Independent Auditors' Report

Scope and Nature of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) Audit

We have performed audits of the accompanying financial statements of Glunt Industries, Inc. 401(k) Profit Sharing Plan, an employee benefit plan subject to the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA), as permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C). The financial statements comprise the statements of net assets available for benefits - modified cash basis as of June 30, 2024 and 2023, and the related statements of changes in net assets available for benefits - modified cash basis for the years then ended, and the related notes to the financial statements.

Management, having determined it is permissible in the circumstances, has elected to have the audits of Glunt Industries, Inc. 401(k) Profit Sharing Plan's financial statements performed in accordance with ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) pursuant to 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. As permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C), our audits need not extend to any statements or information related to assets held for investment of the plan (investment information) by a bank or similar institution or insurance carrier that is regulated, supervised and subject to periodic examination by a state or federal agency, provided that the statements or information regarding assets so held are prepared and certified to by the bank or similar institution or insurance carrier in accordance with 29 CFR 2520.103-5 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA (qualified institution).

Management has obtained a certification from a qualified institution as of and for the years ended June 30, 2024 and 2023, stating that the certified investment information, as described in NOTE D to the financial statements, is complete and accurate.

Opinion

In our opinion, based on our audits and on the procedures performed as described in the *Auditors' Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements* section—

- The amounts and disclosures in the financial statements referred to above, other than those agreed to or derived from the certified investment information, are presented fairly, in all material respects, in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.
- The information in the financial statements referred to above related to assets held by and certified to by a qualified institution agrees to, or is derived from, in all material respects, the information prepared and certified by an institution that management determined meets the requirements of ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C).

Basis for Opinion

We conducted our audits in accordance with auditing standards generally accepted in the United States of America. Our responsibilities under those standards are further described in the *Auditors' Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements* section of our report. We are required to be independent of Glunt Industries, Inc. 401(k) Profit Sharing Plan and to meet our other ethical responsibilities, in accordance with the relevant ethical requirements relating to our audits. We believe that the audit evidence we have obtained is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for our ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit opinion.

Basis of Accounting for the Financial Statements

We draw attention to NOTE B of the financial statements, which describes the basis of accounting. The financial statements and supplemental schedule are prepared on the modified cash basis of accounting, which is a basis of accounting other than accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America. Our opinion is not modified with respect to that matter.

Responsibilities of Management for the Financial Statements

Management is responsible for the preparation and fair presentation of these financial statements in accordance with the modified cash basis of accounting described in NOTE B; this includes determining that the modified cash basis of accounting is an acceptable basis for the preparation of the financial statements in the circumstances. Management is also responsible for the design, implementation and maintenance of internal control relevant to the preparation and fair presentation of financial statements that are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error. Management's election of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit does not affect management's responsibility for the financial statements.

NOTE A - DESCRIPTION OF PLAN

The following description of Glunt Industries, Inc. 401(k) Profit Sharing Plan provides only general information. Participants should refer to the Plan agreement for a more complete description of the Plan's provisions.

General - The Plan is a defined-contribution plan covering all employees of Glunt Industries, Inc. who meet eligibility requirements. It is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA).

Amendment - Effective January 1, 2024, the Company restated the Plan to include provisions of the Setting Every Community Up for Retirement Enhancement 2.0 (SECURE Act 2.0). The SECURE Act 2.0 allows for participants to begin making Roth deferrals and allows employer Roth contributions.

Contributions - Under the Plan's provisions, each participant may contribute an amount up to the elective deferral dollar limit as defined in the Plan. Participants may also roll over amounts representing distributions from other qualified defined-benefit or contribution plans. Under the Plan's safe harbor provisions, the Company makes a matching contribution to the Plan equal to 100% of the first 3% and 50% of the next 2% of the elective contribution made by participants. The Company may also make discretionary profit-sharing contributions to the Plan for the related year. No discretionary contributions were made for the years ended June 30, 2024 and 2023.

Upon enrollment in the Plan, a participant may direct employee and employer contributions to any of the available investment options. Participants may change their investment options at their discretion. All of the balances of the Plan represent participant-directed investments.

Participant accounts - Each participant's account is credited with the participant's contribution, the appropriate company-matching contribution, allocations of Company discretionary contributions and plan earnings, based on each participant's earnings or account balances, as defined. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit which can be provided from the participant's vested account.

Vesting - Vesting in participants' accounts relating to the Company discretionary contribution is based on years of continuous service. A participant is vested in employer contributions based on the following graded schedule: 20% after one year, 40% after two years, 60% after three years, 80% after four years and 100% after five years of credited service. Participants are immediately vested in their deferrals and contributions rolled over from other qualified defined-benefit or contribution plans, the Company safe harbor contribution, plus actual earnings thereon.

NOTE A - DESCRIPTION OF PLAN (CONTINUED)

Notes receivable from participants - Participants may borrow from their account balance a minimum of \$1,000 up to a maximum of \$50,000 or 50% of the vested interest of the participant's account balance, whichever is less. Each participant is limited to one loan outstanding at any point in time. The loans are secured by the balance in the participant's account. The loans bear interest at fixed rates which are determined by adding 1% to the prime interest rate at the time of the loans. The participants are to repay principal and interest ratably through payroll deductions each pay period.

Notes receivable from participants are measured at their unpaid principal balance plus any accrued, but unpaid, interest. Delinquent participant loans are reclassified as distributions based upon the terms set forth in the Plan document.

Payment of benefits - On termination of service due to death, disability or retirement, a participant may elect to receive either a lump-sum amount equal to the value of the participant's vested interest in his or her account, or periodic installments. For termination of service due to other reasons, a participant may only receive the value of the vested interest in his or her account as a lump-sum distribution. Benefits are recorded when paid.

