We have performed audits of the financial statements of Harcum College Defined Contribution 403(b) Retirement Plan (the Plan), an employee benefit plan subject to the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA), as permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) (ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit). The financial statements comprise the statements of net assets available for benefits as of November 30, 2023 and December 31, 2022, and the related statement of changes in net assets available for benefits for the period from January 1, 2023 to November 30, 2023, and the related notes to the financial statements.

Management, having determined it is permissible in the circumstances, has elected to have the audits of the Plan's financial statements performed in accordance with ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) pursuant to 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor's (DOL) Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. As permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C), our audits need not extend to any statements or information related to assets held for investment of the Plan (investment information) by a bank or similar institution or insurance carrier that is regulated, supervised, and subject to periodic examination by a state or federal agency, provided that the statements or information regarding assets so held are prepared and certified to by the bank or similar institution or insurance carrier in accordance with 29 CFR 2520.103-5 of the DOL's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA (qualified institution).

Management has obtained certifications from a qualified institution as of November 30, 2023 and December 31, 2022, and for the period from January 1, 2023 to November 30, 2023, stating that the certified investment information, as described in Note 6 to the financial statements, is complete and accurate.

Disclaimer of Opinion

We do not express an opinion on the accompanying financial statements of the Plan. Because of the significance of the matter described in the Basis for Disclaimer Opinion section of our report, we have not been able to obtain sufficient appropriate audit evidence to provide a basis for an audit opinion on the financial statements.

Basis for Disclaimer of Opinion

The Plan does not have sufficient accounting records and supporting documents relating to certain participant account balances that merged into the Plan in 2009. Accordingly, we were unable to apply auditing procedures sufficient to determine the extent to which the accompanying financial statements may have been affected by these conditions

Emphasis of Matter

As disclosed in Note 1 to the financial statements, the Plan merged into the Pennsylvania Association of Independent Colleges and Universities Multiple Employer Plan effective November 30, 2023 and all assets and liabilities were legally transferred as of that date. Our opinion is not modified with respect to this matter.

Responsibilities of Management for the Financial Statements

Management is responsible for the preparation and fair presentation of the financial statements in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America, and for the design, implementation and maintenance of internal control relevant to the preparation and fair presentation of financial statements that are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error. Management's election of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit does not affect management's responsibility for the financial statements.

Management is also responsible for maintaining a current plan instrument, including all plan amendments, administering the Plan, and determining that the Plan's transactions that are presented and disclosed in the financial statements are in conformity with the Plan's provisions, including maintaining sufficient records with respect to each of the participants, to determine the benefits due or which may become due to such participants.

Auditors' Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements

Our responsibility is to conduct an audit of the Plan's financial statements in accordance with auditing standards generally accepted in the United States of America and to issue an auditors' report. However, because of the matter described in the Basis for Disclaimer of Opinion section of our report, we were not able to obtain sufficient appropriate audit evidence to provide a basis for an audit opinion on these financial statements.

We are required to be independent of the Plan, and to meet other ethical responsibilities, in accordance with the relevant ethical requirements relating to our audit.

Other Matter - Supplemental Schedule Required by ERISA

The supplemental schedule, Schedule H, Line 4(a) - Schedule of Delinquent Participant Contributions, for the period from January 1, 2023 to November 30, 2023 is presented for purposes of additional analysis and is not a required part of the financial statements but is supplementary information required by the DOL's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. Such information is the responsibility of management and was derived from and relates directly to the underlying accounting and other records used to prepare the financial statements. Because of the significance of the matters described in the Basis for Disclaimer of Opinion section of our report, it is inappropriate to and we do not express an opinion on the supplemental schedule referred to above.

1. Description of Plan

The following description of the Harcum College Defined Contribution 403(b) Retirement Plan (the Plan) provides only general information. Participants should refer to the plan agreement for a more complete description of the Plan's provisions.

General

The Plan was a defined contribution retirement plan covering substantially all employees of Harcum College (the College). Employees were eligible to participate upon employment. The Plan was subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA). The Board of Trustees of the College was responsible for the oversight of the Plan. The Investment Committee and its investment managers determined the appropriateness of the Plan's investment offerings and monitored investment performance.

Effective November 30, 2023, the Plan merged into the Pennsylvania Association of Independent Colleges and Universities Multiple Employer Plan (PAICU MEP). Participants' balances totaling \$22,836,357 were legally transferred into the PAICU MEP on November 30, 2023.

