Report on the Audit of the Financial Statements

Scope and Nature of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) Audit

We have performed audits of the financial statements of Plantronics, Inc. 401(k) Plan, an employee benefit plan subject to the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA), as permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) (ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit). The financial statements comprise the statements of net assets available for benefits in liquidation as of December 28, 2023, and December 31, 2022, and the related statements of changes in net assets available for benefits in liquidation for the period January 1, 2023, through December 28, 2023, and the year ended December 31, 2022, and the related notes to the financial statements.

Management, having determined it is permissible in the circumstances, has elected to have the audits of Plantronics, Inc. 401(k) Plan's financial statements performed in accordance with ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) pursuant to 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. As permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C), our audits need not extend to any statements or information related to assets held for investment of the plan (investment information) by a bank or similar institution or insurance carrier that is regulated, supervised, and subject to periodic examination by a state or federal agency, provided that the statements or information regarding assets so held are prepared and certified to by the bank or similar institution or insurance carrier in accordance with 29 CFR 2520.103-5 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA (qualified institution).

Management has obtained certifications from a qualified institution as of December 28, 2023, and December 31, 2022, and for the period January 1, 2023, through December 28, 2023, and for the year ended December 31, 2022, stating that the certified investment information, as described in Note 6 to the financial statements, is complete and accurate.

Opinion

In our opinion, based on our audits and on the procedures performed as described in the Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements section:

- the amounts and disclosures in the accompanying financial statements, other than those agreed to or derived from the certified investment information, are presented fairly, in all material respects, in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America (GAAP).
- the information in the accompanying financial statements related to assets held by and certified to by a qualified institution agrees to, or is derived from, in all material respects, the information prepared and certified by an institution that management determined meets the requirements of ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C).

Emphasis of Matter

As described in Note 1 to the financial statements, the Company was acquired on August 29, 2022, and the Plan sponsor approved the termination of the Plan with an effective termination date of August 28, 2022. Accordingly, the Plan's financial statements are presented on the liquidation basis of accounting for 2023 and 2022 and as of December 28, 2023, the Plan has been fully liquidated. Our opinion is not modified with respect to this matter.

Basis for Opinion

We conducted our audits in accordance with auditing standards generally accepted in the United States of America (GAAS). Our responsibilities under those standards are further described in the Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements section of our report. We are required to be independent of Plantronics, Inc. 401(k) Plan and to meet our other ethical responsibilities, in accordance with the relevant ethical requirements relating to our audits. We believe that the audit evidence we have obtained is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for our ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit opinion.

Responsibilities of Management for the Financial Statements

Management is responsible for the preparation and fair presentation of the financial statements in accordance with GAAP, and for the design, implementation, and maintenance of internal control relevant to the preparation and fair presentation of financial statements that are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error. Management's election of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit does not affect management's responsibility for the financial statements.

Management is also responsible for maintaining a current plan instrument, including all plan amendments, administering the plan, and determining that the plan's transactions that are presented and disclosed in the financial statements are in conformity with the plan's provisions, including maintaining sufficient records with respect to each of the participants, to determine the benefits due or which may become due to such participants.

Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements

Except as described in the Scope and Nature of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) Audit section of our report, our objectives are to obtain reasonable assurance about whether the financial statements as a whole are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error, and to issue an auditor's report that includes our opinion. Reasonable assurance is a high level of assurance but is not absolute assurance and therefore is not a guarantee that an audit conducted in accordance with GAAS will always detect a material misstatement when it exists. The risk of not detecting a material misstatement resulting from fraud is higher than for one resulting from error, as fraud may involve collusion, forgery, intentional omissions, misrepresentations, or the override of internal control. Misstatements are considered material if there is a substantial likelihood that, individually or in the aggregate, they would influence the judgment made by a reasonable user based on the financial statements.

Notes to Financial Statements

NOTE 1 – THE PLAN AND ITS SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

General – The following description of the Plantronics, Inc. 401(k) Plan (the Plan) provides only general information. Participants should refer to the Plan document for a more complete description of the Plan's provisions.

The Plan was a defined contribution plan that was established in 1968 by Plantronics, Inc. (the Company) to provide benefits to eligible employees, as defined in the Plan document. The Plan was designed to be qualified under the applicable requirements of the Internal Revenue Code (the Code) and the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA).

Plan termination – The Company was acquired on August 29, 2022, by HP Inc. As a result of the acquisition the Plan was terminated effective August 28, 2022, and all employer contributions subject to vesting became 100% vested.

