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## **INDEPENDENT AUDITOR'S REPORT**

To the Administrative Committee of the

### **Scope and Nature of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) Audit**

We have performed an audit of the accompanying final financial statements of Grapeman Farms, L.P. 401(k) Plan (the "Plan"), an employee benefit plan subject to the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA), as permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) [ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit]. The financial statements comprise the statements of net assets available for benefits – modified cash basis as of October 31, 2023 and December 31, 2022, and the related statement of changes in net assets available for benefits for the ten months ended October 31, 2023, and the related notes to the financial statements.

As disclosed in the notes, the Company terminated the Plan on October 31, 2023. The participants' account balances were 100% vested and distributed upon Plan termination. Our opinion is not modified with respect to this matter.

- Obtain an understanding of internal control relevant to the audit in order to design audit procedures that are appropriate in the circumstances, but not for the purpose of expressing an opinion on the effectiveness of the Plan's internal control. Accordingly, no such opinion is expressed.
- Evaluate the appropriateness of accounting policies used and the reasonableness of significant accounting estimates made by management, as well as evaluate the overall presentation of the financial statements.
- Conclude whether, in our judgment, there are conditions or events, considered in the aggregate, that raise substantial doubt about the Plan's ability to continue as a going concern for a reasonable period of time.

Our audit did not extend to the certified investment information, except for obtaining and reading the certification, comparing the certified investment information with the related information presented and disclosed in the financial statements, and reading the disclosures relating to the certified investment information to assess whether they are in accordance with the presentation and disclosure requirements of the modified cash basis of accounting.

Accordingly, the objective of an ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit is not to express an opinion about whether the financial statements as a whole are presented fairly, in all material respects, in accordance with the modified cash basis of accounting.

We are required to communicate with those charged with governance regarding, among other matters, the planned scope and timing of the audit, significant audit findings, and certain internal control-related matters that we identified during the audit.

**1. Plan description and summary of significant accounting policies**

***General***

Grapeman Farms, L.P. (the “Company”) sponsors the Grapeman Farms, L.P. 401(k) Plan (the “Plan”). The following description provides only general information about the Plan. Participants should refer to the Plan document for a more complete description of the Plan provisions. The Plan is a qualified contributory defined contribution and profit-sharing plan that provides retirement, death, and disability benefits for eligible employees of the Company. The Plan covers all employees of the Company who are at least 21 years of age and have completed one year of eligible service, as defined in the Plan document. The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (“ERISA”).

***Basis of accounting***

The financial statements are prepared using a modified cash basis of accounting in accordance with a special purpose framework, which is a comprehensive basis of accounting not in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America (“GAAP”). This basis of accounting is consistent with the basis used for the Plan by the third-party administrator and certified by Reliance Trust Company (the “Trustee”). If prepared on the accrual basis of accounting in accordance with GAAP, the statements of net assets available for benefits as of October 31, 2023 and December 31, 2022, would reflect participant contributions receivable, interest and dividends receivable, and excess contributions payable.

***Administration of Plan assets***

The Plan’s assets are held by Reliance Trust Company, the trustee of the Plan (the “Trustee”). The Company uses Automatic Data Processing (ADP) as the third-party administrator for the Plan.

Certain partners or employees of the Company who are involved with Plan administration are not compensated by the Plan for such services. Certain administrative expenses and fees, including certain Trustee fees, recordkeeping, accounting fees, and advisory fees, are paid directly by the Plan and total \$6,611 for the ten months ended October 31, 2023. The Company pays other administrative expenses, including auditing and legal fees.

***Use of estimates***

The Plan administrator must make estimates and assumptions that affect certain reported amounts of the Plan assets, liabilities, changes in net assets, and disclosures as of the date of the financial statements. Accordingly, actual results could differ from those estimates.

***Investment options***

All investments were held in trust and were invested in registered investment companies and common/collective trusts as of October 31, 2023 and December 31, 2022. Certain investment options incur fees and expenses embedded in the related investments. Refer to each investment prospectus for information on the investment, including applicable fees and expenses. Each participant chooses how their contributions and respective account balances will be allocated among the various investments through a participant-directed investment program. Investment income, gains, and losses are allocated to each participant's account each business day.