Contributions

Each year, participants could contribute pre-tax contributions not to exceed 85% of the participant's eligible compensation for the plan year, as defined in the plan document, up to the maximum limits of the Internal Revenue Code (IRC). Participants who had attained age 50 before the end of the plan year were eligible to make catch-up contributions. Participants could also contribute amounts representing distributions from other qualified defined benefit or defined contribution plans (rollover). Participants were eligible to receive the College's matching contribution upon attaining age 21 and completion of one year of service, as defined. The College made a matching contribution of 6% of eligible compensation for participants hired prior to July 1, 2009 and who had contributed at least 5% of eligible compensation on a pay-period basis. For participants hired July 1, 2009 or later and for participants hired prior to July 1, 2009 who did not contribute at least 5% of eligible compensation as of July 1, 2009, the College made a matching contribution of 100% of deferrals on the first 3% of eligible compensation deferred. Highly compensated employees were not eligible to receive the College matching contribution. Participants directed the investment of all contributions into various investment options offered by the Plan. Contributions were subject to certain Internal Revenue Service (IRS) limitations.

Participant Accounts

Each participant's account was credited with the participant's contributions and the College's matching contribution, as well as an allocation of the Plan's earnings. Participants were charged with an allocation of administrative expenses that were paid by the Plan. Allocations were based on participant earnings, account balances or specific participant transactions, as defined in the plan document. The benefit to which a participant was entitled was the benefit that could be provided from the participant's account.

Vesting

Participants were vested immediately in their contributions and the College's contributions plus actual earnings thereon.

Plan Loans

Prior to October 17, 2018, Teachers Insurance and Annuity Association of America and College Retirement Equities Fund (TIAA and CREF) issued plan loans to participants which were secured by the participant's account balance but were contractual agreements between TIAA and CREF and the participant and were funded by the TIAA general fund. A participant was required to transfer 110% of the loan value to the TIAA Traditional Account upon the issuance of the loan and was restricted from transfers or withdrawals. The restricted account balance was used as collateral on the loan balance in accordance with the terms of the loan. These transactions qualified as related-party transactions. As of December 31, 2022, participant account balances which were held in the TIAA Traditional Account that collateralized these loans totaled \$49,011; the related loans totaled \$44,555 at December 31, 2022. Interest rates on the loans outstanding at December 31, 2022 were 4.38% to 5.18%.

Notes Receivable From Participants

Participants were permitted to take a loan directly from the Plan. Participants could borrow from their fund accounts, excluding TIAA Traditional Annuity accounts, a minimum of \$1,000 up to a maximum equal to the lesser of \$50,000 or 50% of their vested account balance. The notes were secured by the balance in the participant's account. Interest rates were commensurate with local prevailing applicable rates as determined by the plan administrator. Principal and interest were paid on a ratable basis directly by the participant to TIAA and CREF. Terms ranged from one to five years or greater for the purchase of a primary residence.

Payment of Benefits

On termination of service due to death, disability, retirement or other reasons, a participant was eligible to receive the interest in their account in a lump sum, installment or various forms of annuities. A participant could elect a hardship distribution if certain criteria was met, as defined in the plan document.

2. Summary of Accounting Policies

Basis of Accounting

The financial statements of the Plan are prepared on the accrual basis of accounting.

Use of Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities and changes therein, and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

Investment Valuation and Income Recognition

Investments were reported at fair value (except for fully benefit-responsive investment contracts, which were reported at contract value). Fair value was the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. The Plan's Investment Committee determined the Plan's valuation policies utilizing information provided by the investment advisers, custodians and insurance company, as applicable. See Note 3 for discussion of fair value measurements.

The Plan's investments in fully benefit-responsive investment contracts were reported at contract value. Contract value was the relevant measure for the portion of the net assets available for benefits of a defined contribution plan attributable to fully benefit-responsive investment contracts because contract value was the amount participants normally would receive if they were to initiate permitted transactions under the terms of the Plan.

Purchases and sales of securities were recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest income was recorded on the accrual basis. Dividends were recorded on the ex-dividend date. Net appreciation includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold as well as held during the year.

Notes Receivable From Participants

Notes receivable from participants were measured at their unpaid principal balance plus any accrued but unpaid interest. Related fees were recorded as administrative expenses and were expensed when they were incurred. Interest income was recorded on the accrual basis. No allowance for credit losses was recorded as of December 31, 2022.

Payment of Benefits

Benefits were recorded when paid

Expenses

Certain expenses of maintaining the Plan were paid by the Plan, unless otherwise paid by the College. Expenses that were paid by the College were excluded from these financial statements. Fees related to the administration of notes receivable from participants were charged directly to the participants account and were included in administrative expenses. Investment related expenses were included in net appreciation in fair value of investments.

Subsequent Events

Subsequent events were evaluated through September 12, 2024, the date the financial statements were available to be issued.

