The financial statements comprise the statements of net assets available for benefits as of June 30, 2024 and 2023, and the related statement of changes in net assets available for benefits for the year ended June 30, 2024, and the related notes to the financial statements.

Management, having determined it is permissible in the circumstances, has elected to have the audit of the Seton Hill University 403(b) Plan's financial statements performed in accordance with ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) pursuant to 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. As permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C), our audits need not extend to any statements or information related to assets held for investment of the Plan (investment information) by a bank or similar institution or insurance carrier that is regulated, supervised and subject to periodic examination by a state or federal agency, provided that the statements or information regarding assets so held are prepared and certified to by the bank or similar institution or insurance carrier in accordance with 29 CFR 2520.103-5 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA (qualified institution).

Management has obtained certifications from a qualified institution as of June 30, 2024 and 2023, and for the year ended June 30, 2024, stating that the certified investment information, as described in Note 3 to the financial statements, is complete and accurate.

Opinion

In our opinion, based on our audits and on the procedures performed as described in the Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements section:

- the amounts and disclosures in the accompanying financial statements, other than those agreed to or derived from the certified investment information, are presented fairly, in all material respects, in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America (U.S. GAAP).
- the information in the accompanying financial statements related to assets held by and certified to by a qualified institution agrees to, or is derived from, in all material respects, the information prepared and certified by an institution that management determined meets the requirements of ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C).

Basis for Opinion

We conducted our audits in accordance with auditing standards generally accepted in the United States of America (U.S. GAAS). Our responsibilities under those standards are further described in the Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements section of our report. We are required to be independent of the Plan and to meet our other ethical responsibilities, in accordance with the relevant ethical requirements relating to our audits. We believe that the audit evidence we have obtained is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for our ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit opinion.

Responsibilities of Management for the Financial Statements

Management is responsible for the preparation and fair presentation of the financial statements in accordance with U.S. GAAP and for the design, implementation, and maintenance of internal control relevant to the preparation and fair presentation of financial statements that are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error. Management's election of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit does not affect management's responsibility for the financial statements.

In preparing the financial statements, management is required to evaluate whether there are conditions or events, considered in the aggregate, that raise substantial doubt about the Plan's ability to continue as a going concern for one year after the date the financial statements are available to be issued.

Management is also responsible for maintaining a current Plan instrument, including all Plan amendments, administering the Plan and determining that the Plan's transactions that are presented and disclosed in the financial statements are in conformity with the Plan's provisions, including maintaining sufficient records with respect to each of the participants, to determine the benefits due or which may become due to such participants.

Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements

Except as described in the Scope and Nature of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) Audit section of our report, our objectives are to obtain reasonable assurance about whether the financial statements as a whole are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error, and to issue an auditor's report that includes our opinion. Reasonable assurance is a high level of assurance but is not absolute assurance and therefore is not a guarantee that an audit conducted in accordance with U.S. GAAS will always detect a material misstatement when it exists. The risk of not detecting a material misstatement resulting from fraud is higher than for one resulting from error, as fraud may involve collusion, forgery, intentional omissions, misrepresentations or the override of internal control. Misstatements are considered material if there is a substantial likelihood that, individually or in the aggregate, they would influence the judgment made by a reasonable user based on the financial statements. In performing an audit in accordance with U.S. GAAS, we:

- Exercise professional judgment and maintain professional skepticism throughout the audit.
- Identify and assess the risks of material misstatement of the financial statements, whether due to fraud or error, and design and perform audit procedures responsive to those risks. Such procedures include examining, on a test basis, evidence regarding the amounts and disclosures in the financial statements.

Our audits did not extend to the certified investment information, except for obtaining and reading the certification, comparing the certified investment information with the related information presented and disclosed in the financial statements and reading the disclosures relating to the certified investment information to assess whether they are in accordance with the presentation and disclosure requirements of U.S. GAAP.

Accordingly, the objective of an ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit is not to express an opinion about whether the financial statements as a whole are presented fairly, in all material respects, in accordance with U.S. GAAP.

