Scope and Nature of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) Audit

We have performed the audits of the financial statements of The Connell Limited Partnership Employee Retirement Savings Plan ("the Plan"), an employee benefit plan subject to the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 ("ERISA"), as permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) ("ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit"). Basis for Opinion

We are required to be independent of the Plan and to meet our other ethical responsibilities, in accordance with the relevant ethical requirements relating to our audits. We believe that the audit evidence we have obtained is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for our ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit opinion.

Responsibilities of Management for the Financial Statements

Notes to Financial Statements

Note 1 - Description of Plan

The following description of the Connell Limited Partnership Employee Retirement Savings Plan (the "Plan") provides only general information. Participants should refer to the Plan agreement for a more complete description of the Plan's provisions.

General

The Plan is a defined contribution plan that was established by Connell Limited Partnership (the "Employer"). Employees are eligible to participate in the Plan upon date of hire ("Participants"). Non-resident aliens, leased employees, full-time college students participating in internship and cooperative study programs and certain employees of companies affiliated through common ownership are not eligible to participate in the Plan. The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA). Substantially all investments are participant-directed.

Participant Contributions

The Plan allows participants to defer up to 100% of their annual pre-tax compensation as defined by the Plan, up to a dollar limit set by Federal law. The Plan also allows for Roth contributions and non-deductible deferral contributions. Participants who have attained age 50 before the end of the Plan year are eligible to make catch-up contributions up to \$7,500.

The Plan includes an auto-enrollment provision whereby all newly eligible employees are automatically enrolled in the Plan unless they affirmatively elect not to participate in the Plan. Newly eligible employees are automatically enrolled in the Plan at a deferral rate of 5%, and there is an automatic increase of 1% per year up to a maximum of 15% unless alternative elections are made. Active participants may also contribute amounts representing distributions from other qualified plans ("Participant Rollovers").

Employer Matching Contributions

Each year, the Employer, at its discretion, determines the amount of Employer matching contributions. The Employer matches 100% of salary deferrals, up to 3% of eligible compensation, and 50% of salary deferrals for the next 2% of eligible compensation for a maximum total match of 4% for all eligible Connell Limited Partnership participants. SencorpWhite, Accu-Seal SencorpWhite, Inc., Intek Integration Technologies, Inc., and Minerva Associates, Inc. participants were eligible for a match of 60% of salary deferrals up to 5% of eligible compensation for a maximum total match of 3%.

Note 1 - Description of Plan (Continued)

Employer Contributions

Each year, the Employer may elect to make Employer contributions to the Plan for eligible employees. There were no Employer contributions made during 2023.

Employer Profit Sharing Contributions

Each year, the Employer may elect to make discretionary profit-sharing contributions to the Plan for eligible employees. There were no profit-sharing contributions made during 2023.

Participant Accounts

Each participant's account is credited with the participant's contributions, Employer contributions and a pro-rata allocation of the administrative fees and investment earnings. Allocations are based on participant earnings, account balances, or specific participant transactions, as defined. Quarterly recordkeeping fees are charged to each participant's account. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant's vested account.

Vesting

Participants are always fully vested in their deferral, rollover contributions, Employer matching contributions and profit sharing contributions plus actual earnings thereon. Prior to August 1, 2017, participants vested in profit sharing contributions at a rate of 20% per year.

Forfeitures

A participant who leaves the employ of the Employer forfeits any non-vested balance. Forfeited account balances may be used to pay the Plan's administrative expenses with any remainder used to reduce Employer contributions. At December 31, 2023 and 2022, unused forfeited balances amounted to \$9,365 and \$3,705, respectively. During the year ended December 31, 2023, \$2,052 of forfeitures were used to offset employer matching contributions.

Payment of Benefits

In-service withdrawals from a participant's elective deferral account are permitted only due to financial hardship or upon reaching age 59½. Hardship withdrawals may be taken from a participant's vested account. Upon termination of service, a participant may elect to receive a lump-sum amount equal to the value of his or her vested account balance. Upon termination, if a participant's vested account balance exceeds \$1,000 but does not exceed \$5,000, and the participant does not elect to have the distribution paid directly to an eligible plan, the Plan administrator may make a lump-sum distribution to a direct rollover individual retirement account. If the balance is \$1,000 or less, it will be automatically distributed to the Participant.

Note 1 - Description of Plan (Continued)

Notes Receivable from Participants

Participants may borrow a minimum of \$1,000 up to a maximum equal to the lesser of \$50,000 or 50% of their vested account balance. Loan terms range from one to five years (or up to ten years for the purchase of a primary residence). No more than one loan may be outstanding at a time. The loans are secured by the balance in the Participant's account and bear interest at a rate commensurate with local prevailing rates, as determined by the Plan administrator. Principal and interest are paid ratably through payroll deductions.

Plan Administration

The Employer is the Plan administrator and has the authority to appoint person(s) or entities to carry out the operation of the Plan. Vanguard Fiduciary Trust Company serves as the Plan's trustee and custodian.

Administrative Expenses

Individual participant accounts are charged directly for loan recordkeeping and benefit disbursement processing fees, if applicable, as well as for a recordkeeping fee charged quarterly. Investment related expenses are included in net appreciation in fair value of investments. Substantially all operating expenses incurred in the administration of the Plan are paid out of the Plan unless paid directly by the Employer.

Note 2 - Summary of Significant Accounting Policies

Basis of Presentation

The financial statements of the Plan are prepared on the accrual basis in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.

