Scope and Nature of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) Audit

We have performed audits of the financial statements of RTG Medical 401(k) Plan (the Plan), an employee benefit plan subject to the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA), as permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) (ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit). The financial statements comprise the statements of net assets available for benefits as of December 31, 2023 and 2022, the related statements of changes in net assets available for benefits for the years then ended, and the related notes to the financial statements.

1. Plan Description

The following brief description of the RTG Medical 401(k) Plan (the Plan) is provided for general informational purposes only. Participants should refer to the Plan agreement for a more complete description of the Plan's provisions.

General

The Plan is a defined contribution plan subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA). The Plan was established to provide retirement benefits for the employees of ReadyTech-Go, Inc. and its wholly-owned subsidiary, ReadyTech-Go Radiology, LLC (the Company).

Employees are eligible to make pre-tax and designated after-tax Roth salary deferral contributions and receive Company safe harbor matching and discretionary profit sharing contributions after attaining age 21. Eligible employees may become participants on the first day of the month following the date on which entry requirements are fulfilled. Participants are eligible to receive safe harbor matching contributions when they become eligible to participate in the Plan. Participants are also eligible for profit sharing contributions made at the discretion of the Company.

Effective August 2024, the Company was acquired by Triage, LLC. Plan management is still in the process of evaluating any implications to the Plan and has made no decisions regarding potential Plan termination or merger. As of September 26, 2024 eligible participants are still allowed to participate in the Plan.

Contributions

Each year, participants may contribute up to 80% of pre-tax annual compensation in connection with the 401(k) provisions of the Plan, up to the maximum dollar limits allowable by law. The Plan allows participants to designate a portion or all of their elective contributions as after-tax Roth contributions. Participants may also contribute amounts representing distributions from other qualified plans. The Plan is a "Safe Harbor 401(k) Plan" whereby the Company is required to make safe harbor matching contributions equal to 100% of each participant's elective deferral, up to 3% of eligible compensation, plus 50% of the next 2% of eligible compensation. The Company may make discretionary profit sharing contributions (none in 2023 and 2022). Participants who are eligible to make deferral contributions and who will attain age 50 before the close of the calendar year are eligible to make eligible catch-up contributions. Contributions are subject to certain limitations.

Participant Accounts

Each participant's account is credited with the participant's contributions and an allocation of, a) the Company's safe harbor matching contributions, b) the Company's discretionary profit sharing contributions and c) Plan earnings and losses. The Company's safe harbor matching contributions are allocated among participants based upon each participant's elected salary deferral. The Company's discretionary profit sharing contributions are allocated among participants based upon eligible compensation of participants. Plan earnings or losses are allocated on the basis of actual results of the investments directed by each participant. Investments are maintained in individual member accounts managed by Reliance Trust Company (Reliance).

Vesting

Participants are immediately vested in their contributions, Company safe harbor matching contributions, and actual earnings thereon. Vesting in the Company's discretionary profit sharing contributions is based on years of continuous service. Participants are 34% vested after one year of credited service, 67% vested after two years of credited service, and 100% after three years of credited service.

Notes Receivable from Participants

Participants may borrow from their fund accounts a minimum of \$1,000 up to a maximum equal to the lesser of \$50,000 or 50% of their vested account balance. The notes are made on a nondiscriminatory basis and are secured by the participant's account. Interest rates are established at current market rates at the time of issuance. Principal and interest are paid ratably through payroll deductions.

Payment of Benefits

Upon retirement, termination, disability, or death, the participant or beneficiary may elect to receive either lump sum, partial, or installment payments equal to the value of the vested funds allocated to the participant's account. If a participant's balance is less than \$5,000 (\$7,000, effective January 1, 2024), the participant may only receive a lump sum payment. Distribution payments between \$1,000 and \$5,000 (\$7,000, effective January 1, 2024) are directly rolled over to an individual retirement account designated by the plan administrator in the event the participant does not elect otherwise. Distributions under \$1,000 will be paid out to the participant in the event the participant does not elect a payout option. The Plan also allows in-service distributions from fully vested accounts for participants who have reached age 59 ½. The Plan also allows for hardship distributions as defined by the Plan. Benefits are recorded when paid.

Forfeitures

Upon a participant's termination of employment before normal retirement, disability, or death, the portion of the Company's discretionary profit sharing contributions not then vested shall be forfeited. The forfeited portion of any participant's account can be used to pay Plan expenses and reduce Company contributions. As of December 31, 2023 and 2022, forfeited non-vested accounts totaled \$4,336 and \$3,643, respectively. For the years ended December 31, 2023 and 2022, no forfeitures were used to pay Plan expenses or reduce Company contributions.

2. Summary of Significant Accounting Policies

A summary of the significant accounting policies consistently applied in the preparation of the accompanying financial statements is set forth below.

Basis of Presentation

The accompanying financial statements have been prepared on the accrual basis and in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America (U.S. GAAP).

