For ages below 80, the additional projection period is increased by 1 year for each year below age 80. For ages above 80, the additional projection period is reduced (but not below zero) by 1/3 year for each year above 80.

Administrative Expenses: Actual plan expenses, not including investment advisory fees, paid out of the trust during the previous plan year, rounded to the nearest thousand dollars - \$0.




