Scope and Nature of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) Audit

We have performed audits of the financial statements of Milan Army Ammunition Plant Pension Plan, an employee benefit plan subject to the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA), as permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) (ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit). The financial statements comprise the statements of net assets available for benefits as of December 31, 2023 and 2022, and the related statements of changes in net assets available for benefits for the years then ended, and the related notes to the financial statements.

Management, having determined it is permissible in the circumstances, has elected to have the audits of Milan Army Ammunition Plant Pension Plan's financial statements performed in accordance with ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) pursuant to 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. As permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C), our audit need not extend to any statements or information related to assets held for investment of the plan (investment information) by a bank or similar institution or insurance carrier that is regulated, supervised, and subject to periodic examination by a state or federal agency, provided that the statements or information regarding assets so held are prepared and certified to by the bank or similar institution or insurance carrier in accordance with 29 CFR 2520.103-5 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA (qualified institution).

Management has obtained certifications from a qualified institution as of and for the years ended December 31, 2023 and 2022, stating that the certified investment information, as described in Note 4 to the financial statements, is complete and accurate.

Opinion

In our opinion, based on our audits and on the procedures performed as described in the Auditors' Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements section

- the amounts and disclosures in the accompanying financial statements, other than those agreed to or derived from the certified investment information, are presented fairly, in all material respects, in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.
- the information in the accompanying financial statements related to assets held by and certified to by a qualified institution agrees to, or is derived from, in all material respects, the information prepared and certified by an institution that management determined meets the requirements of ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C).

Basis for Opinion

We conducted our audits in accordance with auditing standards generally accepted in the United States of America (GAAS). Our responsibilities under those standards are further described in the Auditors' Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements section of our report. We are required to be independent of Milan Army Ammunition Plant Pension Plan and to meet our other ethical responsibilities, in accordance with the relevant ethical requirements relating to our audits. We believe that the audit evidence we have obtained is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for our ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit opinion.

Emphasis of Matter – Plan Merger

The accompanying financial statements have been prepared on a going concern basis. As discussed in Note 1 to the financial statements, the Benefits Committee of the Day & Zimmermann Group, Inc., the Plan's sponsor, voted in 2023 to merge the Plan into an existing plan controlled by the Plan sponsor, and effective December 31, 2023 transferred all of the assets to that plan, which indicates the Plan is not a going concern. Our opinion is not modified with respect to that matter.

Responsibilities of Management for the Financial Statements

Management is responsible for the preparation and fair presentation of the financial statements in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America, and for the design, implementation, and maintenance of internal control relevant to the preparation and fair presentation of financial statements that are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error. Management's election of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit does not affect management's responsibility for the financial statements.

Management is also responsible for maintaining a current plan instrument, including all plan amendments, administering the plan, and determining that the plan's transactions that are presented and disclosed in the financial statements are in conformity with the plan's provisions, including maintaining sufficient records with respect to each of the participants, to determine the benefits due or which may become due to such participants.

Auditors' Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements

Except as described in the Scope and Nature of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) Audit section of our report, our objectives are to obtain reasonable assurance about whether the financial statements as a whole are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error, and to issue an auditors' report that includes our opinion. Reasonable assurance is a high level of assurance but is not absolute assurance and therefore is not a guarantee that an audit conducted in accordance with GAAS will always detect a material misstatement when it exists. The risk of not detecting a material misstatement resulting from fraud is higher than for one resulting from error, as fraud may involve collusion, forgery, intentional omissions, misrepresentations, or the override of internal control. Misstatements are considered material if, there is a substantial likelihood that, individually or in the aggregate, they would influence the judgment made by a reasonable user based on the financial statements.

In performing an audit in accordance with GAAS, we:

- Exercise professional judgment and maintain professional skepticism throughout the audit.
- Identify and assess the risks of material misstatement of the financial statements, whether due to fraud or error, and design and perform audit procedures responsive to those risks. Such procedures include examining, on a test basis, evidence regarding the amounts and disclosures in the financial statements.

- Obtain an understanding of internal control relevant to the audit in order to design audit procedures that are appropriate in the circumstances, but not for the purpose of expressing an opinion on the effectiveness of Milan Army Ammunition Plant Pension Plan's internal control. Accordingly, no such opinion is expressed.