***Contributions***

Each year, participants may make elective contributions of up to 90% of their compensation, subject to certain limitations in accordance with the Internal Revenue Code ("IRC"). Transfers from qualified plans are allowed under the provisions of the Plan. The Plan provides for the automatic election of deferrals at a rate of 1% of compensation for eligible new participants who do not decline to participate. The Plan provides for matching Company contributions of 100% on the first 3% and 50% on the next 2% of the participant's elective contributions. In addition, the Plan provides for a discretionary Company contribution. The Company made matching contributions of \$33,947 and no discretionary contributions for the year ended October 31, 2023.

***Participant accounts***

Each participant's account is increased with the participant's contributions (including elective and rollover), the Company's matching contributions, the Company's discretionary contributions, (d) investment earnings, and is decreased with investment losses, benefit payments, corrective distributions, and an allocation of any administrative expenses paid by the Plan. Allocations are based on certain components of each participant's account balances or earnings, as defined in the Plan document. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is determined by and dependent on the value of the participant's vested account balance at the measurement date.

***Vesting***

Balances in each participant's total account in the Plan are 100% vested.

***Benefit payments***

Upon death, disability, retirement, or termination of employment, a participant with an account balance exceeding \$5,000 may elect to receive a lump-sum distribution equal to the value of their account or elect to have the payment paid as a direct rollover to an individual retirement account, individual retirement annuity, or to another employer's tax-qualified plan. For vested account balances of \$5,000 or less, the Plan will distribute the balance in a lump-sum distribution. In addition, participants who have attained the age of 59½ may withdraw all or any part of the vested portion of their account. Hardship distributions are permitted, but the participants are suspended from contributing to the Plan for the succeeding six months, as defined in the Plan document.

***Benefit payments (continued)***

Benefit payments are recorded when paid.

***Participant notes receivable***

Participants may borrow a minimum of \$1,000 from their account up to a maximum equal to the lesser of \$50,000 or 50% of the account balance. Loan transactions are treated as a transfer to (from) the participant's investments from (to) the participant's loan fund. Loan terms range from one to five years or up to 30 years for purchasing a primary residence. The loans are secured by the balance in the participant's account and bear interest as determined by the Plan administrator. Interest rates range from 5.25% to 9.25%. Principal and interest are payable through bi-weekly payroll deductions. Participant notes receivable are reported at their unpaid principal balances plus any accrued but unpaid interest. Interest income is recorded on an accrual basis. Related fees are charged directly to the borrowing participant's account and are included in administrative expenses when incurred. If a participant does not make loan repayments and the Plan administrator considers the participant's loan to be in default, the loan balance is reduced, and the delinquent participant's note receivable is recorded as a benefit payment. No allowance for losses from delinquent participant notes receivable is recorded as of October 31, 2023 and December 31, 2022. Participant notes receivable qualify as "party-in-interest," which are exempt from the prohibited transaction rules.

***Termination***

The Company has the right under the Plan to discontinue its contributions at any time and to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions of ERISA. The Company terminated the Plan on October 31, 2023, effective as of May 31, 2023, and has liquidated the Plan's assets to the participants upon Plan termination.

***Tax status***

The Internal Revenue Service ("IRS") has determined, by a letter dated October 6, 2020, that the prototype plan and related trust adopted by the Company complies with the IRC's applicable requirements. The Plan has been amended since receiving its IRS determination letter. The Plan administrator and tax counsel believe that the Plan complies with the IRC's applicable requirements as of the date of the financial statements. Accordingly, no provision for income taxes is included in the Plan's financial statements. The Plan's federal and state information returns are subject to examination by federal and various state tax agencies until the statutes of limitations on the returns expire. In general, federal returns have a three-year statute of limitations. The various states have their applicable statutes of limitations, generally four years or less. The statutes of limitations begin to run on the date the returns are filed with the related tax jurisdictions. With few exceptions, the Plan is no longer subject to examinations by federal and state income tax jurisdictions for the tax years ended before December 31, 2020 and 2019, respectively.

