Scope and Nature of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) Audits

We have performed audits of the financial statements of Broadway Technology, LLC 401(k) Plan (the “Plan”), an employee benefit plan subject to the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (“ERISA”), as permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) (“ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit”). The financial statements comprise the statements of net assets as of December 19, 2023 (in Liquidation) and December 31, 2022 (Ongoing), and the related statements of changes in net assets for the period from January 1, 2023 to December 19, 2023 (in Liquidation) and for the year ended December 31, 2022 (Ongoing), and the related notes to the financial statements (the “financial statements”).

Management, having determined it is permissible in the circumstances, has elected to have the audits of the Plan’s financial statements performed in accordance with ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) pursuant to 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor’s Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. As permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C), our audits need not extend to any statements or information related to assets held for investment of the Plan (“investment information”) by a bank or similar institution or insurance carrier that is regulated, supervised, and subject to periodic examination by a state or federal agency, provided that the statements or information regarding assets so held are prepared and certified to by the bank or similar institution or insurance carrier in accordance with 29 CFR 2520.103-5 of the Department of Labor’s Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA (“qualified institution”).

Management has obtained certifications from a qualified institution as of December 19, 2023 and December 31, 2022, and for the period from January 1, 2023 to December 19, 2023 and for the year ended December 31, 2022, stating that the certified investment information, as described in Note D to the financial statements, is complete and accurate.

Opinion

In our opinion, based on our audits and on the procedures performed as described in the Auditor’s Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements section:

- The amounts and disclosures in the accompanying financial statements, other than those agreed to or derived from the certified investment information, are presented fairly, in all material respects, in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America (“GAAP”).
- The information in the accompanying financial statements related to assets held by and certified to by a qualified institution agrees to, or is derived from, in all material respects, the information prepared and certified by an institution that management determined meets the requirements of ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C).

Basis for Opinion

We conducted our audits in accordance with auditing standards generally accepted in the United States of America (“GAAS”). Our responsibilities under those standards are further described in the Auditor’s Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements section of our report. We are required to be independent of the Plan and to meet our other ethical responsibilities, in accordance with the relevant ethical requirements relating to our audits. We believe that the audit evidence we have obtained is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for our ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit opinion.

Responsibilities of Management for the Financial Statements

Management is responsible for the preparation and fair presentation of the financial statements in accordance with GAAP, and for the design, implementation, and maintenance of internal control relevant to the preparation and fair presentation of financial statements that are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error. Management’s election of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit does not affect management’s responsibility for the financial statements.

Except as described in the Scope and Nature of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) Audit for the Financial Statements section of our report, our objectives are to obtain reasonable assurance about whether the financial statements as a whole are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error, and to issue an auditor’s report that includes our opinion. Reasonable assurance is a high level of assurance but is not absolute assurance and therefore is not a guarantee that an audit conducted in accordance with GAAS will always detect a material misstatement when it exists. The risk of not detecting a material misstatement resulting from fraud is higher than for one resulting from error, as fraud may involve collusion, forgery, intentional omissions, misrepresentations, or the override of internal control. Accordingly, the objective of an ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit is not to express an opinion about whether the financial statements as a whole are presented fairly, in all material respects, in accordance with GAAP.

We are required to communicate with those charged with governance regarding, among other matters, the planned scope and timing of the audits, significant audit findings, and certain internal control–related matters that we identified during the audits.

Other Matter

Plan Termination and Liquidation Basis of Accounting

As discussed in the notes to the financial statements, on September 27, 2023, Broadway Technology, LLC (the “Company”) formally approved the termination of the Plan effective October 1, 2023. The Plan was fully liquidated as of December 19, 2023. As a result, the Plan’s 2023 financial statements have been prepared using the liquidation basis of accounting. Our opinion is not modified with respect to this matter.

NOTES TO FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

December 19, 2023 (in Liquidation) and December 31, 2022 (Ongoing)

A. Description of the Plan

General

The following brief description of the Broadway Technology, LLC 401(k) Plan (the “Plan”) is provided for general information purposes only. The Plan is sponsored by Broadway Technology, LLC (the “Company”). Participants should refer to the Plan document for more complete information. The Company’s corporate offices are in New York, New York.