Our audits did not extend to the certified investment information, except for obtaining and reading the certification, comparing the certified investment information with the related information presented and disclosed in the financial statements, and reading the disclosures relating to the certified investment information to assess whether they are in accordance with the presentation and disclosure requirements of accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.

Accordingly, the objective of an ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit is not to express an opinion about whether the financial statements as a whole are presented fairly, in all material respects, in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.

We are required to communicate with those charged with governance regarding, among other matters, the planned scope and timing of the audit, significant audit findings, and certain internal control-related matters that we identified during the audit.

1. The Plan

The following description of the Milan Army Ammunition Plant Pension Plan (the "Plan") is provided for general information purposes only. Participants should refer to the Plan document for a more complete description of the Plan's provisions.

General – The Plan is a defined benefit pension plan established as of August 1, 1953, and covers substantially all employees employed prior to 1999. The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 ("ERISA") and is sponsored by American Ordnance, LLC (the "Plan Sponsor").

As of January 1, 1997, the Plan Sponsor adopted an amendment to the Plan ceasing employee contributions for all participants of the Plan; however, vesting continued normally.

As of November 1, 1999, (the "Freeze Date"), the Plan Sponsor adopted an amendment to the Plan ceasing all future benefit accruals for all participants of the Plan; however, vesting continued normally. Employees hired after November 1, 1999 are not eligible for participation in the Plan.

Plan Merger – Effective December 31, 2023, all assets of the Plan and two affiliated plans, Retirement Plan for Non-Bargaining Employees at IAAP, and the Retirement Income Plan for Employees of Mason & Hanger Corporation (the "component Plans") were transferred and merged into the Retirement Plan for Bargaining Employees at IAAP ("Bargaining Plan"). The surviving Bargaining Plan was renamed the Day and Zimmermann AO/MHG Merged Pension Plan ("surviving Plan"). Each component Plan merged into the surviving Plan will become a component of the surviving Plan. The provisions of each component Plan will continue to apply as written only to the "participants" and "beneficiaries," as defined by the Plan documents, of the applicable component plan as was in effect immediately prior to January 1, 2024.

Plan Administration – The Day & Zimmermann Group, Inc. is the Plan Administrator and is responsible for the general administration of the Plan.

Funding Policy – The Plan Sponsor's funding policy is to make annual contributions to the Plan in amounts required to meet the funding requirements of ERISA as determined by the Plan's actuary. No employer contributions were required for the years ended December 31, 2023 and 2022, and the Plan has met the minimum funding requirements of ERISA for the years ended December 31, 2023 and 2022. The Plan Sponsor made voluntary contributions of \$-0- for the years ended December 31, 2023 and 2022.

Participant contributions were required under the Plan until the amendment to close such contributions effective January 1, 1997. Accumulated employee contributions for active participants as of the valuation dates January 1, 2023 and 2022 were approximately \$24,000 and \$48,000, respectively, including interest credited at a rate determined annually by Aetna Life Insurance Company ("Aetna") under the terms and conditions of the immediate participation guarantee contract. Interest was credited to participant contribution accounts for the valuation periods ending January 1, 2023 and 2022, at 4.62% and 1.57%, respectively.

Pension Benefits – In general, each eligible participant will receive annual pension benefits at their normal retirement date based on a percentage of earnings for each year of participation in the Plan. This benefit percentage has been periodically increased by the Plan Sponsor through the November 1, 1999 Freeze Date, and the impact of these increases is reflected in the benefits accumulated in the year of change.

Participants may withdraw any employee contributions they have made to the Plan subject to limitations prescribed by the Plan document. Such lump-sum withdrawals will reduce the annual pension benefits paid to participants upon retirement.

Effective March 1 2022, the Plan was amended to provide a Temporary and Voluntary Pension Plan Lump-Sum Payment Program for eligible participants that allowed for a new immediate single lump-sum distribution and annuity option. Upon expiration of the program, such new optional forms of benefits shall cease to be available under the Plan.

