1. ORGANIZATION

McKinley Capital International Growth Fund, L.P. (the “Fund”) commenced investment operations on September 20, 2005, as a limited partnership. McKinley Capital Management, LLC, a Delaware limited liability company (the “General Partner”) serves as the investment manager (the “Investment Manager”). The Fund’s investment objective is to provide a long-term return in excess of the return provided by the benchmark MSCI All Country World Ex U.S. Growth Index. Bank of New York Mellon (“BNY Mellon”) is the custodian and performs all recordkeeping functions for the Fund. Dreyfus Corporation, a subsidiary of BNY Mellon, is the manager of various mutual funds including the Dreyfus Treasury Prime Cash Management, which is included in Short Term Investments on the condensed schedule of investments.

The Fund offers three classes of interests: Class A, Class B and Class C interests. All classes have identical rights and differ only in that different classes pay different management fees, as described below under “Related Parties, Management Fees and Other Expenses.” Class A interests are available to any limited partner whose aggregate capital contributions, less that partner’s aggregate withdrawals, are less than \$5,000,000. Class B interests are available to any limited partner whose aggregate capital contributions, less that partner’s aggregate withdrawals, are at least \$5,000,000. Class C interests are available to any limited partner so designated by the General Partner - generally a limited partner who is transferring an existing account with the General Partner into the Fund or who invests at least \$20,000,000 in the Fund. The General Partner designates the class of interests that each limited partner receives on subscribing to the Fund and thereafter may convert any limited partner at any time to a different class of interests, depending on that limited partner’s subsequent additional capital contributions and withdrawals.

According to the terms of the Partnership Agreement, a limited partner may, on at least 15 days prior notice to the General Partner, withdraw all or part of the balance in such limited partner’s capital account as of the last day of any calendar month (each such date being hereinafter called a “Permitted Withdrawal Date”), provided that: (i) no partial withdrawal may reduce a limited partner’s capital account to an amount that is less than the lesser of the limited partner’s initial capital contribution or \$1,000,000; (ii) withdrawals of up to 95% of the balance of the limited partner’s capital account shall be paid within 15 days after the applicable permitted withdrawal date. If a withdrawal exceeds 95% of the balance of the limited partner’s capital account, such 95% shall be paid within 15 days after the applicable permitted withdrawal date and the remainder of the withdrawal shall be paid within 45 days after the applicable permitted withdrawal date (and such remainder shall not earn interest or be considered to be invested in the Fund).

Effective October 26, 2023, the Investment Manager formalized and approved the decision to terminate operations and liquidate the Fund in an orderly manner. As a result, in conformity with U.S. GAAP, the Fund changed its basis of accounting, from going concern basis to the liquidation basis of accounting. Under the liquidation basis of accounting, assets are reflected at net realizable value and liabilities are reflected at their anticipated settlement amounts. All expenses through the liquidation date have been recognized. The adoption of the liquidation basis of accounting did not have material effect on the carry values of assets and liabilities as of October 31, 2023. Under the plan of liquidation, the Fund sold its remaining investments, collected receivables as they became due, used available cash to settle the Fund’s obligations, and will pay out remaining distributions to the Participants of the Fund. The likelihood that the Fund will return from liquidation is remote.

2. SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

The Fund's financial statements have been prepared on the accrual basis of accounting in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America ("U.S. GAAP"). In accordance with U.S. GAAP, management is required to make estimates and assumptions in determining the reported amounts of assets and liabilities and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities at the date of the financial statements and the reported amounts of revenues and expenses during the reporting period. Actual results could differ from those estimates. The Fund is considered an investment company under U.S. GAAP and follows the specialized accounting and reporting guidance in the Financial Accounting Standards Board Accounting Standards Codification 946, *Financial Services – Investment Companies*.

The following are the Fund's significant accounting policies:

Valuation of Investments in Securities, at Fair Value

Investments in securities listed on a national exchange are valued at the last reported sales price on the day of valuation. Securities traded in the over-the-counter market and listed securities for which no sale was reported on that date are stated at the last quoted bid price. Other assets and securities for which market quotations are not readily available are valued at fair value by or under the direction of the Investment Manager, in accordance with U.S. GAAP fair value hierarchy.

The resulting unrealized gains and losses are reflected in the statement of operations.

The Fund utilizes various methods to measure the fair value of most of its investments on a recurring basis. US GAAP establishes a hierarchy that prioritizes inputs to valuation methods. Fair value is defined as the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability (i.e., the "exit price") in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. The three levels of inputs are:

Level 1 - Unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities that the Fund has the ability to access.

Level 2 - Observable inputs other than quoted prices included in Level 1 that are observable for the asset or liability, either directly or indirectly. These inputs may include quoted prices for the identical instrument on an inactive market, prices for similar instruments, interest rates, prepayment speeds, credit risk, yield curves, default rates and similar data.

Level 3 - Unobservable inputs for the asset or liability, to the extent relevant observable inputs are not available, representing the Fund's own assumptions about the assumptions a market participant would use in valuing the asset or liability, and would be based on the best information available.

The availability of observable inputs can vary from security to security and is affected by a wide variety of factors, including, for example, the type of security, whether the security is new and not yet established in the marketplace, the liquidity of markets, and other characteristics particular to the security. To the extent that valuation is based on models or inputs that are less observable or unobservable in the market, the determination of fair value requires more judgment. Accordingly, the degree of judgment exercised in determining fair value is greatest for instruments categorized in Level 3.

The inputs used to measure fair value may fall into different levels of the fair value hierarchy. In such cases, an investment's level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of input that is significant to the fair value measurement. The Fund's assessment of the significance of a particular input to the fair value measurement in its entirety requires judgment and considers factors specific to the investment. See Note 3 for details of investments categorized based upon the fair value hierarchy as described above.

Foreign Currency Translation

The accounting records of the Fund are maintained in U.S. dollars. Investment securities and other assets and liabilities denominated in a foreign currency are translated into U.S. dollars at the prevailing rates of exchange at period-end. Purchases and sales of securities, income receipts and expense payments are translated into U.S. dollars at the prevailing exchange rate on the respective dates of the transactions.

Net realized gains and losses on foreign currency transactions result from the disposition of foreign currencies, currency gains and losses realized between the trade and settlement dates on securities transactions, and the difference between the amount of net investment income accrued and the U.S. dollar amount actually received. Further, the effects of the changes in foreign currency exchange rates on investments in securities are not segregated in the statement of operations from the effects of changes in market prices of those securities but are included with the net realized gain and change in unrealized appreciation from investments in securities.

Foreign Currency Forward Contracts

The Fund may use foreign currency forward contracts to facilitate transactions in foreign securities and to manage the Fund's currency exposure. Contracts to buy generally are used to acquire exposure to foreign currencies, while contracts to sell are used to hedge the Fund's investments against currency fluctuations. Also, a contract to buy or sell can offset a previous contract. The use of foreign currency forward contracts does not eliminate fluctuations in the underlying prices of the Fund's portfolio securities, but it does establish a rate of exchange that can be achieved in the future. Although foreign currency forward contracts limit the risk of loss due to a decline in the value of the hedged currency, they also limit any potential gain that might result should the value of the currency increase. Losses may arise from changes in the value of the foreign currency or if the counterparties do not perform under the contract's terms.

Security Transactions and Investment Income

The Fund records its securities transactions on a trade-date basis. Realized gains and losses from securities transactions are determined using the first-in, first-out basis unless other instructions are provided by the Investment Manager. Dividend income is recorded on the ex-dividend date. Interest income is accrued as it is earned.

Off-Balance Sheet Credit Instruments

At December 31, 2023 the Fund had no standby letters of credit, funding commitments, or other off-balance sheet contractual arrangements. Such financial instruments are recorded when they are funded.

Loss Contingencies

Loss contingencies, including claims and legal actions arising in the ordinary course of business, are recorded as liabilities when the likelihood of loss is probable and an amount or range of loss can be reasonably estimated. Management does not believe there now are such matters that will have a material effect on the financial statements.

Income Taxes

No provision for federal or state income taxes has been made since the Fund is a pass-through entity treated as a partnership for U.S. tax purposes. Accordingly, each partner is liable for the taxes on their respective share of the Fund's income or loss. In certain non-U.S. jurisdictions, the Fund may be subject to an entity level tax on capital gains and other capital transactions.

In accordance with U.S. GAAP, the Fund recognizes the tax benefits of certain tax positions only when the position is "more likely than not" to be sustained assuming examination by federal tax authorities. As of and during the period from January 1, 2023 through December 31, 2023, the Investment Manager has analyzed the Fund's tax positions taken on the federal partnership tax returns and for material investments including possible non-U.S. entity level taxes on net trading gains and concluded the Fund did not require a provision or liability for any uncertain tax positions. Management does not expect any material change to this conclusion within the next twelve months. The Fund files US federal and state partnership tax returns, of which are generally subject to examination by respective tax jurisdictions for three years.

Withholding Taxes

The Fund may be subject to withholding taxes on foreign dividends depending upon the applicable country's tax rules and rates.

