We have performed audits of the financial statements of Symplr 401(k) Plan and Trust (the Plan), an employee benefit plan subject to the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA), as permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) (ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit). The financial statements comprise the statements of net assets available for benefits as of December 31, 2023 and 2022, the related statement of changes in net assets available for benefits for the year ended December 31, 2023, and the related notes to the financial statements.

Management, having determined it is permissible in the circumstances, has elected to have the audits of the Plan's financial statements performed in accordance with ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) pursuant to 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor's (DOL) Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. Notes to Financial Statements

Note 1. Description of Plan

The following description of the Symlr 401(k) Plan and Trust (the Plan) provides only general information. Participants should refer to the Plan agreement for a more complete description of the Plan's provisions.

General: The Plan is a defined contribution plan covering employees of Vendor Credentialing Service, LLC d/b/a Symlr and certain affiliated companies (the Company) who are age 21 or older, excluding union employees, leased employees, and nonresident aliens. The Board of Trustees is responsible for the oversight of the Plan. The Board of Trustees determines the appropriateness of the Plan's investment offerings and monitors investment performance.

The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA).

Contributions: Each year, participants may contribute up to 100% of pretax (or after-tax Roth) annual compensation, as defined in the Plan. Participants who have attained age 50 before the end of the Plan year are eligible to make catch-up contributions. Participants may also contribute amounts representing distributions from other qualified defined benefit or defined contribution plans (rollovers). Participants direct the investment of their contributions into various investment options offered by the Plan. The Plan includes an auto-enrollment provision whereby all newly eligible employees are automatically enrolled in the Plan unless they affirmatively elect not to participate in the Plan. Automatically enrolled participants have their deferral rate set at 5% of eligible compensation and their contributions invested in a designated balanced fund until changed by the participant. Automatically enrolled participants will receive a 1% increase annually to their deferral, up to a maximum of 10%.

The Company makes safe harbor matching contributions equal to 100% of the first 4% of participant deferrals, and 50% of the next 2% of deferrals. Additional profit sharing amounts may be contributed at the option of the Company. No profit sharing contributions were made in 2023. Contributions are subject to certain Internal Revenue Service (IRS) limitations.

Participants direct the investment of contributions into various investment options offered by the Plan. At December 31, 2023 and 2022, these options include various mutual funds, common collective trust funds, and a guaranteed investment contract. Participants may change their investment options daily.

Participant accounts: Each participant's account is credited with the participant's contributions and Company matching contributions, as well as allocations of the Company's profit sharing contribution, if any, and Plan earnings. Participant accounts are charged with an allocation of administrative expenses that are paid by the Plan. Allocations are based on participant earnings, account balances, or specific participant transactions, as defined. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant's vested account.

Vesting: Participants are vested immediately in their contributions plus actual earnings thereon. Participants also are vested immediately in their Company's safe harbor contribution portion of their account. Vesting in the Company's matching (other than safe harbor matching) and profit sharing contribution portion of their accounts is based on years of continuous service. A participant is 100% vested after six years of credited service.

Notes receivable from participants: Participants may borrow from their fund accounts a minimum of \$1,000 up to a maximum equal to the lesser of \$50,000 or 50% of their vested account balance. The loans are secured by the balance in the participant's account. The loan interest rate is set at 1% above the prime rate, as defined. Principal and interest are paid ratably through payroll deductions.

Note 1. Description of Plan (Continued)

Payment of benefits: On termination of service, death, disability, or retirement, a participant may elect to receive a lump-sum amount equal to the value of the participant's vested interest in their account. The Plan will make a mandatory distribution of account balances that are \$5,000 or less. In-service distributions are permissible from the Plan for participants that have obtained the age of 59½. Participants electing in-service distributions may elect to receive all or a portion of their vested benefits in a lump-sum payment. In-service distributions from a participant's rollover contribution account are also permitted under the Plan. In addition, hardship distributions are permitted under specific circumstances.

Forfeited accounts: At December 31, 2023, forfeited nonvested accounts totaled \$5,405. At December 31, 2022, forfeited nonvested accounts totaled \$20,424. These accounts will be used to reduce future Company contributions or pay Plan expenses. In 2023, Company contributions were reduced by \$36,791 from forfeited nonvested accounts.

Note 2. Significant Accounting Policies

Basis of accounting: The financial statements of the Plan are prepared on the accrual basis of accounting.

Use of estimates: The preparation of financial statements in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of net available for benefits and changes therein. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

Investment valuation and income recognition: Investments are reported at fair value (except for fully benefit-responsive investment contracts, which are reported at contract value). Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. The Plan's Investment Committee determines the Plan's valuation policies utilizing information provided by the investment advisers and custodian. See Note 4 for further discussion of fair value measurements.

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Net appreciation includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold as well as held during the year.

Notes receivable from participants: Notes receivable from participants are measured at their unpaid principal balance plus any accrued but unpaid interest. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Related fees are recorded as administrative expenses and are expensed when they are incurred. No allowance for credit losses has been recorded as of December 31, 2023 or 2022.

Contributions: Participant contributions and safe harbor matching contributions on participant contributions are recognized in the period the participant contributions are withheld from compensation.

Payment of benefits: Benefits are recorded when paid.

Expenses: Certain expenses of maintaining the Plan are paid directly by the Company and are excluded from these financial statements. Fees related to the administration of notes receivable from participants are charged directly to the participant's account and are included in administrative expenses. Investment related expenses are included in net appreciation of fair value of investments.

Subsequent events: The Plan has evaluated subsequent events through October 15, 2024, the date the financial statements were available to be issued.

Note 4. Fair Value Measurements

The framework for measuring fair value provides a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (Level 1) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (Level 3). The three levels of the fair value hierarchy are described as follows:

Level 1: Inputs to the valuation methodology are unadjusted quoted prices for identical assets or liabilities in active markets that the Plan has the ability to access.

Level 2: Inputs to the valuation methodology include:

- Quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities in active markets
- Quoted prices for identical or similar assets or liabilities in inactive markets
- Inputs other than quoted prices that are observable for the asset or liability
- Inputs that are derived principally from or corroborated by observable market data by correlation or other means

If the asset or liability has a specified (contractual) term, the Level 2 input must be observable for substantially the full term of the asset or liability.

Level 3: Inputs to the valuation methodology are unobservable and significant to the fair value measurement.

The asset or liability's fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques used maximize the use of observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs.

Following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for assets measured at fair value. There have been no changes in the methodologies used at December 31, 2023 and 2022. There were no transfers to or from Level 3 investments during the year ended December 31, 2023.

Mutual funds: Valued at the daily closing price as reported by the fund. Mutual funds held by the Plan were open-end funds that were registered with the U.S. Securities and Exchange Commission. These funds were required to publish their daily net asset value (NAV) and to transact at that price. The funds held by the Plan were deemed to be actively traded.

Self-directed brokerage accounts: Accounts primarily consist of mutual funds and common stocks that are valued on the basis of readily determinable market prices.

Collective trust funds: Valued at the NAV of units of a collective trust. The NAV, as provided by the custodian, is used as a practical expedient to estimate fair value. The NAV is based on the fair value of the underlying investments held by the fund less its liabilities. This practical expedient would not be used if it is determined to be probable that the fund will sell the investment for an amount different from the reported NAV. Participant transactions (purchases and sales) may occur daily. Were the Plan to initiate a full redemption of the collective trust, the issuer reserves the right to temporarily delay withdrawal from the trust in order to ensure that securities liquidations will be carried out in an orderly business manner.

Note 5. Guaranteed Investment Contract With Principal Life Insurance Company

The Plan entered into a traditional fully benefit-responsive guaranteed investment contract with Principal Life Insurance Company (Principal) totaling \$0 for 2023 and \$66,716 at December 31, 2023 and 2022, respectively. Principal maintained the contributions in a general account. The account was credited with earnings on the underlying investments and charged for participant withdrawals and administrative expenses. The contract issuer was contractually obligated to repay the principal and a specified interest rate that is guaranteed to the Plan. The crediting rate was reviewed on a quarterly basis for resetting. The average rate for 2022 was 4.15%. The guaranteed investment contract did not permit the insurance company to terminate the agreement prior to the scheduled maturity date.

