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## **INDEPENDENT AUDITOR'S REPORT**

### **Scope and Nature of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) Audit**

We have performed audits of the financial statements of PRB Management 401(k) Plan (the Plan), an employee benefit plan subject to the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA), as permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) (ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit). The financial statements comprise the statements of net assets available for benefits as of December 31, 2023 (in liquidation) and December 31, 2022, and the related statement of changes in net assets available for benefits for the year ended December 31, 2023 (in liquidation), and the related notes to the financial statements.

Management, having determined it is permissible in the circumstances, has elected to have the audits of the Plan's financial statements performed in accordance with ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) pursuant to 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor's (DOL) Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. As permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C), our audits need not extend to any statements or information related to assets held for investment of the Plan (investment information) by a bank or similar institution or insurance carrier that is regulated, supervised, and subject to periodic examination by a state or federal agency, provided that the statements or information regarding assets so held are prepared and certified to by the bank or similar institution or insurance carrier in accordance with 29 CFR 2520.103-5 of the DOL's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA (qualified institution).

Management has obtained certifications from a qualified institution as of December 31, 2023 and 2022, and for the year ended December 31, 2023, stating that the certified investment information, as described in Note 3 to the financial statements, is complete and accurate.

### **Opinion**

In our opinion, based on our audits and on the procedures performed as described in the Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements section:

- The amounts and disclosures in the accompanying financial statements, other than those agreed to or derived from the certified investment information, are presented fairly, in all material respects, in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America (U.S. GAAP).
- The information in the accompanying financial statements related to assets held by and certified to by a qualified institution agrees to, or is derived from, in all material respects, the information prepared and certified by an institution that management determined meets the requirements of ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C).

## **Basis for Opinion**

We conducted our audits in accordance with auditing standards generally accepted in the United States of America (GAAS). Our responsibilities under those standards are further described in the Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements section of our report. We are required to be independent of the Plan and to meet our other ethical responsibilities, in accordance with the relevant ethical requirements relating to our audits. We believe that the audit evidence we have obtained is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for our ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit opinion.

## **Emphasis of Matter - Plan Termination and Liquidation Basis**

As discussed in Note 1 to the financial statements, the Managing Member of PRB Management LLC, the Plan's sponsor, approved on July 10, 2023 to terminate the Plan effective August 31, 2023, and management determined liquidation is imminent. As a result, the Plan has changed its basis of accounting from the going concern basis of accounting used in presenting the 2022 financial statements to the liquidation basis of accounting used in presenting the 2023 financial statements. Our opinion is not modified with respect to this matter.

## **Responsibilities of Management for the Financial Statements**

Management is responsible for the preparation and fair presentation of the financial statements in accordance with U.S. GAAP, and for the design, implementation, and maintenance of internal control relevant to the preparation and fair presentation of financial statements that are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error. Management's election of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit does not affect management's responsibility for the financial statements.

In preparing the financial statements, management is required to evaluate whether there are conditions or events, considered in the aggregate, that raise substantial doubt about the Plan's ability to continue as a going concern within one year after the date that the financial statements are issued or available to be issued.

Management is also responsible for maintaining a current plan instrument, including all plan amendments, administering the Plan, and determining that the Plan's transactions that are presented and disclosed in the financial statements are in conformity with the Plan's provisions, including maintaining sufficient records with respect to each of the participants, to determine the benefits due or which may become due to such participants.

## **Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements**

Except as described in the Scope and Nature of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) Audit section of our report, our objectives are to obtain reasonable assurance about whether the financial statements as a whole are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error, and to issue an auditor's report that includes our opinion. Reasonable assurance is a high level of assurance but is not absolute assurance and therefore is not a guarantee that an audit conducted in accordance with GAAS will always detect a material misstatement when it exists. The risk of not detecting a material misstatement resulting from fraud is higher than for one resulting from error, as fraud may involve collusion, forgery, intentional omissions, misrepresentations, or the override of internal control. Misstatements are considered material if, there is a substantial likelihood that, individually or in the aggregate, they would influence the judgment made by a reasonable user based on the financial statements.

In performing an audit in accordance with GAAS, we:

- Exercise professional judgment and maintain professional skepticism throughout the audit.
- Identify and assess the risks of material misstatement of the financial statements, whether due to fraud or error, and design and perform audit procedures responsive to those risks. Our audits did not extend to the certified investment information, except for obtaining and reading the certification, comparing the certified investment information with the related information presented and disclosed in the financial statements, and reading the disclosures relating to the certified investment information to assess whether they are in accordance with the presentation and disclosure requirements of U.S. GAAP.

Accordingly, the objective of an ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit is not to express an opinion about whether the financial statements as a whole are presented fairly, in all material respects, in accordance with U.S. GAAP.

We are required to communicate with those charged with governance regarding, among other matters, the planned scope and timing of the audit, significant audit findings, and certain internal control-related matters that we identified during the audits.

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### NOTE 1. DESCRIPTION OF THE PLAN

The following description of PRB Management 401(k) Plan (the Plan) is provided for general information purposes only. Participants and other interested parties should refer to the Plan document for a more complete description of the Plan's provisions.

**General:** Prior to termination, the Plan, as amended, was a defined contribution plan established on January 1, 2020 covering substantially all of the employees of PRB Management, LLC (the Company or Plan Sponsor), who had attained age 21 and completed 12 consecutive months of service with 1000 hours. If employees did not complete 1000 Hours of Service within their first 12 consecutive months of employment, then the employees could satisfy the service requirement if they were credited with a Year of Service. On March 1, 2022, the Plan was amended to include the automatic enrollment feature and each employee was automatically enrolled in the Plan as a participant with a 1% pre-tax elective deferral on Participant's behalf. The Plan was subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA).

Pursuant to a change in the ownership structure of the Company, the Managing Member of the Company approved on July 10, 2023 to terminate the Plan as of the close of business on August 31, 2023. In accordance with the Plan provisions, all Plan participants became 100% vested in their accounts upon Plan termination. The Plan participants were notified that they must inform the Plan Administrator of their preferred form of distribution by October 9, 2023, otherwise the account balances for non-responding participants would be transferred to individual retirement accounts. As of December 31, 2023, there was no account balance remaining in the Plan.

**Contributions:** Prior to termination, the Plan allowed automatic enrollment for eligible participants. Participants could contribute from 1% up to 90% of their annual compensation, as defined in the Plan, as pre-tax and/or Roth contributions. Total participant contributions were subject to the annual limits imposed by the Internal Revenue Code (IRC). The maximum participant deferral limit was \$22,500 for the year ended December 31, 2023. Catch-up contributions of \$7,500 were available to participants who had attained age 50 or older by December 31, 2023, and had not exceeded the contribution limit for the Plan year.

The Company could also make annual discretionary matching contributions to the participants equal to a percentage of their salary deferral, which were to be allocated to participants employed on the last day of the Plan year. Also, the Company could make annual profit-sharing matching contributions on the basis of their relative compensation to the total compensation of all eligible participants, which were to be allocated to participants employed on the last day of the Plan year. The Company made no discretionary matching contributions nor profit sharing contributions for the year ended December 31, 2023.

**Participant Accounts:** Prior to termination, each participant's account was credited or charged with the participant's contributions and allocations of (a) the Company's contribution, (b) the Plan earnings, and (c) administrative expenses. Allocations of the Plan earnings for investments were based on participants' account balances. The benefit to which a participant was entitled was the benefit that could be provided from the participant's vested account.

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### NOTE 1. DESCRIPTION OF THE PLAN (Continued)

**Vesting:** Prior to termination, participants were immediately vested in their employee contributions. Participants were vested in the Company's matching and discretionary profit-sharing contributions according to the following schedule:

Notwithstanding the above, if a participant (1) died, (2) incurred a disability while employed by the Company or (3) satisfied the conditions for early retirement age, the Company's matching and discretionary profit-sharing contributions became 100% vested without regard to years of service. Upon the termination of the Plan at the close of business on August 31, 2023, all Plan participants became 100% vested in their accounts in accordance with the Plan provisions.

**Notes Receivable from Participants:** Prior to termination, participants could borrow from their vested account balances a minimum of \$500 up to a maximum equal to the lesser of \$50,000 or 50% of their vested account balances. The notes receivable were secured by the vested balances in the participants' accounts and bore interest at prime rate plus 2%. Principal and interest were paid ratably through payroll deductions or participants' own personal funds over a term not to exceed five years, or 30 years for notes receivable borrowed for the purpose of purchasing a principal residence.

Any outstanding loan balance that was present at the time of distribution to the participant was subtracted from the amount distributed to the participant and was used to repay the outstanding loan balance. As a result of Plan termination and related distributions, all outstanding participant loan balances were either repaid or reclassified as distributions during the year ended December 31, 2023.

**Investment Options:** Prior to termination, participants could direct the investments of their compensation deferrals, rollover contributions, and Company matching and discretionary profit-sharing contributions in various investment funds offered and held by Reliance Trust Company.

**Benefit Payments:** Prior to termination, upon termination of service due to death, disability, retirement, or termination of employment, a participant or beneficiary could elect to receive an amount equal to the value of the participant's vested interest in his or her account in a lump-sum amount. An in-service distribution could also be made to participants who had attained the age of 59-1/2, upon disability or when experiencing financial hardship.

**Forfeitures:** Prior to termination, forfeited Company matching and discretionary profit-sharing contributions were used to first pay administrative expenses of the Plan and then to reduce Company contributions of the Plan. There were no forfeitures available as of as of December 31, 2023.

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### NOTE 2. SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

**Basis of Accounting:** Due to the decision to terminate the Plan during 2023, management determined that liquidation of the Plan was imminent and therefore the financial statements for 2023 have been prepared using the liquidation basis of accounting. The 2022 financial statements were prepared as a going concern on the accrual basis of accounting.

**Use of Estimates:** The preparation of financial statements in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America, requires the Plan Administrator to make estimates and assumptions that affect certain amounts and disclosures. Accordingly, actual results may differ from those estimates.

**Investment Valuation and Income Recognition:** Prior to termination, investments were reported at fair market value. Shares of mutual funds were valued at quoted market prices which represented the net asset value of shares held by the Plan at year end. See Note 8 for disclosure of fair value measurements. Realized and unrealized appreciation were based on the market value of the assets at the end of the Plan year compared to the market value of the assets at the beginning of the Plan year, or at the time the assets were purchased or exchanged during the Plan year.

Purchases and sales of securities were recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest income was recorded on the accrual basis. Dividends were recorded on the ex-dividend date.

**Notes Receivable from Participants:** Prior to termination, notes receivable from participants were reported at their outstanding principal balances, plus any accrued but unpaid interest.

**Benefit Payments:** Prior to termination, benefit payments were recorded as expenses when paid.

**Administrative Expenses:** Prior to termination, the Company had incurred certain expenses in administering the Plan, which were not passed on as expenses of the Plan. Administrative expenses charged to the Plan consisted of processing fees and loan origination and maintenance fees.

### NOTE 3. CERTIFIED INFORMATION

The Plan Administrator had elected the method of compliance as permitted by 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. Accordingly, the financial information included in the Plan's financial statements as it related to investment assets, investment transactions, investment income and notes receivable from participants had been derived from information certified as complete and accurate by Reliance Trust, the trustee of the Plan, in accordance with 29 CFR 2520.103-5 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA.

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### NOTE 4. INCOME TAX STATUS

The Plan had adopted a non-standardized defined contribution pre-approved plan which received a determination letter dated October 6, 2020 from the Internal Revenue Service, which stated that the form of the Plan is acceptable under the applicable sections of the IRC. Prior to termination, the Plan Administrator believed that the Plan was designed and was being operated in compliance with the applicable provisions of the IRC. Therefore, no provision for income taxes had been included in the Plan's financial statements.

Accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America require the Plan management to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan and recognize a tax liability if the Plan has taken uncertain tax positions that more-likely-than-not would not be sustained upon examination by applicable taxing authorities. The Plan Administrator has analyzed tax positions taken by the Plan and concluded that, as of December 31, 2023, there were no uncertain tax positions taken, or expected to be taken, that would require recognition of a liability or that would require disclosure in the financial statements.

The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions. However, currently no audits for any tax periods are in progress.

### NOTE 6. PARTY-IN-INTEREST TRANSACTIONS

Prior to termination, the majority of the Plan investments included mutual funds managed by Reliance Trust Company. ADP Retirement Service provided the day-to-day recordkeeping services for the Plan. Therefore, these transactions qualified as party-in-interest transactions as defined by Section 3(14) of ERISA.

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### NOTE 7. RISKS AND UNCERTAINTIES

Prior to termination, the Plan invested in various investment securities, which were exposed to various risks such as interest rate, market performance and credit risks. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it was at least reasonably possible that changes in the values of investment securities would occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect participants' account balances and the amounts reported in the statements of net assets available for benefits.

### NOTE 8. FAIR VALUE MEASUREMENTS

Prior to termination, in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America, the Plan established a framework for measuring fair value. That framework provided a fair value hierarchy that prioritized the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gave the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (Level 1 measurements) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (Level 3 measurements). The three levels of the fair value hierarchy were described below:

*Level 1* Inputs to valuation methodology are unadjusted quoted prices for identical assets or liabilities in active markets that the Plan has the ability to access.

*Level 2* Inputs to the valuation methodology include:

- Quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities in active markets
- Quoted prices for identical or similar assets or liabilities in active markets
- Inputs other than quoted prices that are observable for the asset or liability
- Inputs that are derived principally from or corroborated by observable market data by correlation or other means market participants would use in pricing the asset or liability

*Level 3* Inputs to the valuation methodology are unobservable and significant to the fair value measurement.

The asset's or liability's fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy was based on the lowest level of any input that was significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques used need to maximize the use of observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs.

The following methods and assumptions were used to estimate the fair value of each class of assets:

*Mutual funds:* Valued at the daily closing price as reported by the fund. Mutual funds held by the Plan were open-end mutual funds that were registered with the United States Securities and Exchange Commission. These funds were required to publish their daily net asset value (NAV) and to transact at that price. The mutual funds held by the Plan were deemed to be actively traded.

*Common collective trust:* The unit value of each common collective investment trust was calculated by dividing the fund's NAV on the calculation date by the number of units that were outstanding on the calculation date. The NAV was used as a practical expedient to estimate fair value. The number of units of the common collective trusts that were outstanding on the calculation date was derived from the observable purchase and redemption activity in the collective trusts. There were no notable restrictions on the redemption of investments held in the fund.

The valuation methods described above may produce a fair value calculation that may not be indicative of net realizable value or reflective of future fair values. Furthermore, while the Plan management believes its valuation methods were appropriate and consistent with other market participants, the use of different methodologies or assumptions to determine the fair value of certain financial instruments could result in a different fair value measurement at the reporting date.

The following table sets forth by level, within the fair value hierarchy, the Plan's assets at fair value:
