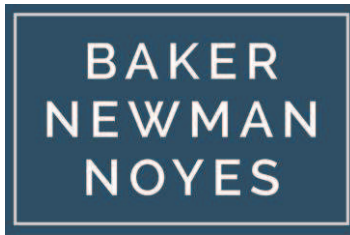

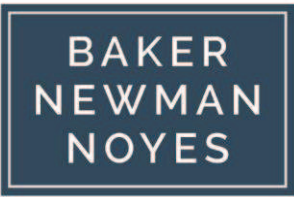

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INDEPENDENT AUDITORS' REPORT

To the Plan Trustees
Boston Children's Heart Foundation Retirement Plan

Scope and Nature of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) Audit

We have performed audits of the financial statements of Boston Children's Heart Foundation Retirement Plan (the Plan), an employee benefit plan subject to the *Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974* (ERISA), as permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) (ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit). The financial statements comprise the statements of net assets available for benefits as of September 30, 2024 and 2023, the related statements of changes in net assets available for benefits for the years then ended, and the related notes to the financial statements.

Management, having determined it is permissible in the circumstances, has elected to have the audits of the Plan's financial statements performed in accordance with ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) pursuant to 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor's (DOL) Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. As permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C), our audits need not extend to any statements or information related to assets held for investment of the Plan (investment information) by a bank or similar institution or insurance carrier that is regulated, supervised, and subject to periodic examination by a state or federal agency, provided that the statements or information regarding assets so held are prepared and certified to by the bank or similar institution or insurance carrier in accordance with 29 CFR 2520.103-5 of the DOL's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA (qualified institution).

Management has obtained certifications from a qualified institution as of and for the years ended September 30, 2024 and 2023 stating that the certified investment information, as described in Note 3 to the financial statements, is complete and accurate.

Opinion

In our opinion, based on our audits and on the procedures performed as described in the Auditors' Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements section:

- The amounts and disclosures in the accompanying financial statements, other than those agreed to or derived from the certified investment information, are presented fairly, in all material respects, in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America (U.S. GAAP).

- The information in the accompanying financial statements related to assets held by and certified to by a qualified institution agrees to, or is derived from, in all material respects, the information prepared and certified by an institution that management determined meet the requirements of ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C).

Basis for Opinion

We conducted our audits in accordance with auditing standards generally accepted in the United States of America (GAAS). Our responsibilities under those standards are further described in the Auditors' Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements section of our report. We are required to be independent of the Plan and to meet our other ethical responsibilities, in accordance with the relevant ethical requirements relating to our audits. We believe that the audit evidence we have obtained is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for our ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit opinion.

Responsibilities of Management for the Financial Statements

Management is responsible for the preparation and fair presentation of the financial statements in accordance with U.S. GAAP, and for the design, implementation, and maintenance of internal control relevant to the preparation and fair presentation of financial statements that are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error. Management's election of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit does not affect management's responsibility for the financial statements.

In preparing the financial statements, management is required to evaluate whether there are conditions or events, considered in the aggregate, that raise substantial doubt about the Plan's ability to continue as a going concern within one year after the date that the financial statements are issued or available to be issued.

Management is also responsible for maintaining a current plan instrument, including all plan amendments, administering the Plan, and determining that the Plan's transactions that are presented and disclosed in the financial statements are in conformity with the Plan's provisions, including maintaining sufficient records with respect to each of the participants, to determine the benefits due or which may become due to such participants.

Auditors' Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements

Except as described in the Scope and Nature of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) Audit section of our report, our objectives are to obtain reasonable assurance about whether the financial statements as a whole are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error, and to issue an auditors' report that includes our opinion. Reasonable assurance is a high level of assurance but is not absolute assurance and therefore is not a guarantee that an audit conducted in accordance with GAAS will always detect a material misstatement when it exists. Our audits did not extend to the certified investment information, except for obtaining and reading the certification, comparing the certified investment information with the related information presented and disclosed in the financial statements, and reading the disclosures relating to the certified investment information to assess whether they are in accordance with the presentation and disclosure requirements of U.S. GAAP.

Accordingly, the objective of an ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit is not to express an opinion about whether the financial statements as a whole are presented fairly, in all material respects, in accordance with U.S. GAAP.

We are required to communicate with those charged with governance regarding, among other matters, the planned scope and timing of the audit, significant audit findings, and certain internal control-related matters that we identified during the audit.

Other Matters - Supplemental Schedule Required by ERISA

The supplemental schedule of assets (held at end of year) as of September 30, 2024, is presented for purposes of additional analysis and is not a required part of the financial statements but is supplementary information required by the DOL's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. Such information is the responsibility of management and was derived from and relates directly to the underlying accounting and other records used to prepare the financial statements. The information included in the supplemental schedule, other than that agreed to or derived from the certified investment information, has been subjected to auditing procedures applied in the audit of the financial statements and certain additional procedures, including comparing and reconciling such information directly to the underlying accounting and other records used to prepare the financial statements or to the financial statements themselves, and other additional procedures in accordance with GAAS. For information included in the supplemental schedule that agreed to or is derived from the certified investment information, we compared such information to the related certified investment information.

