Scope and Nature of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) Audit

We have performed the audits of the financial statements of Heidler Roofing Services, Inc. 401(k) Profit Sharing Plan (the Plan), an employee benefit plan subject to the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA), as permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) (ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit). The financial statements comprise the statement of net assets available for benefits as of July 31, 2024 (in liquidation) and December 31, 2023 (ongoing), the related statement of changes in net assets available for benefits for the period January 1, 2024 through July 31, 2024 (in liquidation) and the year ended December 31, 2023 (ongoing), and the related notes to the financial statements.

Management, having determined it is permissible in the circumstances, has elected to have the audits of the Plan's financial statements performed in accordance with ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) pursuant to 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. As permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C), our audits need not extend to any statements or information related to assets held for investment of the Plan (investment information) by a bank or similar institution or insurance carrier that is regulated, supervised, and subject to periodic examination by a state or federal agency, provided that the statements or information regarding assets so held are prepared and certified to by the bank or similar institution or insurance carrier in accordance with 29 CFR 2520.103-5 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA (qualified institution).

Management has obtained certifications from a qualified institution as of and for the period January 1, 2024 through July 31, 2024 and the year ended December 31, 2023, stating that the certified investment information, as described in Note 3 to the financial statements, is complete and accurate.

Opinion

In our opinion, based on our audits and on the procedures performed as described in the Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements section:

- The information in the accompanying financial statements related to assets held by and certified to by a qualified institution agrees to, or is derived from, in all material respects, the information prepared and certified by an institution that management determined meets the requirements of ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C).

Basis for Opinion

We conducted our audits in accordance with auditing standards generally accepted in the United States of America (GAAS). Our responsibilities under those standards are further described in the Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements section of our report. We are required to be independent of the Plan and to meet our other ethical responsibilities, in accordance with the relevant ethical requirements relating to our audits. We believe that the audit evidence we have obtained is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for our ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit opinion.

Emphasis of Matter

As discussed in Note 1 to the financial statements, the owner and CEO of Heidler Roofing Services, Inc., the Plan Sponsor, decided on March 11, 2024 to terminate the Plan effective April 15, 2024, and management determined that liquidation was imminent. As a result, the Plan has changed its basis of accounting from the going concern basis used in presenting the 2023 financial statements to the liquidation basis used in presenting the 2024 financial statements. Our opinion is not modified with respect to this matter.

Responsibilities of Management for the Financial Statements

Management is responsible for the preparation and fair presentation of the financial statements in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America, and for the design, implementation, and maintenance of internal control relevant to the preparation and fair presentation of financial statements that are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error. Management's election of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit does not affect management's responsibility for the financial statements.

Management is also responsible for maintaining a current plan instrument, including all plan amendments, administering the Plan, and determining that the Plan's transactions that are presented and disclosed in the financial statements are in conformity with the Plan's provisions, including maintaining sufficient records with respect to each of the participants, to determine the benefits due or which may become due to such participants.

Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements

Except as described in the Scope and Nature of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) Audit section of our report, our objectives are to obtain reasonable assurance about whether the financial statements as a whole are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error, and to issue an auditor's report that includes our opinion. Reasonable assurance is a high level of assurance, but is not absolute assurance, and; therefore, is not a guarantee that an audit conducted in accordance with GAAS will always detect a material misstatement when it exists. - Identify and assess the risks of material misstatement of the financial statements, whether due to fraud or error, and design and perform audit procedures responsive to those risks. Such procedures include examining, on a test basis, evidence regarding the amounts and disclosures in the financial statements.
- Obtain an understanding of internal control relevant to the audit in order to design audit procedures that are appropriate in the circumstances, but not for the purpose of expressing an opinion on the effectiveness of the Plan's internal control. Accordingly, no such opinion is expressed.
- Evaluate the appropriateness of accounting policies used and the reasonableness of significant accounting estimates made by management, as well as evaluate the overall presentation of the financial statements.

Our audit did not extend to the certified investment information, except for obtaining and reading the certification, comparing the certified investment information with the related information presented and disclosed in the financial statements, and reading the disclosures relating to the certified investment information to assess whether they are in accordance with the presentation and disclosure requirements of accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.

