Notes to Financial Statements

June 30, 2024 and 2023

NOTE A – DESCRIPTION OF PLAN

The following description of the Profit Sharing Plan for Employees of Fairbanks Native Association (the Plan) provides only general information. Participants should refer to the Plan document for a more complete description of the Plan's provisions.

General. The Plan is a defined contribution plan covering substantially all employees of the Fairbanks Native Association (the Sponsor). Effective July 1, 1989, part-time, seasonal, and temporary employees are required to work a minimum of 1,000 hours in order to participate in the Plan. Employees must also attain the age of 18 to participate in the plan. Once the hour requirement is reached the employee will remain eligible to participate in the Plan for the duration of their employment with the entity. The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA).

Contributions. Each plan year, the sponsor contributes, on behalf of each participant, an amount authorized at the discretion of the board of directors. Contributions are subject to certain limitations. Eligible employees may defer up to 100 percent of pretax annual compensation, as defined in the plan. In addition, participants who have attained the age of 50 before the end of the plan year are eligible to make catch-up contributions. Participants may also contribute amounts representing distributions from other qualified defined benefit or defined contributions plans. All contributions are subject to annual Internal Revenue Service (IRS) limitations. Participants direct the investment of their contributions into various investment options offered by the Plan.

Qualified Non-elective Contributions: Active participants are eligible for employer contributions and safe harbor contributions after 1000 hours of eligible service and attaining age 18.

The Employer match of the salary deferrals is equal to 100% of deferrals that are not in excess of 3% of the participant's eligible wages plus 50% of deferrals that exceed 3% of the participant's eligible wages but that do not exceed 5% of eligible wages.

The Company may, in its sole discretion, make a profit sharing contribution to the Plan on behalf of eligible participants. The employer discretionary profit-sharing contribution rate is 3% of eligible compensation of all eligible participants for the year ended June 30, 2024.

Participant Accounts. Each participant's account is credited with an allocation of (a) the Sponsor's discretionary contribution and (b) plan earnings. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant's account. The self-directed investment account allows participants to invest in investment holdings of their choice.

Vesting. Participants are 100% vested in their salary deferrals and Safe Harbor Matching Contributions. Vesting in the Company's contribution is based on years of continuous service. A participant is 100% vested after four years of credited service. In addition, participants automatically become 100% vested upon the attainment of normal and early retirement age, death or disability while being an employee of the Company.

Notes Receivable from Participants. Participants may borrow from their accounts a minimum of \$1,000 up to a maximum equal to the lesser of \$50,000 or 50% of their account balance. The loans are secured by the balance in the participant's account and bear interest at the rate commensurate with local prevailing rates as determined quarterly by the Plan administrator. Delinquent loans are treated as distributions based on terms of the Plan document. No allowance for credit losses has been resourced as of June 30, 2024 and 2023. Principal and interest are paid ratably through regular payroll deductions.

Benefit Payments Upon termination of service for any reason, including retirement, death, or disability, participants may elect to receive the vested interest in their accounts as a lump sum distribution, installment distributions, or in annual installments over a period of not more than the participant's life expectancy determined at the time of the distribution. Participants with vested interest exceeding \$5,000 who terminate service due to other reasons may elect to receive a lump sum distribution or defer receipt of benefits. After termination of employment, if the vested amount of the participants account balance does not exceed \$1,000, the vested account balance will be distributed directly to the participant in cash. If the vested amount of the participants account balance is more than \$1,000 but less than \$5,000, the vested account balance will be distributed from the Plan either in form of cash payment or a rollover to an individual retirement account or other qualified plan. Financial hardship withdrawals are permitted, as defined in the plan agreement.

Forfeited Accounts. Forfeitures occur when participants terminate employment prior to being fully vested with respect to their employer matching and profit-sharing contributions. The amounts forfeited are used to reduce future employer contributions to the Plan and to pay any administrative expenses. At June 30, 2024 and 2023, forfeited non-vested accounts totaled \$6,819 and \$24,334, respectively. During the year ended June 30, 2024, \$12,152 was used to reduce the employer contributions.

NOTE B – SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of Accounting. The accompanying financial statements have been prepared on the accrual basis of accounting and in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.

Use of Estimates. The preparation of financial statements requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities, the disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities at the date of the financial statements, and the reported amounts of additions and deductions during the reporting period. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

Investment Valuation and Income Recognition. The Plan's investments are stated at fair value (except for fully benefit-responsive investment contracts, which are reported at contract value). Shares of mutual funds are valued at the net asset value of shares held by the Plan at year-end. Interest is recorded as earned on the accrual basis. The common/collective trust fund investments are valued based on the net asset value as determined by using estimated fair value of the underlying assets held in the fund. Net asset value is used as a practical expedient for fair value. Contract value of fully benefit-responsive contracts is equal to principal balance plus accrued interest. Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest income is recorded on an accrual basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date.

Payment of Benefits. Benefits are recorded when paid.

Expenses. Certain expenses of maintaining the Plan are paid by the Plan, unless otherwise paid by the Company. Expenses that are paid by the Company are excluded from these financial statements. The fees charged to the Plan fall into the following categories: investment fees, plan administration fees, and transaction-based fees. If non-transaction-based expenses are paid using the Plan's assets, such fees and expenses are generally allocated to the accounts of participants either proportionally based on the value of their account balance or may be charged equally to each participant. In some cases, certain investment administration fees are deducted directly from investment returns.

