The information included in the supplemental schedules, other than that agreed to or derived from the certified investment information, has been subjected to auditing procedures applied in the audits of the financial statements and certain additional procedures, including comparing and reconciling such information directly to the underlying accounting and other records used to prepare the financial statements or to the financial statements themselves, and other additional procedures in accordance with generally accepted auditing standards. For information included in the supplemental schedules that agreed to or is derived from the certified investment information, we compared such information to the related certified investment information.

In forming our opinion on the supplemental schedules, we evaluated whether the supplemental schedules, other than the information agreed to or derived from the certified investment information, including their form and content, are presented in conformity with the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA.

## Notes to Financial Statements

For the Period Ended December 29, 2023 and For the Year Ended December 31, 2022

### Note A - Description of Plan

The following description of DiGioia, Gray 401(k) Plan ("the Plan") provides only general information. Participants should refer to the Plan agreement for a more complete description of the Plan's provisions.

#### Merger

On November 28, 2023, the board of directors of Gannett Fleming, Inc., a controlling party of DiGioia, Gray, approved the merger of this Plan into the Gannett Fleming, Inc. Tax-Deferred 401(k) Savings Plan ("Savings Plan"), effective December 29, 2023. As a result, all investments were transferred from the Plan into the Savings Plan on that date.

#### General

The Plan was formed on January 1, 2016 by DiGioia, Gray (the "Employer" and "Plan Sponsor") and was a defined contribution plan with a 401(k)-provision covering all employees, as defined in the Plan document, who were 18 years of age or older. Employees were eligible on the first day of the month following three months of employment to make salary deferrals. The Plan Sponsor also made discretionary contributions to the Plan for participants who met the deferral and matching eligibility. The Plan was subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA).

#### Contributions

Participants were able to elect to contribute a portion of their compensation as a pre-tax deferral or as a Roth post-tax deferral as defined in the Plan, not to exceed the maximum allowed as a deduction for federal income tax purposes. Participants who attained age 50 during the Plan year could make an elective catch-up deferral contribution of up to the maximum dollar limit per the Internal Revenue Code. Participants could also contribute amounts representing distributions from other qualified defined benefit or defined contribution plans (rollover). The Plan Sponsor could make discretionary retirement plan contributions which were determined by management of the Company. The Plan included an auto-enrollment provision whereby all eligible employees were automatically enrolled in the Plan with a deferral rate of 3% unless they elected not to participate in the Plan. The contributions for employees automatically enrolled in the Plan automatically increased by 1% of employee's compensation each year up to a maximum of 10%. Upon enrollment in the Plan, a participant could direct employee contributions and company-matching contributions into any of the available investment options. Participants could change their investment options at their discretion. All of the balances in the Plan represented participant-directed investments. The percentage of deferral could be changed on the first day of each month. Any such change would apply only after its effective date, and after it was executed and filed with the Plan Sponsor. Fund allocations could be changed by the participants at any time.

#### Participant Accounts

Each participant's account was credited with the participant's contribution and employer-provided matching contributions, an allocation of Plan earnings and losses, and an allocation of administrative expenses paid by the Plan. Allocations were based on participant earnings, account balances, or specific participant transactions, as defined in the Plan document. Plan earnings were allocated daily based on each participant's account balance. Additional administrative fees were charged by the custodian upon fund withdrawal. The benefit to which a participant was entitled was the benefit that could be provided from the participant's vested account.

#### Vesting

Participants were immediately vested in their deferrals, and contributions rolled over from other qualified plans, plus actual earnings thereon. Vesting in participants' accounts relating to the Company discretionary matching contributions were based on the years of continuous service. A participant was 100% vested in the Company contribution after five years of credited service or upon death or total and permanent disability.

### Note A - Description of Plan (continued)

#### Investment Options

Participants could direct contributions to any of the investment options offered by the Plan. The investment options included money market and mutual funds. The fund values were computed daily by the custodian and reflected changes in the unit values of the investments.

#### Payment of Benefits

Distributions could be made to a participant only upon (1) termination of employment due to death, total and permanent disability or (2) attaining the age of 59 ½. Withdrawals prior to attaining age 59 ½ were not permitted, except in the event of retirement or as a hardship distribution. Upon proof, to the satisfaction and approval of the plan administrator, of an immediate and heavy financial need, amounts contributed could be withdrawn for hardship purpose to current employees. Withdrawals could only be taken from accounts which are fully vested.

#### Forfeited Accounts

At December 29, 2023, and December 31, 2022, forfeited non-vested accounts totaled \$0 and \$13,817, respectively. These accounts were used to pay for Plan expenses. During the period ended December 29, 2023 and during the year ended December 31, 2022, \$14,133 and \$11,910, respectively, were paid from forfeited non-vested accounts to pay for Plan expenses.

### Note B - Summary of Significant Accounting Policies

#### Basis of Accounting

The financial statements of the Plan are prepared under the accrual method of accounting in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.