Forfeited accounts - At June 30, 2024 and 2023, forfeited accounts totaled \$49,007 and \$14,424, respectively. These accounts may be used to pay Plan administrative expenses and/or reduce future Company contributions. Plan expenses were not reduced by any forfeited accounts during each of the years ended June 30, 2024 and 2023. During the years ended June 30, 2024 and 2023, Company contributions were reduced by \$16,534 and \$0, respectively.

NOTE B - SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of accounting - The accompanying financial statements have been prepared on the modified cash basis of accounting. This basis differs from accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America primarily because the Plan does not recognize contributions due from the Company until the cash is received by the Plan.

Estimates and subsequent events - The preparation of financial statements requires the Plan Administrator to make estimates and assumptions that affect certain reported amounts and disclosures. Accordingly, actual results could differ from those estimates. In preparing the financial statements, including estimates and disclosures, the Plan Administrator has considered the effects of subsequent events through March 24, 2025—the date the financial statements were available to be issued.

Investment valuation and income recognition - The Plan's investments are stated at fair value as of June 30, 2024 and 2023. Shares of mutual funds are valued at the net asset value of shares held by the Plan at year end. Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. See NOTE C for a discussion of fair value investments. Common collective trusts are valued at the net asset value as a practical expedient of the units held by the Plan at year end.

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Net appreciation (depreciation) includes the Plan's realized gains and losses on investments sold during the year and unrealized gains and losses on investments held during the year. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date.

NOTE C - FAIR VALUE MEASUREMENTS

Financial Accounting Standards Board (FASB) Accounting Standards Codification (ASC) 820, *Fair Value Measurements and Disclosures*, establishes a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. This hierarchy consists of three broad levels:

- Level 1 inputs consist of unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets and have the highest priority.
- Level 2 inputs consist of significant observable inputs other than quoted prices for identical assets.
- Level 3 inputs consist of significant unobservable inputs that are not corroborated by market data and have the lowest priority.

The Plan uses appropriate valuation techniques based on the available inputs to measure the fair value of its investments. When available, the Plan measures fair value using Level 1 inputs because they generally provide the most reliable evidence of fair value. No Level 2 or Level 3 inputs were available to the Plan.

Level 1 Fair Value Measurements

The fair value of mutual funds is based on quoted net asset values of the shares held by the Plan at year end. The mutual funds held by the Plan are open-ended mutual funds registered with the U.S. Securities and Exchange Commission. The funds must publish their daily net asset values and transact at that price. The mutual funds held by the Plan are considered to be actively traded.

Investments Measured at Net Asset Value (NAV) as a Practical Expedient Common/collective trust - Reliance MetLife Stable Value Series 25053 Fund

This investment is valued at the net asset value of the units held by the Plan at year end. The NAV is used as a practical expedient to estimate fair value. There were no unfunded commitments at June 30, 2024 and 2023. The redemption of the units is not restricted; however, there is a 12-month notice period required for redemption of the units at the Plan level. Participants may withdraw or redirect from the fund daily, as permitted by the Plan.

NOTE E - ADMINISTRATION OF PLAN ASSETS, EXPENSES, RELATED-PARTY TRANSACTIONS AND PARTY IN INTEREST

The Company provides to the Plan certain accounting and administrative services for which no fees are charged. Other administrative fees are paid directly by Glunt Industries, Inc. or are paid directly from Plan assets. Investment-related expenses are included in net assets available for benefits. Participant loan and distribution fees are paid by the respective participants.

Plan investments include shares of mutual funds managed by American Funds. Capital Bank and Trust Company (CB&T) is the trustee of the Plan. CB&T is a federal savings bank with trust powers formed for the primary purpose of providing directed trustee services to retirement plans that invest primarily in the American Funds mutual funds. Therefore, these transactions qualify as party-in-interest transactions. Through an arrangement with the trustee, the Plan received revenue-sharing funds of \$8,642 and \$9,396 for the years ended June 30, 2024 and 2023, respectively, which may be used to offset Plan expenses or allocated to participant accounts. For the years ended June 30, 2024 and 2023, fees paid from these funds totaled \$8,099 and \$1,013, respectively, and amounts allocated to participant accounts totaled \$543 and \$8,384, respectively.

NOTE F - TAX STATUS

Effective January 1, 2024, the Plan was amended and restated (see NOTE A). The Plan has not applied for a determination letter; however, the Non-Standardized Plan Document has received an acceptable opinion by letter dated June 30, 2020, from the Internal Revenue Service. The Plan Administrator and the Plan's tax counsel believe that the Plan is currently designed and being operated in compliance with the applicable requirements of the Internal Revenue Code and, therefore, the Plan is qualified and the related trust is tax exempt. Therefore, no provision for income taxes is included in the Plan's financial statements.

Plan management evaluates tax positions taken by the Plan and recognizes a tax liability (asset) if the Plan has taken an uncertain position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by the Internal Revenue Service. The Plan Administrator has analyzed the tax positions taken by the Plan and has concluded that, as of June 30, 2024 and 2023, there are no uncertain positions taken or expected to be taken that would require recognition of a liability (asset) or disclosure in the financial statements. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress.

NOTE G - PLAN TERMINATION

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the Company has the right under the Plan to discontinue its contributions at any time and to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions of ERISA. In the event of Plan termination, participants will become 100% vested in their accounts.

NOTE H - RISKS AND UNCERTAINTIES

The Plan invests in various investment securities. Investment securities are exposed to various risks such as interest rate, market and credit risks. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the values of investment securities will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect participants' account balances and the amounts reported on the accompanying statements of net assets available for benefits - modified cash basis.

NOTE I - DELINQUENT CONTRIBUTIONS

During 2023, the Company made the required corrections to the Plan to reflect lost earnings for the Plan year ended June 30, 2022.
