### Scope and Nature of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) Audit for the Financial Statements

We have performed an audit of the financial statements of the Rex Three, Inc 401(k) Plan, (the "Plan"), an employee benefit plan subject to the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA), as permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) (ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit). The financial statements comprise the statements of net assets available for benefits as of December 31, 2023 and 2022, and the related statement of changes in net assets available for benefits for the year ended December 31, 2023, and the related notes to the financial statements.

Management, having determined it is permissible in the circumstances, has elected to have the audit of the financial statements performed in accordance with ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) pursuant to 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. ### **NOTES TO FINANCIAL STATEMENTS**

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#### **NOTE 1 - DESCRIPTION OF PLAN**

The following brief description of the Rex Three, Inc. 401(k) Plan (the “Plan”) is provided for general information purposes only. Participants should refer to the Plan agreement for a more complete description of the Plan’s provisions, which is available upon request.

#### **General**

The Plan is a defined contribution plan established by Rex Three, Inc. (the “Company”) beginning January 1, 1987 under the provisions of Section 401(a) on the Internal Revenue Code (the “Code”), which includes a qualified cash of deferred arrangement as described in Section 401(k) of the Code for the benefit of eligible employees of the Company. The Plan’s primary purpose is to provide employees with retirement benefits. The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA).

#### **Plan administrator, custodian and trustee**

The Plan’s administrator, custodian and trustee are as follows:

- Plan Administrator – Rex Three, Inc.
- Third Party Administrator – Principal Life Insurance Company
- Custodian and Trustee (“certifying entity”) – Principal Trust Company (“Principal”)

#### **Eligibility**

All full-time employees of the Company who have at least twelve months of service and have worked a minimum of 1,000 hours are eligible to participate in the Plan. An employee is eligible to participate in the Plan on the first day of the month after meeting the eligibility requirements.

#### **Contributions**

A participant is entitled to contribute up to 100% of their salary to the Plan within limits prescribed by the Code. Individual participant contributions were limited to an annual maximum of \$22,500 for the Plan year ended December 31, 2023. Participants over the age of 50 are allowed to contribute an additional \$7,500. The Company may match contributions, at their discretion, on behalf of each participant, as defined in the Plan Agreement.

All contributions are participant-directed and may be invested in one fund or allocated among different funds, subject to certain limitations set forth in the Plan. Changes in allocation of contributions among funds are permitted pursuant to Plan provisions. Under the terms of the Plan, employer discretionary matching contributions are invested in the same funds at the same percentages as chosen by the participants for their own contributions.

The Company has elected to match participant contributions equal to 1% of the participants’ eligible compensation.

#### **Rollovers**

At the discretion of the Plan administrator, participants may transfer their funds from other tax-qualified plans.

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**NOTE 1 - DESCRIPTION OF PLAN (CONTINUED)**

**Participant accounts**

Each participant's account is credited with the participant's voluntary contributions and allocations of (a) the Company's contributions, and (b) the Plan's earnings and appreciation in the value of investments. The Plan administrator will make decisions for administrative expenses, withdrawals, or distributions made to the participants and investment losses and depreciation in the value of investments. Allocations are based on participant's directions, as defined. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant's vested account.

**Vesting**

Participants are immediately vested in their voluntary contributions plus actual earnings thereon. Vesting in the employer discretionary matching is based on years of continuous service. A participant begins vesting after two years of credited service at a rate of 20% per year beginning in the year 2 until year 6 at which the employee is 100% vested. A year of vesting service is defined as a year in which an employee accrues 1,000 or more hours.

**Investment options**

Upon enrollment in the Plan, participants elect investment options from the various fund choices. Participants may change their fund options at their discretion.

**Notes receivable from participants**

Participants may borrow from their fund accounts a minimum of \$1,000 up to a maximum equal to the lesser of \$50,000 or 50% of their vested account balance. The notes are secured by the balance in the participant's account. Loan terms range from one to five years. The interest rate for outstanding notes at December 31, 2023 ranged from 4.25% to 9.50%, which were commensurate with local prevailing rates as determined quarterly by the Plan administrator. Notes receivable are treated as a transfer to (from) the investment fund from (to) the participant loan fund. Principal and interest are paid ratable through bi-weekly payroll deductions. Delinquent notes receivable from participants are reclassified as distributions based upon the terms on the Plan document.

**Payment of Benefits**

On termination of service, including death, disability, or retirement, a participant may elect to either receive a lump sum amount equal to the value of the participant's vested interest in his or her account, or cash installments for a period not to exceed the participant's life expectancy or the life expectancy of his or her designated beneficiary.

**NOTE 2 - SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES**

**Basis of Accounting**

The financial statements of the Plan are prepared using the accrual basis of accounting.

Investments held by a defined-contribution plan are required to be reported at fair value, except for fully benefit-responsive investment contracts. Contract value is the relevant measure for the portion of the net assets available for benefits of a defined-contribution plan attributable to fully benefit-responsive investment contracts, because contract value is the amount participants normally would receive if they were to initiate permitted transactions under the terms of the Plan.

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**NOTE 2 - SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES (CONTINUED)**

**Use of Estimates**

The preparation of financial statements in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities and changes therein, and disclosures of contingent assets and liabilities. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

**Investment Valuation and Income Recognition**

Investments are stated at fair value as certified by the Plan's certifying entity (except for fully benefit-responsive investment contracts, which are reported at contract value). Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. The Plan's Investment Committee determines the Plan's valuation policies utilizing information provided by the investment advisers and custodian. See Note 4 for discussion of fair value measurements.

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Net appreciation (depreciation) includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold as well as held during the year.

**Notes Receivable from Participants**

Notes receivable from participants are recorded at their unpaid principal balance plus any accrued but unpaid interest. Participant notes receivable are evaluated for collectability and the Plan's Administrator has determined that no allowance is considered necessary. No allowance for credit losses has been recorded as of December 31, 2023 and 2022. If a participant ceases to make loan repayments and the Plan administrator deems the participant loan to be in default, the participant loan balance is reduced and a benefit payment is recorded.

**Excess Contributions Payable**

Amounts payable to participants for contributions in excess of amounts allowed by the Code are recorded as a liability with a corresponding charge to corrective distributions on the Statement of Changes in Net Assets Available for Benefits.

**Payment of Benefits**

Benefits are recorded when paid.

**Plan Expenses**

Substantially all expenses, with the exception of fees related to notes receivable from participants, incurred in connection with the administration of Plan are paid by the Company.

**Reclassification**

Certain amounts in 2022 financial statements and disclosures have been reclassified to confirm to the presentation in the 2023 financial statements.

**Subsequent Events**

The Plan has evaluated subsequent events through June 12, 2024, the date the financial statements were available for issuance.

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**NOTE 3 - INVESTMENT CERTIFICATION BY THE PLAN'S CERTIFYING ENTITY**

The Plan administrator has elected the method of compliance permitted by 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. Accordingly, Principal Trust Company, the certifying entity of the Plan, has certified to the completeness and accuracy of all investments reflected on the accompanying Statements of Net Assets Available for Benefits as of December 31, 2023 and 2022 and Schedule H, Line 4i- Schedule of Assets (Held at End of Year) as of December 31, 2023, and the related net appreciation in value of investments, interest and dividend income reflected in the accompanying Statement of Changes in Net Assets Available for Benefits for the year ended December 31, 2023.

**NOTE 4 - FAIR VALUE MEASUREMENTS**

Financial Accounting Standards Board ("FASB") Accounting Standards Codification (ASC) 820, *Fair Value Measurements and Disclosures*, establishes a framework for measuring fair value. That framework provides a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (level 1 measurements) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (level 3 measurements).

The three levels of the fair value hierarchy under FASB ASC 820 are described as follows:

- Level 1        Inputs to the valuation methodology are unadjusted quoted prices for identical assets or liabilities in active markets that the plan has the ability to access.
- Level 2        Inputs to the valuation methodology include the following:
- Quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities in active markets
  - Quoted prices for identical or similar assets or liabilities in inactive markets
  - Inputs other than quoted prices that are observable for the asset or liability
  - Inputs that are derived principally from, or corroborated by, observable market data by correlation or other means
  - If the asset or liability has a specified (contractual) term, the level 2 input must be observable for substantially the full term of the asset or liability.
- Level 3        Inputs to the valuation methodology are unobservable and significant to the fair value measurement.

The asset's or liability's fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques used need to maximize the use of observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs.

The following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for assets measured at fair value. There have been no changes in the methodologies used at December 31, 2023 and 2022.

*Mutual funds:* Valued at the daily closing price as reported by the fund. Mutual funds held by the Plan are open-end mutual funds that are registered with the Securities and Exchange Commission. These funds are required to publish their daily net asset value (NAV) and to transact at that price. The mutual funds held by the Plan are deemed to be actively traded.

*Pooled separate accounts:* Pooled separate accounts consist of various investment options including mutual funds, stocks and other pooled separate accounts, and are valued based on the investment held. The security prices were obtained from a national pricing service. While the majority of the underlying asset values are quoted prices, the net asset value of the pooled separate account is not publicly quoted.

The preceding methods described may produce a fair value calculation that may not be indicative of net realizable value or reflective of future fair values. Furthermore, although the Plan believes its valuation methods are appropriate and consistent with other market participants, the use of different methodologies or assumptions to determine the fair value of certain financial instruments could result in a different fair value measurement at the reporting date.

The Plan has an investment contract with Principal Life Insurance Company that is not fully benefit responsive. The Company maintains the contributions in a general account. The account is credited with earnings on the underlying investments and charged for participant withdrawals and administrative expenses. The guaranteed investment contract is reported at fair value Level 3, as noted above. At December 31, 2023 and 2022 the balance was \$0 and \$121,869, respectively.

**Fully Benefit Responsive Investment Contract**

The Plan entered into a fully benefit responsive guaranteed investment contract with Principal Life Insurance Company. Principal Life Insurance Company maintains the contributions in a general account. The contract is reported at contract value. At December 31, 2023 and 2022 the balance was \$1,250,013 and \$1,032,666, respectively. The account is credited with earnings on the underlying investments and charged for participant withdrawals and administrative expenses. The guaranteed investment contract issuer is contractually obligated to repay the principal and a specified interest rate that is guaranteed to the Plan.

Because the guaranteed investment contract is fully benefit-responsive, contract value is the relevant measurement attribute for that portion of the net assets available for benefits attributable to the guaranteed investment contract. Contract value, as reported to the Plan by Principal Life Insurance Company, represents contributions made under the contract, plus earnings, less participant withdrawals and administrative expenses. Participants may ordinarily direct the withdrawals or transfer of all or portion of their investment at contract value.

The traditional investment contract held by the Plan is a guaranteed investment contract. The contract issuer is contractually obligated to repay the principals and interest at a specified interest rate that is guaranteed to the Plan. The crediting rate is based on a formula established by the contract issuer. The crediting rate is reviewed periodically for resetting.

If all or a portion of the guaranteed interest account is surrendered early, there will be no charge if the interest rate (applicable U.S. treasury rate on the date of surrender plus .50%) is equal to or less than the guaranteed interest rate. If the interest rate is greater than the guaranteed interest rate, there will be a charge equal to the difference between the rates on the date of surrender and the guaranteed interest rate multiplied by the number of years remaining in the guaranteed period multiplied by the amount being surrendered.

The Plan's ability to receive amounts due in accordance with fully benefit-responsive investment contracts is dependent on the third-party issuer's ability to meet its financial obligations. The issuer's ability to meet its contractual obligations may be affected by the future economic and regulatory developments.

Certain events might limit the ability of the Plan to transact at contract value with the contract issuer, including premature termination of the contract, Plan termination, or Plan merger.

No events are probable of occurring that might limit the ability of the Plan to transact at contract value with the contract issuers and that also would limit the ability of the Plan to transact at contract value with the participants.

**NOTES TO FINANCIAL STATEMENTS**

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**NOTE 6 - RELATED PARTY TRANSACTIONS AND PARTY-IN-INTEREST TRANSACTIONS**

Certain Plan investments are shares of pooled separate accounts and guaranteed investment accounts managed by Principal Life Insurance Company. Principal Life Insurance Company provides brokerage services to the Plan and, therefore, these transactions qualify as party-in-interest transactions. Fees paid by the Plan were \$51,013 for the year ended December 31, 2023.

**NOTE 7 - MUTUAL FUND FEES**

Investments in mutual funds are subjected to sales charges in the form of front-end loads, back-end loads or 12b-1 fees. 12b-1 fees are ongoing fees allowable under Section 12b-1 of the Investment Company Act of 1940. These annual fees are used to pay for marketing and distribution costs of the funds. These fees are deducted prior to the allocation of Plan's investment earnings activity, and thus not separately identifiable as an expense.

**NOTE 8 - PLAN TERMINATION**

The Company may terminate the Plan at any time subject to the provisions of ERISA. In the event the Plan is terminated or upon the complete discontinuance of contributions by the Company to the Plan, participants would become 100% vested in all amounts credited to their account.

**NOTE 9 - TAX STATUS**

The Plan has adopted a Prototype Non-Standardized Plan sponsored by Principal Life Insurance Company. On March 31, 2014, the Internal Revenue Service ("IRS") stated in an opinion letter that the prototype adopted by the Plan, as then designed, was in compliance with applicable requirements of the Code and therefore, the related trust is exempt from taxation. The Plan has been amended since receiving the letter. However, the Plan administrator believes that the Plan is currently designed and being operated in compliance with the applicable requirements of the Code. Therefore, the Plan administrator believes that the Plan is qualified and the related trust is tax-exempt.

Accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America require Plan management to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan and recognize a tax liability if the Plan has taken an uncertain tax position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by the IRS. The Plan administrator has analyzed the tax positions taken by the Plan, and has concluded that as of December 31, 2023, there are no uncertain positions taken or expected to be taken that would require recognition of a liability or disclosure in the financial statements. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however there are currently no examinations for any tax periods in progress.

**NOTE 10 - RISKS AND UNCERTAINTIES**

The Plan invests in various investment securities. Investment securities are exposed to various risks such as interest rate, market, and credit risks, as well as risk related to the financial strength of the insurance company. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the values of investment securities will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect participants' account balances and the amounts reported in the Statements of Net Assets Available for Benefits. Volatility in the financial markets may significantly impact the subsequent valuation of the Plan's investments. Accordingly, the valuation of investments at December 31, 2023 may not necessarily be indicative of amounts that could be realized in a current market exchange.