As a result of the Plan's termination, the Plan's net assets were allocated for payment of Plan benefits to the participants in accordance with ERISA, applicable regulations, and the Plan document. Beginning in January 2023, all the participants of the Plan were required to elect one of the following options with respect to their participant account balances: 1) single lump-sum distribution, or 2) rollover to another qualified retirement plan. Participants not electing one of the above options by July 27, 2023, had their account balances transferred to an investment retirement account. Investment earnings including dividends expected to be earned through the liquidation process of approximately \$24,969,000 were accrued for as of December 31, 2022, based on assets distributed during 2023.

Administration – The Company appointed the Investment Committee (the Committee) to manage the operation and administration of the Plan. The Company contracted with Fidelity Management Trust Company (Fidelity), to act as the trustee and an affiliate of Fidelity to act as the third-party administrator to process and maintain the records of participant data. Substantially all expenses incurred for administering the Plan were paid by the Company.

Estimates – The preparation of financial statements in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities, and changes therein, and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

Basis of accounting – The financial statements of the Plan are prepared on the liquidation basis of accounting in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.

Forfeited accounts – Forfeited nonvested accounts acquired in conjunction with mergers of acquired plans could be used to reduce future employer contributions, pay Plan administrative expenses, or restore accounts previously forfeited.

Investment valuation and income recognition – The investments are reported at fair value. Fidelity certifies the fair market value of all investments. If available, quoted market prices are used to value investments.

Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. See Note 2 for discussion of fair value measurements.

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Net appreciation/depreciation includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought or sold as well as held during the year.

Notes receivable from participants – Notes receivable from participants (notes receivable) are measured at their unpaid principal balance plus any accrued but unpaid interest. Delinquent notes receivable are reclassified as distributions based upon the occurrence of a distributable event based upon the terms of the Plan document. No allowance for credit losses has been recorded as of December 31, 2022.

Payment of benefits – Benefits are recorded when paid.

Income taxes – The Plan adopted a volume submitter plan by Fidelity that received an opinion letter dated June 30, 2020, from the Internal Revenue Service (IRS). The Company believed that the Plan was operated in accordance with, and qualified under, the applicable requirements of the Code and related state statutes, and that the trust, which forms a part of the Plan, was exempt from federal income and state franchise taxes.

In accordance with guidance on accounting for uncertainty in income taxes, management evaluated the Plan's tax positions and does not believe the Plan has any uncertain tax positions that require disclosure or adjustment to the financial statements. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress.

Risks and uncertainties – Prior to December 28, 2023, the Plan provided for various investment options in any combination of investment securities offered by the Plan. Investment securities were exposed to various risks, such as interest rate, market fluctuations, and credit risks. Due to the risk associated with certain investment securities, it was at least reasonably possible that changes in market values, interest rates, or other factors in the near term could have materially affected participants' account balances and the amounts reported in the statement of net assets available for benefits.

Subsequent events – The Plan has evaluated subsequent events through September 24, 2024, which is the date the financial statements were available to be issued.

NOTE 2 – FAIR VALUE MEASUREMENTS

The fair value measurements standard establishes a framework for measuring fair value. That framework provides a hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (Level 1) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (Level 3). The three levels of the fair value hierarchy under the standard are described below:

Level 1 – Inputs to the valuation methodology are unadjusted quoted prices for identical assets or liabilities in active markets that the Plan has the ability to access.

Level 2 – Inputs to the valuation methodology include:

- Quoted market prices for similar assets or liabilities in active markets;
- Quoted prices for identical or similar assets or liabilities in inactive markets;

- Inputs other than quoted prices that are observable for the asset or liability; and
- Inputs that are derived principally from or corroborated by observable market data by correlation or other means.

If the asset or liability has a specified (contractual) term, the Level 2 input must be observable for substantially the full term of the asset or liability.

Level 3 – Inputs to the valuation methodology are unobservable and significant to the fair value measurement.

The asset's or liability's fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques used need to maximize the use of observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs.

Following is a description of the valuation techniques used for assets measured at fair value. There have been no changes in the techniques used at December 31, 2022.

Mutual funds and money market fund: Valued at the daily closing price as reported by the fund. The mutual funds and money market fund held by the Plan are open-end funds that are registered with the U.S. Securities and Exchange Commission. These funds are required to publish their daily net asset value and to transact at that price. The funds held by the Plan are deemed to be actively traded.

BrokerageLink accounts: Primarily consist of mutual funds and common stocks that are valued on the basis of readily determinable market prices.

