NOTE 1 - PLAN DESCRIPTION

The following description of the Industrial Group Intermediate Holdings, LLC Savings Plan (the “Plan”) provides only general information. Participants should refer to the Plan agreement for a more complete description of the Plan's provisions.

General

Industrial Group Intermediate Holdings, LLC’s (the “Company” or “Employer”) sponsors 401(k) Plan on behalf of itself and its wholly owned domestic subsidiaries, Ehrhardt Tool & Machine, LLC, Modern Equipment Company, LLC, John Wood Company, LLC and Miether Bearing Products, LLC, to provide retirement benefits to its employees. The Plan, effective May 30, 2014, is a defined contribution plan and is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (“ERISA”).

On December 23, 2015, the Company has signed a Plan Agreement effective from the year starting January 1, 2016, with Principal Life Insurance Company, an institution that management determined meets the requirements of ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C).

Contributions

Under provisions of the Plan, all employees that have completed three consecutive months of service are eligible to participate in the Plan. The Plan allows both pre-tax contributions and Roth elective contributions. Employees can contribute from 1% to 50% of their compensation per payroll to the Plan. Employee contributions are limited to a maximum annual amount as set periodically by the Internal Revenue Service (“IRS”).

The Employer will contribute to Safe Harbor Matching Contribution Account 100% of the first 3% of compensation that employees defer during a given payroll period, plus 50% of the next 2% of compensation that employees defer. In addition, the Employer may contribute on employees’ behalf a discretionary fixed profit-sharing contribution equal to 1% of eligible employees’ compensation, which was \$93,614 and \$106,177 for the years ended 2022 and 2021, respectively.

Participant Accounts and Investment Options

Separate accounts are maintained for each participant. Each Participant’s account is credited with the participant’s contribution and an allocation of the Company’s contribution, plus Plan earnings. Allocations of Plan earnings are based on participant account balances and underlying investments within each participant’s account. Such amounts are invested in the 29 investment options currently offered by the Plan, as directed by the participant.

Vesting

Participants are immediately vested in their pretax and Roth 401(k) deferrals, safe harbor contributions, nonelective contributions, and employer's matching contributions.

Notes Receivable from Participants

The Plan's loan provisions limit one loan outstanding at a time and two loans in a calendar year. Participants may borrow from their accounts a minimum of \$1,000 up to 50 percent of their vested account balance or \$50,000 reduced by their highest outstanding loan balance(s) during the one-year period ending on the day before new loan is made. Loan transactions are treated as a transfer between the investment fund and the loan fund. Loan terms shall not exceed five years unless the loan is extended due to a leave of absence for military service or the loan qualifies as a primary residence loan, in which case the loan term can be up to fifteen years. The loans are secured by an irrevocable pledge and assignment up to 50% of the vested account balance in the Plan. Interest rate is the greater of the Trustee's Prime Rate or 5-year CD rate + 2%. Principal and interest are paid ratably through payroll deductions. As of December 31, 2022 and 2021, the balance of notes receivable was \$101,822 and \$145,967, respectively. There was no interest receivable from loans to participants as of December 31, 2022 and 2021.

Plan Expenses

For the years ended December 31, 2022 and 2021, the Company paid on behalf of the Plan \$4,174 and \$6,189, respectively, for trustee and administration services provided by Principal Life Insurance Company to maintain and operate the Plan efficiently and in compliance with applicable legal requirements.

Distributions of Benefits

A participant's plan benefits will be distributed at retirement, death, disability and termination of employment. The participant or beneficiary may elect to receive such benefits in an annuity or a single sum payment. Small amounts threshold is \$5,000. If a participant's vested account is \$1,000 or less as of the distribution date the vested account will be distributed in a lump sum. Amounts between \$1,000 and \$5,000 where the participant does not elect a benefit are rolled into an IRA. If the amount vested exceeds \$5,000, a participant may elect to receive an amount equal to the value of the vested interest in his or her account in either a single sum payment, or in any distribution options offered by the plan.