***Investment valuation and income recognition***

Investments are reported at fair value. Fair value is the price received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date.

Purchases and sales of investments and resulting gains and losses are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest income is recorded when earned. Dividend income is recorded on the payment date. Net depreciation includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold.

***Risks and uncertainties***

The Plan provides various investment options in mutual funds of stocks (foreign and domestic) and bonds. Investment securities are exposed to various risks such as interest rates, market, and credit. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities and the level of uncertainty related to changes in the net value of investment securities, it is at least possible that changes in risks in the near term could materially affect participants' account balances and the amounts reported in the statements of net assets available for benefits.

Participants may direct their contributions to various investment options, including certain registered investment companies and common/collective trusts holding foreign company securities. These investments may involve unique risks and considerations not typically associated with investing in companies in the United States ("U.S."). Possible risks include fluctuation or devaluation of currencies, less reliable information about issuers, different securities transaction clearance and settlement practices, and possible adverse political and economic developments. In addition, the securities of foreign companies and their markets may be less liquid, and their prices may be more volatile than those securities of comparable U.S. companies.

***Subsequent events***

The Plan administrator has evaluated events and transactions occurring subsequent to the statement of net assets available for benefits date of October 31, 2023, for items that should potentially be recognized or disclosed in these financial statements. The evaluation was conducted through August 8, 2024, the date when these financial statements were available to be issued. The Company terminated the Plan effective as of May 31, 2023, and has distributed the Plan's assets to the participants.

**2. Fair value measurements**

Investments are reported at fair value in the statements of net assets available for benefits. The methods used to measure fair value may produce an amount that may not indicate net realizable value or reflect future fair values. Although the Plan administrator believes their valuation methods are appropriate and consistent with other market participants, using different methodologies or assumptions to determine the fair value of certain financial instruments could result in a different fair value measurement at the reporting date.

The Plan administrator uses appropriate valuation techniques based on the available inputs to measure the fair value of its investments. When available, the Plan administrator measures fair value using Level 1 inputs because they generally provide the most reliable evidence of fair value.

The following describes the valuation methods used to measure assets at fair value. The methodologies have remained unchanged as of October 31, 2023 and December 31, 2022.

Level 1

The fair value of registered investment companies is based on the quoted net asset values of the shares held by the Plan at year-end.

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**3. Net asset value for common/collective trusts**

Common/collective trusts are recorded at net asset value (NAV). The NAV is determined based on the valuation and pricing of the underlying investments held by the common/collective trusts. NAV is the net value of the common/collective trusts' total assets less total liabilities divided by the number of units/shares held by the Plan. The NAV for common/collective trusts is \$0 and \$289,887 as of October 31, 2023 and December 31, 2022, respectively.

**4. Certification**

The following is a summary of the unaudited information in the Plan's financial statements prepared by the Trustee and furnished to the Plan administrator. The Trustee held the Plan's investment assets and executed investment transactions on behalf of, and as directed by, the participants. The Plan administrator obtained certifications from the Trustee that the following information is complete and accurate:

- (a) Fair value and cost of all assets as of October 31, 2023 and December 31, 2022.
- (b) Net depreciation in fair value of investments, interest and dividend income, and other income for the ten months ended October 31, 2023.

**5. Party-in-interest**

An affiliate of the Trustee manages certain Plan investments. These transactions qualify as "party-in-interest," which are exempt from the prohibited transaction rules. If applicable, purchase fees are paid by the participants investing in those funds, which are subject to such fees. Fees paid by the Plan for the investment management services are \$6,611 and are included in administrative expenses for the ten months ended October 31, 2023.

**6. Reconciliation of financial statements to IRS Form 5500**

The financial statements for the ten months ended October 31, 2023, agree to the IRS Form 5500, Annual Return/Report of Employee Benefit Plan, except for the following reclassifications:
