Scope and Nature of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) Audit

We have performed audits of the financial statements of RGV Adult & Internal Medicine Specialist, PA 401(k) Profit Sharing Plan (Plan), an employee benefit plan subject to the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA), as permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) (ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit). As a result, the Plan has changed its basis used in presenting the 2023 financial statements. Our opinion is not modified with respect to this matter.

Responsibilities of Management for the Financial Statements

Management is responsible for the preparation and fair presentation of the financial statements in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America, and for the design, implementation, and maintenance of internal control relevant to the preparation and fair presentation of financial statements that are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error. Management's election of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit does not affect management's responsibility for the financial statements.

In preparing the financial statements, management is required to evaluate whether there are conditions or events, considered in the aggregate, which raise substantial doubt about the Plan's ability to continue as a going concern within one year after the date that these financial statements are available to be issued.

Note 1: Description of the Plan

General

The following description of RGV Adult & Internal Medicine Specialists, PA 401(k) Profit Sharing Plan (Plan) provides only general information. Participants should refer to the Plan Document for a more complete description of the Plan's provisions.

The Plan is a defined contribution plan sponsored by RGV Adult & Internal Medicine Specialists, PA (Company) for the benefit of its employees who have at least one year of service and are age 21 or older. The Plan is subject to the provisions of the *Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974* (ERISA). Empower Annuity Insurance Company of America (Empower) serves as the Plan custodian.

Contributions

The Plan permits eligible employees through a salary deferral election to have the Company make annual contributions, subject to a maximum dollar limit, as determined under the Internal Revenue Code (IRC) regulations. Employee rollover contributions are also permitted. Participants who have attained age 50 before the end of the plan year are eligible to make catch-up contributions. The Company makes safe harbor nonelective contribution of 3% of employees' compensation. In addition, the Company may make discretionary matching contributions as determined. During the period and year ending November 30, 2023 (in Liquidation) and December 31, 2022 (ongoing), the Company did not make any discretionary matching contributions. Contributions are subject to certain limitations.

Plan Termination

During July 2023, the Company approved a resolution to terminate the Plan. In August 2023, the Company sent a notice of plan termination to all participants. The final withholdings were withheld from the payroll dated July 28, 2023. All participants as of the effective date were distributed from the plan.

Participant Investment Account Options

Each participant has the option of directing their contributions into any of the various investment options offered by the Plan and may change the allocation daily.

The Plan Document also includes an automatic deferral feature whereby a participant is treated as electing to defer 5% of eligible compensation.

Participant Accounts

Each participant's account is credited with the participant's contribution, the Company's contributions and plan earnings and is charged with an allocation of administrative expenses. Allocations are based on participant earnings or account balances, as defined. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant's vested account.

Vesting

Participants are immediately vested in their voluntary contributions, including rollover contributions, and the Company's safe harbor contributions, plus earnings thereon. Vesting in the Company's discretionary matching contributions, plus earnings thereon, is based on years of service. A participant is fully vested after meeting the six years of continuous service.

Payment of Benefits

Upon termination of service due to death, disability or retirement, or termination of employment a participant may elect to receive either a lump-sum amount equal to the value of the vested interest in their account or annual installments over a 5-year period. Upon termination of service for other reasons, a participant may receive the value of the vested interest in their account only as a lump-sum distribution.

Forfeited Accounts

At November 30, 2023 (in Liquidation) and December 31, 2022 (ongoing), forfeited nonvested accounts totaled \$0 and \$10,590, respectively. These accounts will be used to reduce future employer contributions/reallocated to participants in the same manner as employer contributions. Also, in 2022, employer contributions were reduced by \$462 from forfeited nonvested accounts.

Note 2: Summary of Significant Accounting Policies

Basis of Accounting

The accompanying financial statements are prepared on the liquidation basis of accounting for 2023 and the accrual basis of accounting for 2022.

Use of Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of net assets, changes in net assets and the disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities at the date of the financial statements. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

Investment Valuation and Income Recognition

Investments are reported at fair value. Quoted market prices, if available, are used to value investments. Mutual funds are valued at the net asset value (NAV) of shares held by the Plan at year-end.

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Net appreciation (depreciation) in the fair value of investments includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold as well as held during the year.

Notes Receivable from Participants

Notes receivable from participants are reported at their unpaid principal balance plus any accrued but unpaid interest. Delinquent participant loans are reclassified as distributions based upon the terms of the Plan Document. As of November 30, 2023 (in Liquidation) and December 31, 2022 (Ongoing), all notes receivable from participants have been distributed from the plan.