Income Allocation

Net income or loss is allocated to partners using the partners' pro rata capital balances after reflecting capital contributions and withdrawals.

New Accounting Pronouncement

In June 2022, the Financial Accounting Standards Board, or the FASB, issued ASU 2022-03, Fair Value Measurement (Topic 820): Fair Value Measurement of Equity Securities Subject to Contractual Sale Restrictions, or ASU 2022-03, which clarifies the guidance when measuring the fair value of an equity security subject to contractual restrictions that prohibit the sale of an equity security and introduces new disclosure requirements for equity securities subject to contractual sale restrictions that are measured at fair value in accordance with Topic 820. ASU 2022-03 is effective for fiscal years beginning after December 15, 2023, and interim periods within fiscal years beginning after December 15, 2023. The Fund is evaluating the potential impact that the adoption of this guidance will have on the Fund's consolidated financial statements; however, the Fund hasn't invested in such equity securities and doesn't have such equity securities at December 31, 2023.

3. FAIR VALUE

The Fund is in liquidation and held no investments in securities as of December 31, 2023.

4. DERIVATIVE CONTRACTS

In the normal course of business, the Fund enters into trading activities which include foreign currency forward contracts, which are forms of derivative financial instruments.

Derivative financial instruments base their value upon an underlying asset, index or reference rate. These instruments are subject to various risks, including leverage, market, credit, liquidity and operational risks. Changes in the market value of these instruments, subsequent to period-end, may be in excess of amounts recognized in the Fund's statement of net assets. The Fund manages the risks associated with derivatives on an aggregate basis, along with the risks associated with its trading and as part of its overall risk management policies.

Derivatives are generally based upon notional values. Notional amounts are not recorded on the statement of net assets, but rather are utilized solely as a basis for determining future cash flows to be exchanged.

Notional amounts provide a measure of the Fund's involvement with such instruments, but are not necessarily indicative of potential risk. These amounts are disclosed in the accompanying condensed schedule of investments.

5. RELATED PARTIES, MANAGEMENT FEES AND OTHER EXPENSES

According to the terms of the Partnership Agreement and Confidential Offering Circular, the General Partner shall receive a management fee as compensation for its services in managing the investments of the Fund. The General Partner is entitled to a monthly management fee with respect to each limited partner of a specified percentage of the balance of that limited partner's capital account. The management fee percentage is different for each class of limited partners, as follows: 1.0% per year for each Class A limited partner, 0.85% per year for each Class B limited partner, and as negotiated with the General Partner for each Class C limited partner. The management fee percentage paid by the Class C limited partners will likely differ among the Class C limited partners, which may include a performance fee component, but is expected in each case to be lower than the 1.0% and 0.85% management fee percentages paid by the Class A and Class B limited partners, respectively. The management fee is payable in arrears at the end of each month based on the net asset value of each limited partner's capital account on the last day of that month. For the period from January 1, 2023 through December 31, 2023 such fee amounted to \$162,825 of which \$13,843 was payable as of December 31, 2023.

The Fund bears the following costs and expenses incidental to its ongoing operation: (a) all trading costs and expenses (such as, for example, brokerage commissions and charges), (b) interest and commitment fees on loans and debit balances, (c) income taxes, withholding taxes, transfer taxes and other governmental charges and duties, (d) all fees and costs associated with any audit of the Fund, including fees of accounting and other professionals, experts and consultants in connection with any such audit, and (e) the costs and expenses of negotiating and entering into contracts and arrangements and making investments in the ordinary course of the Fund's activities (such as brokerage, legal, accounting and other professional and consulting fees and expenses arising from particular investments and potential investments) and similar expenses in terminating those contracts and arrangements and disposing of the Fund's investments. The General Partner bears all

other operating expenses of the Fund (including legal, accounting and bookkeeping fees and expenses and custody charges), as well as all costs of organizing the Fund. The General Partner also bears its own operating, general, administrative and overhead costs and expenses. All or a portion of these costs and expenses may be paid for, however, by brokerage firms that execute Securities trades for the Fund or the other accounts, as defined in the Partnership Agreement.

6. MARKET AND CONCENTRATION RISK

Market risk represents the potential loss that can be caused by increases or decreases in the fair value of investments resulting from market fluctuations.

The Fund places its cash with a banking institution domiciled in the United States. At times, the amount on deposit exceeds the insured limit of the institution and exposes the Fund to credit risk.

7. SUBSEQUENT EVENTS

Management of the Fund has evaluated events or transactions that may have occurred since December 31, 2023 through August 14, 2024, the date the financial statements were available for issuance. There were no material events that would require disclosure in the Fund's financial statements.
