No matters have come to our attention that would require us, under professional standards, to inform you about: (1) the methods used to account for significant unusual transactions and (2) the effect of significant accounting policies in controversial or emerging areas for which there is a lack of authoritative guidance or consensus.

Significant Accounting Estimates and Related Disclosures

Accounting estimates and related disclosures are an integral part of the financial statements prepared by management and are based on management's current judgments. Those judgments are normally based on knowledge and experience about past and current events and assumptions about future events. Certain accounting estimates are particularly sensitive because of their significance to the financial statements and because of the possibility that future events affecting them may differ markedly from management's current judgments. The most sensitive accounting estimate affecting the financial statements is:

Fair Value Measurements

Mutual Funds

Investments in Mutual Funds are valued at daily closing prices as reported by the fund. Mutual Funds held by the Plan are open-ended mutual funds that are registered with the SEC. These funds are required to publish their daily net asset value and to transact at that price. Mutual Funds held by the Plan are deemed to be actively traded.

The fair values of investments were certified pursuant to 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA) and were not subject to our audit procedures, based upon the terms of our ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit engagement.

Financial Statement Disclosures

Certain financial statement disclosures involve significant judgment and are particularly sensitive because of their significance to financial statement users. The fair value measurements described above were the most sensitive disclosures affecting the Plan's financial statements.

Significant Unusual Transactions

For purposes of this communication, professional standards require us to communicate to you significant unusual transactions identified during our audit. There were no significant unusual transactions identified as a result of our audit procedures.

Form 5500 Procedures

We are required to obtain and read a substantially complete draft of Form 5500 prior to dating our auditor's report. The purpose of this procedure is to identify any material inconsistencies between the draft Form 5500 and the Plan's financial statements. We identified no material inconsistencies in performing and completing our audit.

Identified or Suspected Fraud

We have not identified or have obtained information that indicates that fraud may have occurred.

Significant Difficulties Encountered During the Audit

We encountered no significant difficulties in dealing with management relating to the performance of the audit.

Uncorrected and Corrected Misstatements

For purposes of this communication, professional standards also require us to accumulate all known and likely misstatements identified during the audit, other than those that we believe are trivial, and communicate them to the appropriate level of management. Further, professional standards require us to also communicate the effect of uncorrected misstatements related to prior periods on the relevant classes of transactions, account balances or disclosures, and the financial statements as a whole. There were no such misstatements requiring communication.

In addition, professional standards require us to communicate to you all material, corrected misstatements that were brought to the attention of management as a result of our audit procedures. There were no such misstatements requiring communication.

Disagreements With Management

For purposes of this letter, professional standards define a disagreement with management as a matter, whether or not resolved to our satisfaction, concerning a financial accounting, reporting, or auditing matter, which could be significant to the Plan's financial statements or the auditor's report. No such disagreements arose during the course of the audit.

Circumstances that Affect the Form and Content of the Auditor's Report

For purposes of this letter, professional standards require that we communicate any circumstances that affect the form and content of our auditor's report.

Representations Requested from Management

We have requested certain written representations from management, which are included in the management representation letter dated October 14, 2024.

Management's Consultations With Other Accountants

In some cases, management may decide to consult with other accountants about auditing and accounting matters. Management informed us that, and to our knowledge, there were no consultations with other accountants regarding auditing and accounting matters.

Other Significant Matters, Findings or Issues

We noted that certain IRS compliance testing has not been completed for the Plan as of the date the financial statements were issued. The Plan Sponsor has indicated that all such tests will be completed no later than December 31, 2024, and any necessary corrective actions needed to maintain the Plan's qualified status will be made by such date.

In the normal course of our professional association with the Plan, we generally discuss a variety of matters, including the application of accounting principles and auditing standards, significant events or transactions that occurred during the year, business conditions affecting the Plan, and business plans and strategies that may affect the risks of material misstatement. None of the matters discussed resulted in a condition to our retention as the Plan's auditors.

The Plan merger was completed on December 8, 2023, when the Plan assets were transferred to the Easterseals MORC 401(k) Plan.