3. Fair Value Measurements

The framework for measuring fair value provides a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (Level 1) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (Level 3). The three levels of the fair value hierarchy under authoritative guidance are described as follows:

Level 1 - Inputs to the valuation methodology are unadjusted quoted prices for identical assets or liabilities in active markets that the Plan has the ability to access.

Level 2 - Inputs other than quoted prices included within Level 1 that are observable for the asset or liability, either directly or indirectly, such as:

- quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities in active markets;
- quoted prices for identical or similar assets or liabilities in inactive markets;
- inputs other than quoted prices that are observable for the asset or liability;
- inputs that are derived principally from or corroborated by observable market data by correlation or other means.

If the asset or liability has a specified (contractual) term, the Level 2 input must be observable for substantially the full term of the asset or liability.

Level 3 - Inputs to the valuation methodology are unobservable and significant to the fair value measurement.

The asset or liability's fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy was based on the lowest level of any input that was significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques maximize the use of relevant observables and minimize the use of unobservable inputs.

Following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for assets measured at fair value. There have been no changes in the methodologies used at December 31, 2022.

Mutual funds were valued at the daily closing price as reported by the fund. Mutual funds held by the Plan were open-end mutual funds that were registered with the U.S. Securities and Exchange Commission. These funds were required to publish their daily net asset value (NAV) and to transact at that price. The mutual funds held by the Plan were deemed to be actively traded.

Separate accounts were valued based on the unit of values of such pooled accounts held by the Plan at year-end. Unit values were based on the fair value of the underlying assets of the fund derived from inputs principally from or corroborated by observable market data by correlation or other means, although were not based upon quoted market prices in an active market. The underlying investments of the pooled separate accounts consisted of mutual funds, each of which followed a separate investment strategy. Due to the nature of these pooled accounts, there were no unfunded commitments or redemption restrictions.

The TIAA Real Estate Account was valued based on NAV per unit of participation in the account. The NAV was used as a practical expedient to estimate fair value and was based on the fair value of the underlying investments held by the account less its liabilities. The practical expedient was not used when it was determined to be probable that the fund would sell the investment for an amount different than the reported NAV. Transfers out of the TIAA Real Estate Fund were limited to one per calendar quarter. The underlying investments consisted of real property and short-term high quality investments to maintain liquidity to guarantee redemption requests. The real properties consisted of office, apartment, industrial, retail and storage facility classifications located in all major regions within the United States and internationally located in the United Kingdom and France. The values of the properties held in the fund were based on professional opinions and appraisals which incorporated valuation methodologies to determine fair value including cash flows models, market models and other similar techniques.

The TIAA Access Annuity Accounts were variable annuity accounts invested in proprietary and nonproprietary mutual funds through various sub-accounts. These custodial sub-accounts consisted of underlying investments valued based on quoted market prices and have no unfunded commitments or significant redemption restrictions.

The guaranteed annuity contracts consisted of the TIAA Traditional Accounts (TIAA Accounts). Certain contracts of the TIAA Accounts were fully benefit-responsive and were excluded from the fair value hierarchy table, and certain contracts of the TIAA Accounts were nonbenefit-responsive and were presented at fair value in the hierarchy table. The TIAA Accounts were reported at contract value, which approximated fair value, based on TIAA's ability to pay the guaranteed claims in accordance with the terms of the contract. As of December 31, 2022, TIAA's credit ratings were as follows: A++ by A.M. Best College, AAA by Fitch Ratings, Aa1 by Moody's Investors Service and AA+ by Standard & Poor's. The high credit ratings of TIAA as of the measurement date uphold the TIAA Accounts' ability to meet obligations set forth in the contracts.

Contract value was the aggregation of contributions, plus interest, less withdrawals, if any. Crediting rates were a combination of a guaranteed rate and an annually established discretionary rate. Additionally, the discretionary rate applied to contributions received during a reporting period could vary from the discretionary rate applied to account balances at the end of the prior reporting period. Contract value approximated a discounted cash flow value calculated using an appropriate risk-adjusted market discount rate which correlated closely with TIAA Accounts' historical crediting rates.

5. Fully Benefit-Responsive Investment Contracts

The Plan held a portfolio of guaranteed annuity contracts that comprised traditional annuity contracts. These contracts met the fully benefit-responsive annuity contract criteria, and therefore, were reported at contract value. Contract value was the relevant measure for fully benefit-responsive annuity contracts because this was the amount received by participants if they were to initiate permitted transactions under the terms of the Plan. Contract value represented contributions made under each contract, plus earnings, less participant withdrawals. The fully benefit-responsive contracts held by the Plan totaled \$767,993 at December 31, 2022.