1. Description of the Plan

The following brief description of the Boston Children's Heart Foundation Retirement Plan (the Plan) provides only general information. The Plan is subject to the provisions of the *Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974* (ERISA). Participants should refer to the Plan Agreement for a more complete description of the Plan's provisions.

General

The Plan is a noncontributory defined contribution plan which generally covers all employees of Boston Children's Heart Foundation (the Company) with retirement benefits in accordance with Section 401(a) of the Internal Revenue Code (IRC).

Eligibility

All employees of the Company who are over 21 years of age, other than those that are independent contractors, are eligible to participate in the Plan on their date of employment. Employees are eligible for employer contribution once they have completed 1,000 hours of service during the Plan year.

Participant Accounts

A separate account is established for each participant to which is credited the Company's contribution and an allocation of the Plan's earnings. Allocations are based on participant earnings or account balances as defined. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant's account. Each account is directed by the participant to be invested among fund investments established by the Company.

Participation

Employees are eligible to participate in the Plan on their date of employment. Employees are eligible for the employer contribution if they are physician-employees with an original date of hire after September 30, 2008 and have completed 1,000 hours of service during the Plan year.

Vesting

Participants are immediately 100% vested in contributions and actual earnings thereon.

Distribution of Benefits

Participants are entitled to a distribution of their vested benefits upon retirement, death, disability or upon termination. The Plan also allows for in-service distributions once employees reach the age of 62. The payment of a participant's account may be made in a single lump sum payment or installment. Distributions may be made prior to age 62, however, such amounts are subject to early withdrawal penalties.

2. Summary of Significant Accounting Policies

Basis of Presentation

The accompanying financial statements have been prepared on the accrual basis of accounting.

Use of Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America requires the Plan Administrator to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts in the financial statements, accompanying notes and supplemental schedule. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

Investment Valuation and Income Recognition

The Plan's investments consist of money market funds, mutual funds, pooled separate accounts, and Teachers Insurance and Annuity Association (TIAA) group annuity contracts. Money market funds, mutual funds and the pooled separate accounts are stated at fair value. Group annuity contracts have been determined to be nonfully benefit responsive and are stated at fair value. The pooled separate accounts' fair value is based upon the net asset value of shares, which is based on the fair value of the fund's net assets and the number of outstanding shares. See Note 4 for further disclosure on fair value measurements.

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest is recorded on the accrual basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Net appreciation includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold, as well as held, during the year.

Notes Receivable From Participants

Notes are permissible in accordance with the Plan document. The maximum amount a participant may borrow from the Plan is limited to the lesser of (1) \$50,000 reduced by the excess of the highest outstanding balance of notes during the one year period ending the day before the note is made, over the outstanding balance of notes from the Plan on the date the note is made or (2) one-half the present value of the vested account balance of the participant or, if greater and so provided by the Plan Administrator, the total vested account balance up to \$10,000; provided that additional security is given to the extent such note exceeds 50% of the vested account balance. Repayment terms require that repayment be amortized in level payments, not less frequently than quarterly, over a period not extending beyond five years. A note's term may extend beyond five years if it is used to purchase a primary residence.

The notes are secured by no more than 50% of the vested portion of the participant's account.

Notes receivable are measured at their unpaid principal balance plus any accrued but unpaid interest.

Administrative Expenses

The Company may, at its discretion, pay the expenses incidental to administering the Plan. In the event that the Company does not pay the Plan expenses, the expenses shall be paid by the Plan.

Plan Termination

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the Board of Directors of the Company may, at its discretion, terminate the Plan at any time, subject to the provisions set forth in ERISA. Upon termination of the Plan, the custodian, once notified by the Company of the termination date, will distribute to each participant their account balance on that date in accordance with the terms of the Plan.

Risks and Uncertainties

The Plan provides for various investment options in accounts which invest in investment securities. Investment securities are exposed to various risks such as interest rate, market and credit. Market risks include global events which could impact the value of investment securities, such as pandemics or international conflict. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities and the level of uncertainty related to changes in the value of investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that these changes would, in the near term, materially affect participants' account balances and the amounts reported in the statements of net assets available for benefits and the statement of changes in net assets available for benefits.

Benefit Payments

Benefits are recorded when paid.

Contributions

For the years ended September 30, 2024 and 2023, eligible participants were allocated, as approved by the Board of Directors, an amount up to 20.6% and 13.6%, respectively, of their eligible compensation earned during the Plan year, subject to certain limitations. Contributions based on wages are accrued at year end, then contributed and allocated to the participant's account in accordance with the Plan document in the following year. Rollover contributions are permitted under the Plan, subject to the approval of the Plan Administrator and the appropriate sections of the IRC.

Subsequent Events

Events occurring after the statement of net assets available for benefits date are evaluated by the Plan Administrator to determine whether such events should be recognized or disclosed in the financial statements. The Plan Administrator has evaluated subsequent events through March 31, 2025, the date the financial statements were available to be issued.