Accordingly, the objective of an ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit is not to express an opinion about whether the financial statements as a whole are presented fairly, in all material respects, in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.

We are required to communicate with those charged with governance regarding, among other matters, the planned scope and timing of the audit, significant audit findings, and certain internal control-related matters that we identified during the audit.

Other Matter - Supplemental Schedule Required by ERISA

The information included in the supplemental schedule, other than that agreed to, or derived from, the certified investment information, has been subjected to auditing procedures applied in the audit of the financial statements and certain additional procedures, including comparing and reconciling such information directly to the underlying accounting and other records used to prepare the financial statements or to the financial statements themselves, and other additional procedures in accordance with GAAS. For information included in the supplemental schedule that agreed to, or is derived from, the certified investment information, we compared such information to the related certified investment information.

In forming our opinion on the supplemental schedule, we evaluated whether the supplemental schedule, other than the information agreed to or derived from the certified investment information, including its form and content, is presented in conformity with the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA.

Note 1 - Description of Plan

The following description of the Heidler Roofing Services, Inc. 401(k) Profit Sharing Plan (the Plan) provides only general information. Participants should refer to the plan agreement for more complete information.

General

The Plan was a defined contribution pension plan covering substantially all employees of Heidler Roofing Services, Inc. (the Company and plan sponsor). All employees were eligible to participate upon hire for purposes of employee contributions, matching contributions, and for receiving any employer prevailing wage contribution made to the Plan under prevailing wage law. To be eligible for employer discretionary profit sharing contributions, employees must have completed one year of service, be age 18 or older, and worked at least 1,000 hours during the plan year. The Plan was subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA).

Heidler Roofing Services, Inc. had decided to terminate the Plan effective April 15, 2024. All participants in the Plan as of the termination date were fully vested in their account balances. All account balances were distributed as of July 31, 2024.

Contributions

Each year, participants could contribute up to 100% of pre-tax annual compensation, as defined in the Plan. Participants who had attained age 50 before the end of the plan year were eligible to make catch-up contributions. Participants could also contribute amounts representing distributions from other qualified defined benefit or defined contribution plans. Participants directed the investment of all contributions into various investment options offered by the Plan. The Company provided for a match, which was a discretionary percentage of employee contributions. For the year ended December 31, 2023, the Company contributed 20% of the first 5% of eligible compensation that a participant contributed (maximum match of 1% of eligible compensation). The Company could make an additional discretionary profit sharing contribution. Discretionary profit sharing contributions amounted to \$239,200 for the year ended December 31, 2023. The Company made prevailing wage contributions as permitted under existing prevailing wage law. Contributions were subject to certain IRS limitations. The plan sponsor was acquired as of January 1, 2024 and all contributions ceased from the Plan as of January 1, 2024.

Participant Accounts

Each participant's account was credited with the participant's contribution, prevailing wage contribution, and allocations of (a) the Company's matching and discretionary profit sharing contributions and (b) plan earnings, and charged with an allocation of administrative expenses. Allocations were based on participant earnings or account balances, as defined. The benefit to which a participant was entitled was the benefit that could be provided from the participant's vested account.

Vesting

Participants are immediately vested in their contributions and the employer prevailing wage contributions, plus actual earnings thereon. Vesting in the remainder of their accounts is based on years of service. A participant is 100% vested after three years of service based on the following vesting schedule:

Years of Service	Vesting Percentage
Less than 3	0 %
3 or more	100

Regardless of the number of years of service, a participant's account balance becomes fully vested when a participant dies, becomes permanently disabled, or retires.

Effective April 15, 2024, the date of termination, all participants became fully vested in all employer contributions, including the discretionary match and profit sharing contributions.

Payment of Benefits

On termination of service due to death, disability, retirement, or other reasons, a participant may elect to receive either a lump-sum amount equal to the value of the participant's vested interest in his or her account or in installments under a systematic withdrawal plan.