Other Matters

Our responsibility also includes communicating to you any information which we believe is a material misstatement of fact. Nothing came to our attention that caused us to believe that such information, or its manner of presentation, is materially inconsistent with the information, or manner of its presentation, appearing in the financial statements.

This information is intended solely for the use of the Plan Administrator and management of the Macomb-Oakland Regional Center Money Purchase Plan and is not intended to be and should not be used by anyone other than these specified parties.

Scope and Nature of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) Audit

We have performed audits of the financial statements of the Macomb-Oakland Regional Center Money Purchase Plan, an employee benefit plan subject to the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA), as permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) (ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit). The financial statements comprise the statements of net assets available for benefits as of December 8, 2023 (liquidation date) and December 31, 2022, and the related statement of changes in net assets available for benefits for the period January 1, 2023 through December 8, 2023, and the related notes to the financial statements.

Management, having determined it is permissible in the circumstances, has elected to have the audits of the financial statements performed in accordance with ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) pursuant to 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. As permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C), our audits need not extend to any statements or information related to assets held for investment of the Plan (investment information) by a bank or similar institution or insurance carrier that is regulated, supervised, and subject to periodic examination by a state or federal agency, provided that the statements or information regarding assets so held are prepared and certified by the bank or similar institution or insurance carrier in accordance with 29 CFR 2520.103-5 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA (qualified institution).

NOTES TO FINANCIAL STATEMENTS DECEMBER 8, 2023 AND DECEMBER 31, 2022

Note 1 – Description of the Plan

General

The Plan is a defined contribution plan that was established on June 1, 1996, by Macomb-Oakland Regional Center, Inc. (the “Organization”). The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974, as amended (ERISA). The following description of the Plan is provided for general information purposes only. Participants should refer to the Summary Plan Description or the Adoption Agreement, including amendments thereto, for a complete description of the Plan’s provisions.

Administration

The Plan Sponsor and named Plan Administrator is Macomb-Oakland Regional Center, Inc. Effective October 1, 2022, the Plan Sponsor merged with another non-profit organization, Easter Seals – Michigan, Inc., to form Easterseals MORC. Refer to Note 7 for discussion regarding the plan merger.

The Plan Administrator is responsible for oversight of the Plan. The Plan Administrator determines the appropriateness of the Plan’s investment offerings, monitors investment performance and fees, and reports to the Plan’s Trustee. The Plan’s Trustee and Investment Custodian is VALIC Trust Company Inc. The Investment Custodian holds all of the Plan’s assets and executes all of the Plan’s transactions. The Organization has also retained VALIC Retirement Services to provide participant recordkeeping and administration services.

Eligibility

The Plan covers all employees of the Employer, other than employees considered leased, interns, cooperative students, vocational workers, or independent contractors. There are no minimum age or service requirements to become a participant in the Plan.

Contributions to the Plan

Employees were eligible to receive employer contributions regardless of employment status on the date of plan merger. The Organization contributed 10% of each participant’s eligible compensation from January 1, 2023 through September 30, 2023, subject to certain limitations. The Plan has met the minimum funding requirement under the terms of the plan document. The Organization’s contributions are invested as directed by participants. No employee elective contributions are allowed. Participants may make contributions to the Plan in the form of a rollover of funds from another qualified plan.

Participants direct the investment of their share of employer contributions into the various investment options offered by the Plan. Contributions are subject to certain Internal Revenue Service (IRS) limitations.

Participant Accounts

Each participant’s account is credited with the employer contributions as well as plan earnings. Participant accounts are charged with an allocation of administrative expenses that are paid by the Plan. Allocations are based on participant earnings, account balances, or specific participant transactions, as defined. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant’s vested account.

