Scope and Nature of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) Audit

We have performed audits of the financial statements of The NAB Money Purchase Pension Plan and Trust, an employee benefit plan subject to the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA), as permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) (ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit). The financial statements comprise the statements of net assets available for benefits as of December 31, 2023 and 2022, and the related statement of changes in net assets available for benefits for the year ended December 31, 2023, and the related notes to the financial statements.

Opinion

Management is responsible for the preparation and fair presentation of the financial statements in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America, and for the design, implementation, and maintenance of internal control relevant to the preparation and fair presentation of financial statements that are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error. Management's election of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit does not affect management's responsibility for the financial statements.

For information included in the supplemental schedule that agreed to or is derived from the certified investment information, we compared such information to the related certified investment information.

Note 1 Description of the Plan

The following brief description of The NAB Money Purchase Pension Plan and Trust (the “Plan”) provides general information only. Participants should refer to the Plan Document for a more complete description of the Plan’s provisions.

General

The Plan is a single-employer defined contribution plan covering all eligible employees of National Australia Bank Limited, New York (the “Plan Sponsor” or “Company”). The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974, as amended (ERISA).

The Company intends to continue the Plan indefinitely, though it reserves the right to discontinue it at any time (See Note 5). Assets of the Plan are held by Newport Trust Company (the “Trustee” or “Newport”), the Plan Trustee and Custodian, and Matrix was the sub-custodian. During 2023, Ascensus Trust Company (“Ascensus”) became the sub-custodian.

Eligibility and Participation

All employees who are actively employed on and after July 1, 2003, are age 21 or older, and have completed 1,000 hours of employment within a twelve-month period are eligible to participate in the Plan. If the employee was employed before July 1, 2003, but was not yet a participant in the Plan, the employee may become a participant in the Plan based on special rules applying to those employees.

Contributions

For active participants in the Plan, the Plan Sponsor will contribute a fixed amount, the greater of 5% of each participant’s compensation or an alternate percentage defined in the Plan Document. For the 2023 plan year, the Company contributed a total of \$1,258,636.

Participant Accounts

Each participant’s account is credited with the allocation of (a) the Plan Sponsor’s contributions, as applicable, and (b) Plan earnings. Participant accounts are charged with an allocation of certain administrative expenses that are paid by the Plan. Allocations are based on participant earnings, account balances, or specific participant transactions as defined. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant’s vested account.

Vesting

Participants become fully vested in the Plan after completion of three years of services, as follows:

<u>Years of Service</u>	<u>Vested Percentage</u>
Less than 2	0%
2 but less than 3	50%
3 or more	100%

Participants become immediately vested upon death, disability, or reaching the normal retirement age of 65.

Note 1 Description of the Plan (continued)

Payment of Benefits

Upon termination of service due to separation, death, disability or retirement, a participant or their beneficiary can elect to receive an amount equal to the value of the participant's vested account balance. In accordance with the terms of the Plan, a participant or beneficiary can elect to receive benefit payments as an annuity, lump-sum payment, partial payments, or installments, subject to tax liability, or the benefit payments can be a rollover into another qualified plan.

Forfeited Accounts

Forfeited balances of terminated participants' non-vested accounts may be used to reduce employer contributions to the Plan or to pay Plan expenses. Forfeitures in the amount of \$319 were used to reduce the Company's contributions made in 2024 for the 2023 plan year. Forfeitures in the amount of \$20,099 were used to reduce the Company's contributions made in 2023 for the 2022 plan year. Forfeiture balances as of December 31, 2023 and 2022 amounted to \$4,489 and \$13,460, respectively.

Investment Elections

The Company's contributions are allocated to the various investment options offered by the Plan as the participant directs. Allocations are made in 1% increments. Investment elections made by the participant are effective until another such election is received. Participants may change investment elections on any day. If participants do not have investment elections on file, contributions are defaulted to the Morley Stable Value Fund.

Plan Expenses

Expenses incurred in the operation and audit of the Plan are paid by the Plan Sponsor and are not included in the financial statements. Results of funds in which the Plan invests are presented net of internal fees charged by the fund managers.

Note 2 Summary of Significant Accounting Policies

Basis of Accounting

The accompanying financial statements have been prepared using the accrual basis of accounting in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America ("GAAP").