Death and Disability Benefits – The spouse of an active or terminated member is eligible for an immediate pre-retirement spousal benefit if at the time of the member's death, the spouse was married to the member for at least 12 months; the active member met the eligible requirements for early retirement (age 55), or was over age 50 and completed 15 years of service; and the terminated members met the eligible requirements for early retirement (age 55) at termination.

The immediate pre-retirement spousal benefit is equal to 50% of the participants' accrued annuity reduced .50% for each year the spouse is more than five years younger than the participant, but no less than 40%. The designated beneficiary of a member who dies before retirement and who does not have a spouse eligible for a pre-retirement spousal benefit will receive a return of any member contributions with interest to date of death.

Vesting – Participants were immediately vested in their voluntary contributions plus actual earnings thereon. Vesting in the remainder of their pension benefit was based on years of continuous service. A participant was 100% vested after five years of credited service.

Reclassification – Certain reclassifications have been made to the prior year's comparative information to conform to the presentation of the current financial statements. The reclassifications have no effect on the change in the net assets for the prior year.

2. Summary of Significant Accounting Policies

Basis of Accounting – The accompanying financial statements of the Plan are prepared on the accrual basis of accounting.

Use of Estimates – The preparation of financial statements in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets, liabilities, and changes therein; and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities; and the actuarial present value of accumulated Plan benefits at the date of the financial statements, and changes therein. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

Risks and Uncertainties – The Plan invests in various investment securities. Investment securities are exposed to various risks, such as interest rate, market and credit risks. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the value of investment securities will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect the amounts reported in the statements of net assets available for benefits. Prior to the merger effective December 31, 2023 and as of December 31, 2022, approximately 99% of the Plan's assets were held in a single immediate participation guarantee contract issued by Aetna Life Insurance Company ("Aetna").

Plan contributions are made and the actuarial present value of accumulated Plan benefits are reported based on certain assumptions pertaining to interest rates, inflation rates and employee demographics, all of which are subject to change. Due to uncertainties inherent in the estimates and assumptions process, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in these estimates and assumptions in the near term would be material to the financial statements.

Investment Valuation and Income Recognition – Investments are reported at fair value. Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. Plan management determines the Plan's valuation policies utilizing information provided by its investment advisors, custodians, and insurance company. See Note 5 for a discussion of fair value measurements.

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Net appreciation (depreciation) includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold, as well as held during the year.

Payment of Benefits – Benefit payments to participants are recorded upon distribution.

Administrative Expenses – The Plan's expenses are paid either by the Plan or the Plan Sponsor, as provided by the Plan document. Expenses that are paid directly by the Plan Sponsor and not reimbursed by the Plan are excluded from these financial statements. Certain expenses incurred in connection with the general administration of the Plan that are paid by the Plan are recorded as deductions in the accompanying statements of changes in net assets available for benefits. In addition, certain investment related expenses are included in net appreciation (depreciation) in fair value of investments presented in the accompanying statements of changes in net assets available for benefits.

3. Actuarial Present Value of Accumulated Benefits

Accumulated Plan benefits are those future periodic payments, including lump-sum distributions that are attributable under the Plan's provisions to the service employees have rendered through the Freeze Date. Accumulated Plan benefits include benefits expected to be paid to: a) retired or terminated employees or their beneficiaries; b) beneficiaries of employees who have died; and c) present employees or their beneficiaries. Benefits under the Plan are accumulated based on employees' compensation during each year of credited service prior to the Freeze Date. The accumulated Plan benefits for active employees will equal the accumulation with interest, prior to the Freeze Date, of the annual benefit accruals as of the benefit information date. Benefits payable under all circumstances – retirement, death, disability, and termination of employment – are included, to the extent they are deemed attributable to employee service rendered prior to the Freeze Date and as of the valuation date. Benefits to be provided via annuity contracts excluded from Plan assets are excluded from accumulated Plan benefits.

The actuarial present value of accumulated Plan benefits at January 1, 2023, is determined by an independent actuary and results from applying actuarial assumptions to adjust the accumulated Plan benefits to reflect the time value of money (through discounts for interest) and the probability of payment (by means of decrements such as for death, disability, withdrawals, or retirement) between the valuation date and the expected date of payment.