Forfeited Accounts

At July 31, 2024 and December 31, 2023, forfeited nonvested accounts totaled \$-0- and \$1,370, respectively. These accounts were used to pay administrative expenses. During the period January 1, 2024 through July 31, 2024 and the year ended December 31, 2023, \$1,409 and \$5,000, respectively, of forfeited nonvested accounts were used to reduce administrative expenses.

Note 2 - Summary of Significant Accounting Policies

Basis of Accounting

Due to the decision to terminate the Plan in 2024, management determined that liquidation of the Plan is imminent and the financial statements for 2024 have been prepared using the liquidation basis of accounting. The 2023 financial statements were prepared on the accrual basis of accounting.

Investments held by a defined contribution plan are required to be reported at fair value, except for fully benefit-responsive investment contracts. Contract value is the relevant measure for the portion of the net assets available for benefits of a defined contribution plan attributable to fully benefit-responsive investment contracts because contract value is the amount participants normally would receive if they were to initiate permitted transactions under the terms of the Plan.

Note 2 - Summary of Significant Accounting Policies (continued)

Use of Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities, and changes therein, and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

Investment Valuation and Income Recognition

All investments in the 2024 statement of net assets available for benefits are reported at liquidation value. For all investments, fair value approximates the amount the Plan expects to collect at liquidation. All investments on the 2023 statement of net assets available for benefits are reported at fair value (except for fully benefit-responsive investment contracts, which are reported at contract value). Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. See Note 4 for discussion of fair value measurements.

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. For the period January 1, 2024 through July 31, 2024, interest income is recorded on the liquidation basis. For the year ended December 31, 2023, interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Net appreciation includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold, as well as held during the year.

Excess Contributions Payable

Amounts payable to participants for contributions in excess of amounts allowed by the IRS are recorded as a liability with a corresponding reduction to contributions. The Plan distributed the 2023 excess contributions to the applicable participants prior to March 15, 2024.

Payment of Benefits

Benefits are recorded when paid.

Administrative Expenses

Certain expenses of maintaining the Plan are paid directly by the Company and are excluded from these financial statements. Fees related to the distribution of benefit payments are charged directly to the participant's account and are included in administrative expenses. Investment related expenses are included in net appreciation in fair value of investments.

Note 3 - Information Certified and Provided by Voya Retirement Insurance and Annuity Company

Certain information related to investments disclosed in the accompanying financial statements and ERISA-required supplemental schedule, including investments held at July 31, 2024 and December 31, 2023, and net appreciation in fair value of investments and interest for the period January 1, 2024 through July 31, 2024 and the year ended December 31, 2023, was obtained by management and agreed to, or derived from, information certified as complete and accurate by Voya Retirement Insurance and Annuity Company, the custodian of the Plan.

Note 4 - Fair Value Measurements

The following is a description of the valuation methodology used for assets measured at fair value. There has been no change in the methodology used at July 31, 2024 and December 31, 2023.

Pooled separate accounts are valued at net asset value (NAV) of units held. The NAV is used as a practical expedient to estimate fair value. The NAV is based on the fair value of the underlying investments held by the fund less its liability.

The method described above may produce a fair value calculation that may not be indicative of net realizable value or reflective of future fair values. Furthermore, while the Plan believes its valuation method is appropriate and consistent with other market participants, the use of different methodologies or assumptions to determine the fair value of certain financial instruments could result in a different fair value measurement at the reporting date.

- (d) This class includes investments in equity funds with an investment objective of long-term growth of capital. The funds invest primarily in foreign equity securities. Investments in this class can be redeemed daily at the current net asset value per share based on the fair value of the underlying investments.
- (e) This class includes investments in debt securities with an investment objective of high level current income consistent with preservation of capital and liquidity and the maintenance of a stable \$1.00 net asset value per share. The funds invest primarily in high-quality U.S. dollar-denominated short-term duration debt securities. The funds attempt to maintain a net asset value of \$1.00 per share; however, there is no assurance that the value of the shares in the funds will not fluctuate.

