INDEPENDENT AUDITORS' REPORT

To the Trustees and Administrators of the IR Pros, LLC 401(k) Plan

Scope and Nature of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) Audit

We have performed an audit of the financial statements of IR Pros, LLC 401(k) Plan (the Plan), an employee benefit plan subject to the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA), as permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) (ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit). For information included in the supplemental schedules that agrees to or is derived from the certified investment information, we compared such information to the related certified investment information.

In forming our opinion on the supplemental schedules, we evaluated whether the supplemental schedules, other than the information agreed to or derived from the certified investment information, including their form and content, are presented in conformity with the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA.

NOTE 1 – DESCRIPTION OF THE PLAN

The following description of IR Pros, LLC 401(k) Plan (the Plan) provides only general information. Participants should refer to the plan agreement for a more complete description of the Plan's provisions.

General – Industrial Refrigeration Pros, LLC (the Company or Sponsor) established the Plan effective May 1, 2023. The Plan is a defined contribution plan covering substantially all full-time employees of the Company and any affiliates who have adopted the Plan. Eligible employees must be age 18 or older and have completed 3 months of eligible service. Employees who are not eligible to participate in the Plan are those who are either a) covered by a collective bargaining agreement; b) nonresident aliens, or c) residents of Puerto Rico. The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA).

Contributions – The Plan documents allow that each year, participants may contribute up to 100% of their eligible annual compensation as defined by the Plan. Participants who have attained age 50 before the end of the Plan year are eligible to make catch-up contributions. These contributions are subject to annual contribution limitations as determined by the Internal Revenue Code (IRC). Participants may also contribute amounts representing distributions from other qualified defined benefit or defined contribution plans. Participants direct the investment of their contributions into various investment options offered by the Plan.

The Company also makes a safe harbor contribution of up to 3% of participants compensation. The Company may also make nonelective contributions but made none in 2023.

Participants' Accounts – Each participant's account is credited with the participant's contribution and Plan earnings. The accounts are set up in participant-directed, individual accounts administered by the plan trustee. Contributions and earnings or losses are credited to the accounts as the amounts are received by the trustee. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant's account.

Vesting – A participant is 100% vested in their contributions and safe harbor contributions, and actual earnings thereon at all times. Nonelective contributions vest over a 6 year period.

Investment Options – Participants direct the investment of their contributions into selected investment products offered by the Plan trustee. The investment options include fixed income accounts and various income, growth, value, blend, and international mutual fund accounts. Participants may change their investment options daily.

Payment of Benefits – Benefits are payable to participants or designated beneficiaries upon retirement, death, disability, or termination of employment, and are entitled to receive a lump-sum amount equal to the value of the participant's vested interest in their account. Benefits may also be distributed in the event of a participant's immediate and heavy financial need. Such distributions, which are considered hardship withdrawals, cannot exceed the amount required to relieve the financial need.

Forfeitures – Since all benefits are fully vested, the Plan does not experience forfeitures.

Participant Loans – The Plan allows loans to participants from their fund accounts for a minimum of \$1,000, up to a maximum of: 1) \$50,000 minus the difference between the highest outstanding balance of loans in the past 12 months and the outstanding balance of loans on the date the loan is made, or 2) 50% of a participant’s vested account balance. All loans are subject to the approval of a loan application and are secured by the participant’s Plan benefit and a promissory note. Participants may not have more than 2 loans outstanding at any time. The interest rate is based on Prime + 1% per year. Loans are repaid through payroll deductions within a 5-year period, unless the loan was made to acquire a primary residence, in which case the loan can be repaid in an extended period consistent with commercial loan practices.

Plan Termination – Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the Sponsor has the right, under terms of the Plan, to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions of ERISA.

NOTE 2 – SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of Accounting – The financial statements are prepared on the accrual basis of accounting and in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America (U.S. GAAP). The Plan follows accounting principles set forth in FASB Accounting Standards Codification (ASC) 962, *Plan Accounting – Defined Contribution Pension Plans*.

Use of Estimates in the Preparation of Financial Statements – The preparation of financial statements in conformity with U.S. GAAP requires the plan administrator to make estimates and assumptions that affect certain reported amounts and disclosures. Accordingly, actual results may differ from those estimates.

Receivables/Allowance for Doubtful Accounts – The Plan estimates its allowance for doubtful accounts based on historical experience with doubtful receivables. The Plan has not experienced bad debts since inception, and accordingly has not estimated an allowance for doubtful accounts.

Investment Valuation and Income Recognition – In accordance with FASB ASC 962, the Plan’s investments are stated at fair value. Mutual funds held by the Plan are valued at fair value based on the daily closing price as reported by the funds. Mutual funds are open-ended and are registered with the Securities and Exchange Commission. These mutual funds are required to publish their daily net asset value (NAV) and to transact at that price. The common/collective trusts are valued at the NAV of units held by the Plan. The NAV, as provided by the trustees, is used as a practical expedient to estimate fair value. The NAV is based on the fair value of the underlying investments held by the fund less its liabilities. The practical expedient is not used when it is determined to be probable that the fund will sell the investment for an amount different than the reported NAV.

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest income is recorded on an accrual basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Net

appreciation (depreciation) includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold as well as held during the year.

During the period ended December 31, 2023, the Plan's investments, including net gains and losses on investments sold during the year, increased in fair value by \$1,139,018. All investments are participant directed.

Plan Administration Costs – Administrative expenses of maintaining the Plan may be paid by the Company or the Plan, at the Sponsor's discretion. Expenses that are paid directly by the Sponsor are excluded from these financial statements. Certain administration fees are charged directly to the participant's account and are included in administrative expenses. Investment-related expenses are included in net appreciation (depreciation) of fair value of investments.

Notes Receivable from Participants – Notes receivable from participants are measured at their unpaid principal balance plus any accrued unpaid interest. If a participant ceases to make loan repayments and the plan administrator deems the loan to be in default, the participant loan balance is reduced, and a benefit payment is recorded.

Payment of benefits – Benefits are recorded when paid.

Subsequent Events – Management has evaluated, for potential recognition or disclosure in the financial statements, subsequent events that have occurred through November 1, 2024, which is the date that the financial statements were available to be issued.

NOTE 3 – INFORMATION PREPARED AND CERTIFIED BY THE PLAN TRUSTEE

The Plan Administrator has elected the method of compliance permitted by the Department of Labor Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974. Accordingly, as permitted under such election, no independent auditing procedures were performed with respect to the information certified as complete and accurate by the Plan's Trustee, Empower Trust Company, LLC (Empower). Empower has certified the Plan's statement of accounts as of December 31, 2023, and for the period from inception to December 31, 2023. The statement of accounts includes beginning and ending balances of investments held, notes receivable from participants, and detail of transactions during the period, including investment earnings and interest income on notes receivable from participants.

NOTE 4 – INCOME TAX STATUS

The Plan has adopted a prototype format and is relying on the prototype sponsor's IRS determination letter for qualification. In the prototype sponsor's tax determination letter dated November 14, 2022, the Internal Revenue Service stated that the Plan, as then designed, was in compliance with the applicable requirements of the Internal Revenue Code. The Plan administrator believes the Plan is currently designed and being operated in compliance with the applicable requirements of the Internal Revenue Code.

U.S. GAAP requires plan management to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan and recognize a tax liability (or asset) if the Plan has taken an uncertain position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination. The plan administrator has analyzed the tax positions taken by the Plan, and has concluded that as of December 31, 2023, there are no uncertain positions taken or expected to be taken that would require recognition of a liability (or asset) or disclosure in the financial statements.

The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are no audits for any tax periods in progress.

NOTE 5 – FAIR VALUE MEASUREMENTS

Fair value accounting guidance establishes a framework for measuring fair value, which provides a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (Level 1 measurements) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (Level 3 measurements). The three levels of the fair value hierarchy are described below:

Level 1 Inputs to the valuation methodology are unadjusted quoted prices for identical assets or liabilities in active markets that the plans have the ability to access.

Level 2 Inputs to the valuation methodology other than quoted prices included in Level 1 are observable for the asset or liability, each directly or indirectly, and include:

- Quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities in active markets;
- Quoted prices for identical or similar assets or liabilities in inactive markets;
- Inputs other than quoted prices that are observable for the asset or liability; and
- Inputs that are derived principally from or corroborated by observable market data by correlation or other means.

If the asset or liability has a specified (contractual) term, the Level 2 input must be observable for substantially the full term of the asset or liability.

Level 3 Inputs to the valuation methodology are unobservable and significant to the fair value measurement.

The asset or liability's fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques used maximize the use of observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs.

The methods described above could produce a fair value calculation that is not indicative of net realizable value or reflective of future fair values. Furthermore, while the Plan administrator believes these valuation methods are appropriate, the use of different methodologies or assumptions could result in different fair value measurements at the reporting date. There have been no changes in the methodologies used at December 31, 2023.

Below is a description of the valuation methodologies used for assets measured at fair value.

Registered investment company funds - Valued at the daily closing price as reported by the fund. Registered investment company funds held by the Plan are registered with the Securities and Exchange Commission. These funds are required to publish their daily net asset value (NAV) and to transact at that price. The registered investment company funds held by the Plan are deemed to be actively traded.

Common collective trusts (CCTs) - Investments in CCTs are valued at the net asset value (NAV) of units of a bank collective trust. NAV is a readily determinable fair value and is the basis for current transactions. The unit value of each of these funds is determined on a daily basis. Units are issued and redeemed at their unit value. Net investment income and realized and unrealized gains and losses on investments are not distributed to participants but are reflected in the unit value. Were the Plan to initiate a full redemption of a CCT, the investment advisor reserves the right to temporarily delay withdrawal from the trust in order to ensure that securities liquidations will be carried out in an orderly business manner.

NOTE 6 – RISKS AND UNCERTAINTIES

The Plan invests in various investment securities. Investment securities are exposed to various risks such as interest rate, market, and credit risks. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the value of investment securities will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect participants' account balances and the amounts reported in the statement of net assets available for benefits.

NOTE 7 – RELATED PARTY AND PARTY-IN-INTEREST TRANSACTIONS

Certain Plan investments are shares of mutual funds by the plan trustee as defined by the Plan. As described in Note 2, the Plan paid certain expenses related to Plan operations and investment activity to various service providers. These transactions are exempt party-in-interest transactions under ERISA.