The Plan was effective May 2, 2007, restated most recently effective February 1, 2022, and is a defined contribution plan available to all employees of the Company who have attained the age of 21. All employees of the Company are eligible to participate in the Plan, except for those covered by a collective bargaining agreement. Eligible employees may enter the Plan immediately upon satisfaction of the eligibility requirements. The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (“ERISA”).

The purpose of the Plan is to encourage the Company’s employees to save and invest, systematically, a portion of their current compensation so that they and their families may have a source of additional income upon their retirement, or in the event of death.

The Company was acquired by Bloomberg L.P. on October 2, 2023. In a resolution dated September 27, 2023, the Company formally agreed to terminate the Plan effective October 1, 2023. The Plan was fully liquidated as of December 19, 2023.

Contributions

Participants may contribute, through elective pre-tax, Roth, or after-tax contributions up to 90% of pre-tax annual compensation, as defined by the Plan. All contributions are subject to limitations on annual additions and other limitations imposed by the Internal Revenue Code (the “Code”) as defined in the Plan document. Eligible participants may make a rollover contribution to the Plan.

Participants who are eligible to make salary deferral contributions under the Plan and who have attained age 50 before the close of the year may make catch-up contributions in accordance with, and subject to the limitations imposed by the Code.

The Company makes safe harbor matching contributions equal to 100% of the first 3% and 50% of the next 2% of participants’ eligible compensation contributed to the Plan.

The Company may also make discretionary non-elective contributions to the Plan as determined annually by management of the Plan and the Company’s Board of Directors. Participants must be either employed on the last day of the Plan year or have completed at least 501 hours of service during such year in order to be eligible to receive discretionary non-elective contributions. There were no discretionary non-elective contributions during the period from January 1, 2023 to December 19, 2023 or the year ended December 31, 2022.

A. Description of the Plan - continued

Participant Accounts

Each participant's account is credited with the participant's contributions, safe harbor matching contributions, and allocations of: (a) the Company's discretionary non-elective contributions; and (b) Plan earnings. Participant accounts are charged with an allocation of administrative expenses that are paid by the Plan. Allocations are based on participant earnings or account balances, or specific participant transactions, as defined. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant's account.

Vesting

Participants are immediately vested in their voluntary contributions as well as the Company's safe harbor matching contributions plus actual earnings thereon. Vesting in the Company's non-elective discretionary contribution portion of accounts, plus actual earnings thereon is as follows:

In the event of disability, early retirement, or death, the participant will become fully vested. Effective October 1, 2023, all participant accounts became fully vested.

Notes Receivable from Participants

Participants may borrow from their accounts a minimum of \$1,000 and up to a maximum of: (a) \$50,000 less the highest outstanding note receivable balance over the prior twelve months; or (b) 50% of their vested account balance, whichever is less. Participants may have only one note receivable outstanding at a time. Notes receivable payments are deducted through after-tax payroll deductions over a period generally not to exceed five years. Participant notes receivable are secured by the vested balance in the participant's account and bear interest at a rate commensurate with local prevailing rates as determined by the Company. Principal and interest are paid ratably through payroll deductions. At December 31, 2022, interest rates ranged from 4.25% to 5.75%. There were no notes receivable from participants at December 19, 2023.

A. Description of the Plan – continued

Benefit Payments

Participants withdrawing during the year for reasons of service or disability, retirement, death, or termination are entitled to their vested account balances. Benefits are distributed in the form of rollovers or lump-sum payments. If withdrawing participants are not entitled to their entire account balances, the amounts not received are forfeited. In general, if a participant's vested account balance, as defined by the Plan, is greater than \$1,000 and employment is terminated other than due to retirement or death, the account may not be distributed before normal retirement without the participant's consent. However, regardless of participant election as to the payment, the Plan may, upon termination of service of a participant for any reason, pay the benefits owed in a lump sum if the account balance is less than the involuntary cash-out amount. Distributions are subject to the applicable provisions of the Plan Agreement.

Certain in-service withdrawals are allowed. A participant may also elect to withdraw all or a portion of his/her vested account balance while employed after reaching age 59 ½. A participant may receive a hardship distribution from salary reduction contributions if the distribution is: (1) on account of uninsured medical expenses incurred by the participant, his/her spouse, or dependents; (2) to purchase (excluding mortgage payments) a principal residence of the participant; (3) for the payment of post-secondary tuition expenses; (4) needed to prevent eviction of the participant from his/her principal residence or foreclosure upon the mortgage of the participant's principal residence; (5) payments for burial or funeral expenses for the participant's parent, spouse, children, or dependents; or (6) expenses for the repair of damage to the participant's principal residence.