3. Information Certified by Custodian

All Plan asset information disclosed in the accompanying financial statements and supplemental schedule, including investments held at September 30, 2024 and 2023, notes receivable from participants, related income and transactions, net appreciation in fair value of investments and interest and dividends for the years then ended was obtained or derived from information provided to the Plan Administrator and certified as complete and accurate by Teachers Insurance and Annuity Association of America and College Retirement Equities Fund (TIAA-CREF), the custodian of the Plan. Accordingly, as permitted under 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor's (DOL) Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA, the Plan Administrator instructed the Plan's independent auditors not to perform any auditing procedures with respect to the information certified by the custodian, except for comparing such information certified by the custodian to information included in the Plan's financial statements and supplemental schedule.

4. Investments and Fair Value Measurements

Fair value is the price that would be received upon sale of an asset or paid upon transfer of a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date and in the principal or most advantageous market for that asset or liability. The fair value should be calculated based on assumptions that market participants would use in pricing the asset or liability, not on assumptions specific to the entity.

The fair value hierarchy for valuation inputs prioritizes the inputs into three levels based on the extent to which inputs used in measuring fair value are observable in the market. Each fair value measurement is reported in one of the three levels which is determined by the lowest level input that is significant to the fair value measurement in its entirety. These levels are:

Level 1 – Inputs to the valuation methodology are unadjusted quoted prices for identical assets and liabilities in active markets that the Plan has the ability to access.

Level 2 – Inputs to the valuation method include:

- Quoted prices for similar assets and liabilities in active markets;
- Quoted prices for identical or similar assets or liabilities in inactive markets;
- Inputs other than quoted prices that are observable for the asset or liability; and
- Inputs that are derived principally from or corroborated by observable market data by correlation or other means.

Level 3 – Inputs to the valuation methodology are unobservable and significant to the fair value measurement.

The level in the fair value hierarchy within which the fair value measurement is classified is determined based on the lowest level input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques used need to maximize the use of observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs.

There have been no changes in the methodologies used at September 30, 2024 and 2023.

Following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for assets measured at fair value:

Money market funds: Valued at the closing price reported by the fund sponsor from an actively traded exchange.

Mutual funds: Valued at the daily closing price as reported by the fund. Mutual funds held by the Plan are open-end mutual funds that are registered with the Securities and Exchange Commission. These funds are required to publish their daily net asset value and to transact at that price. The mutual funds held by the Plan are deemed to be actively traded.

Group annuity contract: The group annuity contract is reported at fair value, which approximates contract value. As this contract is contract-based, observable prices for identical or similar investments do not exist and, accordingly, this investment is valued using unobservable inputs. The contract value equals the accumulated cash contributions and interest credited to the contract, less any withdrawals.

Pooled separate account: Valued based upon the net asset value of shares held by the Plan at year end, as determined by the account manager, based upon quoted market prices of the underlying investments and external appraisals of real estate holdings.

The methods described above may produce a fair value calculation that may not be indicative of net realizable value or reflective of future fair values. Furthermore, while the Plan believes its valuation methods are appropriate and consistent with other market participants, the use of different methodologies or assumptions to determine the fair value of certain financial instruments could result in a different fair value measurement at the reporting date.

In accordance with Accounting Standards Update 2015-07, certain investments that are measured at fair value using the net asset value per share (or its equivalent) practical expedient have not been classified in the fair value hierarchy. Therefore, there is no hierarchy required for the pooled separate account held by the Plan totaling \$1,369,981 and \$1,904,806 at September 30, 2024 and 2023, respectively.

There are no unfunded commitments associated with the pooled separate account. Redemption is allowed on a daily basis with these investments.

The Plan obtained an opinion letter as a qualified plan from the Internal Revenue Service (IRS) on June 30, 2020, and, as such, is exempt from federal income taxes. The Plan has been amended since the most recent ruling and management believes the Plan continues to meet IRS requirements. The Plan Administrator believes that the Plan is designed and is currently being operated in compliance with the applicable requirements of the IRC.

5. Income Tax Status (continued)

Accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America require Plan management to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan and recognize a tax liability (or asset) if the Plan has taken an uncertain position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination. Management has evaluated the Plan's tax positions and concluded that the Plan had maintained its tax-exempt status and had taken no uncertain tax positions that require adjustment to the financial statements. Therefore, no provision or liability for income taxes has been included in the financial statements.

6. Transactions With Party-in-Interest

Certain plan investments are shares of mutual funds, nonbenefit responsive contracts and pooled separate accounts managed by TIAA-CREF. TIAA-CREF is the custodian, as defined by the Plan and, therefore, these transactions qualify as party-in-interest transactions that are exempt from the prohibited transaction rules, as defined by ERISA. The Plan also pays various service providers for fees associated with investment management and administrative services to the Plan. These transactions also qualify as party-in-interest transactions.

Notes receivable from participants also qualify as party-in-interest transactions, which are exempt from the prohibited transaction rules of ERISA.

7. Reconciliation of Financial Statements to Form 5500

Notes receivable from participants are reflected as a receivable on the financial statements which is different from the Form 5500 presentation. On the Form 5500, notes receivable are classified as investments under the caption "participant loans."
