Scope and Nature of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) Audits for the 2023 and 2024 Financial Statements

We have performed the audits of the financial statements of The Restated Thrift/Profit Sharing Plan for Cooperatives (Participating Employer – Northern Country Cooperative, Group 135) (“the Plan”), an employee benefit plan subject to the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (“ERISA”), as permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) (“ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit”). - The information in the accompanying 2023 and 2024 financial statements related to assets held by and certified to by a qualified institution agrees to, or is derived from, in all material respects, the information prepared and certified by an institution that management determined meets the requirements of ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C).

Basis for Opinion on the 2023 and 2024 Financial Statements

We conducted our audits in accordance with auditing standards generally accepted in the United States of America (“GAAS”). Our responsibilities under those standards are further described in the Auditors’ Responsibilities for the Audits of the 2023 and 2024 Financial Statements section of our report. We are required to be independent of the Plan and to meet our other ethical responsibilities, in accordance with the relevant ethical requirements relating to our audits. We believe that the audit evidence we have obtained is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for our ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit opinion.

Emphasis of Matter - Basis of Accounting

We draw attention to Note 2 to the financial statements, which describes the basis of accounting. The financial statements are prepared on the modified cash basis of accounting, which is a basis of accounting other than accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America. Our opinion is not modified with respect to this matter.

Responsibilities of Management for the 2023 and 2024 Financial Statements

Management is responsible for the preparation and fair presentation of the financial statements in accordance with the modified cash basis of accounting described in Note 2; this includes determining that the modified cash basis of accounting is an acceptable basis for the preparation of the financial statements in the circumstances. Management is also responsible for the design, implementation, and maintenance of internal control relevant to the preparation and fair presentation of financial statements that are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error. Management’s election of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audits does not affect management’s responsibility for the financial statements.

Management is also responsible for maintaining a current plan instrument, including all plan amendments, administering the Plan, and determining that the Plan’s transactions that are presented and disclosed in the financial statements are in conformity with the Plan’s provisions, including maintaining sufficient records with respect to each of the participants, to determine the benefits due or which may become due to such participants.

Auditors’ Responsibilities for the Audits of the 2023 and 2024 Financial Statements

Except as described in the Scope and Nature of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) Audits for the 2023 and 2024 Financial Statements section of our report, our objectives are to obtain reasonable assurance about whether the financial statements as a whole are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error, and to issue an auditors’ report that includes our opinion. Reasonable assurance is a high level of assurance but is not absolute assurance and therefore is not a guarantee that an audit conducted in accordance with GAAS will always detect a material misstatement when it exists. The risk of not detecting a material misstatement resulting from fraud is higher than for one resulting from error, as fraud may involve collusion, forgery, intentional omissions, misrepresentations, or the override of internal control. Misstatements are considered material if there is a substantial likelihood that, individually or in the aggregate, they would influence the judgment made by a reasonable user based on these financial statements.

In performing an audit in accordance with GAAS, we:

- Exercise professional judgment and maintain professional skepticism throughout the audit.
- Identify and assess the risks of material misstatement of the financial statements, whether due to fraud or error, and design and perform audit procedures responsive to those risks. Such procedures include examining, on a test basis, evidence regarding the amounts and disclosures in the financial statements.
- Obtain an understanding of internal control relevant to the audit in order to design audit procedures that are appropriate in the circumstances, but not for the purpose of expressing an opinion on the effectiveness of the Plan's internal control. Accordingly, no such opinion is expressed.
- Evaluate the appropriateness of accounting policies used and the reasonableness of significant accounting estimates made by management, as well as evaluate the overall presentation of the financial statements.
- Conclude whether, in our judgment, there are conditions or events, considered in the aggregate, that raise substantial doubt about the Plan's ability to continue as a going concern for a reasonable period of time.

Our audits did not extend to the certified investment information, except for obtaining and reading the certifications, comparing the certified investment information with the related information presented and disclosed in the 2023 and 2024 financial statements, and reading the disclosures relating to the certified investment information to assess whether they are in accordance with the presentation and disclosure requirements of the modified cash basis of accounting.

Accordingly, the objective of an ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit is not to express an opinion about whether the financial statements as a whole are presented fairly, in all material respects, in accordance with the modified cash basis of accounting.

We are required to communicate with those charged with governance regarding, among other matters, the planned scope and timing of the audit, significant audit findings, and certain internal control-related matters that we identified during the audit.