Forfeitures

Forfeited balances of terminated participants' non-vested accounts are used to offset employer matching contributions for the year. No forfeitures were allocated to reduce employer matching contributions during the for the period from January 1, 2023 to December 19, 2023 and for the year ended December 31, 2022. There was \$0 and \$400 in unallocated forfeitures outstanding at December 19, 2023 and December 31, 2022, respectively.

Investment Options

Upon enrollment in the Plan, a participant may direct his/her salary deferrals in 1% increments into any of the Plan's investment options.

Plan Expenses

Employees of the Company perform certain administrative functions with no compensation from the Plan. In accordance with Plan provisions, the Company pays substantially all costs relating to asset charges and recordkeeping. All significant administrative expenses are paid by the Company and are not reflected in the accompanying financial statements.

B. Summary of Significant Accounting Policies

Basis of Accounting

As discussed in Note A, on October 1, 2023, the Plan was effectively terminated and as a result, the Plan has changed its basis of accounting from the accrual (ongoing) basis used in presenting the 2022 financial statements to the liquidation basis used in presenting the 2023 financial statements in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America (“GAAP”).

Under the liquidation basis of accounting, assets are measured to reflect the estimated amount of cash expected to be collected in settling or disposing of the assets during the liquidation process and liabilities are measured using the accrual basis of accounting and would include expected income and costs of the disposal of assets and other costs expected to be incurred during the liquidation process. The Plan was fully liquidated effective December 19, 2023, accordingly there are no such items.

Use of Estimates

The preparation of the financial statements in conformity with GAAP requires the plan administrator to make estimates and assumptions that affect certain reported amounts and disclosures. Accordingly, actual results may differ from these estimates.

Contributions

Contributions from the Company and participants are accrued as they become obligations of the Company, as determined by the Plan’s administrator, and in the period in which they are deducted, in accordance with salary deferral agreements.

Notes Receivable from Participants

Notes receivable from participants are recorded at the unpaid principal balance plus accrued but unpaid interest.

Investment Valuation and Income

The investments of the Plan are stated at fair value as of the end of the period/year and are subject to market or credit risks customarily associated with equity investments. Fair value measurements are determined in accordance with GAAP, which defines fair value, establishes a framework for measuring fair value, and expands disclosures about assets and liabilities measured at fair value. See Note C for information related to the Plan’s valuation methodologies.

Investment gains and losses are accounted for using the average cost basis of the securities sold. The net realized and unrealized gains and losses on investments include realized gains and losses on sales of investments during the year or period and unrealized increases or decreases in the fair value of investments held at the end of each period. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date.

Payment of Benefits

Benefits are recorded when paid.

Recently Adopted Accounting Pronouncements

The Plan adopted Accounting Standards Update No. 2013-07, *Presentation of Financial Statements – Liquidation Basis of Accounting*, which provides clarifying guidance for the liquidation basis of accounting, effective October 1, 2023. The adoption did not have a material effect on the financial statements, other than adding additional disclosures regarding the Plan’s termination and related liquidation of Plan assets for the period from January 1, 2023 to December 19, 2023.

C. Fair Value Measurements

GAAP defines fair value as the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date and establishes a three-tier hierarchy that is used to identify assets and liabilities measured at fair value. The hierarchy focuses on the inputs used to measure fair value. The three levels defined are as follows:

- Level 1 — observable inputs that are based upon quoted market prices for identical assets or liabilities within active markets.
- Level 2 — observable inputs other than Level 1 that are based upon quoted market prices for similar assets or liabilities, based upon quoted prices within inactive markets, or inputs other than quoted market prices that are observable through market data for substantially the full term of the asset or liability.
- Level 3 — inputs that are unobservable for the particular asset or liability due to little or no market activity and are significant to the fair value of the asset or liability. These inputs reflect assumptions that market participants would use when valuing the particular asset or liability.