The significant changes in actuarial assumptions since the prior year valuation were; the expected return on assets changed from 4.25% to 4.50%; the discount rate was changed from 2.70% to 5.46%; interest on employee contributions was changed from 1.50% to 3.00%. In addition, the contingent mortality tables were used for current and future beneficiaries, to better reflect expected experience.

The foregoing actuarial assumptions are based on the presumption that the Plan will continue. If the Plan were to terminate, different actuarial assumptions and other factors might be applicable in determining the actuarial value of accumulated Plan benefits. In order to provide information on a more timely basis, the above information is presented on a beginning-of-year basis as allowed by Accounting Standards Codification ("ASC") 960, *Accounting and Reporting by Defined Benefit Pension Plans*. Had the valuations been performed as of an end-of-year basis, there would be no material differences even as the Plan has transferred (see Note 1) but maintained structure.

4. Information Certified by Custodian

Certain information disclosed in the accompanying financial statements and ERISA-required supplemental schedule, including, but not limited to, investments held at December 31, 2023 and 2022, net appreciation in fair value of investments, interest and dividends, and investment expenses for the years ended December 31, 2023 and 2022, was obtained by management and agreed to or derived from information certified as complete and accurate by Aetna Life Insurance Company, the custodian of the Plan.

5. Fair Value Measurements

Financial Accounting Standards Board ("FASB") ASC 820, *Fair Value Measurement and Disclosures*, provides the framework for measuring fair value. That framework provides a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (Level 1 measurements) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (Level 3 measurements). The three levels of the fair value hierarchy under FASB ASC 820 are described as follows:

Level 1: Unadjusted quoted prices in active markets that are accessible to the reporting entity at the measurement date for identical assets and liabilities.

Level 2: Inputs other than quoted prices in active markets for identical assets and liabilities that are observable either directly or indirectly for substantially the full term of the asset or liability. Level 2 inputs include the following:

- Quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities in active markets;
- Quoted prices for identical or similar assets or liabilities in inactive markets;
- Observable inputs other than quoted prices that are used in the valuation of the asset or liability;
- Inputs that are derived principally from or corroborated by observable market data by correlation or other means.

Level 3: Unobservable inputs for the asset or liability (i.e., supported by little or no market activity). Level 3 inputs include management's own assumption about the assumptions that market participants would use in pricing the asset or liability (including assumptions about risk).

The asset's or liability's fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques used need to maximize the use of observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs.

The following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for assets measured at fair value. There have been no changes in methodologies used at December 31, 2023 and 2022.

Immediate participation guarantee contract: The fair value of the Plan's immediate participation guarantee contract is estimated based on the fair market value of all investments held based on closing sales prices as reported on the national securities exchanges, or closing bid prices as reported by investment dealers plus cash balances and accruals less accounts payable or other liabilities.

Pooled separate account: Valued at the net asset value ("NAV") of units held as reported by the managers of the pooled separate account. The NAV is used as a practical expedient to estimate fair value. The NAV is based on the underlying investments held by the pooled separate account less any liabilities. This practical expedient is not used when it is determined to be probable that the pooled separate account will be sold for an amount different than the reported NAV.

6. Immediate Participation Guarantee Contract

The Plan holds an immediate participation guarantee contract with Aetna. Aetna maintains the contributions in an unallocated fund to which it adds interest (average annual effective interest rate of 4.29% and 4.74% for the years ended December 31, 2023 and 2022, respectively). The interest rate is guaranteed but is subject to change. Annuity payments are withdrawn by Aetna from the immediate participation guarantee contract on the due dates of the benefit payments to participants.

7. Related-Party and Party In Interest Transactions

The Plan has an immediate participation guarantee contract issued by Aetna and a pooled separate account managed by Aetna for which fees are charged. Aetna is the custodian for the Plan and, therefore, qualifies as a party in interest. The Plan also pays administrative expenses to Aetna. Fees paid to Aetna for custodial and administrative services amounted to \$165,800 and \$185,801 for the year ended December 31, 2023 and 2022, respectively. These transactions qualify as party in interest transactions and are exempt from the prohibited transactions rules of ERISA (exempt transactions). Fees paid to other service providers for legal, actuarial and accounting and auditing services which are also exempt transactions amounted to \$109,933 and \$164,267 for the years ended December 31, 2023 and 2022, respectively.