The contract met the fully benefit-responsive investment contract criteria and, therefore, was reported at contract value. Contract value was the relevant measure for fully benefit-responsive investment contracts because this was the amount received by participants if they were to initiate permitted transactions under the terms of the Plan. Contract value, as reported to the Plan by Principal, represented contributions made under the contract, plus earnings, less participant withdrawals, and administrative expenses. Participants may ordinarily direct the withdrawal or transfer of all or a portion of their investment at contract value.

The Plan's ability to receive amounts due was dependent on the issuer's ability to meet its financial obligations. The issuer's ability to meet its contractual obligations may be affected by future economic and regulatory developments.

Note 5. Guaranteed Investment Contract With Principal Life Insurance Company (Continued)

Certain events could limit the ability of the Plan to transact at contract value with the issuer. Such events included (1) amendments to the Plan documents (including complete or partial Plan termination or merger with another plan), (2) changes to the Plan's prohibition on competing investment options or deletion of equity wash provisions, (3) bankruptcy of the Plan sponsor or other Plan sponsor events (for example, divestitures or spin-offs of a subsidiary) that cause a significant withdrawal from the Plan, (4) the failure of the trust to qualify for exemption from federal income taxes or any required prohibited transaction exemption under ERISA, or (5) premature termination of the contract. No events are probable of occurring that might limit the ability of the Plan to transact at contract value with participants.

In addition, certain events allowed the issuer to terminate the contract with the Plan and settle at an amount different from contract value. Such events included (1) an uncured violation of the Plan's investment guidelines, (2) a breach of material obligation under the contract, (3) a material misrepresentation, or (4) a material amendment to the agreement without consent of the issuer.

Note 6. Related-Party and Party-in-Interest Transactions

Certain Plan investments are managed by Principal Life Insurance Company or Principal Trust Company. Principal Trust Company is the trustee as defined by the Plan and, therefore, these transactions qualify as party-in-interest transactions. Fees incurred by the Plan for the investment management services are included in net depreciation in fair value of the investment.

Note 7. Plan Termination

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the Company has the right under the Plan to discontinue its contributions at any time and to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions of ERISA. In the event of Plan termination, participants would become 100% vested in their employer contributions.

Note 8. Tax Status

The Plan has adopted a preapproved plan document that has received an opinion letter from the Internal Revenue Service (IRS) dated June 30, 2020, stating that the form of the preapproved plan document was in compliance with applicable requirements of the Internal Revenue Code (IRC). The Plan has been amended since adopting the preapproved plan document; however, The Plan Administrator believes the Plan is designed, and is being operated, in compliance with the applicable requirements of the IRC and the related trust is tax-exempt.

Accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America require plan management to evaluate tax positions taken by the plan and recognize a tax liability if the plan has taken an uncertain position that more likely than not would be sustained upon examination by the U.S. federal, state and local tax authorities. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress.

Note 9. Risks and Uncertainties

The Plan invests in various investment securities. Investment securities are exposed to various risks, such as interest rate, market, and credit risks. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the values of investment securities will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect participants' account balances and the amounts reported in the statement of net assets available for benefits.

Note 10. Delinquent Participant Contributions

During 2023 and 2022, the Plan sponsor inadvertently failed to deposit approximately \$2,872,700 and \$964,249 of participant contributions within the required timeframe as stated by the United States Department of Labor regulations. The Plan sponsor is in the process of determining lost earnings to correct this failure in 2024 for the 2023 late deposits. The 2022 late deposits were corrected in January 2024 with a deposit of lost earnings of \$1,257. The Plan sponsor is in the process of filing Form 5330 and will pay applicable excise tax to the IRS for the 2023 late deposits. The Plan sponsor filed Form 5330 in January 2024 and paid the applicable excise tax to the IRS for the 2022 late deposits. All corrections have been or will be made from the Plan sponsor's assets and not from assets of the Plan.

Note 11. Plan Amendments

On June 12, 2023, the Plan was amended to implement the CARES Act and SECURE Act.
