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## INDEPENDENT AUDITOR'S REPORT

To the Board of Trustees of the

### Opinion

We have audited the financial statements of the Dock Builders, Pier Carpenters, Shorers, House Movers, Pile Drivers, Divers, Tenders and Foundation and Marine Constructors Local Union No. 1456 Membership Relief Benefit Plan (the Plan), an employee benefit plan subject to the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA), which comprise the statements of net assets available for benefits as of June 30, 2024 and 2023, and the related statements of changes in net assets available for benefits for the years then ended, and the related notes to the financial statements.

In our opinion, the accompanying financial statements present fairly, in all material respects, the net assets available for benefits of the Plan as of June 30, 2024 and 2023, and the changes in its net assets available for benefits for the years then ended, in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.

The supplemental Schedule of Assets Held at End of Year, Schedule of Delinquent Participant Contributions and Schedule of Reportable Transactions represent supplemental information required by the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. The supplemental information is the responsibility of the Plan's management and was derived from and relates directly to the underlying accounting and other records used to prepare the financial statements. The information has been subjected to the auditing procedures applied in the audits of the financial statements and certain additional procedures, including comparing and reconciling such information directly to the underlying accounting and other records used to prepare the financial statements or to the financial statements themselves, and other additional procedures in accordance with GAAS.

In forming our opinion on the supplemental information, we evaluated whether the supplemental information, including their form and content, are presented in conformity with the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA.

In our opinion, the information in the accompanying schedules is fairly stated, in all material respects, in relation to the financial statements as a whole, and the form and content are presented in conformity with the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA.

**NOTES TO FINANCIAL STATEMENTS**

JUNE 30, 2024 AND 2023

**NOTE 1. DESCRIPTION OF THE PLAN**

The following brief description of the Dock Builders, Pier Carpenters, Shorers, House Movers, Pile Drivers, Divers, Tenders and Foundation and Marine Constructors Local Union No. 1456 Membership Relief Benefit Plan (the Plan) provides only general information. Participants should refer to the Dock Builders, Pier Carpenters, Shorers, House Movers, Pile Drivers, Divers, Tenders and Foundation and Marine Constructors Local Union No. 1456 Membership Relief Benefit Plan Summary Plan Description for a more complete description of the Plan's provisions.

**General** - The Plan is a trust fund established on January 14, 2003 under an Agreement and Declaration of Trust. The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA), as amended.

**Benefits** - The purpose of the Plan is to provide unemployment benefits, life insurance, accidental death and dismemberment insurance, disability insurance and other benefits similar in nature, to covered members of the former Dock Builders, Pier Carpenters, Shorers, House Movers, Pile Drivers, Divers, Tenders and Foundation and Marine Constructors Local Union No. 1456.

Effective July 21, 2011, the Dock Builders, Pier Carpenters, Shorers, House Movers, Pile Drivers, Tenders and Foundation and Marine Constructors Local Union No. 1456 was dissolved by the United Brotherhood of Carpenters. Effective July 22, 2011, Local Unions 1456 and 1536's memberships and jurisdictions were merged into Local Union 1556 of United Brotherhood of Carpenters and Joiners of America (the Union).

The Plan offers a weekly benefit of \$250 per week not to exceed a total of \$3,000 or twelve weeks in a rolling twelve month period. Recipients must remit weekly unemployment stubs in order to receive the benefit. Once the benefit has been awarded, the recipient has eighteen months to claim the benefit.

## **NOTE 1. DESCRIPTION OF THE PLAN (continued)**

**Eligibility** - To be eligible for a benefit, the covered member must be a member of the Union for the entire three year period immediately preceding the request for benefits. On July 17, 2018, the Board of Trustees adopted an amendment to the Plan effective November 1, 2018, providing for the freeze of participant assessments. Only members who were participating in the Plan prior to October 31, 2018 are eligible to receive benefits. The covered member must also be current with respect to payment of all dues and assessments and has wholly fulfilled his or her obligation to the District Council of Carpenters of New York City and Vicinity Union Participation Program.

