NOTE 1 - DESCRIPTION OF PLAN

The following description of In-Pact, Inc. Profit Sharing Plan (the Plan) provides only general information. Participants should refer to the Plan Agreement for a more complete description of the Plan's provisions.

A. General

The Plan was organized effective July 1, 1990, as a defined contribution retirement savings plan covering all eligible employees of In-Pact, Inc. (the Employer) who have at least one year of service and are age 21 or older. The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA). The Plan Trustees are responsible for oversight of the Plan and determine the appropriateness of the Plan's investment offerings, monitor investment performance and report to the Board of Directors of the Employer.

B. Contributions

Each year, the Employer may elect to make discretionary profit-sharing contributions to the Plan, as determined by the Employer's Board of Directors. For the years ended June 30, 2024 and 2023, the Employer made no profit-sharing contributions. No employee contributions are permitted to the Plan. Contributions are subject to maximum annual amounts permitted under the Internal Revenue Code (IRC). All Plan contributions are directed by the Plan Trustees.

Participants may make rollover contributions from amounts representing distributions from other qualified plans.

C. Participant Accounts

Each participant's account is credited with the allocations of the Employer's profit-sharing contributions, the participant's rollover contributions, Plan earnings, and forfeitures of terminated participants' nonvested accounts. Participant accounts may also be charged with an allocation of certain administrative expenses of the Plan. Allocations are based on participant earnings or account balances, or specific participant transactions, as defined in the Plan Agreement. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant's vested account.

D. Vesting and Forfeitures

Participants are vested immediately in their rollover contributions plus actual earnings thereon. Vesting in the Employer's contribution portion of their account is based on years of service. A participant becomes 20% vested after two years of service, increasing by 20% per year, with full vesting after six years of credited service.

NOTE 1 - DESCRIPTION OF PLAN CONTINUED

At June 30, 2024 and 2023, forfeited nonvested accounts of terminated participants totaled \$545 and \$484, respectively. These accounts may be used to pay Plan expenses and/or be reallocated to eligible Plan participants. For the year ended June 30, 2024, forfeited nonvested accounts of \$0 were used to pay Plan expenses and \$0 were reallocated to eligible Plan participants. For the year ended June 30, 2023, forfeited nonvested accounts of \$0 were used to pay Plan expenses and \$0 were reallocated to eligible Plan participants.

E. Payment of Benefits and Withdrawals

Upon the occurrence of a distributable event due to separation from service by termination, death, disability, or retirement, as defined by the Plan Agreement, a participant may elect to receive a lump-sum cash distribution equal to the value of the participant's vested interest in his or her account. Hardship and in-service withdrawals, as defined in the Plan Agreement, are also permitted from a participant's account.

F. Termination of Plan

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the Employer has the right under the Plan to discontinue its contributions at any time and to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions of ERISA. In the event of Plan termination, the participants will become 100% vested in their accounts.

NOTE 2 - SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

A. Basis of Accounting

The accompanying financial statements are prepared on the accrual basis of accounting.

B. Use of Estimates in Preparation of Financial Statements

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with generally accepted accounting principles requires the plan administration to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities at the date of the financial statements and the reported amounts of revenues and expenses during the reporting period. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

C. Investment Valuation and Income Recognition

Employee and employer contributions are invested in mutual fund options selected by the Board of Trustees and plan sponsor. These investments are valued at quoted market prices. The investment funds available are as follows:

The Invesco Government Money Market Cash Reserves fund is a cash equivalents fund that seeks to provide current income consistent with preservation of capital and liquidity.

NOTE 2 - SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES CONTINUED

The Invesco Income Fund A seeks current income, and secondarily capital appreciation. It invests primarily in fixed-income securities and derivatives and other instruments that have economic characteristics similar to such securities.

The Invesco American Franchise Fund A seeks long-term capital appreciation. The fund invests, under normal circumstances, at least 80% of its net assets (plus any borrowings for investment purposes) in securities of U.S. issuers.

The Invesco Equity and Income Fund A seeks current income and, secondarily, capital appreciation. The fund invests, under normal circumstances, at least 80% of its net assets (plus any borrowings for investment purposes) in equity and income securities, and in derivatives and other instruments that have economic characteristics similar to such securities.

