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## INDEPENDENT AUDITOR'S REPORT

To the Trustee and Plan Administrator  
Southern Connecticut Vascular Center Cash Balance Plan

### **Scope and Nature of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) Audit**

We have performed audits of the accompanying financial statements of Southern Connecticut Vascular Center Cash Balance Plan, an employee benefit plan subject to the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA), as permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) (ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit). The financial statements comprise the statements of net assets in liquidation as of August 31, 2023 and December 31, 2022, and the related statements of changes in net assets in liquidation for the eight months ended August 31, 2023 and for the year ended December 31, 2022, and the related notes to the financial statements.

Management, having determined it is permissible in the circumstances, has elected to have the audits of Southern Connecticut Vascular Center Cash Balance Plan's financial statements performed in accordance with ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) pursuant to 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. As permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C), our audits need not extend to any statements or information related to assets held for investment of the plan (investment information) by a bank or similar institution or insurance carrier that is regulated, supervised, and subject to periodic examination by a state or federal agency, provided that the statements or information regarding assets so held are prepared and certified to by the bank or similar institution or insurance carrier in accordance with 29 CFR 2520.103-5 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA (qualified institution).

Management has obtained certifications from a qualified institution as of August 31, 2023 and December 31, 2022, and for the eight months ended August 31, 2023 and the year ended December 31, 2022, stating that the certified investment information, as described in Note 4 to the financial statements, is complete and accurate.

## **Opinion**

In our opinion, based on our audits and on the procedures performed as described in the Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements section—

- the amounts and disclosures in the financial statements referred to above, other than those agreed to or derived from the certified investment information, are presented fairly, in all material respects, in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.
- the information in the financial statements referred to above, related to assets held by and certified to by a qualified institution agrees to, or is derived from, in all material respects, the information prepared and certified by an institution that management determined meets the requirements of ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C).

## **Basis for Opinion**

We conducted our audits in accordance with auditing standards generally accepted in the United States of America. Our responsibilities under those standards are further described in the Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements section of our report. We are required to be independent of Southern Connecticut Vascular Center Cash Balance Plan and to meet our other ethical responsibilities, in accordance with the relevant ethical requirements relating to our audits. We believe that the audit evidence we have obtained is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for our ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit opinion.

## **Emphasis of Matter – Plan Termination and Liquidation Basis of Accounting**

As discussed in Note 3 to the financial statements, the trustees of Southern Connecticut Vascular Center Cash Balance Plan approved a plan of liquidation on November 1, 2022, and management determined liquidation is imminent. As a result, the Plan changed its basis of accounting from the going concern basis used in presenting the net assets as of January 1, 2022 to the liquidation basis of accounting used in presenting the 2022 and 2023 financial statements. Our opinion is not modified with respect to this matter.

## **Responsibilities of Management for the Financial Statements**

Management is responsible for the preparation and fair presentation of the financial statements in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America, and for the design, implementation, and maintenance of internal control relevant to the preparation and fair presentation of financial statements that are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error. Management's election of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit does not affect management's responsibility for the financial statements.

Management is also responsible for maintaining a current plan instrument, including all plan amendments; administering the plan; and determining that the plan's transactions that are presented and disclosed in the financial statements are in conformity with the plan's provisions, including maintaining sufficient records with respect to each of the participants, to determine the benefits due or which may become due to such participants.

### **Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements**

Except as described in the Scope and Nature of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) Audit section of our report, our objectives are to obtain reasonable assurance about whether the financial statements as a whole are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error, and to issue an auditor's report that includes our opinion. Reasonable assurance is a high level of assurance but is not absolute assurance and therefore is not a guarantee that an audit conducted in accordance with generally accepted auditing standards will always detect a material misstatement when it exists. The risk of not detecting a material misstatement resulting from fraud is higher than for one resulting from error, as fraud may involve collusion, forgery, intentional omissions, misrepresentations, or the override of internal control. Misstatements are considered material if there is a substantial likelihood that, individually or in the aggregate, they would influence the judgment made by a reasonable user based on the financial statements.

