Scope and Nature of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) Audit

Management is responsible for the preparation and fair presentation of the financial statements in accordance with GAAP, and for the design, implementation, and maintenance of internal control relevant to the preparation and fair presentation of financial statements that are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error. Except as described in the *Scope and Nature of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) Audit of the Financial Statements* section of our report, our objectives are to obtain reasonable assurance about whether the financial statements as a whole are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error, and to issue an auditor's report that includes our opinion. Reasonable assurance is a high level of assurance, but it is not absolute assurance; therefore, it is not a guarantee that an audit conducted in accordance with GAAS will always detect a material misstatement when it exists. The risk of not detecting a material misstatement resulting from fraud is higher than for one resulting from error, as fraud may involve collusion, forgery, intentional omissions, misrepresentations, or the override of internal control. Misstatements are considered material if there is a substantial likelihood that, individually or in the aggregate, they would influence the judgement made by a reasonable user based on the financial statements.

In performing an audit in accordance with GAAS, we:

- Exercise professional judgment and maintain professional skepticism throughout the audit.
- Identify and assess the risks of material misstatement of the financial statements, whether due to fraud or error, and design and perform audit procedures responsive to those risks. Such procedures include examining, on a test basis, evidence regarding the amounts and disclosures in the financial statements.

- Evaluate the appropriateness of accounting policies used and the reasonableness of significant accounting estimates made by management, as well as evaluate the overall presentation of the financial statements.
- Conclude whether, in our judgment, there are conditions or events that, considered in the aggregate, raise substantial doubt about the Plan's ability to continue as a going concern for a reasonable period of time.

Our audits did not extend to the certified investment information, except for obtaining and reading the certification, comparing the certified investment information with the related information presented and disclosed in the financial statements, and reading the disclosures relating to the certified investment information to assess whether they are in accordance with the presentation and disclosure requirements of GAAP. Accordingly, the objective of an ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit is not to express an opinion about whether the financial statements as a whole are presented fairly, in all material respects, in accordance with GAAP.

We are required to communicate with those charged with governance regarding, among other matters, the planned scope and timing of the audit, significant audit findings, and certain internal control-related matters that we identified during the audit.

Other Matters

Supplemental Information Required by ERISA

The supplemental information listed in the index as of December 31, 2023, is presented for purposes of additional analysis and is not a required part of the financial statements, but is supplemental information required by the DOL's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. Such information is the responsibility of management and was derived from and relates directly to the underlying accounting and other records used to prepare the financial statements. The information included in the supplemental information, other than that agreed to or derived from the certified investment information, has been subjected to auditing procedures applied in the audits of the financial statements and certain additional procedures, including comparing and reconciling such information directly to the underlying accounting and other records used to prepare the financial statements or to the financial statements themselves, and other additional procedures in accordance with GAAS. For information included in the supplemental information that agreed to or is derived from the certified investment information, we compared such information to the related certified investment information.

In forming our opinion on the supplemental information, we evaluated whether the supplemental information, other than the information agreed to or derived from the certified investment information, including their form and content, is presented in conformity with the DOL's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA.

Note 1 – Plan Description

The following description of the Innovex Downhole Solutions 401(k) Plan (the “Plan”) provides only general information. Participants should refer to the Summary Plan Description and the Plan Document for a more complete description of the Plan’s provisions.

General

The Plan is a defined contribution 401(k) plan that provides retirement savings benefits to eligible employees of the Innovex Downhole Solutions, Inc. (“Employer” or “Company”). The Plan commenced effective September 1, 2013, and was amended and restated effective January 31, 2021, to comply with the latest rules and regulations. It is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (“ERISA”) and the Internal Revenue Code (“IRC”).

Plan Custodians and Trustees

Effective August 1, 2022, Empower Companies changed the legal name of Great-West Companies to Empower. Empower Trust Company, LLC (“Empower”) and Empower Annuity Insurance Company of America (collectively, the “Custodians”) are the Custodians maintaining custody of all investments held by the Plan. Empower Retirement, LLC (the “Recordkeeper”) maintains the Plan’s participant account balances and provides recordkeeping services to the Plan. Among other duties, the Recordkeeper receives contributions, holds and invests the fund assets in accordance with the direction of participants, and makes distributions as directed by the Plan Administrator. Certain officers of the Company serve as Trustees of the Plan.

Eligibility

Except those under collective bargaining agreements, leased employees, and nonresident aliens who receive no United States-source income, all employees are eligible to participate in the Plan upon hire. Eligible employees are permitted to enter the Plan on the first day of the month coincident with, or next following, commencement of employment.

Contributions

Participants may elect to contribute, on a before-tax or Roth basis, up to 90% of their eligible compensation, up to the maximum amount permitted for deferral annually under the IRC, which was \$22,500 for 2023. Participants who reach the age of 50 on or before the end of a Plan year are allowed to make additional before-tax catch-up contributions of up to the maximum amount permitted annually under the IRC, which was \$7,500 for 2023.