GAAP requires that management describe the methodologies used to measure the fair value of assets and liabilities. The methodologies used to measure the fair value of the Plan’s investments are as follows:

- The money market fund is valued based on the short-term cash component as of the measurement date and classified within Level 1 of the valuation hierarchy.
- Mutual funds are valued at the published per share net asset value (“NAV”) of shares held by the Plan and are classified within Level 1 of the valuation hierarchy. There are no significant restrictions on redeeming these investments at NAV.

There have been no changes in the methodologies used at December 19, 2023 and December 31, 2022. The Plan has no assets classified within Level 2 or Level 3 of the valuation hierarchy. The Plan had no investments at December 19, 2023.

These items are classified in their entirety based on the lowest priority level of input that is significant to the fair value measurement. The assessment of the significance of a particular input to the fair value measurement requires judgment and may affect the placement of assets and liabilities within the levels of the fair value hierarchy.

D. Certified Investments

Certain information related to investments and notes receivable from participants disclosed in the accompanying financial statements, including investments and notes receivable from participants held at December 19, 2023 and December 31, 2022, and net realized and unrealized gains and losses on investments, interest and dividends, and interest income on notes receivable from participants for the period from January 1, 2023 to December 19, 2023 and for the year ended December 31, 2022, was obtained by management and agreed to or derived from information certified as complete and accurate by Fidelity Management Trust Company, the trustee.

E. Tax Status

Effective February 1, 2022, the Plan was amended and restated by the adoption of the Fidelity Management & Research Company Non-Standardized Pre-Approved Profit Sharing Plan with CODA which has a favorable opinion letter from the Internal Revenue Service (“IRS”) dated June 30, 2020. This opinion letter states that the form of the prototype plan is acceptable under Section 401 of the Code. The Company may rely on this letter with respect to the qualification of the Plan under Code Section 401(a) with certain limitations.

Prior to the restatement referenced above, the Plan utilized the Fidelity Management & Research Company Volume Submitter Prototype Profit Sharing Plan with CODA which has a favorable opinion letter from the Internal Revenue Service (“IRS”) dated March 31, 2014.

E. Tax Status – continued

Once qualified, the Plan is required to operate in conformity with the Code to maintain its qualification. The Company believes that the Plan is being operated in compliance with the applicable requirements of the Code and, therefore, believes that the Plan was qualified, and the related trust was tax-exempt as of the financial statement date.

GAAP requires management to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan and recognize a tax liability (or asset) if the Plan has taken an uncertain position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by the IRS. The plan administrator has analyzed the tax positions taken by the Plan and has concluded that as of December 19, 2023 and December 31, 2022, there are no uncertain positions taken or expected to be taken that would require recognition of a liability (or asset) or disclosure in the financial statements. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress.

F. Plan Termination

As mentioned in Note A, on September 27, 2023 the Company adopted a resolution to terminate the Plan effective October 1, 2023. Participants became 100% vested in their account balances and all elective deferrals, employer contributions, accrued benefits, and new participant enrollments ceased upon the termination of the Plan. The participant account balances were fully distributed at December 19, 2023.

G. Risks and Uncertainties

The Plan invested in various investment securities prior to liquidation. Investment securities are exposed to various risks, such as interest rate, market, and credit risks. Market risks include global events which could impact the value of investment securities, such as a pandemic or international conflict. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, prior to liquidation, it was at least reasonably possible that changes in the values of investment securities would occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect participants' account balances and the amounts reported in the statements of net assets.

H. Parties-in-Interest Transactions

Party-in-interest transactions include those with fiduciaries or employees of the Plan, any person who provides services to the Plan, an employer whose employees are covered by the Plan, an employee organization whose members are covered by the Plan, a person who owns 50% or more of such an employer or employee organization, or relatives of such persons.

H. Parties-in-Interest Transactions – continued

The Plan invested in shares of mutual funds managed by Fidelity Management Trust Company. Fidelity Management Trust Company acts as trustee for only those investments as defined by the Plan. Transactions in such investments, as well as loans made to participants, qualify as party-in-interest transactions, which are exempt from the prohibited transaction rules.

The Plan paid certain expenses related to plan operations and investment activity to various service providers. These transactions are party-in-interest transactions under ERISA which are exempt from the prohibited transaction rules.

I. Subsequent Events

In preparing the accompanying financial statements, management has evaluated all subsequent events and transactions for potential recognition or disclosure through September 25, 2024, the date the financial statements were available for issuance.