Presentation of Participant-Directed Funds

The Plan's presentation of participant-directed investments is in accordance with the Financial Accounting Standards Board (FASB) Accounting Standards Codification (ASC) 962, *Plan Accounting – Defined Contribution Pension Plans*.

Use of Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America requires the plan administrator to make estimates and assumptions that affect certain reported amounts and disclosures. Accordingly, actual results may differ from those estimates.

Investment Valuation and Income Recognition

Investments are reported at fair value. Fair value is the price that would be received to buy or sell an investment in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. The Company determines the Plan's valuation policies utilizing information provided by the investment advisors and the custodian. See Note 4 for further discussion on fair value measurements.

Purchases and sales of investments are recorded on a trade-date basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Net appreciation (depreciation) includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold as well as held during the year.

Notes Receivable from Participants

Notes receivable from participants are measured at their unpaid principal balance plus any accrued but unpaid interest. Delinquent notes are reclassified as distributions based upon terms of the Plan document.

Risks and Uncertainties

The Plan invests in various investment securities. Investment securities are exposed to various risks such as interest rate, market and credit risks. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the values of investment securities will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect participants' account balances and the amounts reported in the statements of net assets available for benefits.

Other

Certain administrative expenses are paid by the Plan and recorded in administrative expenses. Other certain expenses specifically incurred by or attributable to individual participants are paid from the applicable participant's account. Investment related expenses are included in net appreciation (depreciation) in fair value of investments. Audit fees are paid by the Company and are excluded from these financial statements.

Subsequent Events

Subsequent events are events or transactions that occur after the statement of net assets available for benefits date, but before the financial statements are available to be issued and may require potential recognition or disclosure in the financial statements. Management has considered such events or transactions through September 26, 2024. See the *General* and *Payment of Benefits* sections in Note 1 for descriptions of subsequent events.

3. Information Certified by Reliance

The plan administrator has elected the method of compliance as permitted by 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor's (DOL) Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. Accordingly, as permitted under such election, the plan administrator instructed the Plan's independent auditors not to perform any auditing procedures with respect to the following information certified by Reliance, the trustee of the Plan, except for comparing such information certified by the trustee to information included in the Plan's financial statements and supplementary information.

4. Fair Value Measurements

FASB ASC 820, *Fair Value Measurements and Disclosures*, provides a framework for measuring fair value. That framework provides a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (Level 1 measurements) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (Level 3 measurements).

The three levels of the fair value hierarchy are described below:

- Level 1: Inputs to the valuation methodology are unadjusted quoted prices for identical assets or liabilities in active markets that the Plan has the ability to access.
- Level 2: Inputs to the valuation methodology include:
- Quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities in active markets;
 - Quoted prices for identical or similar assets or liabilities in inactive markets;
 - Inputs other than quoted prices that are observable for the asset or liability;
 - Inputs that are derived principally from or corroborated by observable market data by correlation or other means.

If the asset or liability has a specified (contractual) term, the Level 2 input must be observable for substantially the full term of the asset or liability.

Level 3: Inputs to the valuation methodology are unobservable and significant to the fair value measurement.

The asset’s or liability’s fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques need to maximize the use of observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs.

The following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for assets measured at fair value. There have been no changes in the methodologies used as of December 31, 2023 and 2022.

Mutual Funds: Valued at the daily closing price as reported by the funds. Funds held by the Plan are open-end funds that are registered with the Securities and Exchange Commission. These funds are required to publish their daily net asset value (NAV) and to transact at that price. The funds held by the Plan are deemed to be actively traded.

The methods described above may produce a fair value calculation that may not be indicative of net realizable value or reflective of future fair values. Furthermore, while the Plan believes its valuation method is appropriate and consistent with other market participants, the use of different methodologies or assumptions to determine the fair value of certain financial instruments could result in a different fair value measurement at the reporting date.

5. Tax Status

The Plan is qualified as a profit-sharing plan under Section 401(a) of the Internal Revenue Code and is exempt from federal income taxation under Section 501(a) of the Internal Revenue Code.

The plan administrator believes that the Plan is currently designed and being operated in compliance with the applicable requirements of the Internal Revenue Code. Therefore, no provision for income taxes has been included in the financial statements.

Accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America require plan management to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan and recognize a tax liability (or asset) if the Plan has taken an uncertain position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by the applicable taxing authority. The plan administrator has analyzed the tax positions taken by the Plan and has concluded that there are no uncertain positions taken or expected to be taken that would require recognition of a liability (or asset) or disclosure in the financial statements. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress. The Plan administrator believes it is no longer subject to income tax examinations for years prior to 2020.

6. Plan Termination

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the Company has the right under the Plan to discontinue its contributions at any time and to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions of ERISA. In the event of Plan termination, participants will become 100% vested. Distributions to participants of the account balances would be made as soon as practicable after the termination date.