We are required to communicate with those charged with governance regarding, among other matters, the planned scope and timing of the audit, significant audit findings and certain internal control-related matters that we identified during the audit.

Other Matters - Supplemental Schedule Required by ERISA

The supplemental schedule of schedule of assets (held at end of year) as of June 30, 2024, is presented for the purpose of additional analysis and is not a required part of the financial statements, but is supplementary information required by the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. Such information is the responsibility of management and was derived from and relates directly to the underlying accounting and other records used to prepare the financial statements. The information included in the supplemental schedule, other than that agreed to or derived from the certified investment information, has been subjected to auditing procedures applied in the audit of the financial statements and certain additional procedures, including comparing and reconciling such information directly to the underlying accounting and other records used to prepare the financial statements or to the financial statements themselves and other additional procedures in accordance with U.S. GAAS. For information included in the supplemental schedule that agreed to or is derived from the certified investment information, we compared such information to the related certified investment information.

In forming our opinion on the supplemental schedule, we evaluated whether the supplemental schedule, other than the information agreed to or derived from the certified investment information, including its form and content, is presented in conformity with the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA.

NOTE 1 - PLAN DESCRIPTION

The following description of the Seton Hill University 403(b) Plan (Plan) provides only general information. Plan participants should refer to the Plan document for a complete description of the Plan's provisions.

General - The Plan is a defined contribution plan sponsored by Seton Hill University (University). Full-time employees, certain part-time employees and adjunct faculty become eligible to join the Plan upon reaching the age of 18. Student employees are excluded from Plan participation. Participating employees, excluding adjunct faculty, who have completed at least 1,000 hours of service during the Plan year may receive matching contributions. The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA), as amended. The Retirement Plan Committee is responsible for oversight of the Plan.

Contributions - Each year, participants may elect to contribute through after-tax and before-tax payroll deductions based on a percentage or dollar amount of the participant's eligible compensation, subject to Internal Revenue Code (IRC) limitations. Those who have attained age 50 before the end of the Plan year are eligible to make catch-up contributions. Participants may also contribute amounts representing distributions from other qualified defined benefit or defined contribution plans (rollovers). Participants direct their contributions into various investment options offered by the Plan. Participants, excluding adjunct faculty, are eligible to receive matching contributions upon completion of 1,000 hours of service. Effective July 1, 2020, the Plan was amended to make employer contributions based on a fixed-tiered match. For participants with less than five years of service, the University matched 100% of the participant's contributions from 3% to 5%. At the beginning of the participant's fifth year of service, the University matches 100% of the participant's contributions from 3% to 4% and contributes a total of 6% of the participant's eligible compensation if the participant makes contributions of 5% or greater. At the beginning of the participant's seventh year of service, the University matches 100% of the participant's contributions from 3% to 4% and contributes a total of 8% of the participant's eligible compensation if the participant makes contributions of 5% or greater.

Participant Accounts - Each participant's account is credited with the participant's contributions and University's discretionary contributions. Participant accounts are charged with an allocation of administrative expenses that are paid by the Plan. Allocations are based on participant earnings, account balances or specific participant transactions, as defined. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant's vested account.

Vesting - Participants are vested immediately in their contributions, University discretionary contributions and actual earnings thereon.

Payment of Benefits - Normal retirement age is the last day of the academic year in which age 65 is attained. Upon reaching retirement age, or earlier termination of service at any age, a participant is entitled to and may elect to receive benefits from Teachers Insurance and Annuity Association of America (TIAA) and/or College Retirement Equities Fund (CREF) annuity accumulations under any of the following options: lump sum (with restrictions), lifetime annuity, partial payments or installment payments not to exceed the life expectancy of the participant.

Notes Receivable from Participants - Prior to February 2017, notes receivable were issued as separate contracts by TIAA and did not represent Plan assets. Loans to participants in the Plan were collateralized and were not reflected as a reduction of the participant's account balance; however, the account balance was held as collateral to the loan. Plan loans issued prior to February 2017 continue to be classified as Plan loans and will remain collateralized loans until they are paid in full. Total outstanding Plan loans amounted to \$485 and \$829 for the Plan years ended June 30, 2024 and 2023, respectively. No Plan loans were deemed to be in default as of June 30, 2024 and 2023.

Effective February 2017, the Plan administrator amended the Plan loan policy to allow for retirement plan loans, which are classified as participant loans. These loans are funded by the participant's account balance and represent Plan assets. Participants may borrow up to the lesser of 50% of their vested account balance or \$50,000. Notes receivable may be repaid through payroll deductions or by electronic payments within five years, except those notes used in the purchase of a primary residence, in which case the loans must be repaid within 10 years. Participants are allowed a maximum of three outstanding loans. The loan interest rate is set at 1% above the prime rate, as defined.

NOTE 2 - SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

A summary of significant accounting policies consistently applied by the Plan administrator in the preparation of the accompanying statements of net assets available for benefits and related statement of changes in net assets available for benefits are the related notes to the financial statements (financial statements) follow:

Basis of Accounting - The financial statements of the Plan are prepared on the accrual basis of accounting.

Use of Estimates - The preparation of the financial statements in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America (U.S. GAAP) requires the Plan administrator to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities and changes therein, and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

Investment Valuation and Income Recognition - Investments are reported at fair value, except for fully benefit-responsive investment contracts, which are reported at contract value. Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. The Plan's Retirement Committee determines the Plan's valuation policies utilizing information provided by the investment advisers, custodians and insurance company. See Note 4 for discussion of fair value measurement.

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Net appreciation in fair value of investments includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold as well as held during the year.

Notes Receivable from Participants - Notes receivable from participants are measured at their unpaid principal balance plus any accrued but unpaid interest. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Related fees are recorded as administrative expense and are expensed when incurred. No allowance for credit loss has been recorded as of June 30, 2024 or 2023. If a participant ceases to make loan payments and the Plan administrator deems the participant loan to be in default, the participant loan balance is reduced and a benefit payment is recorded.

Payment of Benefits - Benefits are recorded when paid.

Expenses - Certain expenses of maintaining the Plan are paid by the Plan, unless otherwise paid by the University. Fees related to the administration of notes receivable from participants are charged directly to participant accounts. Service fees related to the Plan's investment consultants are allocated among all Plan participants. Both types of fees are included in administrative expenses. Investment-related expenses are included in net appreciation of fair value of investments.

Subsequent Events - Subsequent events are defined as events or transactions that occur after the statement of net assets available for benefits date, but before the financial statements are issued or available to be issued. Management has evaluated subsequent events through March 3, 2025, the date that the financial statements were issued and determined that there have been no events that have occurred that would require adjustments to the disclosures in the financial statements.

NOTE 3 - INFORMATION CERTIFIED BY THE TRUSTEE (UNAUDITED)

Certain information related to investments and notes receivable from participants disclosed in the accompanying financial statements and ERISA-required supplemental schedule, including investments and notes receivable from participants held at June 30, 2024 and 2023, and net appreciation in fair value of investments, interest and dividend income and interest income on notes receivable from participants for the year ended June 30, 2024, was obtained or derived from information supplied to the Plan administrator and certified as complete and accurate by TIAA and CREF, the trustee of the Plan for TIAA, CREF and TIAA-CREF Investment Products, and TIAA, FSB, directed trustee or custodian of certain other investments.

NOTE 4 - FAIR VALUE MEASUREMENT

The framework for measuring fair value provides a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (Level 1) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (Level 3).

The three levels of the fair value hierarchy are described as follows:

Level 1 - Inputs to the valuation methodology are unadjusted quoted prices for identical assets or liabilities in active markets that the Plan has the ability to access.

Level 2 - Inputs to the valuation methodology include:

- quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities in active markets;
- quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities in inactive markets;
- inputs other than quoted prices that are observable for the asset or liability; and
- inputs that are derived principally from or corroborated by observable market data by correlation or other means.

If the asset or liability has a specified (contractual) term, the Level 2 input must be observable for substantially the full term of the asset or liability.