Distribution of Benefits

On termination of service, participants with vested account balances of \$1,000 or less are subject to involuntary cash-outs, in which automatic distribution of their account balance will occur without direct consent unless they elect a rollover. Participants whose vested account balances are \$5,000 or less may elect a lump sum distribution or rollover of their account balance to another qualified account. Participants whose vested account balances exceed \$5,000 are paid in the form of a joint and survivor annuity if a participant is married or as a life annuity if the participant is single. Alternatively, a participant may elect a lump sum distribution, periodic equal installment payments, a partial withdrawal, or a rollover of their account balance to another qualified account. However, all forms of distributions are subject to the Qualified Joint and Survivor Annuity requirements as defined in the plan document. Additionally, they may also elect to defer the distribution of their plan balance. Participants who elect to have their benefit payments deferred continue to share in allocations of investment income and losses. Special rules apply to distributions due to death, disability and retirement. Participants should refer to the full plan document for details.

The Plan allows for in-service distributions upon attainment of age 62 for all employer contributions and rollover contributions for any reason.

Vesting

Participants are immediately vested in rollover contributions and earnings thereon. Vesting in the Organization's contributions is based on a cliff vesting schedule, with participants becoming 100% vested after 3 years of credited service. Participants also become 100% vested upon death, disability, or attainment of normal retirement age of 62.

Forfeitures

Forfeitures can be used to offset plan administration expenses and reduce employer contributions. Forfeitures of \$-0- were used to offset plan administrative expenses and \$134,579 were used to reduce employer contributions during the period January 1, 2023 through December 8, 2023.

Note 2 – Summary of Significant Accounting Policies

Basis of Accounting

The financial statements are prepared using the accrual basis of accounting. Income from investments is recorded when it is earned. Expenses are recorded in the accounting period in which they are incurred.

Use of Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities at the date of the financial statements and the reported amounts of revenues and expenses during the reporting period. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

Investment Valuation and Income Recognition

Investments are reported at fair value, except for the fully benefit-responsive investment contract, which is reported at contract value. Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. The Plan's Investment Committee determines the Plan's valuation policies utilizing information provided by the investment advisers and Custodian. See Note 4 for a discussion of fair value measurements.

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Net appreciation or depreciation in fair value of investments includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold as well as held during the period.

Payment of Benefits

Benefits are recorded when paid.

Fees and Expenses

Certain expenses of maintaining the Plan are paid by the Plan, unless otherwise paid by the Organization. Expenses that are paid by the Organization are excluded from these financial statements. Investment related expenses are included in net appreciation or depreciation in fair value of investments.

Subsequent Events

The financial statements and related disclosures include evaluation of events up through and including October 14, 2024, which is the date the financial statements were available to be issued.

Note 3 – Unaudited Investment Information Certified by the Custodian

Plan management has elected the method of compliance permitted by 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. As permitted under such election, the following information has been certified by VALIC Trust Company Inc. as to its completeness and accuracy and was not subjected to any auditing procedures performed by the Plan's independent auditors:

1. All investment balances reflected in the accompanying statements of net assets available for benefits as of December 8, 2023 and December 31, 2022; and
2. All investment activity reflected in the statement of changes in net assets available for benefits for the period January 1, 2023 through December 8, 2023.

Note 4 – Fair Value Measurements

The framework for measuring fair value provides a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (Level 1 measurement) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (Level 3 measurement). The three levels of the fair value hierarchy under FASB ASC 820 are described below:

Level 1 – Inputs to the valuation methodology are unadjusted quoted prices for identical assets or liabilities in active markets that the Plan has the ability to access.

Level 2 – Inputs to the valuation methodology include quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities in active markets, quoted prices for identical assets or liabilities in inactive markets, inputs other than quoted prices that are observable for the asset or liability, or inputs that are derived principally from or corroborated by observable market data by correlation or other means. If the asset or liability has a specified contractual term, the Level 2 input must be observable for substantially the full term of the asset or liability.

Level 3 – Inputs to the valuation methodology are unobservable and significant to the fair value measurement.

The following is a description of the valuation methods used for assets measured at fair value. There have been no changes in the methodologies used at December 8, 2023 and December 31, 2022.