Payment of Benefits

Benefit payments to participants are recorded upon distribution.

Administrative Expenses

Administrative expenses are paid by the Company.

Note 3: Certification of Plan Custodian

The plan administrator has elected the method of annual reporting compliance permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) pursuant to 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. Accordingly, Empower, a qualified institution, has certified the following investment information included in the accompanying financial statements is complete and accurate:

- Investments and as shown in the statements of net assets available for benefits as of November 30, 2023 (in Liquidation) and December 31, 2022 (Ongoing).
- Investment income (loss) as shown in the statements of changes in net assets available for benefits for the period and year ended November 30, 2023 (in Liquidation) and December 31, 2022 (Ongoing).

The Plan's independent auditors did not perform auditing procedures with respect to this certified investment information, except for comparing such certified investment information to the related investment information included in the financial statements.

Note 4: Related-Party and Party-in-Interest Transactions

Party-in-interest transactions include those with fiduciaries or employees of the Plan, any person who provides services to the Plan, an employer whose employees are covered by the Plan, an employee organization whose members are covered by the Plan, a person who owns 50% or more of such an employer or employee association or relatives of such persons.

Certain Plan investments are shares of mutual funds managed by Empower. Empower is the custodian as defined by the Plan and, therefore, these transactions qualify as party-in-interest transactions. Fees incurred by the Plan for the investment management services are included in net appreciation (depreciation) in fair value of the investment. The Company directly pays any other fees related to the Plan's operations. The Company also provides certain administrative services at no cost to the Plan.

Note 5: Disclosures About Fair Value of Plan Assets

Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. Fair value measurements must maximize the use of observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs. The hierarchy comprises three levels of inputs that may be used to measure fair value:

- Level 1** Quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities
- Level 2** Observable inputs other than Level 1 prices, such as quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities, quoted prices in markets that are not active, or other inputs that are observable or can be corroborated by observable market data for substantially the full term of the assets or liabilities
- Level 3** Unobservable inputs supported by little or no market activity and that are significant to the fair value of the assets or liabilities

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Recurring Measurements

Following is a description of the valuation methodologies and inputs used for assets measured at fair value on a recurring basis and recognized in the accompanying statements of net assets available for benefits, as well as the general classification of such assets pursuant to the valuation hierarchy. There have been no significant changes in the valuation techniques during the period and year ended November 30, 2023 (in Liquidation) and December 31, 2022 (Ongoing). The Plan had no liabilities measured at fair value on a recurring basis. In addition, the Plan had no assets or liabilities measured at fair value on a nonrecurring basis.

Investments

Where quoted market prices are available in an active market, securities are classified within Level 1 of the valuation hierarchy. If quoted market prices are not available, then fair values are estimated by using quoted prices of securities with similar characteristics or independent asset pricing services and pricing models, the inputs of which are market-based or independently sourced market parameters, including, but not limited to, yield curves, interest rates, volatilities, prepayments, defaults, cumulative loss projections and cash flows. Such securities are classified in Level 2 of the valuation hierarchy. In certain cases where Level 1 or Level 2 inputs are not available, securities are classified within Level 3 of the hierarchy.

Note 6: Tax Status

The Plan operates under a nonstandardized adoption agreement in connection with a prototype retirement plan and custodial document sponsored by Empower. This prototype plan document has been filed with the appropriate agency. The Plan has not obtained or requested a determination letter. However, the Plan Administrator believes that the Plan is currently designed and being operated in compliance with the applicable requirements of the Internal Revenue Code and that the Plan was qualified, and the related trust was tax exempt as of the financial statement date.

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Note 7: Nonexempt Transactions

Defined contribution plans are required to remit employee contributions to the Plan as soon as they can be reasonably segregated from the employer's general assets, but no later than the 15th business day of the month following the month in which the participant contributions are withheld by the employer. While the Company remitted all employee contributions to the Plan, employee contributions of \$61,010 and loan payments of \$196, were not remitted within the required time period for the year ended December 31, 2022 (Ongoing). While the Company remitted all employee contributions to the Plan, employee contributions of \$88,535 and loan payments of \$1,069, were not remitted within the required time period for the year ended December 31, 2021 (Ongoing).

Note 8: Risks and Uncertainties

The Plan invests in various investment securities. Investment securities are exposed to various risks such as interest rate, market, and credit risks. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the values of investment securities will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect the participants' account balances, and the amounts reported in the statements of net assets available for benefits.

Note 9: Subsequent Events

Subsequent events have been evaluated through October 15, 2024, which is the date the financial statements were available to be issued.