The methods described above may produce a fair value calculation that may not be indicative of net realizable value or reflective of future fair values. Furthermore, while the Plan believes its valuation methods are appropriate and consistent with other market participants, the use of different methodologies or assumptions to determine the fair value of certain financial instruments could result in a different fair value measurement at December 31, 2022.

NOTE 3 – RELATED-PARTY TRANSACTIONS

Certain Plan investments are managed by Fidelity, the trustee of the Plan. Any purchases and sales of these investments are performed in the open market at fair value. Such transactions, while considered party-in-interest transactions under ERISA regulations, are permitted under the provisions of the Plan and are specifically exempt from the prohibition of party-in-interest transactions under ERISA.

The Plan receives revenue credits from some investments. Such amounts may be applied to pay Plan administrative expenses or allocated to the accounts of the participants.

NOTE 4 – PARTICIPATION AND BENEFITS PRIOR TO PLAN TERMINATION

Eligibility – Employees of the Company were immediately eligible to participate in the Plan. Part-time (scheduled to work less than 20 hours a week) and temporary employees were eligible to participate in the Plan after completing one year of service in which at least 1,000 hours were worked.

Participant contributions – Participants could elect to have the Company contribute their eligible pre-tax or after-tax compensation (as Roth contributions) to the Plan up to the amount allowable under the Plan document and current income tax regulations. The Plan also permitted the automatic enrollment of eligible employees in the Plan with a contribution of 3% of eligible compensation, unless the employee affirmatively elected otherwise. Participants who have the Company contribute a portion of their compensation to the Plan agreed to accept an equivalent reduction in taxable or taxed compensation. Contributions withheld were invested in accordance with the participant's direction.

Participants were also allowed to make rollover contributions of amounts received from other tax-qualified employer-sponsored retirement plans. Such contributions were deposited in the appropriate investment funds in accordance with the participant's direction and the Plan's provisions.

Employer contributions – The Company was allowed to make discretionary matching contributions to the Plan as defined in the Plan and as approved by the Board of Directors. For the period of January 1, 2022, through August 28, 2022, the Company matched 100% of every \$1.00 contributed by a participant for the first 3% of eligible pre-tax and Roth contributions and 50% of every \$1.00 contributed by a participant for the next 3% of eligible pre-tax and Roth contributions for the period. There were no employer matching contributions for 2023 and for the period August 29, 2022 through December 31, 2022.

The Company was also allowed to make employer discretionary contributions as defined in the Plan and as approved by the Board of Directors. The Company made a discretionary contribution to the Plan in the amount of approximately \$441,000 in 2023. There were no discretionary employer contributions for 2022.

Vesting – Participants were immediately vested in their entire account, including employer contributions.

Participant accounts – Each participant's account was credited with the participant's contribution, Plan earnings or losses, and an allocation of the Company's contribution. Allocation of the Company's contribution was based on eligible participant contributions and/or eligible employee compensation, as defined in the Plan.

Payment of benefits – Upon retirement, death, or termination, the participants or beneficiaries could elect to leave their account balance in the Plan or receive their total benefits in a lump sum amount, as defined in the Plan. For participant account balances that did not exceed \$5,000, but was more than \$1,000, the Plan provided for an automatic rollover of the account balance to an individual retirement account, unless the participant elected a direct rollover to an eligible retirement plan or elected to receive a taxable distribution. The Plan allowed for the automatic lump sum distribution of participant account balances that did not exceed \$1,000.

Notes receivable from participants – The Plan allowed participants to borrow up to the lesser of \$50,000 or 50% of their account balance. The notes receivable were secured by the participant's balance. Such notes receivable bore interest at the available market financing rates and were required to be repaid to the Plan within a five-year period, unless the proceeds were used for the purchase of a principal residence in which case the maximum repayment period could have been longer. The specific terms and conditions of such notes receivable were established by the Committee. Outstanding notes receivable at December 31, 2022, carried interest rates ranging from 3.5% to 6.5% with various maturities through May 2036.

NOTE 5 – CERTIFIED INFORMATION

The Plan administrator has elected the method of compliance permitted by 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. Accordingly, Fidelity has certified to the completeness and accuracy of:

- Investments and notes receivable reflected on the accompanying statements of net assets available for benefits as of December 28, 2023, and December 31, 2022.
- Net realized and unrealized appreciation/depreciation in fair value of investments, dividends and interest, and interest income from notes receivable reflected on the accompanying statements of changes in net assets available for benefits for the period January 1, 2023 through December 28, 2023 and for the year ended December 31, 2022.