D. Payment of Benefits

Benefits are recorded when paid.

E. Expenses

Administrative expenses for maintaining the Plan may be paid by the Employer or the Plan, at the Employer's discretion. Certain administrative fees are charged directly to the participant's account and are included in administrative expenses. Investment related expenses are included in net appreciation (depreciation) in fair value of investments.

F. Income Tax Status

The Plan obtained its latest determination letter on June 30, 2020, in which the Internal Revenue Service stated that the Plan, as then designed, was in compliance with the applicable requirements of the Internal Revenue Code. The Plan has been amended since receiving the determination letter. However, the Plan administrator and the Plan's tax counsel believe that the Plan is currently designed and being operated in compliance with the applicable requirements of the Internal Revenue Code. Therefore, they believe that the Plan was qualified, and the related trust was tax-exempt as of the financial statement date.

Employer contributions and interest income are not taxable to the participant until distributed.

G. Uncertain Income Tax Positions

When applicable, changes in benefits arising from current and prior tax positions taken by the Plan are recognized in the period in which the change occurs. Changes resulting from settlements with taxing authorities are recognized in the period that settlement occurs. Reductions in unrecognized tax benefits as a result of a lapse of the applicable statute of limitations are recognized in the period the statute lapses. Projected penalties and interest recognized on tax positions where it is reasonably possible that the Plan's tax position will not prevail in a review by taxing authorities is recognized as part of current period income tax expense. The Board of Trustees believe that the current and three prior tax periods remain subject to examination by taxing jurisdictions.

H. Risks and Uncertainties

The Plan invests in various investment securities. Investment securities are exposed to various risks such as interest rate, market, and credit risks. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the values of investment securities will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect participants' account balances and the amounts reported in the Statements of Net Assets Available for Benefits.

NOTE 3 - INVESTMENTS AND INFORMATION CERTIFIED BY ASCENSUS TRUST COMPANY

The Plan administrator has elected the method of compliance as permitted by 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the United States Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. Accordingly, as permitted under such election, the Plan administrator instructed the Plan's independent auditors not to perform any auditing procedures with respect to the following information certified by Ascensus, LLC, as agent for Ascensus Trust Company, except for comparing such information certified by the custodian to information included in the Plan's financial statements and supplemental schedule.

NOTE 4 - FAIR VALUE MEASUREMENTS

The Plan has implemented accounting standards related to fair value measurements, which establishes a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (Level 1 measurements) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (Level 3 measurements). The three levels of the fair value hierarchy under the standard are described below:

Basis of Fair Value Measurement

- Level 1: Unadjusted quoted prices in active markets that are accessible at the measurement date for identical, unrestricted assets or liabilities;
- Level 2: Quoted prices in markets that are not considered to be active or financial instruments for which all significant inputs are observable, either directly or indirectly;
- Level 3: Prices or valuations that require inputs that are both significant to the fair value measurement and unobservable

A financial instruments level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement.

The following tables present by level, within the fair value hierarchy, the Plan investment assets at fair value, as of June 30, 2024 and 2023. As required, investment assets are classified in their entirety based upon the lowest level of input that is significant to the fair value measurement.

NOTE 5 - PARTY-IN-INTEREST TRANSACTIONS

Ascensus Trust Company, the Plan's custodian and/or its affiliates, receives indirect fees from investments which are deducted from investment returns. Direct fees paid by the Plan to the Custodian and/or its affiliates totaled \$5,909 and \$5,798 for the Plan years ended June 30, 2024 and 2023, respectively. Indirect fees paid by the Plan to the Custodian and/or its affiliates totaled \$57 and \$54 for the Plan years ended June 30, 2024 and 2023, respectively.

Swartz, Retson & Co., P.C., by virtue of its role as auditor of the Plan's financial statements, qualifies as a party-in-interest. Fees paid to Swartz, Retson & Co., P.C. were \$0 and \$0 for the years ended June 30, 2024 and 2023, respectively.

Certain employees of the Organization provide administrative and trustee services to the Plan. These employees are not paid by the Plan for their services. Certain other administrative expenses are paid by the Organization on behalf of the Plan.