Investments, Investment Valuation and Income Recognition

Investments are reported at fair value. Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. The Plan administrator determines the Plan's valuation policies utilizing information provided by the custodian. See Note 4 for discussions of fair value measurements.

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Net appreciation includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold as well as investments held during the year.

Benefits Paid

Benefits are recorded when paid.

Notes Receivable from Participants

Notes receivable from participants are measured at their unpaid principal balance plus any accrued but unpaid interest. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Related fees are recorded as administrative expenses and are expensed when they are incurred. No allowance for credit losses has been recorded as of December 31, 2023 and 2022.

Use of Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America requires Plan management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts and disclosures. Accordingly, actual results could vary from the estimates that were used.

Subsequent Events

The Plan administrator has evaluated subsequent events through October 14, 2024, the date that the financial statements were available to be issued. No significant matters were identified for disclosure during the evaluation.

Note 3 – Information Certified by the Trustee and Custodian

Plan investments are held by the Plan's trustee and custodian, Vanguard Fiduciary Trust Company ("Vanguard"). Vanguard has certified to the fair value of all investments at December 31, 2023 and 2022, and investment transactions during the year ended December 31, 2023. Investment transactions include interest and dividend income and net appreciation in fair value of investments. Information included in the Supplemental Schedule of Assets (Held at End of Year) and notes receivable from participants has also been derived from information certified by Vanguard. The Plan offers investment choices to allow participants to create a diversified portfolio of assets based on the participants' risk tolerance.

The Plan's independent public accountants did not perform auditing procedures with respect to this information, except for comparing such information to the related information included in the financial statements and supplemental schedule.

Note 4 - Fair Value Measurements

The framework for measuring fair value provides a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (Level 1) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (Level 3). The three levels of the fair value hierarchy are described below:

Level 1 Inputs to the valuation methodology are unadjusted quoted prices for identical assets or liabilities in active markets that the Plan has the ability to access.

Level 2 Inputs to the valuation methodology include:

- quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities in active markets;
- quoted prices for identical or similar assets or liabilities in inactive markets;
- inputs other than quoted prices that are observable for the asset or liability;
- inputs that are derived principally from or corroborated by observable market data by correlation or other means.

If the asset or liability has a specified (contractual) term, the Level 2 input must be observable for substantially the full term of the asset or liability.

Level 3 Inputs to the valuation methodology are unobservable and significant to the fair value measurement.

The asset or liability's fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques used need to maximize the use of observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs.

Following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for assets measured at fair value. There have been no changes in the methodologies used at December 31, 2023 and 2022.

Mutual funds: Valued at the daily closing price as reported by the fund. Mutual funds held by the Plan are open-end mutual funds that are registered with the Securities and Exchange Commission. These funds are required to publish their daily Net Asset Value ("NAV") and to transact at that price. The mutual funds held by the Plan are deemed to be actively traded.

Stable value common/collective trust: A stable value fund that is composed primarily of indirect fully benefit-responsive investment contracts is valued at the NAV of units of the collective trust. The NAV, as provided by the trustee and custodian, is used as a practical expedient to estimate fair value. The NAV is based on the fair value of the underlying investments held by the fund less its liabilities. The practical expedient is not used when it is determined to be probable that the fund will sell the investment for an amount different than the reported NAV. Participant transactions (purchases and sales) may occur daily. If the Plan initiates a full redemption of the collective trust, the issuer reserves the right to require 12 months' notification in order to ensure that securities liquidations will be carried out in an orderly business manner.

Note 5 - Risks and Uncertainties

The Plan invests in various investment securities. Investment securities are exposed to various risks such as interest rate, market and credit risks. Market risks include global events such as a pandemic or international conflict which could impact the value of investment securities. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the values of investment securities will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect participants' account balances and the amounts reported in the Statements of Net Assets Available for Benefits.

Note 6 - Related-Party Transactions and Party-In-Interest Transactions

Certain Plan investments are shares of mutual funds and units in a common/collective trust managed by Vanguard Fiduciary Trust Company ("Vanguard"). The Employer has engaged Vanguard to serve as the trustee and custodian of the Plan and, therefore, these transactions qualify as party-in-interest. During the Plan year ended December 31, 2023, \$33,641 of administrative expenses were incurred by the Plan to Vanguard and other service providers. In addition, notes receivable from participants also qualify as exempt party-in-interest transactions, as defined by ERISA. Fees incurred by the Plan for the investment management services are included in net appreciation in fair value of the investments, as they are paid through revenue sharing, rather than a direct payment.

Note 7 - Plan Termination

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the Employer has the right under the Plan to discontinue its contributions at any time and terminate the Plan subject to the provisions of ERISA. In the event of Plan termination, participants will become fully vested in their accounts. Any unallocated assets of the Plan shall be allocated to participant accounts and distributed in such a manner as the Employer may determine.

Note 8 - Tax Status

The Plan has adopted the Vanguard Fiduciary Trust Company Prototype Basic Plan Document which obtained its latest opinion letter on June 30, 2020, in which the Internal Revenue Service stated that the Plan, as then designed, was in compliance with the applicable requirements of the Internal Revenue Code (the "Code"). Although the Plan has been amended since receiving the opinion letter, the Plan administrator believes that the Plan is currently designed and being operated in compliance with the applicable requirements of the Code and that, therefore, the Plan continues to qualify under Section 401(a) and the related trust continues to be tax exempt. Therefore, no provision for income taxes has been included in the Plan's financial statements.

Accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America require Plan management to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan and recognize a tax liability (or asset) if the Plan has taken an uncertain tax position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by the IRS. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress.