The traditional investment contracts held by the Plan were the TIAA Traditional Annuity and the TIAA Stable Value. The contract issuer was contractually obligated to repay the principal and interest at a guaranteed minimum rate of interest between 1% and 3%. The crediting rate was reviewed semi-annually for resetting. The contract could not be terminated before the scheduled maturity date.

The Plan's ability to receive amounts due in accordance with fully benefit-responsive investment contracts was dependent on the third-party issuer's ability to meet its financial obligations. The issuer's ability to meet its contractual obligations could be affected by future economic and regulatory developments.

Certain events might limit the ability of the Plan to transact at contract value with the contract issuer. Such events included (1) amendments to the plan documents (including complete or partial plan termination or merger with another plan), (2) changes to the Plan's prohibition on competing investment options or deletion of equity wash provisions, (3) bankruptcy of the plan sponsor or other plan sponsor events (for example, divestitures or spinoffs of a subsidiary) that cause a significant withdrawal from the Plan, (4) the failure of the trust to qualify for exemption from federal income taxes or any required prohibited transaction exemption under ERISA or (5) premature termination of the contract.

No events were probable of occurring that might limit the ability of the Plan to transact at contract value with the contract issuers and that also would limit the ability of the Plan to transact at contract value with the participants.

In addition, certain events allowed the issuer to terminate the contracts with the Plan and settle at an amount different from contract value. Such events include (1) an uncured violation of the Plan's investment guidelines, (2) a breach of material obligation under the contract, (3) a material misrepresentation or (4) a material amendment to the agreement without the consent of the issuer.

6. Information Certified by Custodians

The plan administrator has elected the method of compliance permitted by 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA for 2023 and 2022. Accordingly, TIAA and CREF, the Custodians of the Plan, have certified to the completeness and accuracy of all investments reported in the accompanying Statements of Net Assets Available for Benefits as of November 30, 2023 and December 31, 2022, and the related investment activity reported in the Statement of Changes in Net Assets Available for Benefits for the period from January 1, 2023 to November 30, 2023.

7. Related-Party and Party in Interest Transactions

Certain of the Plan's investments were managed by the custodians, TIAA and CREF, and therefore, these transactions qualified as party in interest transactions. Fees incurred by the Plan for the investment manager services were included in net appreciation in fair value of investments, as they were paid through revenue sharing, rather than a direct payment. Additionally, the Plan issued loans to participants, which were secured by the participant's account balances. These transactions qualified as party in interest transactions.

Certain administrative functions of the Plan were performed by officers or employees of the College. No such officer or employee received compensation from the Plan.

8. Tax Status

The Plan adopted a 403(b) volume submitter plan; the 403(b) volume submitter plan received an advisory letter dated March 31, 2017, that the volume submitter plan and related trust are designed in accordance with the applicable sections of the IRC. Although the Plan has been restated since receiving the advisory letter, the plan administrator believes that the Plan is designed and is currently being operated in compliance with the applicable requirements of the IRC, and therefore, believes that the Plan is qualified and the related trust is tax-exempt.

Accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America require management to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan and recognize a tax liability if the Plan has taken an uncertain position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by the IRS. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress.

9. Risks and Uncertainties

The Plan invested in various investment securities. Investment securities were exposed to various risks, such as interest rate, market and credit risks. Market risks included global events which could impact the value of the investment security such as a pandemic or international conflict. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it was at least reasonably possible that changes in the values of investment securities would occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect participants' account balances and the amounts reported in the Statements of Net Assets Available for Benefits.

10. Plan Records Management

In November 2007, the DOL issued amended regulations eliminating an exemption granted to 403(b) plans from the annual Form 5500 reporting and disclosure requirements under Part 1 of Subtitle B of Title I of ERISA. Prior to the amended regulations, the Plan was not viewed as a separate reporting entity. Historically, the Plan was viewed as a collection of individual contracts with which participants could engage in a range of actions with limited involvement, if any, by the plan sponsor. Accordingly, various accounting, human resources and payroll records related to the Plan's 403(b) annuity contracts and custodial accounts issued to current and former employees prior to January 1, 2009, were not sufficiently maintained by the Plan. Consequently, the financial statements and supplemental schedule have been prepared based on available records analyzed by plan management. As certain records were not available from the inception of the Plan, the effect, if any, on the completeness or accuracy of the Plan's financial statements cannot be determined.

11. Delinquent Participant Contributions

For the period from January 1, 2023 to November 30, 2023, the College did not remit certain participant contributions to the Plan on a timely basis as defined by the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. Untimely remittances identified on the Schedule of Delinquent Participant Contributions totaled \$21 and were corrected in 2024. Additionally, the College has compensated participants for lost earnings resulting from the delay in contributions.