## **NOTE 2. SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES**

**Method of Accounting** - The financial statements are prepared using the accrual basis of accounting.

**Investments and Income Recognition** - United States Government and Government Agency obligations, mutual funds and exchange traded funds are carried at fair value which generally represents quoted market prices or net asset value of the fund as of the last business day of the fiscal year as provided by the custodian. The short-term investments are money market accounts valued at cost, which approximates fair value and certificate of deposits valued at fair value as provided by the bank.

Purchases and sales are recorded on the trade date basis. Interest and dividends are recorded on the accrual basis. Net appreciation (depreciation) includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold, as well as held during the year.

**Payment of Benefits** - Benefit payments to participants are recorded when paid.

**Benefit Obligations** - Benefit obligations at year end are the outstanding balances of benefit awards which were paid subsequent to year end.

**Estimates** - The preparation of financial statements in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect certain reported amounts and disclosures in the financial statements. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

**Reclassifications** - Certain reclassifications have been made to prior year amounts to conform to the current year presentations.

## **NOTE 3. PRIORITIES UPON TERMINATION**

It is the intent of the Trustees to continue the Plan in full force and effect. In order to safeguard against any unforeseen contingencies, the right to discontinue the Plan is reserved to the Trustees. In the event of termination, the Trustees shall first satisfy or make provisions to satisfy the obligations of the Plan. Any remaining Plan assets will be distributed in such manner as will in the opinion of the Trustees bring about the purpose of the Plan. Termination shall not permit any part of the Plan to be used for or diverted to purposes other than the exclusive benefit of the participants.

#### **NOTE 4. FUNDING POLICY**

The benefits provided are funded by assessments levied upon the working Union members. Effective October 1, 2014, the assessments levied was 0.5% of gross wages. Assessments are accounted for as exchange transactions.

On July 17, 2018, the Board of Trustees adopted an amendment to the Plan to freeze participant assessments effective November 1, 2018.

#### **NOTE 5. TAX STATUS**

The Plan is in the process of applying for a determination letter from the Internal Revenue Service stating that the Plan is qualified under the Internal Revenue Code. However, the Plan administrator believes that the Plan is qualified, and that the related trust is exempt from taxation.

Accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America require Plan management to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan and recognize a tax liability if the Plan has taken an uncertain position that, more likely than not, would not be sustained upon examination by the U.S. Federal, state, or local taxing authorities. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress. Typically, plan tax years will remain open for three years; however, this may differ depending upon the circumstances of the Plan.

#### **NOTE 6. CASH CONCENTRATION**

The Plan places its cash with financial institutions deemed to be credit worthy. Cash balances may at times exceed the insured deposit limits. The Federal Deposit Insurance Corporation (FDIC) insured deposit limit is \$250,000.

#### **NOTE 7. RELATED PARTY TRANSACTIONS**

##### **Identification of Related Organizations**

The Plan has the following related entities with which it has transactions:

- Local Union 1556 of United Brotherhood of Carpenters and Joiners of America (the Union).
- Local Union 1556 Scholarship Fund (the 1556 Scholarship Fund).
- Dock Builders Local Union No. 1456 Frederick W. Devine Scholarship Fund (the Scholarship Fund).
- New York City District Council of Carpenters.

## **NOTE 7. RELATED PARTY TRANSACTIONS (continued)**

The entities listed above share common Trustees or officers with this Plan. The Union qualifies as a tax-exempt organization under section 501(c)(5). The Scholarship Funds are applying for determination; however, the administrator believes that the Plans are qualified as tax-exempt organizations.

The Plan does not have employees. Personnel assigned to administer and operate the Plan are employees of Local Union 1556 of United Brotherhood of Carpenters and Joiners of America (the Union).

During the years ended June 30, 2024 and 2023, the Plan was allocated salary, employee benefits and payroll taxes of \$60,805 and \$48,088, respectively. At June 30, 2024 and 2023, the Plan owed the Union a net of \$425,645 and \$364,840, respectively.

During the year ended June 30, 2024, the Local did not reimburse any of the amounts owed to the Plan for the balance due for the Timberman portion of insurance premiums. At June 30, 2024 and 2023, the Union owed the Plan \$51,558.

During the years ended June 30, 2024 and 2023, the Plan was owed \$230 from the 1556 Scholarship Fund for expenses paid by the Plan on the Scholarship Fund's behalf.

Certain Plan investments are money market funds managed by Wells Fargo. Wells Fargo is the Trustee, as defined by the Plan, and therefore, these transactions qualify as party-in-interest transactions. These transactions have been denoted as such on the supplemental schedules of assets held at end of year and reportable transactions.

The transactions above qualify as party-in-interest transactions which are exempt from prohibited transactions rules of ERISA.

## **NOTE 8. FAIR VALUE MEASUREMENTS**

The framework for measuring fair value provides a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (Level 1) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (Level 3). The three levels of the fair value hierarchy are described as follows:

Basis of Fair Value Measurement:

Level 1 - Inputs to the valuation methodology are unadjusted quoted prices for identical assets or liabilities in active markets that the Plan has the ability to access.

Level 2 - Inputs to the valuation methodology include: quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities in active markets; quoted prices for identical or similar assets or liabilities in inactive markets; inputs other than quoted prices that are observable for the asset or liability; inputs that are derived principally from or corroborated by observable market data by correlation or other means.

**NOTE 8. FAIR VALUE MEASUREMENTS (continued)**

If the asset or liability has a specified (contractual) term, the level 2 input must be observable for substantially the full term of the asset or liability.

Level 3 - Inputs to the valuation methodology are unobservable and significant to the fair value measurement.

The asset's or liability's fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques maximize the use of relevant observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs.

The availability of observable market data is monitored to assess the appropriate classification of financial instruments within the fair value hierarchy. Changes in economic conditions or model-based valuation techniques may require the transfer of financial instruments from one fair value level to another. In such instances, the transfer is reported at the beginning of the reporting period.

For the years ended June 30, 2024 and 2023, there were no transfers in or out of levels 1, 2 or 3.

**NOTE 11. RISKS AND UNCERTAINTIES**

The Plan invests in various investments. Investments are exposed to various risks such as interest rate, market, sector and credit risks. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investments, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the values of investments will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect the amounts reported in the Statements of Net Assets Available for Benefits.

**NOTE 12. INSURED BENEFITS**

On June 14, 2013, the Article 1 Section 1(a) of the Trusts was revised to read: To pay or provide for the payment of unemployment benefits, life insurance, accidental death and dismemberment insurance, disability insurance, and other benefits of a similar nature for the sole and exclusive benefit of members of the Union upon whose behalf contributions have been made to the Trust Fund. The terms conditions and amounts of such payments, as well as a plan of benefits shall be established by the Trustees. The amendment shall be effective as of January 1, 2011.

The total insured benefit payments at June 30, 2024 and 2023 consisted of \$91,046 and \$101,044, respectively.

**NOTE 13. DELINQUENT PARTICIPANT ASSESSMENTS**

Certain contributing employers failed to timely remit participant assessment payments to the Plan totaling \$1,994 for the year ended June 30, 2024. The Plan actively pursues delinquent employers as part of its collection procedures. The Plan has assessed interest on the delinquent participant assessments and is in the process of collecting that interest from the applicable employers. In addition, the Plan has notified the employers that they may be liable for an excise tax on these delinquent amounts. These transactions are denoted in the supplementary schedule of delinquent participant contributions.

**NOTE 14. SUBSEQUENT EVENTS**

The Plan has evaluated subsequent events through April 2, 2025, the date the financial statements were available to be issued, and they have been evaluated in accordance with relevant accounting standards.