8. Plan Termination

In the event the Plan terminates, the net assets of the Plan will be allocated, as prescribed by ERISA and its related regulations, generally to provide the following benefits in the order indicated:

1. Benefits attributable to employee contributions, taking into account those paid out before termination.
2. Annuity benefits that former employees or their beneficiaries have been receiving for at least three years, or that employees eligible to retire for that three-year period would have been receiving if they had retired with benefits in the normal form of annuity under the Plan. The priority amount is limited to the lowest benefit that was payable (or would have been payable) during those three years. The amount is further limited to the lowest benefit that would be payable under Plan provisions in effect at any time during the five years preceding Plan termination.
3. Other vested benefits insured by the Pension Benefit Guaranty Corporation ("PBGC") (a U.S. government agency) up to the applicable limitations (discussed subsequently).
4. All other vested benefits (that is, vested benefits not insured by the PBGC).

Certain benefits under the Plan are insured by the PBGC if the Plan terminates. Generally, the PBGC guarantees most vested normal age retirement benefits, early retirement benefits, and certain disability and survivor's pensions. However, the PBGC does not guarantee all types of benefits under the Plan, and the amount of benefit protection is subject to certain limitations. Vested benefits under the Plan are guaranteed at the level in effect on the date of the Plan's termination.

Whether all participants receive their benefits should the Plan terminate at some future time will depend on the sufficiency, at the time, of the Plan's net assets to provide for accumulated benefit obligations and may also depend on the financial condition of the Plan Sponsor and level of benefits guaranteed by the PBGC.

The Company has the right under the Plan to discontinue its contributions at any time and to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions set forth in ERISA. Effective December 31, 2023, the Plan transferred and merged into the Retirement Plan for Bargaining Employees at IAAP, see Note 1.

9. Tax Status

The Plan obtained its latest determination letter on August 5, 2009, in which the Internal Revenue Service ("IRS") stated that the Plan, as then designed, was in compliance with the applicable requirements of the Internal Revenue Code (the "Code") and, therefore, the related trust is exempt from taxation. In December 2016, the IRS began publishing a Required Amendments List for individually designed plans which specifies changes in qualification requirements. The list is published annually and requires plans to be amended for each item on the list, as applicable, to retain its tax-exempt status. Plan management believes that the Plan and related trust are currently designed and being operated in compliance with the applicable requirements of the Code and Plan document. Therefore, no provision for income taxes has been included in the Plan's financial statements.

Accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America require Plan management to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan and recognize a tax liability if the Plan has taken an uncertain position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by the applicable taxing authority. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress. The Plan Sponsor believes it is no longer subject to income tax examinations for years prior to 2020.

10. Subsequent Events

Subsequent events are defined as events or transactions that occur after the statement of net assets available for benefits date, but before the financial statements are issued or are available to be issued. Management has evaluated subsequent events through October 10, 2024, the date that the financial statements were available to be issued and determined that there have been no events that have occurred that would require adjustments to our disclosures in the financial statements.

Certain assumptions are prescribed as noted below. The other assumptions are estimates derived from historical and recent experience as well as market observations, combined with professional judgment about future expectations.

Interest:

The interest rates used for the 2022 plan year are the 24-month average corporate bond segment rates for September 2022 (a four-month lookback) subject to funding stabilization. Under stabilization, the interest rates used for funding purposes are calculated in the usual manner (24-month average corporate bond rates) but are then constrained to be within a corridor around a 25-year average of those same bond rates. Each of the three segments of the yield curve reflecting the 25-year average rates is constrained to be no less than 5%. For 2023, the stabilization corridor is 5%. It will remain 5% through 2030 and then increase by 5% per year beginning in 2031 until it reaches 30% for 2035. The interest rate description above reflects that the plan sponsor elected to apply the ARPA provisions beginning with the 2022 plan year. The rates are as follows:

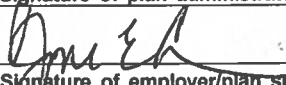