Use of Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with GAAP requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities and changes therein and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

Note 2 Summary of Significant Accounting Policies (continued)

Investment Valuation and Income Recognition

The Plan's investments are reported at fair value. Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. See Note 4 for discussion of fair value measurement.

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Dividends are recorded on ex-dividend date. Net appreciation includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold as well as held during the year.

Payment of Benefits

Benefit payments to participants are recorded when paid.

Note 3 Information Prepared and Certified by the Plan's Trustee

Newport is the Trustee and custodian of the Plan's assets. The Trustee executes the Plan's transactions and provides other administrative services. The cost of such services as well as other administrative and audit costs are absorbed by the Plan Sponsor.

In accordance with the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations, as of December 31, 2023 and for the period June 26, 2023 through December 31, 2023, Ascensus, LLC, as an authorized representative of Ascensus Trust Company and Newport, certifies that its investment information is complete and accurate. As of December 31, 2022, and for the period January 1, 2023 through June 25, 2023, Newport certifies that the investment information is complete and accurate.

The following information included in the accompanying financial statements and ERISA-required supplemental schedule was obtained from data that has been prepared and certified as complete and accurate by the trustees.

Note 4 Fair Value Measurement

The framework for measuring fair value provides a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (Level 1) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (Level 3). The three levels of the fair value hierarchy under Financial Accounting Standards Board's Accounting Standards Codification ("ASC") 820 are described as follows:

Level 1 – Inputs to the valuation methodology are unadjusted quoted prices for identical assets or liabilities in active markets that the Plan has the ability to access.

Level 2 – Inputs to the valuation methodology include:

- quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities in active markets;
- quoted prices for identical or similar assets or liabilities in inactive markets;
- inputs other than quoted prices that are observable for the asset or liability;
- inputs that are derived principally from or corroborated by observable market data by correlation or other means.

If the asset or liability has a specified (contractual) term, the Level 2 input must be observable for substantially the full term of the asset or liability.

Level 3 – Inputs to the valuation methodology are unobservable and significant to the fair value measurement.

The asset or liability's fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques maximize the use of relevant observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs.

The following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for assets measured at fair value:

Mutual funds: Valued at the daily closing price as reported by the funds. These funds held by the Plan are open-end mutual funds that are registered with the U.S. Securities and Exchange Commission. These funds are required to publish their daily net asset value (NAV) and to transact at that price. The mutual funds held by the Plan are deemed to be actively traded.

Common collective trusts (CCT): Valued using the NAV practical expedient of the CCT as reported by the CCT managers. The NAV practical expedient is based on the fair value of the underlying assets owned by the CCT, minus its liabilities, and then divided by the number of units outstanding. The NAV practical expedient of a CCT is calculated based on a compilation of primarily observable market information.

Note 4 Fair Value Measurement (continued)

There have been no changes in the methodologies used at December 31, 2023 and 2022. The preceding methods described may produce a fair value calculation that may not be indicative of net realizable value or reflective of future fair values. Furthermore, although the Plan believes its valuation methods are appropriate and consistent with other market participants, the use of different methodologies or assumptions to determine the fair value of certain financial instruments could result in a different fair value measurement at the reporting date.

Note 5 Plan Termination

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the Plan Sponsor has the right under the Plan to discontinue its contributions at any time and to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions of ERISA. In the event of Plan termination, participants will become fully vested in their account balances and the net assets of the Plan will be allocated as prescribed by ERISA and regulations pursuant thereto.

Note 6 Related Party Transactions and Party-In-Interest Transactions

Newport performs recordkeeping and investment advisory services for the Plan. The Plan's sub-custodians are Ascensus (2023) and Matrix (2022), As such, these parties qualify as parties-in-interest.

There is a revenue sharing arrangement with a custodial broker dealer who remits back a portion of the revenue received from its handling of the Plan accounts. This revenue includes 12b-1 fees, shareholder servicing fees, sub-transfer agent fees, and similar items. These fees are typically paid by the mutual fund in which Plan assets are invested to the custodial broker dealer for its services. For the year ended December 31, 2023, a portion of other income totaling \$418 represented excess revenue sharing. This amount is segregated into a separate account until distributed by the Plan. The funds can be used to pay future Plan expenses and any leftover funds can be allocated to participants at year end as earnings (pro rata to all eligible participants with a balance). The Plan will use the amount to offset Plan expenses.