Other Matter - Supplemental Schedule Required by ERISA

The supplemental schedule (modified cash basis) of assets (held at year end) as of December 31, 2023, is presented for purposes of additional analysis and is not a required part of the financial statements but is supplementary information required by the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. Such information is the responsibility of management and was derived from and relates directly to the underlying accounting and other records used to prepare the financial statements. The information included in the supplemental schedule (modified cash basis), other than that agreed to or derived from the certified investment information, has been subjected to auditing procedures applied in the audit of the financial statements and certain additional procedures, including comparing and reconciling such information directly to the underlying accounting and other records used to prepare the financial statements or to the financial statements themselves, and other additional procedures in accordance with GAAS. For information included in the supplemental schedule (modified cash basis) that agreed to or is derived from the certified investment information, we compared such information to the related certified investment information.

In forming our opinion on the supplemental schedule (modified cash basis), we evaluated whether the supplemental schedule (modified cash basis), other than the information agreed to or derived from the certified investment information, including its form and content, is presented in conformity with the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA.

In our opinion:

- The form and content of the supplemental schedule (modified cash basis), other than the information in the supplemental schedule (modified cash basis) that agreed to or is derived from the certified investment information, is presented, in all material respects, in conformity with the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA.
- The information in the supplemental schedule (modified cash basis) related to assets held by and certified to by a qualified institution agrees to, or is derived from, in all material respects, the information prepared and certified by an institution that management determined meets the requirements of ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C).

Other Matter - Auditors' Report on the 2022 Financial Statements

Predecessor auditors performed an audit of the 2022 financial statements of the Plan. In accordance with ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) pursuant to 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA, the prior year audit did not extend to any statements or information related to assets held for investment of the Plan that were certified by a qualified institution. Their report dated October 9, 2023, indicated that (a) the amounts and disclosures in the 2022 financial statements (modified cash basis), other than those agreed to or derived from the certified investment information, were presented fairly, in all material respects, in accordance with the modified cash basis of accounting, and (b) the information in the 2022 financial statements (modified cash basis) related to assets held by and certified to by a qualified institution agrees to, or is derived from, in all material respects, the information prepared and certified by an institution that management determined meets the requirements of ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C). Their report also indicated that the form and content of the 2022 supplemental schedule, other than the information in the 2022 supplemental schedule that agreed to or is derived from the certified investment information, was presented, in all material respects, in conformity with the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA; and the information in the 2022 supplemental schedule related to assets held by and certified to by a qualified institution agrees to, or is derived from, in all material respects, the information prepared and certified by an institution that management determines meets the requirements of ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C).

NOTES TO FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

(1) Description of plan

The Restated Thrift/Profit Sharing Plan for Cooperatives (“Thrift/Profit Sharing Plan”) is a defined contribution plan administered by Associated Benefits Corporation (the “Plan Administrator”). The participating employer, Northern Country Cooperative, Group 135, has adopted the Thrift/Profit Sharing Plan (the “Plan”). The following description of the Plan provides only general information. Participants should refer to the plan document for a more complete description of the Plan’s provisions, which are available from the plan administrator.

General - The Plan is a defined contribution plan available to all employees of the participating employer who have attained age 21, completed 4 months of service, and are expected to be credited with at least 1,000 hours of service during their first twelve consecutive months of employment or during any calendar year. Principal Trust Company serves as the trustee of the Plan. The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (“ERISA”).

Plan merger - Effective January 31, 2024, all assets of the Plan merged into NEXUS Cooperative (formerly Viafield), Group 173, another participating employer of The Restated Thrift/Profit Sharing Plan for Cooperatives (EIN 42-0243960, Plan #030), as further discussed in Note 9.

Contributions - Contributions to the Plan included (i) salary reduction contributions authorized by participants, (ii) matching contributions made by the adopting employer; and (iii) participant rollovers from other qualified plans. Participants had the option to make Roth elective salary contributions to the Plan.

Participants could elect to contribute a percentage of their compensation to the Plan each year, subject to the limitations, as defined in the plan document. Such contributions were excluded from the participant’s taxable income for federal income tax purposes until received as a withdrawal or distribution from the Plan. Participants who attained age 50 before the end of the plan year were eligible to make catch-up contributions. The Plan included an auto-enrollment provision whereby all newly eligible employees were automatically enrolled in the Plan unless they affirmatively elect not to participate in the Plan. Automatically enrolled participants had their deferral rate set at 2% of eligible compensation. Participants could request to automatically increase their contributions by 1% per year each July 1 until the participant’s contributions reach the maximum allowed, as defined in the plan document.