Distributions of Benefits – continued

During the years ended December 31, 2022 and 2021, the amount of benefits distributed to participants was \$532,194 and \$1,408,896, respectively.

The total amount allocated to accounts of persons who have elected to withdraw from the plan but have not yet been paid was \$163 and \$862 as of December 31, 2022 and 2021, respectively.

Other

Participants' 401(k) deferrals and fully vested company contribution may be withdrawn in the case of certain hardships. Participants may withdraw rollover contributions at any time. Participants may withdraw all fully vested balances after reaching age 59 ½.

NOTE 2 - SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of Accounting – The financial statements of the Plan have been prepared on the accrual basis in accordance with the U.S. generally accepted accounting principles (“U.S. GAAP”).

Use of Estimates – The preparation of financial statements in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of net assets available for plan benefits and changes therein. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

Investment Valuation and Income Recognition – The Plan's investments are reported at fair value. Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. See Note 7 for discussion of fair value measurements. Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a settlement date basis. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date.

Net appreciation or reduction includes the plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold, as well as held during the year.

Payment of Benefits – Benefit payments are recognized when paid.

Notes Receivable from Participants – Notes receivable from participants are measured at their unpaid principal balance plus any accrued but unpaid interest. Delinquent participant loans are reclassified as distributions based upon the terms of the Plan document.

Forfeited Accounts - Forfeited accounts are used to pay plan expenses or employer contributions. For the years ended December 31, 2022 and 2021, forfeited account balances totaled \$540 and \$7,433, respectively. As of December 31, 2022 and 2021, no forfeited account balances remained outstanding.

NOTE 3 - PARTY-IN-INTEREST

The Plan engages in certain transactions involving the trustee, which are party-in-interest transactions as defined by ERISA. A substantial portion of the Plan's assets is invested in the trustee's pooled separate accounts and collective trust accounts, as reported in Note 1 and Note 7. Plan expenses are paid by the Plan sponsor.

NOTE 4 - PLAN TERMINATION

While it is the intention to maintain the Plan indefinitely, the Company has the right to amend or terminate the Plan at any time. Upon termination of the Plan, all amounts credited the participants' account shall become 100% vested, regardless of the Plan's current vesting schedule. The entire vested benefits will be distributed to participants and their beneficiaries in accordance with the Plan and subject to ERISA guidelines.

NOTE 5 - INFORMATION CERTIFIED BY TRUSTEE (UNAUDITED)

The following unaudited information, included in the Plan's financial statements and schedule of assets that was prepared by Principal Life Insurance Company, the trustee, and furnished to the plan administrator. The trustee holds the Plan's investment assets and executes investment transactions. The plan administrator has obtained certifications from the trustee that such information is complete and accurate.

- Investments as indicated on the statement of net assets available for plan benefits;
- Investment income as indicated on the statement of changes in net assets available for plan benefits

The Plan's independent public accountants did not perform auditing procedures with respect to this information, except for comparing such information to the related information included in the financial statements and schedules.

NOTE 6 – TAX STATUS

The Internal Revenue Service approved a master proto-type plan by a letter dated August 23, 2017 under which the Plan operates, that the plan and related trust are designed in accordance with applicable sections of the Internal Revenue Code (IRC). Although the plan has been amended since receiving the determination letter, the plan administrator and the plan's tax counsel believe that the plan is designed and is currently being operated in compliance with the applicable requirements of the IRC and therefore believe that the plan is qualified and the related trust is tax-exempt.

NOTE 6 – TAX STATUS (CONTINUED)

Accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America require plan management to value tax positions taken by the plan and recognize a tax liability (or asset) if the plan has taken an uncertain position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by the Internal Revenue Service. The plan administrator has analyzed the tax positions taken by the plan, and has concluded that as of December 31, 2022, there are no uncertain positions taken or expected to be taken that would require recognition of a liability (or asset) or disclosure in the financial statements. The plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress.

NOTE 7 - FAIR VALUE MEASUREMENTS

Financial Accounting Standards Board (FASB) Accounting Standards Codification (ASC) 820, Fair Value Measurements and Disclosures, provides the framework for measuring fair value. That framework provides a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (level 1 measurements) and the lowest to unobservable inputs (level 3 measurements). The three levels of the fair value hierarchy under FASB 820 are described as follows:

Level 1— Inputs to the valuation methodology are unadjusted quoted prices for identical assets or liabilities in active markets that the Plan has the ability to access.

Level 2—Inputs to the valuation methodology include

- Quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities in active markets;
- Quoted prices for identical or similar assets or liabilities in inactive markets;
- Inputs other than quoted prices that are observable for the asset or liability;
- Inputs that are derived principally from or corroborated by observable market data by correlation or other means.

If the asset or liability has a specified (contractual) term, the level 2 input must be observable for substantially the full term of the asset or liability.

Level 3—Inputs to the valuation methodology are unobservable and significant to the fair value measurement.

The asset's or liability's fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques used need to maximize the use of observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs.

NOTE 7 - FAIR VALUE MEASUREMENTS (CONTINUED)

Following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for assets measured at fair value. There have been no changes in the methodologies used at December 31, 2022 and 2021.

Registered Investment Companies (Mutual Funds): Valued at the daily closing price as reported by the fund. Mutual funds held by the Plan are open-end mutual funds that are registered with the U.S. Securities and Exchange Commission. These funds are required to publish their daily net asset value and to transact at that price. The mutual funds held by the Plan are deemed to be actively traded.

NOTE 8 - RISKS AND UNCERTAINTIES

The plan invests in various investment instruments. Investment securities, in general, are exposed to various risks such as interest rate, market, and credit risks. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the values of investment securities will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect participants' account balances and the amounts reported in the statement of net assets available for benefits. The Plan investments in funds which invest in securities of foreign countries, which involve special risks and considerations not typically associated with investing in U.S. companies. These risks include devaluation of currencies, less reliable information about issuers, different securities transaction clearance and settlement practices, and possible adverse political and economic developments. Moreover, securities of many foreign companies and their markets may be less liquid and their prices more volatile than those securities of comparable U.S. companies.

NOTE 9 – PUTNAM STABLE VALUE FUND

On November 15, 2021, the Plan switched from the Principal Fixed Income Guaranteed Option to Putnam Stable Value Fund (25 bps management fee) (“The Fund”), both met the fully benefit-responsive investment contract criteria and therefore are reported at contract value. The Fund is a single group annuity contract with a fixed rate of interest. It is not a portfolio of contracts whose yields are based on changes in fair value of underlying assets as would be found in a Stable Value fund.

The Fund’s objective is to invest in traditional and synthetic guaranteed investment contracts (“GIC”), government securities, registered money market mutual funds and long-term corporate debt. The average yield for the year ended December 31, 2022 and 2021 is 2.46% and 1.85%, respectively. The portfolio gross crediting interest rates as of December 31, 2022 and 2021 was 2.38% and 1.60%, respectively.

There are no limitations or guarantees on the Contracts. The basis and frequency of determining crediting interest-rate resets are daily and accrual/units. The minimum crediting interest rate under the terms of the Contract does not apply.

The Fund could be limited in their ability to transact with issuers at contract value if the Fund raises its risk profile or are subjected to an extended period of significant cash outflow. The Fund maintains strong risk parameters and work with its issuers before any risk parameter changes are contemplated.

The Fund maintains cash, internal cash flow and a maturity ladder of investments to offset cash withdrawals. Further, the Fund’s managers may limit withdrawals in order to maintain sufficient liquidity. Therefore, the probability of the Fund losing access to contract value transactions is remote.

NOTE 10 – SUBSEQUENT EVENTS

Subsequent events were evaluated through date of the auditor’s report, which is the date the financial statements were available to be issued and has determined that no significant events occurred after December 31, 2022, but prior to the issuance of these financial statements, that would have a material impact on its financial statements.