In performing an audit in accordance with generally accepted auditing standards, we:

- Exercise professional judgment and maintain professional skepticism throughout the audit.
- Identify and assess the risks of material misstatement of the financial statements, whether due to fraud or error, and design and perform audit procedures responsive to those risks. Such procedures include examining, on a test basis, evidence regarding the amounts and disclosures in the financial statements.
- Obtain an understanding of internal control relevant to the audit in order to design audit procedures that are appropriate in the circumstances, but not for the purpose of expressing an opinion on the effectiveness of Southern Connecticut Vascular Center Cash Balance Plan's internal control. Accordingly, no such opinion is expressed.
- Evaluate the appropriateness of accounting policies used and the reasonableness of significant accounting estimates made by management, as well as evaluate the overall presentation of the financial statements.

Our audits did not extend to the certified investment information, except for obtaining and reading the certification, comparing the certified investment information with the related information presented and disclosed in the financial statements, and reading the disclosures relating to the certified investment information to assess whether they are in accordance with the presentation and disclosure requirements of accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.

Accordingly, the objective of an ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit is not to express an opinion about whether the financial statements as a whole are presented fairly, in all material respects, in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.

We are required to communicate with those charged with governance regarding, among other matters, the planned scope and timing of the audit, significant audit findings, and certain internal control-related matters that we identified during the audit.

NOTES TO FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

AUGUST 31, 2023 AND DECEMBER 31, 2022

NOTE 1 – DESCRIPTION OF THE PLAN

The following description of Southern Connecticut Vascular Center Cash Balance Plan (the “Plan”) provides only general information. Participants should refer to the Plan document, and any amendments thereto, for a more complete description of the Plan’s provisions.

General

The Plan is a noncontributory defined benefit pension plan that covered substantially all employees of Southern Connecticut Vascular Center, LLC (the “Company”), who had completed a year of service and attained age 21. The Plan also covered employees of U.S. Vascular Management Group, LLC, an entity related to the Company through common ownership. Non-key highly compensated employees who had the designation of angio tech, employed physician, advanced practice practitioner, management, office management, outreach, and per diem were not eligible for benefits under this Plan. The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (“ERISA”), as amended.

In connection with the Plan termination disclosed in Note 3, the Plan was amended to reflect the vote by the Plan Sponsor’s Members to fully freeze and terminate the plan effective December 31, 2022. The Plan fully liquidated in August 2023.

The trustees of the Plan are responsible for oversight of the Plan and determine the appropriateness of the Plan’s investment offerings and monitor investment performance.

Participant Accounts

Prior to the termination and full liquidation of the Plan, the accrued benefit of a participant was maintained in a hypothetical account, as defined by the Plan. Additions to each participant’s hypothetical account were as follows:

As of the last day of each year, a contribution credit was credited to the hypothetical account of each eligible participant. The contribution credit was the amount specified in the Plan document and was generally equal to 3% of each eligible participant’s compensation, however, certain participants received a contribution credit that was a stated amount in the plan document. Each participant’s cash balance credit amount was subject to certain limitations, as defined by the Plan and the Internal Revenue Code (IRC).

The hypothetical accounts were also increased by an interest credit that is equal to 5% of the balance on the last day of the previous Plan year.

NOTE 1 – DESCRIPTION OF THE PLAN (CONTINUED)

Funding Policy

The Plan's funding policy is for the Company to contribute an amount which will meet or exceed the annual ERISA minimum funding requirement. The Plan met the ERISA minimum funding requirements in 2023 and 2022.

Pension Benefits and Vesting

Participants were entitled to Plan benefits beginning at the normal retirement age equal to the later of age 62 or the 5<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the first day of the Plan year in which the employee commenced participation in the Plan. Employees who terminated after becoming fully vested in the Plan, but prior to eligibility for normal retirement, were entitled to a deferred vested benefit equal to their accrued benefit as of the date of termination. Benefit payments were paid in the form of: a) life annuity for single participants; b) a 100% joint-and-survivor annuity; c) 50% or 75% survivor joint annuity d) a lump sum distribution; and e) other optional forms of benefit, as provided by the Plan. Participants should refer to the Plan document for more complete information about payment of benefits. Participating employees were fully vested in the accrued normal retirement benefit under the Plan after the completion of 3 years of service. Participants also become 100% vested upon death.

Death Benefits

The beneficiary of an active or terminated participant was entitled to certain benefits as defined in the Plan document in the event that the participant dies prior to receiving benefit payments. In order to be eligible, certain requirements must be satisfied.

NOTE 2 – SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of Accounting

The Plan was terminated effective December 31, 2022. Accordingly, the Plan's basis of accounting was changed to liquidation basis of accounting for periods subsequent to December 31, 2021.

As a result of the change to the liquidation basis of accounting, the Plan's assets were required to be recorded at the amount that the Plan expects to realize upon liquidation. As a result, market value adjustments and interest income that occurred in 2023 were recorded as of and for the year ended December 31, 2022.

Use of Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets, liabilities, and changes therein; disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities; and the actuarial present value of accumulated plan benefits at the date of the financial statements, and the changes therein. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

Investment Valuation and Income Recognition

Investments are reported at fair value. Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. See Note 4 for discussion of fair value measurements.

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Net depreciation includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold as well as held during the year.

Payment of Benefits

Benefits are recorded when paid.

Administrative Expenses

The Plan's expenses are paid either by the Plan or the Company, as provided by the plan document. Expenses that are paid directly by the Company are excluded from these financial statements. Certain expenses incurred in connection with the general administration of the Plan that are paid by the Plan are recorded as deductions in the accompanying statements of changes in net assets available for benefits. In addition, certain investment related expenses are included in the net depreciation of fair value of investments presented in the accompanying statements of changes in net assets available for benefits.

Subsequent Events

The Plan has evaluated subsequent events through June 12, 2024, the date the financial statements were available to be issued.

NOTE 3 – PLAN TERMINATION

On November 1, 2022, the trustees of the Plan voted to terminate the Plan effective December 31, 2022. Accordingly, the distribution phase of the plan termination process commenced. Participants with an accrued vested benefit were notified of the termination and were given an option to receive a lump sum payment equal to the actuarial present value of their accrued benefit as of December 31, 2022, plus an interest credit of 5% from December 31, 2022 through the benefit commencement date. Participants electing the lump sum option were also given the option to roll the lump sum value of their benefit to a qualified employee benefit plan. All participants received distributions and the Plan was fully liquidated in August 2023.

NOTE 4 – CERTIFIED INVESTMENTS

Certain information related to investments disclosed in the accompanying financial statements and ERISA-required supplemental schedule, including investments held at December 31, 2022, and the related net depreciation in fair value of investments and interest and dividends for the eight months ended August 31, 2023 and the year ended December 31, 2022, was obtained by management and agreed to or derived from information certified as complete and accurate under power of attorney by Empower Annuity Insurance Company of America (formerly Great-West Life & Annuity Insurance Company).

As a result of applying the liquidation basis of accounting, certain adjustments were made to the Plan's guaranteed investment contract as of December 31, 2022 that were not certified. As a result, investments totaling \$6,565,311 as of December 31, 2022, and interest and dividends of \$54,540 and net depreciation in fair value of investments of \$687,481 for the year ended December 31, 2022 were not certified by Empower Annuity Insurance Company of America.

NOTE 5 – FAIR VALUE MEASUREMENTS

The framework for measuring fair value provides a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (level 1) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (level 3). The three levels of the fair value hierarchy are described as follows:

*Level 1* - Inputs to the valuation methodology are unadjusted quoted prices for identical assets or liabilities in active markets that the plan has the ability to access.

*Level 2* - Inputs to the valuation methodology include:

- Quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities in active markets;
- Quoted prices for identical or similar assets or liabilities in inactive markets;
- Inputs other than quoted prices that are observable for the asset or liability;
- Inputs that are derived principally from or corroborated by observable market data by correlation or other means.

If the asset or liability has a specified (contractual) term, the level 2 input must be observable for substantially the full term of the asset or liability.

*Level 3* - Inputs to the valuation methodology are unobservable and significant to the fair value measurement.

The asset or liability's fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques used need to maximize the use of observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs.

The following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for assets measured at fair value. There have been no changes in methodologies used at August 31, 2023 and December 31, 2022.

*Pooled Separate Accounts (PSA)* - The fair values of participation units held in pooled separate accounts are based on the net asset values reported by the fund managers as of the financial statement dates and recent transaction prices, which are based on the performance of underlying assets. Each of the pooled separate accounts held by the Plan is a passively managed fund that invests in a single open-ended mutual fund. The Plan did not hold any pooled separate accounts as August 31, 2023. The underlying investment composition of the pooled separate accounts as of December 31, 2022 was approximately 100% fixed income funds. Each pooled separate account provided for daily redemptions by the Plan with no advance notice requirements and had redemption prices that were determined by the fund's net asset value per unit.

*Fixed Account* – The Plan had a traditional investment contract with Massachusetts Mutual Life Insurance Company (MassMutual) that was valued at contract value, which approximated fair value as of December 31, 2021. Contract value represents contributions made to the contract, plus earnings, less participant withdrawals and administrative expenses. MassMutual maintains the contributions in a general account. MassMutual is contractually obligated to repay the principal and a specified interest rate that is guaranteed to the Plan. The crediting interest rate is based on a formula agreed upon with the issuer, but it may not be less than 1%. Such interest rates are reviewed on a semi-annual basis for resetting. There are no reserves against contract value for credit risk of the contract issuer or otherwise.

As disclosed in Note 3, the trustees elected to terminate the Plan effective December 31, 2022. In connection with the election to terminate, the Plan's financial statements as of December 31, 2022, are accounted for under the liquidation basis of accounting. Under the liquidation basis of accounting, all assets are required to be recorded at the estimated amount the Plan expects to collect in settling or disposing of those assets. Upon termination of the Plan, the fixed account is subject to a market value adjustment, which was determined to be a reduction in value of \$687,481 when the Plan was fully paid out in August 2023. This adjustment was recorded as of December 31, 2022.

The methods described above may produce a fair value calculation that may not be indicative of net realizable value or reflective of future fair values. Furthermore, although the Plan believes its valuation methods are appropriate and consistent with other market participants, the use of different methodologies or assumptions to determine the fair value of certain financial instruments could result in a different fair value measurement at the reporting date.

NOTE 6 – ACTUARIAL PRESENT VALUE OF ACCUMULATED PLAN BENEFITS

Accumulated plan benefits are those future periodic payments, including lump-sum distributions that are attributable under the Plan's provisions to the service employees have rendered to date. Accumulated plan benefits included benefits expected to be paid to (a) retired or terminated employees or their beneficiaries, (b) beneficiaries of employees who have died, and (c) present employees or their beneficiaries.

The actuarial present value of accumulated plan benefits is determined by the Plan's independent actuaries, Intac Actuarial Services, Inc. at January 1, 2023 and is that amount that results from applying actuarial assumptions to adjust the accumulated plan benefits to reflect the time value of money (through discount for interest) and the probability of payment (by means of decrements such as for death, withdrawal or retirement) between the valuation date and the expected date of payment.

The significant actuarial assumptions used in the valuation as of January 1, 2023 were as follows:

- a) Discount Rate: 5%
- b) Retirement Age: 62
- c) Mortality: 2019 Static Table – Combined

NOTE 7 – TAX STATUS

The Company adopted a Volume Submitter Plan and Trust (the VS Plan) sponsored by a third-party administrator. The Internal Revenue Service issued an opinion letter dated March 30, 2018 indicating that the VS Plan, as then designed, was in compliance with applicable requirements of the Internal Revenue Code (the Code). The VS Plan's opinion letter is being relied on by the Plan. Plan management believes the Plan is designed and is currently being operated in compliance with the applicable requirements of the Code, and therefore believes that the Plan is qualified, and the related trust is tax-exempt.

Accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America requires plan management to evaluate uncertain tax positions taken by the Plan. The financial statement effects of a tax position are recognized when the position is more likely than not, based on the technical merits, to be sustained upon examination by the IRS. The plan administrator has analyzed the tax positions taken by the Plan and has concluded that as of August 31, 2023, and December 31, 2022, there are no uncertain positions taken or expected to be taken. The Plan has recognized no interest or penalties related to uncertain tax positions. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions.

Certain administrative functions are performed by officers and employees of the Company. No officer or employee receives compensation from the Plan for these services. The Plan held units of pooled separate accounts and an unallocated investment contract issued or managed by Empower Annuity Insurance Company of America, or their affiliates. Empower Annuity Insurance Company of America is a third-party administrator and, therefore, these transactions as well as the Plan's payment of fees to Empower Annuity Insurance Company of America, or their affiliates qualify as party-in-interest transactions. Fees paid by the Plan to Empower Annuity Insurance Company of America or their affiliates totaled \$8 and \$10,363 for the eight months ended August 31, 2023 and the year ended December 31, 2022, respectively.
