Note 1: DESCRIPTION OF PLAN

The following description of the Radwell International, LLC ("Company") 401(k) Profit Sharing Plan & Trust ("Plan") provides only general information. Participants should refer to the Plan agreement for a more complete description of the Plan's provisions.

General

The Plan was a defined contribution plan which was established on January 1, 2000. The plan covered all eligible non-union full-time employees of Radwell International LLC who were age eighteen or older and had completed 90 days of service. It was subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA). The Board of Trustees of the plan was responsible for oversight of the plan, determined the plan's investment offerings, and monitored investment performance.

Certified Investments

Certain information related to investments and notes receivable from participants disclosed in the accompanying financial statements, including investments and notes receivable from participants held at January 8, 2024 and December 31, 2023, and net appreciation in fair value of investments, interest and dividends, and interest income on notes receivable from participants for the period ended January 8, 2024 and year ended December 31, 2023, was obtained by management and agreed to or derived from information certified as complete and accurate by Transamerica Life Insurance Company (the trustee of the Plan).

Contributions

Each year participants elected to defer a portion of their compensation up to the maximum allowable amount. Effective January 1, 2017, the plan sponsor adopted an automatic enrollment deferral percentage of 4%, unless the participant made a Contrary Election. The employer matched 25% of the employee's total compensation up to the employee's first 4% of their deferred contribution. The Company's contributions were \$0 and \$551,535 for the period ended January 8, 2024 and year ended December 31, 2023, respectively. Additional profit sharing contributions could have been contributed at the option of the Company. Contributions were subject to certain IRS limitations. With the consent of the Administrator, participants could have contributed amounts representing distributions from other qualified plans.

Participant Accounts

Each participant's account was credited with the participant's contribution and allocations of the Company's contribution and, Plan earnings, and charged with an allocation of net appreciation (depreciation) in the fair value of investments and administrative expenses. Allocations were based on participant earnings or account balances, as defined. The benefit to which a participant was entitled was the benefit that was provided from the participant's vested account.

Vesting

Participants were immediately vested in their contributions plus actual earnings thereon. Vesting in the Company's contribution portion of their accounts plus actual earnings thereon was based on years of continuous service. A participant was 100% vested after five years of credited service. See Footnote 10- Plan Merger for additional information.

Investment Options

Upon enrollment in the Plan, a participant could direct contributions in various investment options.

Notes Receivable From Participants

Participants were able to borrow from their fund accounts a minimum of \$1,000 up to a maximum of \$50,000 or 50% of their vested account balance, whichever was less. The loans were secured by the balance in the participant's account and bear interest at a rate of 0% which was commensurate with local prevailing rates as determined by the plan administrator. Principal and interest were paid ratably through payroll deductions.

Payment of Benefits and Withdrawals

On termination of service due to death, disability or retirement, a participant or beneficiary could have elected to receive either a lump-sum amount equal to the value of the participant's vested interest in his or her account, or periodic payments. If the participant did not make an election prior to the designated time period, payment of any benefits provided were made in the form of a single sum payment to the participant. For termination of service due to other reasons, a participant may have received the value of the vested amount in his or her account as a lump-sum distribution, according to provisions of the plan document. Hardship distributions were permitted under certain circumstances as outlined in the Plan document.

Forfeited Accounts

At January 8, 2024 and December 31, 2023, forfeited nonvested accounts totaled \$0 and \$30,335. Forfeitures were used to reduce future employer contributions or pay reasonable plan expenses. In 2024 and 2023, employer contributions and expenses were reduced by \$0 and \$23,429, respectively.

Note 2: SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of Accounting

The financial statements of the Plan are prepared on the accrual method of accounting in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America, except for distributions paid to participants which are presented on the cash basis of accounting.

Use of Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America requires the plan management to make estimates and assumptions that affect certain reported amounts and disclosures. Actual results may differ from those estimates.

Investment Valuation and Income Recognition

The Plan's investments were stated at fair value, except for the fully benefit-responsive investment contract, which was reported at contract value. Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. The Plan's management determines the valuation policies utilizing information provided by the investment advisors, trustee and insurance company. See Note 3 for a discussion of fair value measurements.

Investment Valuation and Income Recognition

Purchases and sales of securities were recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest income was recorded on the accrual basis.

In accordance with the policy of stating investments at fair market value, net appreciation (depreciation) as reflected in the statement of changes in net assets available for Plan benefits represents realized and unrealized gains (losses) for investments bought, sold, and held during the year.

Notes Receivable from Participants

Notes receivable from participants were measured at their unpaid principal balance plus any accrued but unpaid interest. Interest income was recorded on the accrual basis. Related fees were recorded as management expenses and were expensed when they were incurred. No allowance for estimated non-collectable amounts has been recorded as of January 08, 2024 and 2023. If a participant ceases to make loan repayments and the plan administrator deems the participant loan to be in default, the participant loan balance is reduced, and a benefit payment is recorded.

Payment of Benefits

Benefits were recorded when paid.

Expenses

Certain expenses of maintaining the Plan were paid directly by the Company and were excluded from these financial statements. Fees related to the administration of notes receivable from participants were charged directly to the participant's account and were included in administrative expenses. Investment related expenses were included in net appreciation of fair value of investments.

Subsequent Events

The plan has evaluated subsequent events through November 11, 2024, the date the financial statements were available to be issued.

Note 3: FAIR VALUE MEASUREMENTS

The framework for measuring fair value provides a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (level 1 measurements) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (level 3 measurements). The three levels of the fair value hierarchy under FASB ASC 820 are described as follows:

Level 1 Inputs to the valuation methodology are unadjusted quoted prices for identical assets or liabilities in active markets that the Plan has the ability to access.

Level 2 Inputs to the valuation methodology include:

- Quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities in active markets;
- Quoted prices for identical or similar assets or liabilities in inactive markets;
- Inputs other than quoted prices that are observable for the asset or liability;
- Inputs that are derived principally from or corroborated by observable market data by correlation or other means.

If the asset or liability has a specified (contractual) term, the level 2 input must be observable for substantially the full term of the asset or liability.

Level 3 Inputs to the valuation methodology are unobservable and significant to the fair value measurement.

The asset's or liability's fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques used need to maximize the use of observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs. Following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for assets measured at fair value. There have been no changes in the methodologies used at January 08, 2024 and 2023.

Pooled Separate Accounts: Valued at the net asset value (NAV) of the units held by the fund. The NAV is used as a practical expedient to estimate fair value. The NAV is based on fair value of the underlying investments held by the fund.

Pooled Separate Accounts offered were proprietary to Transamerica and many invested exclusively in one underlying mutual fund traded on an established market.

Note 4: STABLE VALUE FUND

The Plan invested in a stable value fund with Transamerica Life Insurance Company totaling \$0 and \$2,062,514 for 2024 and 2023, respectively. The fund invests in fixed annuities referred to as the Transamerica Stable Value Core Fund. The fund was credited with earnings on the underlying investments and charged for participant withdrawals and administrative expenses.

The stable value fund issuer was contractually obligated to repay the principal, however the interest rate was not guaranteed to the Plan. The crediting rate was based on a formula established by the fund issuer. The crediting rate was reviewed on a monthly basis for resetting. The average yield equals the credited rate to the plan. The average yield for January 8, 2024 and December 31, 2023 is 1.25%. The stable value fund did not permit the insurance company to terminate the agreement prior to the scheduled maturity date.

