We have performed audits of the financial statements of Hoover Treated Wood Products, Inc. 401(k) Retirement Plan (the "Plan"), an employee benefit plan subject to the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA), as permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) (ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit). The financial statements comprise the statements of net assets available for benefits as of July 1, 2024 and December 2023, and the related statement of changes in net assets available for benefits for the period from January 1, 2024 through July 1, 2024, and the related notes to the financial statements.

NOTES TO FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

NOTE 1 - DESCRIPTION OF PLAN

The following description of the Hoover Treated Wood Products, Inc. 401(k) Retirement Plan (the "Plan") provides only general information. Participants should refer to the Plan document for a more complete description of the Plan's provisions.

General

The Plan was a defined contribution plan covering substantially all of the non-union hourly employees of Hoover Treated Wood Products, Inc. (the "Company" or "Plan Sponsor") and was subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974, as amended ("ERISA").

Plan Administration

The Company, as Plan Sponsor, had appointed Fidelity Management Trust Company ("FMTC") as the trustee of the Plan. Fidelity Workplace Services LLC provided recordkeeping and other administrative services to the Plan.

Eligibility

All non-union hourly employees of the Company were eligible to participate in the Plan unless specifically excluded. Entry dates were: January 1, April 1, July 1, and October 1. Employees who are at least 18 years of age and have completed six months of service are eligible to contribute to the Plan. Excluded employees consist of the following:

- Leased employees, independent contractors and other workers who are not compensated through the internal corporate payroll system.
- An employee whose employment is governed by a collective bargaining agreement with the Company and the agreement does not call for participation in the Plan.
- Salaried employees.

Contributions

Each year, participants contributed a portion of their pre-tax compensation as defined by the Plan, up to 60% of such compensation and subject to Internal Revenue Code ("IRC") pre-tax deferral limits as defined. Participants age 50 and older also made catch-up contributions as defined by the IRC. Participants also contributed amounts representing distributions from other qualified retirement plans.

The Plan also included an automatic salary deferral provision, which states that once an employee was eligible to participate, the Company automatically deferred 2% of the employee's eligible compensation to the Plan as a pre-tax contribution, which was then increased each year thereafter by 1% up to a maximum of 6%. Eligible employees completed a salary deferral agreement to select an alternative deferral amount or to elect not to defer under the Plan.

The Plan provides for a discretionary matching contribution which equaled 50% of the first 6% of eligible compensation contributed by each participant on a per pay period basis for 2024 and 2023.

The Plan also provided for a discretionary nonelective contribution which may be funded annually and were determined by the Company's board of directors. For the period January 1, 2024, through July 1, 2024, there were no discretionary nonelective contributions. For the year ended December 31, 2023, the discretionary nonelective contributions totaled \$576,411. Employees were eligible to receive a share of any discretionary Company contributions if they were employed on the last business day of the Plan year and

provided at least 1,000 hours of service during the Plan year. Eligible employees were not required to contribute to the Plan to be eligible for the employer discretionary nonelective contribution. The discretionary nonelective contributions were allocated based on a uniform percentage of each participant's eligible compensation for the Plan year.

The Plan also provided for qualified nonelective contributions. There were no qualified nonelective contributions made during 2024 or 2023.

Contributions were subject to certain regulatory limitations.

Participant Accounts

Participants' accounts were invested in one or more of the investment funds available under the Plan at the direction of the participant. Each participant's account was credited with (a) participant's contributions, (b) an allocation of Company contributions, and (c) an allocation of investment earnings; and was charged with (a) withdrawals, (b) an allocation of investment losses and (c) certain administrative expenses. Allocations were based on participant earnings or account balances, as defined. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant's vested account.

Vesting

Participants were immediately vested in their contributions plus earnings thereon. Vesting in the Company's matching and discretionary contributions plus earnings thereon was based on years of service. A participant was 20% vested after one year, 40% vested after two years, 60% vested after three years, 80% vested after four years, and 100% vested after five years of credited service.

Investment Options

Participants would direct their contributions, allocated Company contributions, and any related earnings into a number of available investment options that vary in degree of risk and investment objective. The Plan held various mutual funds and a money market fund as investment options for participants. Participants changed their investment options daily

Benefit Payments

Upon termination of service, a participant would receive an amount equal to the value of the vested interest in his or her account. If a participant terminates while an active employee due to death, disability, or retirement, his or her account balance will automatically become 100% vested. Participants would receive all or a portion of their balance of deferred contributions and rollovers by requesting an in-service withdrawal if they were at least 59½. The Plan also provided that a participant received liquidation of all or a portion of his or her deferral contribution balance in the event of an economic hardship in the form of a lump-sum distribution only.

Forfeitures and Administrative Expenses

Forfeitures of terminated participants' nonvested accounts were used to either pay expenses of the Plan or reduce future Company contributions. Forfeited nonvested accounts as of July 1, 2024, and December 31, 2023, were \$0 and \$91,755, respectively. The Plan used \$82,680 to reduce Company contributions during the period from January 1, 2024, through July 1, 2024. The Plan did not use forfeitures to reduce administrative expenses during the period from January 1, 2024, through July 1, 2024.

Pursuant to provisions of the Plan, the Company paid substantially all expenses for the administration of the Plan except for certain investment related and participant requested service expenses. Amounts reported as administrative expenses per the statement of changes in net assets available for benefits primarily pertain to participant-initiated transaction fees.

Transfer of Assets

Effective July 1, 2024, the Plan was merged into the Graham Holdings Company Plan and all participants in the Plan had their account balances transferred to the Graham Holdings Company Plan as of July 1, 2024. There was approximately \$6,697,838 of assets transferred into the Graham Holdings Company Plan.

NOTE 2 - SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of Accounting

The financial statements of the Plan are prepared under the accrual method of accounting.

Use of Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America ("U.S. GAAP") required the Plan Administrator to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities and changes therein and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

Risks and Uncertainties

Investment securities were exposed to various risks, such as interest rate, market and credit risks. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in values of investment securities will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect participants' account balances and the amounts reported in the statements of net assets available for benefits.

Investment Valuation and Income Recognition

Investments of the Plan were reported at fair value. Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. See Note 3 for a description of fair value measurements.

Purchases and sales of securities were recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest income was recorded on the accrual basis. Dividends were recorded on the ex-dividend date. Net appreciation includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold as well as held during the year.

Benefit Payments

Benefits were recorded when paid.

Subsequent Events

The Plan has evaluated subsequent events through February 14, 2025, the date the financial statements were available to be issued.

NOTE 3 - FAIR VALUE MEASUREMENTS

Accounting Standards Codification (“ASC”) 820 provides a framework for measuring fair value. That framework provides a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (Level 1 measurements) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (Level 3 measurements). The three levels of the fair value hierarchy under ASC 820 are described as follows:

Level 1 - Inputs to the valuation methodology are unadjusted quoted prices for identical assets or liabilities in active markets that the Plan has the ability to access.

Level 2 - Inputs to the valuation methodology include:

- quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities in active markets;
- quoted prices for identical or similar assets or liabilities in inactive markets;
- inputs other than quoted prices that are observable for the asset or liability; and
- inputs that are derived principally from or corroborated by observable market data by correlation or other means.

If the asset or liability has a specific (contractual) term, the Level 2 input must be observable for substantially the full term of the asset or liability.

Level 3 - Inputs to the valuation methodology are unobservable and significant to the fair value measurement.

The asset’s or liability’s fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy was based on the lowest level of any input that was significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques used need to maximize the use of observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs.

Following is a description of the valuation methodology used for assets measured at fair value. There were no changes in the methodologies used as of July 1, 2024 and December 31, 2023.

Money market fund and mutual funds: valued at the quoted market prices of shares held by the Plan at year end and were considered Level 1 measurements.

The preceding method described may produce a fair value calculation that may not be indicative of net realizable value or reflective of future fair values. Furthermore, although the Plan believes its valuation methodology is appropriate and consistent with other market participants, the use of different methodologies or assumptions to determine the fair value of certain financial instruments could result in a different fair value measurement at the reporting date.

NOTE 4 - RELATED-PARTY TRANSACTIONS

The Plan's investments were shares of mutual funds and a money market fund were held by FMTC and managed by one of its affiliates. FMTC was the trustee as defined by the Plan, and therefore, transactions in these investments qualified as party-in-interest transactions.

NOTE 5 - INFORMATION CERTIFIED BY TRUSTEE

The Plan Administrator had elected the method of annual reporting compliance permitted by 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. Accordingly, FMTC, the trustee of the Plan, had certified that the following data included in the accompanying financial statements is complete and accurate:

- Investments, at fair value as shown in the statements of net assets available for benefits as of July 1, 2024 and December 31, 2023.
- Net investment income as shown in the statement of changes in net assets available for benefits for the period January 1, 2024, through July 1, 2024.

NOTE 6 - FEDERAL INCOME TAX STATUS

The Plan adopted a prototype plan document, which received an opinion letter from the IRS on June 30, 2020, which stated that the prototype plan document is designed in accordance with the applicable sections of the IRC. Although the Plan has been amended and restated since receiving the determination letter, the Plan Administrator believes that the Plan is designed, and is currently being operated, in compliance with the applicable requirements of the IRC and, therefore, believes that the Plan is qualified, and related trust is tax exempt.

U.S. GAAP requires Plan management to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan and recognize a tax liability (or asset) if the Plan had taken an uncertain position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by the IRS or other applicable taxing authorities. The Plan Administrator analyzed the tax positions taken by the Plan and concluded that as of July 1, 2024, and December 31, 2023, there were no uncertain positions taken or expected to be taken that would require recognition of a liability (or asset) or disclosure in the Plan's financial statements. The Plan was subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, the Plan was not under audit with respect to any tax periods.

NOTE 7 – PLAN TERMINATION

The Company has the right under the Plan to discontinue its contributions at any time and to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions of ERISA. In the event of Plan termination, participants would become 100% vested in all Company contributions. Effective July 1, 2024, the Plan was merged into the Graham Holdings Company Plan (see Note 1).