Note 5 - Investment Contract with Insurance Company

The Plan held two traditional investment contracts. These contracts meet the fully benefit-responsive investment contract criteria and therefore are reported at contract value. Contract value is the relevant measure for fully benefit-responsive investment contracts because this is the amount received by participants if they were to initiate permitted transactions under the terms of the Plan. Contract value represents contributions made under each contract, plus earnings, less participant withdrawals, and administrative expenses.

The investment contracts held by the Plan are guaranteed investment contracts. The contract issuer is contractually obligated to repay the principal and interest at a specified interest rate that is guaranteed to the Plan. The crediting rates are based on a formula established by the contract issuer, but may not be less than 3% and 1%, respectively. The crediting rates are reviewed on a quarterly basis for resetting. The contracts cannot be terminated before the scheduled maturity dates. The Plan's ability to receive amounts due in accordance with fully benefit-responsive investment contracts is dependent on the third-party issuer's ability to meet its financial obligations. The contract issuer's ability to meet its contractual obligations may be affected by future economic and regulatory developments. Certain events might limit the ability of the Plan to transact at contract value with the contract issuer. These events may be different under each contract. Examples of such events include the following:

- A. The Plan's failure to qualify under Section 401(a) of the Internal Revenue Code (IRC) or the failure of the trust to be tax-exempt under Section 501(a) of the IRC.
- B. Premature termination of the contracts.
- C. Plan termination or merger.
- D. Changes to the Plan's prohibition on competing investment options.
- E. Bankruptcy of the plan sponsor or other plan sponsor events (for example, divestitures or spinoffs of a subsidiary) that significantly affect the Plan's normal operations.

No events are probable of occurring that might limit the ability of the Plan to transact at contract value with the contract issuers and that also would limit the ability of the Plan to transact at contract value with the participants.

In addition, certain events allow the issuer to terminate the contracts with the Plan and settle at an amount different from contract value. Those events may be different under each contract. Examples of such events include the following:

- A. An uncured violation of the Plan's investment guidelines.
- B. A breach of material obligation under the contract.
- C. A material misrepresentation.
- D. A material amendment to the agreements without the consent of the contract issuer.

Note 6 - Tax Status

The Company adopted a nonstandardized pre-approved profit sharing/money purchase plan sponsored by Lifestyle Retirement Company. The nonstandardized pre-approved profit sharing/money purchase plan has received an opinion letter from the IRS, dated June 30, 2020, stating that the nonstandardized pre-approved profit sharing/money purchase plan is qualified under the appropriate section of the IRC. The nonstandardized pre-approved profit sharing/money purchase plan opinion letter has been relied upon by this Plan. The Plan has been amended since receiving the opinion letter. The plan administrator believes that the Plan is designed and is currently being operated in compliance with the applicable requirements of the IRC.

Accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America require plan management to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan. Management evaluated the Plan's tax positions and concluded that the Plan had maintained its tax-exempt status and had taken no uncertain tax positions that require recognition or disclosure in the financial statements. Therefore, no provision or liability for income taxes has been included in the financial statements. With few exceptions, the Plan is no longer subject to income tax examinations by the U.S. Federal, state, or local tax authorities for years before 2021.

Note 7 - Risks and Uncertainties

The Plan invested in various investment securities. Investment securities were exposed to various risks such as interest rate, market, and credit risks. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the values of investment securities could occur and that such changes could materially affect participants' account balances and the amount received due to the Plan termination.

Note 8 - Related Party Transactions and Party-In-Interest Transactions

The Plan invested in pooled separate accounts and guaranteed investment contracts managed by Voya Retirement Insurance and Annuity Company. Voya Retirement Insurance and Annuity Company was the custodian as defined by the Plan and; therefore, those transactions qualified as party-in-interest transactions. Fees paid by the Plan for investment management and custody services were immaterial.

Note 9 - Reconciliation of Financial Statements to the Form 5500

The Plan invested in various pooled separate accounts that do not file a Form 5500 as a Direct Filing Entity. Accordingly, on the Form 5500 filed by the Plan, the percentage of the interest in the underlying assets of the pooled separate accounts must be reported in the appropriate categories on the asset and liability statement of the Form 5500 for the Plan.
