

Note A

Description of Plan

The following description of the Market Lab Research, Inc. 401(k) Profit Sharing Plan (the "Plan") provides only general information. Participants should refer to the Plan document for a more complete description of the Plan's provisions.

General:

The Plan is a defined contribution plan established on November 1, 2001. The Plan covers all employees of Market Lab Research, Inc. (the Employer and Sponsor), except union and non-resident aliens, who have completed one year of service. The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA). The plan trustees are responsible for oversight of the Plan. The investment committee determines the appropriateness of the Plan's investment offerings, monitors investment performance and reports to the Plan's trustees. In November 2019, the Sponsor was acquired by Schlesinger Group, LLC.

Plan Merger:

Effective April 1, 2021, the Plan entered into a Merger Agreement with the Schlesinger Global, LLC 401(k) Profit Sharing Plan. As a result substantially all investments, except the Key Guaranteed Portfolio Fund (see Note H), were transferred from the Plan into the Schlesinger Global, LLC 401(k) Profit Sharing Plan as of that date or soon thereafter as practicable. The Key Guaranteed Portfolio Fund was liquidated and assets transferred in May 2022.

Contributions:

Each year, participants may elect to contribute a portion of pre-tax annual compensation, as defined in the Plan. Roth contributions, as well as rollovers from other qualified plans, are accepted. Participants who have attained age 50 before the end of the plan year are eligible to make catch-up contributions. Participants direct the investment of their contributions into various investment options offered by the plan. Contributions are subject to certain Internal Revenue Service limitations.

Each year, the Sponsor will make matching contributions equal to a discretionary percentage, to be determined by the Sponsor, of the participant's salary deferral. For 2021, the matching contribution for participants was 50% of the first 6% of compensation that a participant contributed to the plan. The Sponsor may also elect to make a discretionary profit sharing contribution to the Plan. The Sponsor did not elect to make a profit sharing contribution for the period ended March 31, 2021.

Participant Accounts:

Each participant's account is credited with the participant's contribution and company contributions, as well as allocations of plan earnings or losses. Participant accounts are charged with an allocation of administrative expenses that are paid by the Plan. Allocations are based on participant earnings, account balances or specific participant transactions, as defined. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant's vested account.

Vesting:

Participants are vested immediately in their contributions plus actual earnings thereon. Vesting in the Company's contribution portion of their accounts is based on years of continuous service. A participant is 100 percent vested after 3 years of credited service.

Forfeited Accounts:

Upon termination of employment, participants forfeit their nonvested balances. Forfeited balances of terminated participants' nonvested accounts are used to reduce future company contributions or pay plan expenses. Unallocated forfeiture balances as of March 31, 2021 and December 31, 2020, were \$1,274 and \$813, respectively. During 2021, no forfeitures were used.

Notes Receivable from Participants:

Notes receivable from participants are measured at their unpaid balances plus any accrued but unpaid interest. A participant may borrow from his or her fund account a minimum of \$1,000 up to a maximum equal to the lesser of \$50,000 or 50% of the vested account balance. Loan terms range from one to five years, except that any loan used to purchase the participant's principal residence may be repaid over a period of 15 years from the date of the loan. Each loan is secured by the balance in the participant's account and bears interest at 1% over the Prime Rate published in the Wall Street Journal on the first business day of the month the loan is originated. Principal and interest are paid ratably through payroll deductions. Delinquent notes receivable from participants are reclassified as distributions based upon the terms of the plan document.

Payment of Benefits:

On termination of service due to death, disability, or retirement, a participant or designated beneficiary may elect to receive either a lump sum amount equal to the value of the participant's vested interest in his or her account, or periodic installments equal to the value of the participant's vested interest in his or her account. For termination of services for other reasons, a participant may receive the value of the vested interest in his or her account as a lump sum distribution. Hardship withdrawals are available in accordance with Internal Revenue Service guidelines. In addition, the Plan allows for in-service distributions from vested company matching and nonelective accounts for participants who have reached the age of 55.

Note B

Significant Accounting Policies

Basis of Accounting:

The financial statements of the Plan are prepared using the accrual basis of accounting.

Investment contracts held by a defined-contribution plan are required to be reported at fair value. However, contract value is the relevant measurement attribute for that portion of the net assets available for benefits of a defined-contribution plan attributable to fully benefit-responsive investment contracts because contract value is the amount participants would receive if they were to initiate permitted transactions under the terms of the Plan.

Investment Valuation and Income Recognition:

Investments are reported at fair value, except for fully benefit-responsive investment contracts, which are reported at contract value. Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. See Note G for discussion of fair value measurements.

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Net appreciation (depreciation) includes the plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold as well as held during the year.

Operating Expenses:

Certain expenses of maintaining the Plan are paid directly by the Company and are excluded from these financial statements. Fees related to participant recordkeeping and specific participant transactions are charged directly to each participants' account and are included in administrative expenses. Investment related expenses are allocated proportionately to plan participants based on their respective account balances and included in administrative expenses.

Notes Receivable from Participants:

Notes receivable from participants are measured at their unpaid principal balance plus any accrued but unpaid interest. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Related fees are recorded as administrative expenses and are expensed when they are incurred. If a participant ceases to make loan repayments and the plan administrator deems the participant loan to be in default, the participant loan balance is reduced and a benefit payment is reflected.

Payment of Benefits:

Benefit distributions, determined in accordance with provisions of the Plan, are recorded when paid.

Use of Estimates:

The preparation of the financial statements in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America requires the plan administrator to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities and changes therein, and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

Excess Contributions:

Benefit distributions for the plan year ended December 31, 2020, include payments of \$16,648 to be made to certain active participants to return to them excess deferral contributions as required to satisfy the relevant nondiscrimination provisions of the Plan. These amounts are also included in the Plan's statements of net assets available for benefits as excess contributions payable at December 31, 2020. The Plan was unable to distribute the 2020 excess contributions to the applicable participants prior to March 15, 2021. There were no excess contributions for the period ended March 31, 2021.

Note C

Party-In-Interest Transactions

Certain plan investments are investments managed by Great-West Trust Company, LLC and Great-West Life & Annuity Insurance Company. Great-West Trust Company, LLC and Great-West Life & Annuity Insurance Company are the trustees, as defined by the Plan and, therefore, these transactions qualify as party-in-interest transactions. These party-in-interest transactions are exempt from the prohibited transaction rules of ERISA.

During the period ended March 31, 2021, the Company failed to remit to the Plan's custodian certain participant contributions totaling \$2,136 within the period prescribed by Department of Labor regulations. These delinquent remittances are considered nonexempt party-in-interest transactions. The Company intends to make corrective contributions to the Plan to compensate affected participants for lost earnings on the delinquent remittances.

Note D

Information Prepared and Certified by Trustees

Certain information related to investments and notes receivable from participants disclosed in the accompanying financial statements and ERISA-required supplemental schedule, including investments held and notes receivable from participants at March 31, 2021 and December 31, 2020, and net appreciation in fair value of investments, interest and dividends, and interest income on notes receivable from participants for the period from January 1, 2021 to March 31, 2021, was obtained by management and agreed to or derived from information certified as complete and accurate by Great-West Life & Annuity Insurance Company and Great-West Trust Company LLC (the trustees of the Plan).

Note E

Risks and Uncertainties

The Plan invests in various investment securities. Investment securities are exposed to various risks, such as interest rate, market, and credit risks. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the value of investment securities will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect participants' account balances and the amounts reported in the Statement of Net Assets Available for Benefits.

Note F
Income Tax Status

The prototype plan sponsor has received an opinion letter dated March 31, 2014, in which the IRS stated that the restated prototype plan document was in compliance with applicable requirements of the Internal Revenue Code (IRC). The plan administrator timely adopted the restated prototype plan. The plan administrator believes that the Plan is currently being operated in accordance with the IRC.

GAAP requires plan management to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan and recognizes a tax liability (or asset) if the Plan has taken an uncertain position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by the applicable authorities. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress.

Note G
Fair Value Measurements

The framework for measuring fair value provides a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (Level 1) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (Level 3). The three levels of the fair value hierarchy under FASB ASC 820 are described as follows:

- Level 1 Inputs to the valuation methodology are unadjusted quoted prices for identical assets or liabilities in active markets that the Plan has ability to access.
- Level 2 Inputs to the valuation methodology include quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities in active markets; quoted prices for identical or similar assets or liabilities in inactive markets; inputs other than quoted prices that are observable for the asset or liability; and inputs that are derived principally from or corroborated by observable market data by correlation or other means. If the asset or liability has a specified (contractual) term, the Level 2 input must be observable for substantially the full term of the asset or liability.
- Level 3 Inputs to the valuation methodology are unobservable and significant to the fair value measurement.

The asset or liability's fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques used need to maximize the use of observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs.

Following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for assets measured at fair value. There have been no changes in the methodologies used at March 31, 2021 and December 31, 2020.

Mutual funds: Valued at the daily closing price as reported by the fund. Mutual funds held by the plan are open-end mutual funds that are registered with the Securities and Exchange Commission. These funds are required to publish their daily net asset value (NAV) and to transact at that price. The mutual funds held by the plan are deemed to be actively traded.

Note H
Guaranteed Interest Accounts

The Plan has a group annuity contract with Great-West Life & Annuity Insurance Company ("Great-West"). The Key Guaranteed Portfolio Fund is a general account product. The methodology for calculating the interest crediting rate is based on the earnings of the underlying assets in the entire medium-long term new portfolio compared to the minimum interest crediting rate, as stated in the contract, and prevailing market conditions. The interest crediting rate is reset quarterly. Contract value is the relevant measurement attribute for that portion of the net assets available for benefits attributable to the group annuity contract since the contract was determined to be fully benefit-responsive. The account is credited with earnings on the underlying investments and charged for participant withdrawals and administrative expenses. Contract value represents contributions made under the contract, plus earnings, less participant withdrawals and administrative expenses. Participants may transfer their account balance in the Fund to any other investment option offered under the Plan at any time with no restrictions or penalties, because the Fund is designed to be a Plan's only guaranteed/stable value/money market investment.

In order to provide the participant with liquidity (100% for participant transfers), there cannot be any actively competing guaranteed/stable value/money market investments in the Plan. Bond funds of durations longer than three years are permitted. The guaranteed investment contract issuer is contractually obligated to repay the principal and a specified interest rate that is guaranteed to the Plan. There are no reserves against contract value for credit risk of the contract issuer or otherwise. The crediting interest is based on a formula agreed upon with the issuer but may not be less than zero percent. Such interest rates are reviewed on a quarterly basis for resetting. Certain events limit the ability of the Plan to transact at contract value with the issuer. Such events include the following:

- (a) amendments to the Plan document (including complete or partial Plan termination or merger with another plan),
- (b) changes to the Plan's prohibition on competing investment options or deletion of equity wash provisions,
- (c) bankruptcy of the Plan Sponsor or other Plan Sponsor events that cause a significant withdrawal from the Plan or

- (d) the failure of the trust to qualify for exemption from federal income taxes or any required prohibited transaction exemption under ERISA.

Upon termination of the group annuity contract, the employer may (a) receive the payoff of the fund in a lump sum with a market value adjustment, (b) receive the payout of the fund in a lump sum at book value, or (c) maintain participant accounts in the Key Guaranteed Portfolio Fund. Effective with the Merger of the Plan in April 2021, the Plan terminated the group annuity contract. Great-West Life & Annuity Insurance Company exercised its right to defer payment of the amount for 12 months. All future contributions and distributions to and from the Key Guaranteed Portfolio Fund were suspended at that time. The fund will be liquidated in May 2022 and the assets will transfer to other investment options.
