We have performed an audit of the financial statements of Employee Benefits Plan of Whittier Street Health Center Committee, Inc. (the Plan), an employee benefit plan subject to the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA), as permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) (ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit). The financial statements comprise the statement of net assets available for benefits as of June 30, 2024, and the related statement of changes in net assets available for benefits for the year then ended, and the related notes to the financial statements.

Management has obtained certification from a qualified institution as of and for the year ended June 30, 2024, stating that the certified investment information, as described in Note 3 to the financial statements, is complete and accurate.

Their report, dated April 5, 2024, indicated an unmodified opinion in accordance with ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) over the financial statements and supplemental schedule required by ERISA.

June 30, 2024 and 2023

1. Description of Plan

The following description of Employee Benefits Plan of Whittier Street Health Center Committee, Inc. (the Plan) provides only general information. Participants should refer to the Plan document for a more complete description of the Plan's provisions.

General

The Plan is a defined contribution money purchase plan covering all eligible employees of Whittier Street Health Center Committee, Inc. (the Health Center or Plan Sponsor). The Board of Directors of the Health Center is responsible for the oversight of the Plan. The Plan Oversight Committee determines the appropriateness of the Plan's investment offerings, monitors investment performance, and reports to the Health Center's Board of Directors. The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA).

Eligibility

Employees of the Health Center become eligible for the Health Center's nonelective contributions upon obtaining the age of 21, completing 1 year of service (with at least 1,000 hours), and being employed on the last day of the Plan year.

Contributions

The Health Center makes nonelective contributions equal to 3% of each participants' annual compensation during the Plan year. Amounts contributed to the Plan on behalf of any individual may not exceed Internal Revenue Service (IRS) contribution limits for the related Plan year.

Employees are not allowed to make contributions to the Plan; however, employees may contribute amounts representing distributions from other qualified retirement plans (rollover contributions). Participants may direct the investment of their nonelective and rollover contributions into various investment options offered by the Plan.

Participant Accounts

Each participant's account is credited with an allocation of the applicable Health Center's contribution and plan earnings and are charged with an allocation of administrative expenses that are paid by the Plan. Allocations are based on participant earnings or account balances, as defined in the plan document. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant's vested account.

Vesting

Participants become fully vested in the Health Center's nonelective contributions following three years of service consisting of 1,000 hours of service in each year.

Payment of Benefits

The Plan provides for a normal retirement benefit to be paid to a participant, or their beneficiary, who has reached the normal retirement age of 65, or an early retirement age of 62. Upon termination of service, a participant may elect to receive a lump-sum amount equal to their balance. The Plan allows balances up to \$1,000 to be paid out to participants upon termination without approval. There are also retirement benefits available upon disability and death. The Plan allows in-service withdrawals upon attainment of age 59 ½.

Notes Receivable from Participants

Loans are not permitted under the Plan.

Forfeitures

Forfeitures represent non-vested Plan Sponsor contributions forfeited by participants who terminated their employment or who withdraw from the Plan. Forfeitures are retained by the Plan and can be used to reduce future Plan Sponsor contributions. There were \$7,695 of forfeited amounts used to reduce Plan Sponsor contributions for the plan year ended June 30, 2024. As of June 30, 2024 and 2023, there were \$7,816 and \$6,125, respectively, of unallocated forfeitures.

2. **Summary of Significant Accounting Policies**

Basis of Accounting

The accompanying financial statements have been prepared on the accrual basis of accounting, in accordance with U.S. generally accepted accounting principles (U.S. GAAP).

Use of Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in accordance with U.S. GAAP requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities and changes therein and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities at the date of the financial statements. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

Investments

The Plan's investments are reported at fair value. Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. The Plan Administrator determines the Plan's valuation policies utilizing information provided by the qualified institution. See Note 4 for discussion of fair value measurements.

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Net appreciation includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments purchased and sold as well as held during the year.

Payment of Benefits

Benefits are recorded when paid.

Administrative Expenses

Certain expenses of maintaining the Plan are paid directly by the Health Center and are excluded from these financial statements. The Plan's asset management fees are indirectly allocated from participants' accounts, and are included in the accompanying statement of changes in net assets available for benefits in administrative expenses. Fees related to the processing of distributions are charged directly to the participant's account and are included in administrative expenses. Investment-related expenses are included in net appreciation of investments.

Subsequent Events

Management has considered transactions or events occurring through April 3, 2025, the date that the financial statements were available to be issued. Management has not evaluated subsequent events after that date for inclusion in the financial statements.

3. Information Prepared and Certified by the Trustee

The investments, investment transactions, and net appreciation in fair value of investments were obtained by management and agreed to or derived from the information certified by the trustee as complete and accurate. This information is included in the following:

- Statements of Net Assets Available for Benefits;
- Statement of Changes in Net Assets Available for Benefits; and
- Schedule H, line 4i - Schedule of Assets (Held at End of Year).

4. Fair Value Measurement

Following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for assets measured at fair value:

Pooled separate accounts: Valued at the accumulation unit value, which is calculated daily as the number of accumulation units held is multiplied by the accumulation unit value, using net asset value (NAV) as a practical expedient which is considered by Plan management to be the best approximation of fair value. The NAV is used as a practical expedient to estimate the fair value, unless it is probable that all or a portion of the pooled separate accounts will be sold for an amount different from NAV. As of June 30, 2024 and 2023, the Plan had no plans to sell the pooled separate accounts at amounts different than NAV. The accumulation unit value is first established when a new fund starts, and is then determined daily based on the NAV as a practical expedient of the fair value of the shares of the underlying fund, plus the fund's dividends and less any account charges. Transactions occur daily in and out of the accounts. There are no unfunded commitments from participants in the Plan who invest in these accounts.

Common collective trust (CCT): Valued at the NAV of units of the common collective trust. The NAV, as provided by the trustee, is used as a practical expedient which is considered by Plan management to be the best approximation of fair value. The NAV is based on the fair value of the underlying investments held by the fund less its liabilities. The NAV is used as a practical expedient to estimate the fair value, unless it is probable that all or a portion of the CCT will be sold for an amount different from NAV. As of June 30, 2024 and 2023, the Plan had no plans to sell the CCT at an amount different than NAV. Participant transactions (purchases and sales) may occur daily. Were the Plan to initiate a full redemption of the CCT, the investment advisor reserves the right to temporarily delay withdrawal from the trust in order to ensure that securities liquidations will be carried out in an orderly business manner. The CCT seeks to maintain a stable value of \$1 per unit.

There have been no changes in the methodologies used at June 30, 2024 and 2023.

5. Common Collective Trust

The Plan's investment in the CCT is represented by the CCT's underlying investments in the Principal Stable Value Signature fund which invests in fully-benefit-responsive investment contracts, commonly referred to as guaranteed investment contracts (GICs), synthetic investment contracts, and similarly designed contracts issued by insurance companies, banks and other financial institutions. The Plan's investment in the CCT is not considered a fully benefit-responsive investment contract and is reported at fair value (see Note 4).

6. Income Tax Status

The Plan Sponsor has obtained an opinion letter dated June 30, 2020, in which the IRS stated that the restated prototype plan document was in compliance with applicable requirements of the Internal Revenue Code (IRC). The Plan Administrator timely adopted the restated prototype plan. The Plan Administrator believes that the Plan is currently being operated in accordance with the IRC.

U.S. GAAP requires plan management to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan and recognizes a tax liability (or asset) if the Plan has taken an uncertain position that more-likely-than-not would not be sustained upon examination by the applicable authorities. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress.

7. Plan Termination

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the Health Center has the right under the Plan to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions of ERISA. In the event of Plan termination, all participants will become fully vested and all accrued benefits shall be paid to participants in accordance with the provisions of the Plan.

8. Party-in-Interest

Plan investments are managed by Principal Life Insurance Company, the trustee, therefore, these transactions qualify as party-in-interest transactions. Direct fees paid by the Plan for the investment management services amounted to \$22,524 for the year ended June 30, 2024.

9. Risks and Uncertainties

The Plan invests in various investments. Investments are exposed to various risks, such as interest rate, market and credit risks. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investments, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the values of investments will occur in the near term, and that these changes could materially affect the amounts reported in the accompanying statements of net assets available for benefits.