Level 3 - Inputs to the valuation methodology are unobservable and significant to the fair value measurement.

The asset or liability's fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques maximize the use of relevant observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs.

Following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for assets measured at fair value. There have been no changes in the methodologies used at June 30, 2024 and 2023.

TIAA Traditional Annuity Account - Certain contracts of the TIAA Traditional Annuity Account meet the fully benefit-responsive contract criteria as described in Note 5 and are excluded from the fair value hierarchy table. Contract value equals the accumulated cash contributions and interest credited to the Plan's contract, less any withdrawals, and approximates fair value. The valuation of the Plan's investments in the TIAA Traditional Non-Benefit-Responsive Annuity that are included in the fair value hierarchy table requires significant judgment due to the absence of quoted market prices and heavy reliance on Level 3 inputs. There is, however, a liquidity guarantee by the TIAA general account. The TIAA Traditional Non-Benefit-Responsive Annuity is equal to the cumulative contributions invested plus a guaranteed rate of interest credited over the term based on the rate declared when the contribution is made. Crediting rates are a combination of a guaranteed rate and an annually established discretionary rate. The discretionary rate applied to contributions received during a reporting period may vary from the discretionary rate applied to account balances at the end of the prior reporting period. When the accumulated value is converted to an annuity, it is converted to a present value annuity based on the participant's life expectancy. Contract value approximates a discounted cash flow value calculated using an appropriate risk-adjusted market discount rate, which correlates closely with TIAA Traditional Non-Benefit-Responsive Annuity's historical crediting rates.

Mutual Funds - Includes TIAA-CREF funds and other mutual funds. Valued at the daily closing price as reported by the funds. Mutual funds held by the Plan are open-end mutual funds that are registered with the Securities and Exchange Commission. These funds are required to publish their daily net asset value and to transact at that price. The mutual funds held by the Plan are deemed to be actively traded.

CREF Accounts - Valued using market quotations or prices obtained from independent pricing sources that may employ various pricing methods to value the investments, including matrix pricing. Participants hold accumulation units in CREF accounts, which are registered with the Securities and Exchange Commission. These accounts determine the closing accumulation unit value on any day the NASDAQ is open and are deemed to be readily traded.

TIAA Real Estate - Value is principally derived from the market value of the underlying real estate holdings or other real estate-related investments. The daily unit values for the TIAA Real Estate Account are updated overnight for each day that the NASDAQ is open and is listed on the securities exchange.

Transfers into the TIAA Traditional Non-Benefit Responsive Annuity from other funds totaled \$157,666 and \$73,427 for the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023, respectively. Transfers out of the TIAA Non-Benefit Responsive Annuity into other funds totaled \$1,204,356 and \$990,245 for the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023, respectively.

NOTE 5 - BENEFIT-RESPONSIVE ACCOUNTS

Plan participants have entered into the TIAA Traditional Benefit-Responsive Annuity (TIAA Traditional) and the TIAA Stable Value Fund (Stable Value), both fully benefit-responsive annuity contracts with TIAA, the issuer. TIAA maintains TIAA Traditional contributions in a general account and Stable Value contributions in a non-unitized separate account. Accounts are credited with earnings on the underlying investments and charged for participant withdrawals and administrative expenses. TIAA is contractually obligated to repay the principal and a specified interest rate that is guaranteed to the Plan.

NOTE 5 - BENEFIT-RESPONSIVE ACCOUNTS (Continued)

TIAA Traditional is an unallocated fixed annuity contract that is fully and unconditionally guaranteed by TIAA. TIAA Traditional provides a guarantee of principal, a guaranteed minimum rate of interest (generally 3%, but in some recent contracts between 1% and 3%) and the potential for additional interest if declared by TIAA. Additional interest, when declared, remains in effect for the “declaration year,” which begins each March 1. Additional interest is not guaranteed for future years. Contributions to a participant’s account purchase a guaranteed amount of lifetime annuity income. When a participant’s account in the TIAA Traditional is annuitized based on available options, the present value of the stream of payments is equal to the account balance. The subsequent stream of annuity payments occurs outside of the Plan and does not represent an obligation of the Plan.