The participating employer contributed 25% of the first 6% of base compensation that a participant contributes to the Plan.

Participants could also contribute amounts representing distributions from other qualified defined benefit or defined contribution plans. Contributions were subject to certain Internal Revenue Code (“IRC”) limitations.

(1) Description of plan (continued)

Participant accounts - Individual accounts were maintained for each Plan participant. Each participant's account was credited with the participant's contribution and employer contributions and an allocation of plan earnings (losses) and charged with withdrawals and an allocation of administrative expenses that were paid by the Plan. Allocations were based on participant account balances, as defined. The benefit to which a participant was entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant's vested account.

Participant investment account options - Participants could direct the investment of their employee and employer contributions and/or account balances into various investment options offered by the Plan and could change investments and transfer amounts between funds daily.

Vesting - Participants were immediately vested in all contributions, plus actual earnings (losses) thereon.

Notes receivable from participants - Participants could borrow from their fund accounts a minimum of \$1,000 up to a maximum equal to the lesser of 50% of their vested account balance or \$50,000 minus the participant's highest outstanding loan balance during the twelve-month period before a loan is granted. The loans were secured by the balance in the participant's account and bear interest at one percentage point above the prime lending rate charged by Principal Trust Company. Principal and interest were paid ratably through payroll deductions or as a lump sum for the outstanding loan balance. Loan terms ranged from 1 to 5 years; however, terms could extend to 15 years for the purchase of a primary residence.

Payment of benefits - On termination of service (including termination of service due to death, disability or retirement), a participant could generally elect to receive either a lump sum amount equal to the value of the participant's vested interest in his or her account, or installments payments over various periods as elected by the participant.

(2) Summary of significant accounting policies

Basis of accounting - The accompanying financial statements have been prepared on a modified cash basis of accounting, which is a basis of accounting other than accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America ("GAAP"). Under the modified cash basis of accounting, transactions are recorded in the financial statements on the cash receipts and disbursement basis; however, investments are adjusted to fair value. Accordingly, these financial statements are not intended to present the Plan's financial position or changes in financial position in conformity with GAAP. The principal differences in the Plan's financial statements relate to investment income (loss) and contributions, which are not recorded until received.

Use of estimates - The preparation of financial statements in conformity with the modified cash basis of accounting, which is a basis of accounting other than GAAP, requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect reported amounts of assets and liabilities and changes therein, and disclosures of contingent assets and liabilities. Accordingly, actual results may differ from those estimates.

(2) Summary of significant accounting policies (continued)

Risks and uncertainties - The Plan utilized various investment securities, including mutual funds and common collective trusts. Investment securities, in general, are exposed to various risks such as interest rate risk, credit risk and overall market volatility. Market risks include global events which could impact the value of investment securities, such as a pandemic or international conflict. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the values of investment securities could occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect participants' account balances, and the amounts reported in the statements of net assets available for benefits.

Investment valuation and income recognition - Investments were reported at fair value. Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date.

Purchases and sales of securities were recorded on a trade-date basis. Dividend and interest income are recorded as received. Net appreciation (depreciation) included the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold as well as held during the year.

Contributions - Contributions from Plan participants and the matching contributions from the participating employer were recorded when received by the Plan.

Notes receivable from participants - Notes receivable from participants were measured at their unpaid principal balance plus accrued but unpaid interest.

Administrative expenses - Administrative expenses of the Plan were paid by the Plan as provided in the Plan document. Certain fees were paid by the participating employer which are not reflected in the statements of changes in net assets available for benefits.

All investment management and transaction fees directly related to the Plan investments were paid by the Plan. Management fees and operating expenses charged to the Plan for investments were deducted from income earned on a daily basis and were not separately reflected. Consequently, investment management fees and operating expenses were reflected as a reduction of investment return for such investments.

Payment of benefits - Benefit payments to participants are recorded upon distribution. As of January 31, 2024, December 31, 2023 and 2022, there were no participants who elected to withdraw from the Plan but had not yet been paid.