NOTE C – INVESTMENTS CERTIFIED BY ASSET CUSTODIAN

The administrator of the Plan has elected the method of compliance permitted by 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosures under ERISA of 1974. Accordingly, Matrix Trust Company as custodian, has certified that the following data included in the accompanying financial statements and supplemental schedule as complete and accurate:

- (a) Plan investments and cash, as shown in the Statements of Net Assets Available for Benefits;
- (b) Interest and dividend income and net appreciation in fair value of investments, as shown in the Statements of Changes in Net Assets Available for Benefits; and
- (c) All information included in the Schedule of Assets (Held at End of Year) as shown in the supplemental schedule.

NOTE D – FAIR VALUE MEASUREMENTS

The Financial Accounting Standards Board issued authoritative guidance establishing a framework for measuring fair value. That framework provides a fair value hierarchy based on the inputs used to measure fair value and expanding disclosures about the use of fair value measurements. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (level 1 measurements), and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (level 3 measurements). The three levels of the fair value hierarchy are described below:

- Level 1** Inputs to the valuation are unadjusted quoted prices for identical assets or liabilities in active markets that the Plan has the ability to access.

Level 2 Inputs to the valuation include:

- Quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities in active markets;
- Quoted prices for identical or similar assets or liabilities in inactive markets;
- Inputs other than quoted prices that are observable for the asset or liability;
- Inputs that are derived principally from or corroborated by observable market data by correlation or other means.

Level 3 Inputs to the valuation are unobservable and significant to the fair value measurement.

The asset's or liability's fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of input that is significant to the fair value measurement. The Plan's assessment of the significance of a particular input to the fair value measurements requires judgment and may affect the valuation of the assets and liabilities being measured and their level within the fair value hierarchy.

Following is a description of the valuation methods used for assets measured at fair value. There have been no changes in the methods used at June 30, 2024 and 2023.

Mutual funds: Valued at the daily closing price as reported by the fund. Mutual funds held by the Plan are open-end mutual funds that are registered with the Securities and Exchange Commission. These funds are required to publish their daily net asset value (NAV) and to transact at that price. The mutual funds held by the Plan are deemed to be actively traded.

Money market funds: Consists of investments in an institutional money market fund that permits daily redemption, the fair value of which is based upon the quoted price in active markets provided by the financial institution managing this fund.

The methods described above may produce a fair value calculation that may not be indicative of net realizable value or reflective of future values. Furthermore, while the Plan believes its valuation methods are appropriate and consistent with other market participants, the use of different methodologies or assumptions to determine the fair value of certain financial instruments could result in a different fair value measurement at the reporting date.

NOTE E – RELATED PARTY AND PARTY IN INTEREST TRANSACTIONS

Certain plan investments are managed by Matrix Trust Company. Matrix Trust Company is the custodian as defined by the Plan and, therefore, these transactions qualify as party-in-interest transactions as defined by ERISA. Any transactions involving these investments are on the open market at fair value. Consequently, such transactions are permitted under the provisions of the Plan and are exempt from the prohibition of party-in-interest transactions under ERISA. Notes receivable from participants also qualify as exempt party-in-interest transactions.

NOTE F – PLAN TERMINATION

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the Sponsor has the right under the Plan to discontinue its contributions at any time and to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions of ERISA. In the event of plan termination, participants will become 100% vested in their accounts. Any unallocated assets of the Plan shall be allocated to participant accounts and distributed in such a manner as the Sponsor may determine.

NOTE G – TAX STATUS

The Plan has adopted a Volume Submitter Profit Sharing Plan with CODA sponsored by CCH Incorporated, DBA Ftwilliam.com which received a favorable opinion letter from the Internal Revenue Service dated March 31, 2014, which states that the Plan and related trust are designed in accordance with applicable sections of the Internal Revenue Code (IRC). Although the Plan has been amended since receiving the determination letter, the Plan Administrator believes that the Plan is designed and is currently being operated in compliance with the applicable requirements of the IRC.

Accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America require Plan management to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan and recognize a tax liability (or asset) if the Plan has taken an uncertain position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by the Internal Revenue Service. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions, however there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress.

NOTE H – RISKS AND UNCERTAINTIES

The Plan has placed its investments with various investment securities. Investment securities are exposed to various risks such as interest rate, market, and credit risks. As part of the Plan's investment strategy, the trustees perform periodic evaluations of the relative credit standing and investment performance of financial institutions.

Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the values of investment securities will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect participants' account balances and the amounts reported in the statements of assets available for benefits.

NOTE I – RECONCILIATION OF FINANCIAL STATEMENTS TO FORM 5500

There were no reconciling items from the financial statements to form 5500 for the years ended June 30, 2024 or June 30, 2023.

NOTE J – ADMINISTRATIVE COSTS

The Plan permits the payment of Plan expenses to be made from the Plan's assets. If expenses are paid using the Plan's assets, such fees or expenses will generally be allocated to the accounts of participants either proportionally based on the value of their account balances or as an equal dollar amount based on the number of participants in the Plan. Participants may be assessed fees directly associated with the administration of their account.

NOTE K – SUBSEQUENT EVENTS

Management has evaluated subsequent events through February 26, 2025, the date which the financial statements were available for issue. No events were identified that would require adjustment or disclosure according to generally accepted accounting principles.
