To the Board of Trustees of the

Opinion

We have audited the financial statements of the Painters District Council 711 Health and Welfare Fund (the Plan), an employee benefit plan subject to the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA), which comprise the statements of net assets available for benefits and of benefit obligations as of April 30, 2024 and 2023, and the related statements of changes in net assets available for benefits and of changes in benefit obligations for the years then ended, and the related notes to the financial statements.

As discussed in Note 13, the Plan merged into the International Union of Painters & Allied Trades District Council No. 21 Welfare Fund effective April 30, 2024. Our opinion is not modified with respect to this matter.

NOTE 1. SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Method of Accounting - The financial statements are prepared using the accrual basis of accounting.

Investments and Investment Recognition - Investments in United States Government and Government Agency obligations, corporate obligations, common stock, the short-term investments and interest bearing cash, and the fixed income mutual fund are carried at fair value which generally represents quoted market prices as of the last business day of the year or net asset value of the fund.

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on the trade-date basis. Interest and dividend income are recorded on the accrual basis. Net appreciation (depreciation) includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold, as well as held during the year.

Employer Contributions Receivable - Contributions due but not paid prior to year end are recorded as contributions receivable. The Plan believes that the receivables are fully collectible; therefore, no allowance for credit losses is recorded.

Benefit Obligations - Claims incurred but not reported and accumulated eligibility credits are determined by the Plan's actuary or third-party administrator based on claims experience. The benefit obligations for claims payable and vacation benefits payable are calculated by the Plan's administrator.

Estimates - The preparation of financial statements in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect certain amounts and disclosures in the financial statements. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

Stop-Loss - The Plan has entered into a stop-loss insurance arrangement in an effort to limit its exposure for self-insured benefits (individual participant claims over a specified dollar amount, as well as its aggregate exposure for all claims). Premium for stop-loss insurance are included in total cost of benefits in the accompanying statements of changes in net assets available for benefits. Stop-loss refunds are also posted as a credit to the cost of benefits.

Refunds - The Plan utilizes a pharmacy benefit manager (PBM) which periodically makes refunds to the Plan based on the Plan's actual utilization pattern of specific drugs. Refunds due from the Plan's PBM are recorded when earned and are reported as a receivable, with the offset being netted with claims paid in the accompanying statements of changes in net assets available for benefits for the years ended April 30, 2024 and 2023.

NOTE 1. SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES (continued)

Reclassifications - Certain reclassifications have been made to prior year amounts to conform with the current year presentation.

NOTE 2. DESCRIPTION OF THE PLAN

The following description of the Painters District Council 711 Health and Welfare Fund (the Plan) provides only general information. Participant should refer to the Summary Plan Description for a more complete description of the Plan's provisions.

The Plan is a multiemployer health and welfare plan and is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA), as amended. The Plan was established on June 1, 1990 as a result of a collective bargaining agreement between the Painters District Council 711 of the International Union of Painters and employer associations.

The Plan provides health and welfare benefits to eligible members and their dependents of the Painters District Council 711 of the International Union of Painters which represents painters and workers in allied trades throughout the State of New Jersey.

Participants become eligible for benefits on the first day of the month following the month in which the participant first completes the required number of hours of work with a contributing employer during no more than a 12 consecutive month period. The effective date is the date on which initial eligibility is reached. On the effective date, the participant and eligible dependents are eligible for benefits for the 12-month period immediately following the effective date, or the eligibility period. After initial eligibility, completion of the required hours of work with a contributing employer during any work period subsequent to the participants effective date will qualify the participant for either Level 1 or Level 2 benefits for the following eligibility period.

Participants who are eligible for Level 1 benefits are eligible for medical benefits and a life insurance benefit totaling \$15,000. Level 2 benefits consist of Level 1 benefits, plus prescription drug, dental, vision and disability benefits.

The Plan provides health benefits (including major medical, hospital, dental, and vision and prescription drug), life insurance, accidental death and dismemberment and weekly disability benefits to participants who have met certain eligibility requirements.

NOTE 3. PRIORITIES UPON TERMINATION

It was the intent of the Trustees to continue the Plan in full force and effect; however, to safeguard against any unforeseen contingencies, the right to discontinue the Plan is reserved to the Trustees. In the event of termination, the Trustees shall first satisfy or make provisions to satisfy the obligations of the Plan. Any remaining Plan assets will be distributed in such manner as will in the opinion of the Trustees bring about the purpose of the Plan. Termination shall not permit any part of the Plan to be used for or diverted to purposes other than the exclusive benefit of the participants. The Plan was terminated as of April 30, 2024. See Note 13 for further information.

NOTE 4. TAX STATUS

The Plan obtained its latest determination letter dated February 15, 1991, in which the Internal Revenue Service stated that the Plan, as then designed, was in compliance with the applicable requirements under Section 501(c)(9) of the Internal Revenue Code and was, therefore, not subject to tax under present Federal income tax laws. The Plan has been amended since receiving the determination letter. The Plan's Trustees and the Plan's counsel believe that the Plan is currently designed and being operated in compliance with the applicable requirements of the Internal Revenue Code.

Accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America require Plan management to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan and recognize a tax liability if the Plan has taken an uncertain position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by the U.S. Federal, state, or local taxing authorities. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress. Typically, plan tax years will remain open for three years; however, this may differ depending upon the circumstances of the Plan.

NOTE 5. FUNDING POLICY

Benefits are funded by employer contributions made on behalf of the participants, as agreed to in the collective bargaining agreements, participant contributions and COBRA contributions. Employer contributions, participant contributions, and COBRA contributions are accounted for as exchange transactions.

NOTE 6. FAIR VALUE MEASUREMENTS

The framework for measuring fair value provides a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (Level 1) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (Level 3). The three levels of the fair value hierarchy are described as follows:

Basis of Fair Value Measurement:

Level 1 - Inputs to the valuation methodology are unadjusted quoted prices for identical assets or liabilities in active markets that the Plan has the ability to access.

Level 2 - Inputs to the valuation methodology include: quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities in active markets; quoted prices for identical or similar assets or liabilities in inactive markets; inputs other than quoted prices that are observable for the asset or liability; inputs that are derived principally from or corroborated by observable market data by correlation or other means.

If the asset or liability has a specified (contractual) term, the level 2 input must be observable for substantially the full term of the asset or liability.

Level 3 - Inputs to the valuation methodology are unobservable and significant to the fair value measurement.

NOTE 6. FAIR VALUE MEASUREMENTS (continued)

The asset or liability's fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques maximize the use of relevant observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs.

No investments were held as of April 30, 2024 due to the merger of the assets of the Plan into the International Union of Painters & Allied Trades District Council No. 21 Welfare Fund effective April 30, 2024.

The availability of observable market data is monitored to assess the appropriate classification of financial instruments within the fair value hierarchy. Changes in economic conditions or model-based valuation techniques may require the transfer of financial instruments from one fair value level to another. In such instances, the transfer is reported at the beginning of the period.

For the years ended April 30, 2024 and 2023, there were no transfers in or out of levels 1, 2, or 3.

NOTE 7. RELATED PARTY TRANSACTIONS

Contributions from participating employers are remitted to a common District Council 711 Disbursal Account. These funds are then transferred to the appropriate Painters District Council 711 Benefit Funds (the Funds). The amount collected on behalf of the Plan but not yet dispersed totaled \$2,385,353 at April 30, 2023. These amounts are recorded as cash on the Plan's statement of net assets available for benefits.

Morgan Stanley is the Plan's investment custodian. As noted on the Schedule of Reportable Transactions, certain investments are Morgan Stanley products.

NOTE 8. BENEFIT OBLIGATIONS

The obligation for claims payable and incurred but not reported represents those claims that were incurred prior to the end of the plan year and paid thereafter.

The obligation for accumulated eligibility credits represents the benefit periods earned as of the end of the plan year but not utilized until after the plan year.

NOTE 10. RISKS AND UNCERTAINTIES

The Plan invests in various investments. Investments are exposed to various risks such as economic, interest rate, market and sector risks. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investments, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the values of investments will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect the amounts reported in the statements of net assets available for benefits.

NOTE 11. CASH AND CASH EQUIVALENTS CONCENTRATIONS

The Plan maintains its cash at various financial institutions. The balances are insured by the Federal Deposit Insurance Corporation (FDIC) up to \$250,000 per bank. No cash was held as of April 30, 2024 due to the merger of the assets of the Plan into the International Union of Painters & Allied Trades District Council No. 21 Welfare Fund effective April 30, 2024.

NOTE 12. DEPOSIT WITH HORIZON BLUE CROSS BLUE SHIELD OF NEW JERSEY

At April 30, 2023, Horizon Blue Cross Blue Shield of New Jersey held a deposit from the Plan totaling \$441,675. The deposit was required by Horizon as part of the administrative services agreement between Horizon Blue Cross Blue Shield of New Jersey and Painters District Council 711 Health and Welfare Fund. Under the terms of this agreement, the deposit is used to fund claims that are paid by Horizon Blue Cross Blue Shield of New Jersey on behalf of the Plan that have not yet been invoiced.

NOTE 13. MERGER WITH THE INTERNATIONAL UNION OF PAINTERS & ALLIED TRADES DISTRICT COUNCIL NO. 21 WELFARE FUND

Effective April 30, 2024, the Plan merged into the International Union of Painters & Allied Trades District Council No. 21 Welfare Fund (DC 21 HW Fund) at which time the assets and liabilities of the Plan were transferred to the DC 21 HW Fund. The Plan's net assets available for benefits transferred to the DC 21 HW Fund on April 30, 2024 consisted of the following:
