Opinion

We have audited the accompanying financial statements of Northwest Carpenters Vacation Plan (the "Plan"), an employee benefit plan subject to the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 ("ERISA"), which comprise the statements of net assets available for benefits as of June 30, 2024 and December 31, 2023, and the related statement of changes in net assets available for benefits for the period ended June 30, 2024, and the related notes to the financial statements.

In our opinion, the financial statements referred to above present fairly, in all material respects, the net assets available for benefits of the Plan as of June 30, 2024 and December 31, 2023, and the changes in its net assets available for benefits for the period ended June 30, 2024, in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.

NOTE 1 - DESCRIPTION OF THE PLAN

The following description of the Northwest Carpenters Vacation Plan (the "Plan") is provided for general information purposes only. Participants should refer to the Plan document and amendments for more specific provisions (Note 7).

A. General

The Plan is a multiemployer collectively-bargained employee welfare plan established on January 1, 1972 to provide vacation benefits to eligible participants pursuant to applicable collective bargaining agreements between the Pacific Regional Council of Carpenters' signatory district councils and local unions in Western and Central Washington and contributing employers. The Plan is subject to provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974, as amended (ERISA) and provisions of the Internal Revenue Code (the "Code").

B. Administration and Expenses

The Board of Trustees (the "Board") is the Plan sponsor and plan administrator. The Board is comprised of both union and employer trustees who are bonded in accordance with the law. The Board of Trustees has the right under the Plan to modify benefits provided by the Plan.

Trustees serve without compensation from the Plan; they may be reimbursed for reasonable expenses incurred in performance of their duties as trustees. The Board established an administrative office to provide record keeping and administrative services to the Plan and other related pension and health and welfare plans maintained for union members. Costs of administering the Plan are paid by the Plan.

C. Contributions

Employees who are employed by an employer who is signatory to a collective bargaining agreement that calls for contributions to the Plan are eligible. Employers remit amounts withheld from eligible employees' after-tax pay at the rate of \$2 per hour in 2024 and 2023 as determined under collective bargaining.

D. Benefits

The Plan entered into an arrangement with Qualstar Credit Union ("Qualstar") whereby Qualstar maintains individual accounts for participants. Contributions received by the Plan are transferred to a Qualstar account in the participant's name. Benefits are available to the participant upon deposit into their account.

E. Forfeitures

If there are no deposits or withdrawals from a participant's account for 36 consecutive months and Qualstar is unable to locate the participant, the account is returned to the administrative office. If the administrative office is unable to locate the participant after 24 additional months the account is forfeited. Contributions from participants who fail to enroll in the Plan and who do not request their contributions to be returned to them will be forfeited after 60 consecutive months.

NOTE 2 - SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

A. Basis of Accounting

The Plan's financial statements have been prepared on the accrual basis of accounting.

B. Investment Valuation and Income Recognition

Investments are reported at fair value. Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date (Note 4).

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Investment income is reported on the accrual basis.

C. Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America requires Plan management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amount of assets and liabilities, and changes therein and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities. Actual results may differ from those estimates.

D. Tax-Exempt Status

The Trust established under the Plan to hold the Plan's assets is intended to qualify for tax-exempt status pursuant to Code Section 501(c)(9). The Board and Plan legal counsel believe the Plan is designed and operated in accordance with and qualifies under applicable requirements of the Code and the trust, which forms a part of the Plan, is exempt from federal income taxes.

Accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America require management to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan and recognize a tax liability if the Plan has taken a tax position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by a tax authority. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress.

NOTE 3 - PARTY-IN-INTEREST TRANSACTIONS

The Board established an administrative office in Seattle, Washington to maintain participant records and to carry out a majority of tasks associated with day-to-day administration of the Northwest Carpenters Trusts (NWCT) benefit plans including the Plan, the Northwest Carpenters Health and Security Plan (NWC Health Plan), the Northwest Carpenters Retirement Plan (NWC Pension Plan), and the Northwest Carpenters Individual Account Pension Plan (NWC IAP Plan).

The NWC Health Plan maintains a joint contribution bank account for receipt of employer contributions to NWCT benefit plans and related organizations and it maintains administrative and payroll bank accounts for funding the Plans' administrative costs. The administrative office allocates contributions among the trusts and makes bi-monthly transfers from the NWC Health Plan joint contribution account to other NWCT benefit plans. The Plan recorded a receivable of \$405,548 from the NWC Health Plan as of December 31, 2023.

NOTE 3 - PARTY-IN-INTEREST TRANSACTIONS (Continued)

NWCT joint administrative and overhead costs are allocated 65% to NWC Health Plan and 35% to NWC Pension Plan. The Plan reimbursed the NWC Health Plan and NWC Pension Plan a total of \$31,738 in 2024 for its share of joint administrative costs.

NOTE 4 - FAIR VALUE MEASUREMENTS

Accounting guidance on measuring fair value establishes a hierarchy that prioritizes valuation inputs into three levels based on the extent to which inputs used in measuring fair value are observable in the market. Under the fair value hierarchy Level 1 inputs are quoted prices for identical securities in an active market. Level 2 inputs are quoted prices for similar instruments and model-based valuation techniques for which all significant assumptions are observable in the market or can be corroborated by observable market data. Level 3 inputs are generally unobservable and typically reflect management's estimates of assumptions that market participants would use in pricing the asset or liability.

The Plan maintains a short term money market fund that is valued at the daily closing price reported by the fund. The fund is registered with the Securities and Exchange Commission and is required to publish its daily net asset value and to transact at that price (Level 1).

NOTE 5 - RISKS AND UNCERTAINTIES

The Plan invests in a short term money market fund. In general, investments are exposed to various risks, such as interest rate, market and credit risk. Due to the level of risk associated with investments, it is reasonably possible that changes in value of investments will occur in the near term and such changes could materially affect amounts reported in the financial statements.

NOTE 6 - PLAN TERMINATION

Upon termination of the Plan, any and all monies remaining in the Plan, after the payment of all expenses, shall be paid out of accordance with the Trust Agreement to the persons entitled thereto, until such monies have been exhausted. The Board of Trustees is authorized and empowered to withdraw or transfer or cause to be withdrawn or transferred all monies in the administrative account of the Plan or any portions of such monies, as in its absolute discretion it determines to be necessary or desirable to accomplish the purpose of the Plan.

NOTE 7 - PLAN MERGER

The Plan merged with the Southwest Carpenters Vacation Trust ("SW Carpenters") on June 30, 2024. Its remaining net assets available for benefits were transferred to SW Carpenters on June 30, 2024.

NOTE 8 - SUBSEQUENT EVENTS

Management has evaluated subsequent events through March 13, 2025, the date on which the financial statements were available to be issued. There were no material subsequent events that required recognition or additional disclosures in these financial statements.