Stable Value is a fixed-rate group annuity contract issued by TIAA. The contract provides a guaranteed minimum rate of interest between 1% and 3% before deductions for contract fees, with the potential for crediting of additional interest above the guaranteed minimum. Additional interest can be declared by the TIAA Board of Trustees, remains in effect for six-month periods and is not guaranteed for future periods.

The contracts meet the fully benefit-responsive contract criteria and therefore are reported at contract value. Contract value is the relevant measure for fully benefit-responsive investment contracts because this is the amount received by participants if they were to initiate permitted transactions under the terms of the Plan. Contract value, as reported to the Plan by TIAA, represents contributions, interest credited and transfers, if any, less participant withdrawals. TIAA Traditional and Stable Value are immediately liquid to participants and do not have participant-level withdrawal restrictions, except that immediate transfers from Stable Value cannot be made to competing investment options pursuant to the contract’s “equity wash” provisions.

The Plan’s ability to receive amounts due is dependent on the issuer’s ability to meet its financial obligations, which may be affected by future economic and regulatory developments. There are no reserves against contract value for credit risk of the contract issuer or otherwise. The crediting interest rate is based on a formula agreed upon with the issuer, but it may not be less than 3%. Such interest rates are reviewed at least on an annual basis by the TIAA Board of Trustees for changes.

Certain events limit the ability of the Plan to transact at contract value with the issuer, including: (1) amendments to the Plan documents (including complete or partial Plan termination or merger with another plan); (2) changes to the Plan’s prohibition on competing investment options or deletion of equity wash provisions; (3) bankruptcy of the Plan sponsor or other Plan sponsor events that cause a significant withdrawal from the Plan; (4) the failure of the trust to qualify for exemption from federal income taxes or any required prohibited transaction exemption under ERISA; or (5) premature termination of the contract. No events are probable of occurring that might limit the ability of the Plan to transact at contract value with the contract issuers that also would limit the ability of the Plan to transact at contract value with the participants.

Certain events allow the issuer to terminate the contract with the Plan and settle at an amount different from contract value. Such events include: (1) an uncured violation of the Plan’s investment guidelines; (2) a breach of material obligation under the contract; (3) a material misrepresentation; or (4) a material amendment to the agreement without the consent of the issuer.

NOTE 6 - RELATED-PARTY TRANSACTIONS AND PARTY-IN-INTEREST TRANSACTIONS

Certain Plan investments are shares of funds managed by TIAA, CREF and TIAA-CREF. TIAA-CREF is the Plan trustee as defined by the Plan and, therefore, these transactions qualify as party-in-interest transactions. Fees incurred by the Plan for investment management services are included in net appreciation in fair value of the investment since they are paid directly through revenue sharing rather than a direct payment. Certain administrative functions are performed by employees of the University at no cost to the Plan.

NOTE 7 - PLAN TERMINATION

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the University has the right under the Plan to discontinue its contributions at any time and to terminate the Plan subject to provisions set forth under ERISA.

NOTE 8 - TAX STATUS

The Plan is a prototype plan of TIAA-CREF, which received an opinion letter on August 7, 2017, in which the IRS stated that the form of the Plan document was acceptable under the applicable requirements of the IRC. The Plan has been designed to qualify under Section 403(b) of the IRC. Although the Plan has been amended since receiving this opinion letter, the Plan administrator believes that the Plan is designed, and is currently being operated, in compliance with the applicable requirements of the IRC and, therefore, believes that the Plan is qualified, and the related trust is tax-exempt.

U.S. GAAP require Plan management to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan and recognize a tax liability if the Plan has taken an uncertain position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by the IRS. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions, however there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress. The Plan administrator believes that the Plan is no longer subject to income tax examinations for Plan years prior to 2021.

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NOTE 9 - RISKS AND UNCERTAINTIES

The Plan invests in securities that are exposed to various risks, such as interest rate, market and credit risks. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in value will occur in the near term that such changes could materially affect participants' account balances, and the amounts reported in the statements of net assets available for benefits.