Mutual Funds

The Plan's investments measured at fair value consist solely of mutual funds that are measured on a recurring basis using Level 1 inputs. Mutual Funds are valued at daily closing prices as reported by the fund. Mutual Funds held by the Plan are open-ended mutual funds that are registered with the SEC. These funds are required to publish their daily net asset value and to transact at that price. Mutual Funds held by the Plan are deemed to be actively traded.

Note 5 – Fully Benefit-Responsive Investment Contract

The Plan has entered into a fully benefit-responsive investment contract with VALIC Retirement Services with regard to the VALIC Fixed Interest Option. VALIC maintains the contributions in a general account. The account is credited with earnings on the underlying investments and charged for participant withdrawals and administration expenses. The issuer is contractually obligated to repay the principal and a specified interest rate that is guaranteed to the Plan and set in response to specific characteristics, plan specific elections and other factors.

Because the contract is fully benefit-responsive, contract value is the relevant measurement attribute for that portion of the net assets available for benefits attributable to the investment contract. Contract value, as reported to the Plan by VALIC, represents contributions made under the contract, plus earnings, less participant withdrawals and administration expenses. Participants may ordinarily direct the withdrawal or transfer of all or a portion of their investment at contract value.

In the event that the full value of the account could not be paid upon demand, such as amounts subject to the Fixed Income Account Market Value Adjustment, the “fair value” estimates are based upon the “demand value” for the contract. The “demand value” is the amount due to the contract holder under the surrender provisions of the contract.

Certain events may limit the ability of the Plan to transact at contract value with VALIC. Such events include: 1) amendments to the plan document, including complete or partial termination or merger of the Plan, 2) activity such as bankruptcy that causes significant withdrawals from the Plan or contract, and 3) the failure of the Plan to continue to qualify for tax-exempt status. The Plan Administrator does not believe it is probable that the plan merger described in Note 7, or any other events, limited the Plan’s ability to transact at contract value with participants.

Interest is credited to the Fixed Interest Option using a single portfolio rate approach. Under this methodology, a single interest crediting rate is applied to all contributions made to the product regardless of the timing of those contributions. Interest crediting rates are reviewed on a monthly basis for resetting but may not be less than 1.5 percent.

Note 6 – Party-in-Interest Transactions

Certain plan investments are managed by VALIC Trust Company Inc., who is the Plan’s Trustee and Investment Custodian. During the period January 1, 2023 through December 8, 2023, the Plan paid direct compensation to the Investment Custodian for services rendered. Indirect compensation (that is netted against investment income on the statement of changes in net assets available for benefits) is paid to the Investment Custodian from total annual operating expenses charged on the balance of fund investments, depending on the particular fund. Transactions involving these investments are considered party-in-interest transactions; however, these transactions are not considered prohibited transactions under 29 CFR 408(b) of the ERISA regulations.

Note 7 – Plan Merger

The plan merger was completed on December 8, 2023, when the plan assets were transferred to the Easterseals MORC 401(k) Plan.

Note 8 – Plan Amendment and Tax Status

The Plan is utilizing a pre-approved plan, which has been filed with the IRS and has received a favorable opinion letter dated June 30, 2020 from the IRS. The Plan Sponsor has not elected to apply for an individual IRS Determination Letter upon adoption of the Plan nor on any subsequent amendments. However, the Plan Sponsor believes that the Plan is currently designed and being operated in compliance with applicable requirements of the Internal Revenue Code and, therefore, that the Plan is qualified under Section 401(a) and that the related Trust is tax-exempt as of December 8, 2023.

The plan document was most recently amended for the plan merger, effective September 30, 2023.

Certain IRS compliance testing has not been completed for the Plan as of the date these financial statements were issued. The Plan Sponsor has indicated that all such tests will be completed no later than December 31, 2024, and any necessary corrective actions needed to maintain the Plan’s qualified status will be made by such date.

Accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America require plan management to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan and recognize a tax liability if the Plan has taken an uncertain position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by the applicable taxing authorities. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress.

Note 9 – Significant Concentrations

Investments representing 10% or more of the Plan's net assets available for benefits are considered to be significant concentrations and are as follows at December 31, 2022:
