Report on the Audit of the Financial Statements

Opinion

We have audited the accompanying financial statements of Teamsters - TForce Freight 401(k) Plan and Trust, an employee benefit plan subject to the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA), which comprise the statements of net assets available for benefits as of December 31, 2023 and 2022, and the related statement of changes in net assets available for benefits for the year ended December 31, 2023, and the related notes to the financial statements.

In our opinion, the financial statements present fairly, in all material respects, the net assets available for benefits of Teamsters - TForce Freight 401(k) Plan as of December 31, 2023 and 2022 and the changes in its net assets available for benefits for the year ended December 31, 2023, in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.

Basis for Opinion

We conducted our audits in accordance with auditing standards generally accepted in the United States of America (GAAS). 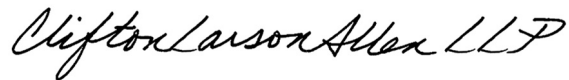

NOTE 1 PLAN DESCRIPTION

The following is a brief description of the Teamsters - TForce Freight 401(k) Plan (the Plan) and is provided for general information purposes only. Participants should refer to the Plan agreement for more complete information.

General

The Plan is a defined contribution plan established May 2, 2021. The Plan covers all employees of TForce Freight, Inc. (the Employer) whose terms and conditions of employment are governed by a collective bargaining agreement between the International Brotherhood of Teamsters, Chauffeurs, Warehousemen and Helpers of America, and each other labor union that represents employees of an Employer Company (the Employer and any domestic affiliate that adopts the Plan) for purposes of collective bargaining which has, with the approval of the Trustees, entered into a collective bargaining agreement with an Employer Company which specifically calls for the participation of its members in this Plan (the Union) and the Employer. The Plan excludes employees who are residents of Puerto Rico and leased employees. There is no age or service requirement for employees to become eligible to participate. Eligible employees enter on the later of the employment date or May 2, 2021 (the effective date of the Plan). The Plan is subject to the provisions of ERISA, as amended.

Contributions

The Plan includes a cash or deferred arrangement allowed under Section 401(k) of the Internal Revenue Code (IRC). Eligible participants may elect to contribute up to 35% of their eligible compensation to the Plan as pre-tax or after-tax Roth contributions. Each participant, shall be deemed to have made an election to have their Employer Company make elective deferral contributions on their behalf at an amount equal to 3% of eligible compensation, unless an affirmative election is made otherwise within 90 days following entry into the Plan. Each participant who is deemed to have made an elective deferral contribution election (pursuant to 3% above), shall also be deemed to have elected to increase their elective deferral contributions in 1% increments in each Plan year following the Plan year of automatic enrollment up to a maximum deferral rate of 10% of eligible compensation. The Plan also allows each eligible participant to elect to reduce their eligible compensation by a whole percentage up to but not exceeding 5% as an after-tax voluntary contribution, subject to Plan provisions. The Plan allows participants age 50 and over to make catch up contributions.

Participants may also contribute amounts representing distributions from other qualified defined benefit or defined contribution plans (rollover). Participants direct the investment of contributions into various investment options offered by the Plan. Contributions are subject to certain Internal Revenue Service (IRS) limitations.

Participant Accounts

Each participant's account is credited with the participant's deferral and voluntary contributions and an allocation of Plan earnings and losses. Participant accounts may charge with an allocation of administrative expenses that are paid by the Plan. Allocations are based on participant earnings or account balances, or participant transactions, as defined. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant's vested account.

Vesting

The participants are always 100% vested in the value of their accounts.

Notes Receivable from Participants

Participants are entitled to borrow up to 50% of their vested account balances, subject to a \$1,000 minimum and \$50,000 maximum note for specified purposes as defined by the Plan. Notes are repayable over periods of not more than five years (or longer period for purchase of a principal residence) and bear interest at the prime rate plus 1% at the time of borrowing. Principal and interest are repaid ratably through payroll deductions.

Benefit Payments

Upon termination of service, death, disability, or retirement, the participant may receive the value of vested interest in their account in the form of a lump sum distribution, partial withdrawals or installment payment. If a participant terminates employment and the participant's account balance was never greater than \$1,000, the Plan administrator will authorize the benefit payment without the participant's consent. The Plan also allows for in-service withdrawals at age 59½ and financial hardship, subject to Plan provisions.

NOTE 2 SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of Accounting

The financial statements of the Plan are prepared on the accrual basis of accounting.

Use of Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America requires the Plan administrator to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of net assets available for benefits and disclosures of contingent net assets available for benefits at the date of the financial statements and the reported amounts of changes in net assets available for benefits during the reporting period. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

NOTE 2 SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES (CONTINUED)

Investment Valuation and Income Recognition

The Plan's investments are reported at fair value (except for the fully benefit-responsive investment contracts, which are reported at contract value). Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. See Note 3 for fair value of investments.

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Net appreciation includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold as well as held during the year.

Notes Receivable from Participants

Notes receivable from participants are measured at their unpaid principal balance plus any accrued but unpaid interest. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Related fees are recorded as administrative expenses and are expensed when they are incurred. No allowance for credit losses has been recorded as of December 31, 2023 and 2022. If a participant ceases to make note repayments and the Plan administrator deems the participant note to be in default, the participant note balance will be deemed taxable to the participant. The note balance will be reduced and a benefit payment will be recorded at the time the participant incurs a distributable event.

Administrative Expenses

Certain expenses of maintaining the Plan are paid directly by the Employer and are excluded from these financial statements. Certain fees related to the administration of investment management, investment advisory, benefits paid, notes receivable from participants, and other administration of accounts are charged directly to the participant accounts and are included in the administrative expenses. Investment related expenses are included in the net appreciation of fair value of investments.

Benefit Payments

Benefits are recorded when paid.

Subsequent Events

The Plan has evaluated subsequent events through October, 7, 2024, except as to Note 10, which is as of December 19, 2024, the date the financial statements were available to be issued.

NOTE 3 FAIR VALUE OF INVESTMENTS

Financial Accounting Standards Board (FASB) *Accounting Standards Codification* (ASC) 820, *Fair Value Measurements and Disclosures*, provides the framework for measuring fair value. That framework provides a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value.

The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (Level 1) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (Level 3). The three levels of the fair value hierarchy are described as follows:

Level 1 – Inputs to the valuation methodology are unadjusted quoted prices for identical assets or liabilities in active markets that the Plan has the ability to access.

Level 2 – Inputs other than quoted prices included within Level 1 that are observable for the asset or liability, either directly or indirectly, such as:

- quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities in active markets;
- quoted prices for identical or similar assets or liabilities in inactive markets;
- inputs other than quoted prices that are observable for the asset or liability;
- inputs that are derived principally from or corroborated by observable market data by correlation or other means.

If the asset or liability has a specified (contractual) term, the Level 2 input must be observable for substantially the full term of the asset or liability.

Level 3 – Inputs to the valuation methodology are unobservable and significant to the fair market value measurement.

The asset or liability's fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques used need to maximize the use of observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs.

Following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for assets measured at fair value. There have been no changes in valuation methodologies used at December 31, 2023 and 2022.

Collective Funds: Valued daily at the net asset value (NAV) of units of the bank collective trust. NAV is a readily determinable fair value and is the basis for current transactions. Participants may transact (purchases and sales) on a daily basis.

Self-Directed Brokerage Accounts: Consist of interest bearing cash, common stock, preferred stock and unit investment trusts. Investments in interest bearing cash are valued based on cost, which approximates fair value in a noninflationary economy and is protected by the Federal Deposit Insurance Corporation. Investments in the common stock, preferred stock and unit investment trusts are valued at the closing price reported in the active market in which the individual security is traded.

NOTE 4 GROUP ANNUITY CONTRACT WITH INSURANCE COMPANY

The Plan entered into a traditional fully benefit-responsive guaranteed investment contract with Prudential Retirement Insurance and Annuity Company (Prudential). Prudential maintains the contributions in a general account. The account is credited with earnings on the underlying investments and charged for participant withdrawals and administrative expenses. The guaranteed investment contract issuer is contractually obligated to repay the principal and a specified interest rate that is guaranteed to the Plan. The crediting rate is based on a formula established by the contract issuer but may not be less than 0%. The crediting rate is reviewed on a periodically for resetting.

This contract meets the fully benefit-responsive investment contract criteria and therefore, is reported at contract value. Contract value is the relevant measure for fully benefit-responsive investment contracts because this is the amount received by participants if they were to initiate permitted transactions under the terms of the Plan. Contract value, as reported to the Plan by Prudential, represents contributions made under the contract, plus earnings, less participant withdrawals, and administrative expenses. Participants may ordinarily direct the withdrawal or transfer of all or a portion of their investment at contract value.

The Plan's ability to receive amounts due is dependent on the issuer's ability to meet its financial obligations. The issuer's ability to meet its contractual obligations may be affected by future economic and regulatory developments.

Certain events might limit the ability of the Plan to transact at contract value with the issuer. Such events include (1) amendments to the Plan documents (including complete or partial Plan termination or merger with another plan), (2) changes to the Plan's prohibition on competing investment options or deletion of equity wash provisions, (3) bankruptcy of the Plan Sponsor or other Plan Sponsor events (for example, divestitures or spin-off of a subsidiary) that cause a significant withdrawal from the Plan, (4) the failure of the trust to qualify for exemption from federal income taxes or any required prohibited transaction exemption under ERISA, or (5) premature termination of the contract.

In addition, certain events allow the issuer to terminate the contract with the Plan and settle at an amount different from contract value. Such events include (1) an uncured violation of the Plan's investment guidelines, (2) a breach of material obligation under the contract, (3) a material misrepresentation, and (4) a material amendment to the agreement without the consent of the issuer.

NOTE 5 TAX STATUS

The Company has filed for a determination letter with the IRS and has not received any formal letter back as of the date of the financial statements. The Plan administrator believes that the Plan is designed and is currently being operated in compliance with the applicable requirements of the IRC. Therefore, we believe that the Plan is qualified, and the related trust is tax-exempt.

Accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America require Plan management to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan and recognize a tax liability (or asset) if the Plan has taken an uncertain position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by the IRS. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress.

NOTE 6 RISKS AND UNCERTAINTIES

The Plan invests in various investment securities. Investment securities are exposed to various risks such as interest rate, market, and credit risks. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the values of the investment securities will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect participants' account balances and the amounts reported in the statements of net assets available for benefits.

NOTE 7 PLAN TERMINATION

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the Employer has the right under the Plan to discontinue contributions at any time and to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions of ERISA.

NOTE 10 NONEXEMPT TRANSACTIONS

The previously issued financial statements dated October 7, 2024, have been revised to correct an error in the disclosure of the amounts reported and disclosed in the Schedule of Delinquent Participant Contributions for the year ended December 31, 2022 as described below.

During 2022 and 2023, the Company failed to remit employee 401(k) deferral contributions and loan repayments for certain payroll periods within the timeframe prescribed by the Department of Labor. These are deemed prohibited transactions in accordance with ERISA and the IRC. These delinquent transmittals totaled \$5,882,779 and \$1,240,591 for 2022 and 2023. In 2022, the Company corrected \$5,785,757 (\$0 was previously reported on the 2022 financial statements) of the 2022 late remittances. The Company corrected the remaining \$1,240,591 (\$97,022 of 2022 late remittances and \$1,143,569 of 2023 late remittances) in 2024 by depositing lost earnings.

Report on the Audit of the Financial Statements

Opinion

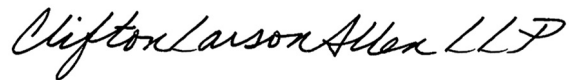

NOTE 1 PLAN DESCRIPTION

The following is a brief description of the Teamsters - TForce Freight 401(k) Plan (the Plan) and is provided for general information purposes only. Participants should refer to the Plan agreement for more complete information.

General

The Plan is a defined contribution plan established May 2, 2021. The Plan covers all employees of TForce Freight, Inc. (the Employer) whose terms and conditions of employment are governed by a collective bargaining agreement between the International Brotherhood of Teamsters, Chauffeurs, Warehouseman and Helpers of America, and each other labor union that represents employees of an Employer Company (the Employer and any domestic affiliate that adopts the Plan) for purposes of collective bargaining which has, with the approval of the Trustees, entered into an collective bargaining agreement with an Employer Company which specifically calls for the participation of its members in this Plan (the Union) and the Employer. The Plan excludes employees who are residents of Puerto Rico and leased employees. There is no age or service requirement for employees to become eligible to participate. Eligible employees enter on the later of the employment date or May 2, 2021 (the effective date of the Plan). The Plan is subject to the provisions of ERISA, as amended.

Contributions

The Plan includes a cash or deferred arrangement allowed under Section 401k of the Internal Revenue Code (IRC). Eligible participants may elect to contribute up to 35% of their eligible compensation to the Plan as pre-tax or after-tax Roth contributions. Each participant, shall be deemed to have made an election to have their Employer Company make elective deferral contributions on their behalf at an amount equal to 3% of eligible compensation, unless an affirmative election is made otherwise within 90 days following entry into the Plan. Each participant who is deemed to have made an elective deferral contribution election (pursuant to 3% above), shall also be deemed to have elected to increase their elective deferral contributions in 1% increments in each Plan year following the Plan year of automatic enrollment up to a maximum deferral rate of 10% of eligible compensation. The Plan also allows each eligible participant to elect to reduce their eligible compensation by a whole percentage up to but not exceeding 5% as an after-tax voluntary contribution, subject to Plan provisions. The Plan allows participants age 50 and over to make catch up contributions.

Participants may also contribute amounts representing distributions from other qualified defined benefit or defined contribution plans (rollover). Participants direct the investment of contributions into various investment options offered by the Plan. Contributions are subject to certain Internal Revenue Service (IRS) limitations.

Participant Accounts

Each participant's account is credited with the participant's deferral and voluntary contributions and an allocation of Plan earnings and losses. Participant accounts may charge with an allocation of administrative expenses that are paid by the Plan. Allocations are based on participant earnings or account balances, or participant transactions, as defined. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant's vested account.

Vesting

The participants are always 100% vested in the value of their accounts.

Notes Receivable from Participants

Participants are entitled to borrow up to 50% of their vested account balances, subject to a \$1,000 minimum and \$50,000 maximum note for specified purposes as defined by the Plan. Notes are repayable over periods of not more than five years (or longer period for purchase of a principal residence) and bear interest at the prime rate plus 1% at the time of borrowing. Principal and interest are repaid ratably through payroll deductions.

Benefit Payments

Upon termination of service, death, disability, or retirement, the participant may receive the value of vested interest in their account in the form of a lump sum distribution, partial withdrawals or installment payment. If a participant terminates employment and the participant's account balance was never greater than \$1,000, the Plan administrator will authorize the benefit payment without the participant's consent. The Plan also allows for in-service withdrawals at age 59½ and financial hardship, subject to Plan provisions.

NOTE 2 SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of Accounting

The financial statements of the Plan are prepared on the accrual basis of accounting.

Use of Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America requires the Plan administrator to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of net assets available for benefits and disclosures of contingent net assets available for benefits at the date of the financial statements and the reported amounts of changes in net assets available for benefits during the reporting period. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

NOTE 2 SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES (CONTINUED)

Investment Valuation and Income Recognition

The Plan's investments are reported at fair value (except for the fully benefit-responsive investment contracts, which are reported at contract value). Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. See Note 3 for fair value of investments.

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Net appreciation includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold as well as held during the year.

Notes Receivable from Participants

Notes receivable from participants are measured at their unpaid principal balance plus any accrued but unpaid interest. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Related fees are recorded as administrative expenses and are expensed when they are incurred. No allowance for credit losses has been recorded as of December 31, 2023 and 2022. If a participant ceases to make note repayments and the Plan administrator deems the participant note to be in default, the participant note balance will be deemed taxable to the participant. The note balance will be reduced and a benefit payment will be recorded at the time the participant incurs a distributable event.

Administrative Expenses

Certain expenses of maintaining the Plan are paid directly by the Employer and are excluded from these financial statements. Certain fees related to the administration of investment management, investment advisory, benefits paid, notes receivable from participants, and other administration of accounts are charged directly to the participant accounts and are included in the administrative expenses. Investment related expenses are included in the net appreciation of fair value of investments.

Benefit Payments

Benefits are recorded when paid.

Subsequent Events

The Plan has evaluated subsequent events through October, 7, 2024, except as to Note 10, which is as of December 19, 2024, the date the financial statements were available to be issued.

NOTE 3 FAIR VALUE OF INVESTMENTS

Financial Accounting Standards Board (FASB) *Accounting Standards Codification* (ASC) 820, *Fair Value Measurements and Disclosures*, provides the framework for measuring fair value. That framework provides a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value.

The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (Level 1) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (Level 3). The three levels of the fair value hierarchy are described as follows:

Level 1 – Inputs to the valuation methodology are unadjusted quoted prices for identical assets or liabilities in active markets that the Plan has the ability to access.

Level 2 – Inputs other than quoted prices included within Level 1 that are observable for the asset or liability, either directly or indirectly, such as:

- quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities in active markets;
- quoted prices for identical or similar assets or liabilities in inactive markets;
- inputs other than quoted prices that are observable for the asset or liability;
- inputs that are derived principally from or corroborated by observable market data by correlation or other means.

If the asset or liability has a specified (contractual) term, the Level 2 input must be observable for substantially the full term of the asset or liability.

Level 3 – Inputs to the valuation methodology are unobservable and significant to the fair market value measurement.

The asset or liability's fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques used need to maximize the use of observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs.

Following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for assets measured at fair value. There have been no changes in valuation methodologies used at December 31, 2023 and 2022.

Collective Funds: Valued daily at the net asset value (NAV) of units of the bank collective trust. NAV is a readily determinable fair value and is the basis for current transactions. Participants may transact (purchases and sales) on a daily basis.

Self-Directed Brokerage Accounts: Consist of interest bearing cash, common stock, preferred stock and unit investment trusts. Investments in interest bearing cash are valued based on cost, which approximates fair value in a noninflationary economy and is protected by the Federal Deposit Insurance Corporation. Investments in the common stock, preferred stock and unit investment trusts are valued at the closing price reported in the active market in which the individual security is traded.

NOTE 4 GROUP ANNUITY CONTRACT WITH INSURANCE COMPANY

The Plan entered into a traditional fully benefit-responsive guaranteed investment contract with Prudential Retirement Insurance and Annuity Company (Prudential). Prudential maintains the contributions in a general account. The account is credited with earnings on the underlying investments and charged for participant withdrawals and administrative expenses. The guaranteed investment contract issuer is contractually obligated to repay the principal and a specified interest rate that is guaranteed to the Plan. The crediting rate is based on a formula established by the contract issuer but may not be less than 0%. The crediting rate is reviewed on a periodically for resetting.

This contract meets the fully benefit-responsive investment contract criteria and therefore, is reported at contract value. Contract value is the relevant measure for fully benefit-responsive investment contracts because this is the amount received by participants if they were to initiate permitted transactions under the terms of the Plan. Contract value, as reported to the Plan by Prudential, represents contributions made under the contract, plus earnings, less participant withdrawals, and administrative expenses. Participants may ordinarily direct the withdrawal or transfer of all or a portion of their investment at contract value.

The Plan's ability to receive amounts due is dependent on the issuer's ability to meet its financial obligations. The issuer's ability to meet its contractual obligations may be affected by future economic and regulatory developments.

Certain events might limit the ability of the Plan to transact at contract value with the issuer. Such events include (1) amendments to the Plan documents (including complete or partial Plan termination or merger with another plan), (2) changes to the Plan's prohibition on competing investment options or deletion of equity wash provisions, (3) bankruptcy of the Plan Sponsor or other Plan Sponsor events (for example, divestitures or spin-off of a subsidiary) that cause a significant withdrawal from the Plan, (4) the failure of the trust to qualify for exemption from federal income taxes or any required prohibited transaction exemption under ERISA, or (5) premature termination of the contract.

In addition, certain events allow the issuer to terminate the contract with the Plan and settle at an amount different from contract value. Such events include (1) an uncured violation of the Plan's investment guidelines, (2) a breach of material obligation under the contract, (3) a material misrepresentation, and (4) a material amendment to the agreement without the consent of the issuer.

NOTE 5 TAX STATUS

The Company has filed for a determination letter with the IRS and has not received any formal letter back as of the date of the financial statements. The Plan administrator believes that the Plan is designed and is currently being operated in compliance with the applicable requirements of the IRC. Therefore, we believe that the Plan is qualified, and the related trust is tax-exempt.

Accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America require Plan management to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan and recognize a tax liability (or asset) if the Plan has taken an uncertain position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by the IRS. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress.

NOTE 6 RISKS AND UNCERTAINTIES

The Plan invests in various investment securities. Investment securities are exposed to various risks such as interest rate, market, and credit risks. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the values of the investment securities will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect participants' account balances and the amounts reported in the statements of net assets available for benefits.

NOTE 7 PLAN TERMINATION

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the Employer has the right under the Plan to discontinue contributions at any time and to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions of ERISA.

Prudential Retirement Insurance and Annuity Company, the insurance company, provides recordkeeping services for the Plan. Therefore, the investment transactions qualify as party-in-interest transactions.

NOTE 10 NONEXEMPT TRANSACTIONS

The previously issued financial statements dated October 7, 2024, have been revised to correct an error in the disclosure of the amounts reported and disclosed in the Schedule of Delinquent Participant Contributions for the year ended December 31, 2022 as described below.

During 2022 and 2023, the Company failed to remit employee 401(k) deferral contributions and loan repayments for certain payroll periods within the timeframe prescribed by the Department of Labor. These are deemed prohibited transactions in accordance with ERISA and the IRC. These delinquent transmittals totaled \$5,882,779 and \$1,240,591 for 2022 and 2023. In 2022, the Company corrected \$5,785,757 (\$0 was previously reported on the 2022 financial statements) of the 2022 late remittances. The Company corrected the remaining \$1,240,591 (\$97,022 of 2022 late remittances and \$1,143,569 of 2023 late remittances) in 2024 by depositing lost earnings.

Report on the Audit of the Financial Statements

Opinion

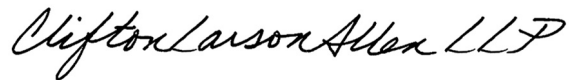

NOTE 1 PLAN DESCRIPTION

The following is a brief description of the Teamsters - TForce Freight 401(k) Plan (the Plan) and is provided for general information purposes only. Participants should refer to the Plan agreement for more complete information.

General

The Plan is a defined contribution plan established May 2, 2021. The Plan covers all employees of TForce Freight, Inc. (the Employer) whose terms and conditions of employment are governed by a collective bargaining agreement between the International Brotherhood of Teamsters, Chauffeurs, Warehouseman and Helpers of America, and each other labor union that represents employees of an Employer Company (the Employer and any domestic affiliate that adopts the Plan) for purposes of collective bargaining which has, with the approval of the Trustees, entered into an collective bargaining agreement with an Employer Company which specifically calls for the participation of its members in this Plan (the Union) and the Employer. The Plan excludes employees who are residents of Puerto Rico and leased employees. There is no age or service requirement for employees to become eligible to participate. Eligible employees enter on the later of the employment date or May 2, 2021 (the effective date of the Plan). The Plan is subject to the provisions of ERISA, as amended.

Contributions

The Plan includes a cash or deferred arrangement allowed under Section 401k of the Internal Revenue Code (IRC). Eligible participants may elect to contribute up to 35% of their eligible compensation to the Plan as pre-tax or after-tax Roth contributions. Each participant, shall be deemed to have made an election to have their Employer Company make elective deferral contributions on their behalf at an amount equal to 3% of eligible compensation, unless an affirmative election is made otherwise within 90 days following entry into the Plan. Each participant who is deemed to have made an elective deferral contribution election (pursuant to 3% above), shall also be deemed to have elected to increase their elective deferral contributions in 1% increments in each Plan year following the Plan year of automatic enrollment up to a maximum deferral rate of 10% of eligible compensation. The Plan also allows each eligible participant to elect to reduce their eligible compensation by a whole percentage up to but not exceeding 5% as an after-tax voluntary contribution, subject to Plan provisions. The Plan allows participants age 50 and over to make catch up contributions.

Participants may also contribute amounts representing distributions from other qualified defined benefit or defined contribution plans (rollover). Participants direct the investment of contributions into various investment options offered by the Plan. Contributions are subject to certain Internal Revenue Service (IRS) limitations.

NOTE 1 PLAN DESCRIPTION (CONTINUED)

Participant Accounts

Each participant's account is credited with the participant's deferral and voluntary contributions and an allocation of Plan earnings and losses. Participant accounts may charge with an allocation of administrative expenses that are paid by the Plan. Allocations are based on participant earnings or account balances, or participant transactions, as defined. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant's vested account.

Vesting

The participants are always 100% vested in the value of their accounts.

Notes Receivable from Participants

Participants are entitled to borrow up to 50% of their vested account balances, subject to a \$1,000 minimum and \$50,000 maximum note for specified purposes as defined by the Plan. Notes are repayable over periods of not more than five years (or longer period for purchase of a principal residence) and bear interest at the prime rate plus 1% at the time of borrowing. Principal and interest are repaid ratably through payroll deductions.

Benefit Payments

Upon termination of service, death, disability, or retirement, the participant may receive the value of vested interest in their account in the form of a lump sum distribution, partial withdrawals or installment payment. If a participant terminates employment and the participant's account balance was never greater than \$1,000, the Plan administrator will authorize the benefit payment without the participant's consent. The Plan also allows for in-service withdrawals at age 59½ and financial hardship, subject to Plan provisions.

NOTE 2 SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of Accounting

The financial statements of the Plan are prepared on the accrual basis of accounting.

Use of Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America requires the Plan administrator to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of net assets available for benefits and disclosures of contingent net assets available for benefits at the date of the financial statements and the reported amounts of changes in net assets available for benefits during the reporting period. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

NOTE 2 SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES (CONTINUED)

Investment Valuation and Income Recognition

The Plan's investments are reported at fair value (except for the fully benefit-responsive investment contracts, which are reported at contract value). Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. See Note 3 for fair value of investments.

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Net appreciation includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold as well as held during the year.

Notes Receivable from Participants

Notes receivable from participants are measured at their unpaid principal balance plus any accrued but unpaid interest. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Related fees are recorded as administrative expenses and are expensed when they are incurred. No allowance for credit losses has been recorded as of December 31, 2023 and 2022. If a participant ceases to make note repayments and the Plan administrator deems the participant note to be in default, the participant note balance will be deemed taxable to the participant. The note balance will be reduced and a benefit payment will be recorded at the time the participant incurs a distributable event.

Administrative Expenses

Certain expenses of maintaining the Plan are paid directly by the Employer and are excluded from these financial statements. Certain fees related to the administration of investment management, investment advisory, benefits paid, notes receivable from participants, and other administration of accounts are charged directly to the participant accounts and are included in the administrative expenses. Investment related expenses are included in the net appreciation of fair value of investments.

Benefit Payments

Benefits are recorded when paid.

Subsequent Events

The Plan has evaluated subsequent events through October, 7, 2024, except as to Note 10, which is as of December 19, 2024, the date the financial statements were available to be issued.

NOTE 3 FAIR VALUE OF INVESTMENTS

Financial Accounting Standards Board (FASB) *Accounting Standards Codification* (ASC) 820, *Fair Value Measurements and Disclosures*, provides the framework for measuring fair value. That framework provides a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value.

The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (Level 1) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (Level 3). The three levels of the fair value hierarchy are described as follows:

Level 1 – Inputs to the valuation methodology are unadjusted quoted prices for identical assets or liabilities in active markets that the Plan has the ability to access.

Level 2 – Inputs other than quoted prices included within Level 1 that are observable for the asset or liability, either directly or indirectly, such as:

- quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities in active markets;
- quoted prices for identical or similar assets or liabilities in inactive markets;
- inputs other than quoted prices that are observable for the asset or liability;
- inputs that are derived principally from or corroborated by observable market data by correlation or other means.

If the asset or liability has a specified (contractual) term, the Level 2 input must be observable for substantially the full term of the asset or liability.

Level 3 – Inputs to the valuation methodology are unobservable and significant to the fair market value measurement.

The asset or liability's fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques used need to maximize the use of observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs.

Following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for assets measured at fair value. There have been no changes in valuation methodologies used at December 31, 2023 and 2022.

Collective Funds: Valued daily at the net asset value (NAV) of units of the bank collective trust. NAV is a readily determinable fair value and is the basis for current transactions. Participants may transact (purchases and sales) on a daily basis.

Self-Directed Brokerage Accounts: Consist of interest bearing cash, common stock, preferred stock and unit investment trusts. Investments in interest bearing cash are valued based on cost, which approximates fair value in a noninflationary economy and is protected by the Federal Deposit Insurance Corporation. Investments in the common stock, preferred stock and unit investment trusts are valued at the closing price reported in the active market in which the individual security is traded.

NOTE 4 GROUP ANNUITY CONTRACT WITH INSURANCE COMPANY

The Plan entered into a traditional fully benefit-responsive guaranteed investment contract with Prudential Retirement Insurance and Annuity Company (Prudential). Prudential maintains the contributions in a general account. The account is credited with earnings on the underlying investments and charged for participant withdrawals and administrative expenses. The guaranteed investment contract issuer is contractually obligated to repay the principal and a specified interest rate that is guaranteed to the Plan. The crediting rate is based on a formula established by the contract issuer but may not be less than 0%. The crediting rate is reviewed on a periodically for resetting.

This contract meets the fully benefit-responsive investment contract criteria and therefore, is reported at contract value. Contract value is the relevant measure for fully benefit-responsive investment contracts because this is the amount received by participants if they were to initiate permitted transactions under the terms of the Plan. Contract value, as reported to the Plan by Prudential, represents contributions made under the contract, plus earnings, less participant withdrawals, and administrative expenses. Participants may ordinarily direct the withdrawal or transfer of all or a portion of their investment at contract value.

The Plan's ability to receive amounts due is dependent on the issuer's ability to meet its financial obligations. The issuer's ability to meet its contractual obligations may be affected by future economic and regulatory developments.

Certain events might limit the ability of the Plan to transact at contract value with the issuer. Such events include (1) amendments to the Plan documents (including complete or partial Plan termination or merger with another plan), (2) changes to the Plan's prohibition on competing investment options or deletion of equity wash provisions, (3) bankruptcy of the Plan Sponsor or other Plan Sponsor events (for example, divestitures or spin-off of a subsidiary) that cause a significant withdrawal from the Plan, (4) the failure of the trust to qualify for exemption from federal income taxes or any required prohibited transaction exemption under ERISA, or (5) premature termination of the contract.

In addition, certain events allow the issuer to terminate the contract with the Plan and settle at an amount different from contract value. Such events include (1) an uncured violation of the Plan's investment guidelines, (2) a breach of material obligation under the contract, (3) a material misrepresentation, and (4) a material amendment to the agreement without the consent of the issuer.

NOTE 5 TAX STATUS

The Company has filed for a determination letter with the IRS and has not received any formal letter back as of the date of the financial statements. The Plan administrator believes that the Plan is designed and is currently being operated in compliance with the applicable requirements of the IRC. Therefore, we believe that the Plan is qualified, and the related trust is tax-exempt.

Accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America require Plan management to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan and recognize a tax liability (or asset) if the Plan has taken an uncertain position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by the IRS. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress.

NOTE 6 RISKS AND UNCERTAINTIES

The Plan invests in various investment securities. Investment securities are exposed to various risks such as interest rate, market, and credit risks. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the values of the investment securities will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect participants' account balances and the amounts reported in the statements of net assets available for benefits.

NOTE 7 PLAN TERMINATION

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the Employer has the right under the Plan to discontinue contributions at any time and to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions of ERISA.

NOTE 10 NONEXEMPT TRANSACTIONS

The previously issued financial statements dated October 7, 2024, have been revised to correct an error in the disclosure of the amounts reported and disclosed in the Schedule of Delinquent Participant Contributions for the year ended December 31, 2022 as described below.

During 2022 and 2023, the Company failed to remit employee 401(k) deferral contributions and loan repayments for certain payroll periods within the timeframe prescribed by the Department of Labor. These are deemed prohibited transactions in accordance with ERISA and the IRC. These delinquent transmittals totaled \$5,882,779 and \$1,240,591 for 2022 and 2023. In 2022, the Company corrected \$5,785,757 (\$0 was previously reported on the 2022 financial statements) of the 2022 late remittances. The Company corrected the remaining \$1,240,591 (\$97,022 of 2022 late remittances and \$1,143,569 of 2023 late remittances) in 2024 by depositing lost earnings.
