement plan and trust/custodial document sponsored by Minnesota Life. This prototype plan document has been filed with the appropriate agency. The Plan has not obtained or requested a determination letter. However, the plan administrator believes that the Plan is currently designed and being operated in compliance with the applicable requirements of the Internal Revenue Code and that the Plan was qualified and the related trust was tax-exempt as of the financial statement date.