This fund met the fully benefit-responsive investment contract criteria and therefore was reported at contract value. Contract value is the relevant measure for fully benefit-responsive investment contracts because this is the amount received by participants if they were to initiate permitted transactions under the terms of the Plan. Contract value, as reported to the Plan by Transamerica Life Insurance Company for 2024 and 2023, respectively, represents contributions made under the fund, plus earnings, less participant withdrawals, and administrative expenses. Participants may have ordinarily directed the withdrawal or transfer of all or a portion of their investment at contract value.

The Plan's ability to receive amounts due was dependent on the issuer's ability to meet its financial obligations. The issuer's ability to meet its contractual obligations may have been affected by future economic and regulatory developments.

Certain events may have limited the ability of the Plan to transact at contract value with the issuer. Such events include (1) amendments to the Plan documents (including complete or partial Plan termination or merger with another plan), (2) changes to the Plan's prohibition on competing investment options or deletion of equity wash provisions, (3) bankruptcy of the Plan sponsor or other Plan sponsor events (for example, divestitures or spin-offs of a subsidiary) that cause a significant withdrawal from the Plan, or (4) the failure of the trust to qualify for exemption from federal income taxes or any required prohibited transaction exemption under ERISA (5) premature termination of the contract. No events were probable of occurring that may have limited the ability of the Plan to transact at contract value with the contract issuers and that also would limit the ability of the plan to transact at contract value with the participants.

In addition, certain events allowed the issuer to terminate the contract with the Plan and settle at an amount different from contract value. Such events included (1) an uncured violation of the Plan's investment guidelines, (2) a breach of material obligation under the contract, (3) a material misrepresentation, (4) a material amendment to the agreement without the consent of the issuer.

Note 5: PLAN ADMINISTRATION COSTS

In 2024 and 2023 the Company elected to pay a portion of the Plan's administrative costs and not seek reimbursement from the Plan. The Plan did pay administrative costs of \$0 and \$45,526 for 2024 and 2023, respectively.

Note 6: RELATED PARTY TRANSACTIONS AND PARTY IN INTEREST TRANSACTIONS

The Plan invested in shares of pooled separate accounts managed by Transamerica Life Insurance Company for 2024 and 2023, respectively. Transamerica Life Insurance Company for 2024 and 2023, respectively, acted as the custodian for those investments as defined by the Plan. Transactions in such investments qualify as party-in-interest transactions which are exempt from the prohibited transaction rules.

Note 7: PLAN TERMINATION

The Company had the right under the Plan to discontinue its contributions at any time and to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions of ERISA. In the event of Plan termination, all contributions would have been discontinued. See also Footnote 10- Plan Merger.

Note 8: TAX STATUS

On June 30, 2020, the IRS stated that the prototype adopted by the Plan, as then designed, qualified under Internal Revenue Code (IRC) Section 401(a). The Plan has not received a determination letter specific to the plan itself; however, the plan administrator believes that the Plan was designed and was being operated in compliance with the applicable requirements of the IRC. Therefore, no provision for income taxes has been included in the plan's financial statements.

Accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America require Plan management to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan and recognize a tax liability if the plan has taken uncertain position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by the Internal Revenue Service and or Department of Labor. The Plan is subject to routine audits by the Internal Revenue Service and or Department of Labor, however there are currently no audits for any periods in progress.

Note 9: RISKS AND UNCERTAINTIES

The Plan invested in various investment securities. Investment securities are exposed to various risks such as interest rate, market, and credit risks. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the values of investment securities will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect participants' account balances and the amounts reported in the statement of net assets available for benefits.

Note 10: PLAN MERGER

Effective as of January 1, 2024, the plan merged with and into the acquired Electrical Source Holdings, LLC 401(k) Retirement Plan (ESH Plan). Plan assets were transferred to the trustee of the ESH Plan, Fidelity Investments, subsequent to the plan merger. The acquired ESH Plan name changed to Radwell International, LLC 401(k) Profit Sharing Plan, and acquired ESH Plan sponsor name changed to Radwell International, LLC. As a result of this merger, participant's vested account balances were transferred to acquired ESH Plan.