Note 7 Tax Status

The Plan is an adoption of the Newport Group Inc Non-Standardized Pre-Approved Profit Sharing/Money Purchase/CODA (Cash or Deferred Arrangement) for which the Internal Revenue Service (IRS) has determined and informed Newport Group Inc by an opinion letter dated June 30, 2020, that the Plan and related trust are designed in accordance with applicable sections of the Internal Revenue Code (IRC). Although the Plan has been amended since receiving the opinion letter, the Plan Administrator and the Plan's tax counsel believe that the Plan is designed and is currently being operated in compliance with the applicable requirements of the IRC, and, therefore, believe that the Plan is qualified, and the related trust is tax exempt.

GAAP requires Plan management to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan and recognize a tax liability if the Plan has taken an uncertain position that more likely than not would be sustained upon examination by the IRS. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress.

Note 8 Risks and Uncertainties

The Plan invests in various investment securities. Investment securities are exposed to various risks such as interest rate, market, and credit risks. Market risks include global events which could impact the value of investment securities. Due to the level of the risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the values of investment securities will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect the participants' account balances and the amounts reported in the statements of net assets available for benefits.

The Plan's exposure to a concentration of credit risk is limited by the diversification of investments across all participant-directed fund elections. Additionally, the investments within each participant-directed fund election are further diversified into varied financial instruments, depending solely upon participant investment mix elections.

Misstatements are considered material if, there is a substantial likelihood that, individually or in the aggregate, they would influence the judgment made by a reasonable user based on the financial statements.

Our audits did not extend to the certified investment information, except for obtaining and reading the certifications, comparing the certified investment information with the related information presented and disclosed in the financial statements, and reading the disclosures relating to the certified investment information to assess whether they are in accordance with the presentation and disclosure requirements of accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.

Accordingly, the objective of an ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit is not to express an opinion about whether the financial statements as a whole are presented fairly, in all material respects, in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.

We are required to communicate with those charged with governance regarding, among other matters, the planned scope and timing of the audit, significant audit findings, and certain internal control-related matters that we identified during the audits.

Other Matters – Supplemental Schedule Required by ERISA

The supplemental Schedule H, Line 4(i) – Schedule of Assets (Held at End of Year) as of December 31, 2023 is presented for purposes of additional analysis and is not a required part of the financial statements but is supplementary information required by the Department of Labor’s Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. Such information is the responsibility of management and was derived from and relates directly to the underlying accounting and other records used to prepare the financial statements. The information included in the supplemental schedule, other than that agreed to or derived from the certified investment information, has been subjected to auditing procedures applied in the audits of the financial statements and certain additional procedures, including comparing and reconciling such information directly to the underlying accounting and other records used to prepare the financial statements or to the financial statements themselves, and other additional procedures in accordance with GAAS. For information included in the supplemental schedule that agreed to or is derived from the certified investment information, we compared such information to the related certified investment information.

In forming our opinion on the supplemental schedule, we evaluated whether the supplemental schedule, other than the information agreed to or derived from the certified investment information, including their form and content, is presented in conformity with the Department of Labor’s Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA.

Note 1 Description of the Plan

The following brief description of The NAB Money Purchase Pension Plan and Trust (the “Plan”) provides general information only. Participants should refer to the Plan Document for a more complete description of the Plan’s provisions.

General

The Plan is a single-employer defined contribution plan covering all eligible employees of National Australia Bank Limited, New York (the “Plan Sponsor” or “Company”). The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974, as amended (ERISA).

The Company intends to continue the Plan indefinitely, though it reserves the right to discontinue it at any time (See Note 5). Assets of the Plan are held by Newport Trust Company (the “Trustee” or “Newport”), the Plan Trustee and Custodian, and Matrix was the sub-custodian. During 2023, Ascensus Trust Company (“Ascensus”) became the sub-custodian.

Eligibility and Participation

All employees who are actively employed on and after July 1, 2003, are age 21 or older, and have completed 1,000 hours of employment within a twelve-month period are eligible to participate in the Plan. If the employee was employed before July 1, 2003, but was not yet a participant in the Plan, the employee may become a participant in the Plan based on special rules applying to those employees.

Contributions

For active participants in the Plan, the Plan Sponsor will contribute a fixed amount, the greater of 5% of each participant’s compensation or an alternate percentage defined in the Plan Document. For the 2023 plan year, the Company contributed a total of \$1,258,636.

Participant Accounts

Each participant’s account is credited with the allocation of (a) the Plan Sponsor’s contributions, as applicable, and (b) Plan earnings. Participant accounts are charged with an allocation of certain administrative expenses that are paid by the Plan. Allocations are based on participant earnings, account balances, or specific participant transactions as defined. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant’s vested account.

Vesting

Participants become fully vested in the Plan after completion of three years of services, as follows:

<u>Years of Service</u>	<u>Vested Percentage</u>
Less than 2	0%
2 but less than 3	50%
3 or more	100%

Participants become immediately vested upon death, disability, or reaching the normal retirement age of 65.

Note 1 Description of the Plan (continued)

Payment of Benefits

Upon termination of service due to separation, death, disability or retirement, a participant or their beneficiary can elect to receive an amount equal to the value of the participant's vested account balance. In accordance with the terms of the Plan, a participant or beneficiary can elect to receive benefit payments as an annuity, lump-sum payment, partial payments, or installments, subject to tax liability, or the benefit payments can be a rollover into another qualified plan.

Forfeited Accounts

Forfeited balances of terminated participants' non-vested accounts may be used to reduce employer contributions to the Plan or to pay Plan expenses. Forfeitures in the amount of \$319 were used to reduce the Company's contributions made in 2024 for the 2023 plan year. Forfeitures in the amount of \$20,099 were used to reduce the Company's contributions made in 2023 for the 2022 plan year. Forfeiture balances as of December 31, 2023 and 2022 amounted to \$4,489 and \$13,460, respectively.

Investment Elections

The Company's contributions are allocated to the various investment options offered by the Plan as the participant directs. Allocations are made in 1% increments. Investment elections made by the participant are effective until another such election is received. Participants may change investment elections on any day. If participants do not have investment elections on file, contributions are defaulted to the Morley Stable Value Fund.

Plan Expenses

Expenses incurred in the operation and audit of the Plan are paid by the Plan Sponsor and are not included in the financial statements. Results of funds in which the Plan invests are presented net of internal fees charged by the fund managers.

Note 2 Summary of Significant Accounting Policies

Basis of Accounting

The accompanying financial statements have been prepared using the accrual basis of accounting in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America ("GAAP").

Use of Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with GAAP requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities and changes therein and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

Note 2 Summary of Significant Accounting Policies (continued)

Investment Valuation and Income Recognition

The Plan's investments are reported at fair value. Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. See Note 4 for discussion of fair value measurement.

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Dividends are recorded on ex-dividend date. Net appreciation includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold as well as held during the year.

Payment of Benefits

Benefit payments to participants are recorded when paid.

Note 3 Information Prepared and Certified by the Plan's Trustee

Newport is the Trustee and custodian of the Plan's assets. The Trustee executes the Plan's transactions and provides other administrative services. The cost of such services as well as other administrative and audit costs are absorbed by the Plan Sponsor.

In accordance with the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations, as of December 31, 2023 and for the period June 26, 2023 through December 31, 2023, Ascensus, LLC, as an authorized representative of Ascensus Trust Company and Newport, certifies that its investment information is complete and accurate. As of December 31, 2022, and for the period January 1, 2023 through June 25, 2023, Newport certifies that the investment information is complete and accurate.

The following information included in the accompanying financial statements and ERISA-required supplemental schedule was obtained from data that has been prepared and certified as complete and accurate by the trustees.

Note 4 Fair Value Measurement

The framework for measuring fair value provides a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (Level 1) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (Level 3). The three levels of the fair value hierarchy under Financial Accounting Standards Board's Accounting Standards Codification ("ASC") 820 are described as follows:

Level 1 – Inputs to the valuation methodology are unadjusted quoted prices for identical assets or liabilities in active markets that the Plan has the ability to access.