Rollover contributions may also be accepted by the Plan on behalf of participants from other plans qualified under Section 401(a) of the IRC, provided that such rollover contributions are approved by the Plan’s Administrator.

The Employer may make discretionary matching contributions, as determined by the Employer. Effective with the payroll paid on January 21, 2022, the Employer reinstated the discretionary matching contribution at a rate of 50% of the first 6% that each eligible participant contributed to the Plan.

Participant Accounts

Each participant's account is credited with the participant's contributions, the Company's matching contributions, and allocations of Plan earnings, and is charged with an allocation of administrative expenses. Allocations are based on participant earnings, account balances, or specific participant transactions, as defined. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant's vested account.

Vesting

Participants who were employed with the Employer on and participants in the Plan as of December 31, 2017, are always 100% vested with respect to all contributions in their accounts and related earnings. In addition, service with the following predecessor employers will be included to determine the number of years of service for vesting purposes: Team Oil Tools; Isolation Technologies; Antelope Oil Tool & Manufacturing Company; EnerServ, Inc.; EnerServ, LLC; and Quick Connectors, Inc.

For participants not employed with the Company on and/or not a participant in the Plan as of December 31, 2017, vesting in Employer contributions, plus any income or loss thereon, is subject to the following vesting schedule:

Participant-Directed Investments

All assets of the Plan are participant-directed investments. Participants have the option of directing their account balances to one or more investment options offered by the Plan. The Plan has selected various investment options, as more fully described in the Plan Document, to which participants may designate the allocation of their account balances. The funds vary in types of investments, rates of return, and investment risk.

Notes Receivable from Participants

Participants may borrow from their fund accounts a minimum of \$1,000 up to a maximum equal to the lesser of \$50,000 or 50% of their account balance. A participant may only have one outstanding loan at a time. The loans must be repaid over a period no longer than five years; however, the Plan Administrator may permit a longer repayment term of up to ten years if the loan is for the purchase of the participant's principal residence. The loans are secured by the balance in the participant's account. The loan interest rate, determined quarterly, is set at 2% above Prime, as defined. Principal and interest are paid ratably through payroll deductions and are due in equal installments not less frequently than monthly.

Note 1 – Plan Description (continued)

Payment of Benefits

Upon separation of service due to death, disability, retirement, or termination of employment, a participant may elect to receive either a lump sum payment equal to the value of the participant's vested balance or a partial withdrawal. Distributions to a terminated employee with an account balance not exceeding \$5,000 are made as a lump sum distribution as soon as administratively possible following the participant's termination of employment. The participant may elect whether to receive the distribution directly or to rollover the distribution into another retirement plan.

If a terminated employee has an account balance exceeding \$5,000, the participant may elect to maintain their balances within the Plan. If the vested account balance is \$1,000 or less, the Plan permits involuntary lump sum cash distributions. A participant may withdraw all or a portion of their vested account balance in the event of a financial hardship, as defined by the Plan. Additionally, in-service withdrawals are permitted upon attainment of age 59 ½.

Forfeited Accounts

At December 31, 2023 and 2022, forfeited nonvested accounts totaled \$167,900 and \$207,141, respectively. These accounts will be used to reduce future Employer contributions.

Note 2 – Summary of Significant Accounting Policies

Basis of Accounting

The Plan's financial statements are prepared on the accrual basis of accounting in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America ("GAAP").

Investments held by a defined contribution plan are required to be reported at fair value, except for fully benefit-responsive investment contracts. Contract value is the relevant measure for the portion of the net assets available for benefits of a defined contribution plan attributable to fully benefit-responsive investment contracts because contract value is the amount participants normally would receive if they were to initiate permitted transactions under the terms of the Plan.

Use of Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in accordance with GAAP requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities, changes in those assets and liabilities, and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

Investment Valuation and Income Recognition

Investments are reported at fair value except for the fully benefit-responsive investment contracts, which are reported at contract value. Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. See Note 3 for discussion of fair value measurements.

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Net appreciation includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments purchased and sold, as well as held, during the year.

Notes Receivable from Participants

Notes receivable from participants are measured at their unpaid principal balance, plus any accrued but unpaid interest. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Related fees are recorded as administrative expenses and are expensed when they are incurred. No allowance for credit losses has been recorded as of December 31, 2023 and 2022. Delinquent participant loans are recorded as distributions on the basis of the terms of the Plan Agreement.

Payment of Benefits

Benefits payments are recorded when paid.

Administrative Expenses

Certain expenses of maintaining the Plan are paid by the Plan, unless otherwise paid by the Employer. Expenses that are paid by the Employer are excluded from these financial statements. Certain expenses specifically incurred by, or attributable to, a participant will be paid from that participant's account and are included in administrative expenses. Investment-related expenses are included in net appreciation of fair value of investments.

Subsequent Events

The Plan has evaluated subsequent events through September 26, 2024, the date the financial statements were available to be issued.

Note 3 – Fair Value Measurements

The framework for measuring fair value provides a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (level 1), and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (level 3).