#### Use of Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America requires plan management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities and changes therein, and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

#### Withdrawals and Exchanges

Withdrawals and exchanges between investment fund options by participants are recorded based upon the specific proceeds and cost of the investment at the date of withdrawal or exchange.

#### Participant Contribution Receivable

Participant contributions receivable represent participant deferrals withheld prior to December 31, 2022. The balance is based on actual collections subsequent to year end.

#### Employer Contribution Receivable

Employer contributions receivable represent employer matching contributions related to participant deferrals withheld prior to December 31, 2022. The balance is based on actual collections subsequent to year end.

#### Investment Valuation and Income Recognition

The Plan's investments are stated at fair value. All Plan assets were transferred to the Savings Plan before close of business on December 29, 2023. Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. The Plan's investment committee determines the Plan's valuation policies utilizing information provided by the investment advisers and custodians. See note D for discussion of fair value measurements.

### Investment Valuation and Income Recognition (continued)

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Net appreciation includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold as well as held during the year.

### Payment of Benefits

Benefits are recorded when paid.

### Administrative Expenses

Certain expense of maintaining the Plan are paid by the Plan, unless otherwise paid by the Plan Sponsor. Expenses that are paid by the Plan Sponsor are excluded from these financial statements. Investment related expense are included in net appreciation of fair value of investments.

## Note C - Unaudited Information Certified by the Plan Custodian

The December 29, 2023, and December 31, 2022 statements of net assets available for benefits, the investment activities included on the statement of changes in net assets available for benefits for the period ended December 29, 2023, and the accompanying notes to the financial statements were prepared in part or entirely from information certified by the custodian in accordance with 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974. The Plan's investments were held in custodial accounts maintained by Ascensus Trust Company for the period ended December 29, 2023 December 31, 2023 and for the year ended December 31, 2022, and the plan administrator obtained certifications from the custodian for the period and year then ended, respectively. The information certified includes total investments of \$0 and \$6,537,266 at December 29, 2023, and December 31, 2022, respectively, and related net investment income of \$1,394,878 for the period ended December 29, 2023.

## Note D - Fair Value Measurements

FASB ASC Topic 820, *Fair Value Measurements and Disclosures*, establishes a framework for measuring fair value. The framework provides a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (Level 1 measurements) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (Level 3 measurements). The three levels of value hierarchy under FASB ASC Topic 820 are described as follows:

### Level 1 Fair Value Measurements

Inputs to the valuation methodology are unadjusted quoted prices for identical assets or liabilities in active markets that the Plan has the ability to access.

### Level 2 Fair Value Measurements

Inputs to the valuation methodology include:

- quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities in active markets;
- quoted prices for identical or similar assets or liabilities in inactive markets;
- inputs other than quoted prices that are observable for the asset or liability;
- inputs that are delivered principally from or corroborated by correlation or other means.

If the asset or liability has a specified (contractual) term, the level 2 input must be observable for substantially the full term of the asset or liability.

### Level 3 Fair Value Measurements

Inputs to the valuation methodology are unobservable and significant to the fair value measurements.

The asset or liability's fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques used to maximize the use of observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable measurements.

Following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for assets measured at fair value. There have been no changes in the methodologies used at December 31, 2022.

Money Market Funds: Valued at the closing price reported on an actively traded exchange and are valued as level 1.

Mutual Funds: Valued at the daily closing price as reported by the fund. Mutual funds held by the Plan are open-ended mutual funds that are registered with the SEC. These funds are required to publish their daily net asset value (NAV) and to transact at that price. The mutual funds held by the Plan are deemed to be actively traded and are reported as level 1.

The preceding method described may produce fair value calculations that may not be indicative of net realizable value or reflective of future values. Furthermore, although the plan believes its valuation is appropriate and consistent with other market participants, the use of different methodologies or assumptions to determine the fair value could result in a different fair value measurement at the reporting date.

## Note E - Plan Termination

The Plan Sponsor had the right under the Plan to discontinue its contributions at any time and to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions of ERISA. In the event of Plan termination, participants would have become 100% vested in their accounts.

## Note F - Income Tax Status

The master prototype plan from which the Plan was drafted received a favorable determination from the Internal Revenue Service on June 30, 2020. The Plan Administrator believes the Plan was designed, and operated, in compliance with the applicable requirements of the Internal Revenue Code.

### **Note G - Risks and Uncertainties**

The Plan invested in various investment securities. Investment securities are exposed to various risks such as interest rate, market, and credit risks.

### **Note H - Related Party and Party-In Interest Transactions**

Parties-in-interest are defined under Department of Labor regulations as any fiduciary of the Plan, any party rendering services to the Plan, the employer, and certain others. Plan transactions with parties-in-interest included administrative fees paid to the Plan's third-party administrator and custodian, Ascensus.

### **Note I - Subsequent Events**

Subsequent events have been evaluated through October 11, 2024, the date the financial statements are available to be issued.