Level 2 – Inputs to the valuation methodology include:

- quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities in active markets;
- quoted prices for identical or similar assets or liabilities in inactive markets;
- inputs other than quoted prices that are observable for the asset or liability;
- inputs that are derived principally from or corroborated by observable market data by correlation or other means.

If the asset or liability has a specified (contractual) term, the Level 2 input must be observable for substantially the full term of the asset or liability.

Level 3 – Inputs to the valuation methodology are unobservable and significant to the fair value measurement.

The asset or liability's fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques maximize the use of relevant observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs.

The following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for assets measured at fair value:

Mutual funds: Valued at the daily closing price as reported by the funds. These funds held by the Plan are open-end mutual funds that are registered with the U.S. Securities and Exchange Commission. These funds are required to publish their daily net asset value (NAV) and to transact at that price. The mutual funds held by the Plan are deemed to be actively traded.

Common collective trusts (CCT): Valued using the NAV practical expedient of the CCT as reported by the CCT managers. The NAV practical expedient is based on the fair value of the underlying assets owned by the CCT, minus its liabilities, and then divided by the number of units outstanding. The NAV practical expedient of a CCT is calculated based on a compilation of primarily observable market information.

Note 4 Fair Value Measurement (continued)

There have been no changes in the methodologies used at December 31, 2023 and 2022. The preceding methods described may produce a fair value calculation that may not be indicative of net realizable value or reflective of future fair values. Furthermore, although the Plan believes its valuation methods are appropriate and consistent with other market participants, the use of different methodologies or assumptions to determine the fair value of certain financial instruments could result in a different fair value measurement at the reporting date.

Note 5 Plan Termination

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the Plan Sponsor has the right under the Plan to discontinue its contributions at any time and to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions of ERISA. In the event of Plan termination, participants will become fully vested in their account balances and the net assets of the Plan will be allocated as prescribed by ERISA and regulations pursuant thereto.

Note 6 Related Party Transactions and Party-In-Interest Transactions

Newport performs recordkeeping and investment advisory services for the Plan. The Plan's sub-custodians are Ascensus (2023) and Matrix (2022), As such, these parties qualify as parties-in-interest.

There is a revenue sharing arrangement with a custodial broker dealer who remits back a portion of the revenue received from its handling of the Plan accounts. This revenue includes 12b-1 fees, shareholder servicing fees, sub-transfer agent fees, and similar items. These fees are typically paid by the mutual fund in which Plan assets are invested to the custodial broker dealer for its services. For the year ended December 31, 2023, a portion of other income totaling \$418 represented excess revenue sharing. This amount is segregated into a separate account until distributed by the Plan. The funds can be used to pay future Plan expenses and any leftover funds can be allocated to participants at year end as earnings (pro rata to all eligible participants with a balance). The Plan will use the amount to offset Plan expenses.

Note 7 Tax Status

The Plan is an adoption of the Newport Group Inc Non-Standardized Pre-Approved Profit Sharing/Money Purchase/CODA (Cash or Deferred Arrangement) for which the Internal Revenue Service (IRS) has determined and informed Newport Group Inc by an opinion letter dated June 30, 2020, that the Plan and related trust are designed in accordance with applicable sections of the Internal Revenue Code (IRC). Although the Plan has been amended since receiving the opinion letter, the Plan Administrator and the Plan's tax counsel believe that the Plan is designed and is currently being operated in compliance with the applicable requirements of the IRC, and, therefore, believe that the Plan is qualified, and the related trust is tax exempt.

GAAP requires Plan management to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan and recognize a tax liability if the Plan has taken an uncertain position that more likely than not would be sustained upon examination by the IRS. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress.

Note 8 Risks and Uncertainties

The Plan invests in various investment securities. Investment securities are exposed to various risks such as interest rate, market, and credit risks. Market risks include global events which could impact the value of investment securities. Due to the level of the risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the values of investment securities will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect the participants' account balances and the amounts reported in the statements of net assets available for benefits.

The Plan's exposure to a concentration of credit risk is limited by the diversification of investments across all participant-directed fund elections. Additionally, the investments within each participant-directed fund election are further diversified into varied financial instruments, depending solely upon participant investment mix elections.