The three levels of the fair value hierarchy under Financial Accounting Standards Board ("FASB") Accounting Standards Codification ("ASC") 820 are described as follows:

- **Level 1** – Inputs to the valuation methodology are unadjusted quoted prices for identical assets or liabilities in active markets that the Plan has the ability to access at the measurement date.
- **Level 2** – Inputs to the valuation methodology include quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities in active markets; quoted prices for identical or similar assets or liabilities in inactive markets; inputs other than quoted prices that are observable for the asset or liability; or inputs that are derived principally from or corroborated by observable market data by correlation or other means. If the asset or liability has a specified (contractual) term, the level 2 input must be observable for substantially the full term of the asset or liability.
- **Level 3** – Inputs to the valuation methodology are unobservable and significant to the fair value measurement.

The asset or liability's fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques maximize the use of relevant observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs.

Note 3 – Fair Value Measurements (continued)

The following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for assets measured at fair value. There have been no changes in the methodologies used at December 31, 2023 and 2022.

- **Mutual Funds** – Valued at the daily closing price as reported by the fund. Mutual funds held by the Plan are open-end mutual funds that are registered with the United States Securities and Exchange Commission. These funds are required to publish their daily net asset value (“NAV”) and to transact at that price. The mutual funds held by the Plan are deemed to be actively traded and are classified within level 1 of the fair value hierarchy.

Note 5 – Guaranteed Investment Contract with Insurance Company

The Plan has a group annuity contract with Empower Annuity Insurance Company of America that invests contributions in the Key Guaranteed Portfolio Fund. The Key Guaranteed Portfolio Fund is a general account product. The methodology for calculating the interest crediting rate is based on the earnings of the underlying assets in the entire medium-long-term new portfolio compared to the minimum interest crediting rate, as stated in the contract, and prevailing market conditions. The interest crediting rate is reset quarterly.

The contract is measured at contract value, which is the relevant measurement attribute for that portion of the net assets available for benefits attributable to the group annuity contract since the contract was determined to be fully benefit-responsive. There are no reserves against contract value for credit risk of the contract issuer or otherwise. The contract is credited with earnings on the underlying investments and charged for participant withdrawals and administrative expenses. Contract value represents contributions made under the contract, plus earnings, less participant withdrawals, and administrative expenses. Participants may ordinarily direct the withdrawal or transfer of all or a portion of their investment at contract value. The guaranteed investment contract issuer is contractually obligated to repay the principal and a specified interest rate that is guaranteed to the Plan.

Certain events limit the ability of the Plan to transact at contract value with the issuer. Such events include the following: (a) amendments to the Plan Document (including complete or partial Plan termination or merger with another plan), (b) changes to the Plan's prohibition on competing investment options or deletion of equity wash provisions, (c) bankruptcy of the Plan Sponsor or other Plan Sponsor events that cause a significant withdrawal from the Plan, or (d) the failure of the Trust to qualify for exemption from federal income taxes or any required prohibited transaction exemption under ERISA. The Plan Administrator does not believe that any events which would limit the Plan's ability to transact at contract value with participants are probable of occurring.

Note 6 – Related Party Transactions and Party-in-Interest Transactions

Certain Plan investments are a fixed annuity contract and mutual funds managed by the Custodians. These transactions qualify as party-in-interest transactions as defined by ERISA but are permitted under the provisions of the Plan and are exempt from the prohibition of party-in-interest transactions under ERISA. As described in Note 2, the Plan paid certain expenses related to Plan operations and investment activity to service providers.

The Plan has notes receivable from participants at December 31, 2023 and 2022. These receivables and all transactions relating to these receivables qualify as party-in-interest transactions that are exempt from the prohibition of party-in-interest transactions under ERISA.

Note 7 – Plan Termination

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the Company has the right under the Plan to discontinue its contributions at any time and to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions of ERISA. In the event of Plan termination, participants would become 100% vested in their Employer contributions.

Note 8 – Tax Status

The Plan operates under a non-standardized, preapproved profit-sharing plan sponsored by Nova 401K Associates Inc. (“Nova”). The Internal Revenue Service (“IRS”) has determined and informed Nova, by a letter dated June 30, 2020, that the Plan and related trust are designed in accordance with applicable sections of the IRC. Although the Plan has not filed individually with the IRS regarding the Plan’s qualified tax status, the Plan Administrator believes that the Plan is designed and currently being operated in compliance with the applicable requirements of the IRC, and thus believes that the Plan is qualified, and the related trust is tax-exempt.

GAAP requires Plan management to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan and recognize a tax liability if the Plan has taken an uncertain position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by the IRS. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress.

Note 9 – Risks and Uncertainties

The Plan invests in various investment securities. Investment securities are exposed to various risks, such as interest rate, market, and credit risks. Because of the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the values of investment securities will occur in the near term, and that such changes could materially affect participants’ account balances and the amounts reported in the statement of net assets available for benefits.