Plan transfers - Transfers into and out of the Plan (other than the plan merger) represented the participant accounts of employees who have moved between participating employers of the Thrift/Profit Sharing Plan during the period ended January 31, 2024, and the years ended December 31, 2023, and 2022.

(3) Information prepared and certified by the trustee

The plan administrator elected the method of annual reporting compliance permitted by 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. Accordingly, Delaware Charter Guarantee and Trust Company d/b/a Principal Trust Company, the trustee of the Plan, has certified that the following data included in the accompanying financial statements and supplemental schedule is complete and accurate with respect to investments:

- Investments at fair value
- Notes receivable from participants
- Net appreciation (depreciation) in fair value of investments
- Dividends
- Other income
- Interest income on notes receivable from participants
- Schedule of assets (held at end of year)

The Plan's independent public accountants did not perform auditing procedures with respect to this information, except for comparing such information to the related information included in the financial statements and supplemental schedule.

(4) Fair value measurements

The framework for measuring fair value provides a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (Level 1) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (Level 3). The three levels of the fair value hierarchy under Financial Accounting Standards Board Accounting Standards Codification 820 are described below:

Following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for assets measured at fair value. There have been no changes in the methodologies used at January 31, 2024, December 31, 2023 and 2022.

Mutual funds: Valued at the daily closing price as reported by the fund. Mutual funds held by the Plan are open-end mutual funds that are registered with the Securities and Exchange Commission. These funds are required to publish their daily net asset value (“NAV”) and to transact at that price. The mutual funds held by the Plan are deemed to be actively traded.

Common collective trusts: Valued at the NAV of units of a bank collective trust. The NAV, as provided by the trustee, is used as a practical expedient to estimate fair value. Participant transactions (purchases and sales) may occur daily. Were the Plan to initiate a full redemption of the collective trust, the investment advisor reserves the right to temporarily delay withdrawal from the trust in order to ensure that securities liquidations will be carried out in an orderly business manner.

Stable value common collective trust: A stable value fund that is composed primarily of fully benefit-responsive investment contracts is valued at the NAV of units of the bank collective trust. The NAV, as provided by the trustee, is used as a practical expedient to estimate fair value. Participant transactions (purchases and sales) may occur daily. If the Plan initiates a full redemption of the collective trust, the issuer reserves the right to require 12 months’ notification in order to ensure that securities liquidations will be carried out in an orderly business manner.

As of January 31, 2024, there were no assets held by the Plan as a result of the plan merger discussed in Notes 1 and 9.

(5) Related party transactions and party-in-interest transactions

Fees incurred by the Plan for investment management services were included in net appreciation (depreciation) in fair value of investments, as they were paid through revenue sharing, rather than a direct payment. The Plan paid certain expenses related to the Plan's operations and investment activity to various service providers. These transactions were party-in-interest transactions. The participating employer paid directly any other fees related to the Plan's operation.

(6) Plan termination

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the participating employer has the right under the Plan to discontinue its contributions at any time and to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions set forth in ERISA.

(7) Tax status

The Internal Revenue Service ("IRS") has determined and informed the participating employer by letter dated October 18, 2017, that the Plan and the related Trust were designed in accordance with the applicable sections of the IRC. Although the Plan had been amended since receiving the determination letter, the plan administrator believes that the Plan was designed and operated in compliance with the applicable requirements of the IRC and the Plan and related Trust continue to be tax-exempt.

Under the modified cash basis of accounting, Plan management evaluates tax positions taken by the Plan and would recognize tax consequences when an amount has been paid or received. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress.

(8) Concentrations

At December 31, 2023, approximately 26% and 16%, of the Plan's investments were invested in the ABC Stable Value Fund and SSgA S&P 500 Index Security Lend Series II, respectively.

At December 31, 2022, approximately 29% and 15%, of the Plan's investments were invested in the ABC Stable Value Fund and SSgA S&P 500 Index, respectively.

(9) Plan merger

Effective January 31, 2024, all assets of the Plan merged into NEXUS Cooperative (formerly Viafield), Group 173, another participating employer of The Restated Thrift/Profit Sharing Plan for Cooperatives (EIN 42-0243960, Plan #030). As a result of the plan merger, assets of \$14,011,368 were transferred out of the Plan.

(10) Subsequent events

The Plan has evaluated subsequent events through October 14, 2024, which is the date the financial statements were available to be issued. No significant matters were identified for disclosure during this evaluation.
