1. DESCRIPTION OF THE FUND

General

The National Hockey League Health Fund (the “Fund”) was established July 1, 2002, to serve as a contributory funding medium for certain benefits provided by the National Hockey League (the “Sponsor”) under the National Hockey League Health Fund. The Fund provides health, dental and vision benefits to Fund participants and eligible dependents. Information on eligibility requirements and benefit levels can be found in the Summary Plan Description. The Fund is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act (“ERISA”) of 1974. The Fund commenced providing benefits to participants on July 1, 2003.

Benefits

The Fund covers the Sponsor’s active and certain retired U.S. League staff, on-ice officials, and certain team employees both active and retired, together with their dependents for all reasonable and customary medical expenses. There is no overall limit to the benefits which may be claimed under this Fund.

The dental plan covers the Sponsor’s U.S. League staff, past and present officials, and certain team employees, together with their dependents, for all eligible dental expenses that are not related to occupational injury or disease.

Insurance Coverage

The Fund purchased a Cigna health reinsurance program, known as Cash Management Program, which is an experience rated contract with the health insurance provider (“Provider”). The Cash Management Program provides the Fund with certain cash flow advantages in funding the obligations arising from the Fund’s group insurance account. Under the terms of the Cigna Cash Management Program, the Provider is responsible for any run out claims, claims incurred but not reported and related expenses. The Cash Management Program includes a built-in experience protection benefit which is designed to limit the Fund’s exposure to paying benefits on a monthly and annual aggregate basis. In 2024 and 2023, the Fund received refunds from the Cash Management Program totaling \$2,597,839 and \$1,972,765, respectively, realized as a reduction of benefits paid.

Effective January 1, 2017, the Fund moved all Canadian participants into a Cigna Global policy managed by Cigna Life Insurance Company of Canada. The Cigna Global plan is a stand-alone, fully-insured global health plan.

Effective January 1, 2017, the Fund implemented a stand-alone, fully-insured vision plan with a benefit provider, Eyemed. The plan is underwritten by Fidelity Security Life Insurance Company and has the same eligibility as the medical and dental plans.

2. SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of Accounting

The accompanying financial statements have been prepared on the accrual basis of accounting, in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.

Use of Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America requires the Fund’s management to make estimates and assumptions which affect the reported amounts of assets, liabilities and benefit obligations, and the disclosures of contingencies, if any, at the date of the financial statements and changes therein during the reporting period. Actual results may differ from those estimates.

Cash Equivalents

All highly liquid investments with maturities of three months or less when purchased are considered cash equivalents.

Funds Withheld

In accordance with the terms of the Supplemental Premium Agreement with Cigna, the Provider withholds a portion of the contributions due to the Fund. These funds are withheld to secure the payment of major medical and dental benefits. If the Fund were to terminate, any unused portion of the funds withheld would be returned to the Fund following the period of processing run-out claims.

Contributions Receivable

Employer and participant contributions are accrued based upon an analysis of remittance reports and subsequent cash receipts and are recognized as revenue in the time period in which they are earned. The carrying amount of contributions receivable is reduced by an allowance for credit losses including past collection experience, industry standards, current economic conditions, and expected future economic conditions. The allowance was set as \$0 as of July 1, 2023, and June 30, 2024.

Recognition of Benefits

Benefits are recognized when paid.

Accounting Principles Adopted

Credit Losses

In June 2016, the Financial Accounting Standards Board (FASB) issued an Accounting Standards Update (ASU) Update 2016-13, *Financial Instruments – Credit Losses* (Topic 326) amending the accounting for credit losses on financial statements. This methodology replaced the incurred loss methodology with expected credit losses using a wide range of reasonable and supportable information. The amendment affects loans, debt securities, trade receivables, net investments in leases, off-balance-sheet credit exposure and other financial instruments recorded at amortized cost. The Plan adopted the new standard effective July 1, 2023, using the modified retrospective approach. Upon adoption, there was no cumulative effect adjustment to the opening balance of net assets.

Claims Administration

Claims administration fees are recognized on a pro-rata basis over the applicable policy period. Any amounts remaining unpaid at the period end are accrued in the period they are incurred.

Subsequent Events

In preparing these financial statements, management of the Fund has evaluated events and transactions that occurred after June 30, 2024 for potential recognition or disclosure in the financial statements. These events and transactions were evaluated through March 27, 2025, the date that the financial statements were available to be issued and no items have come to the attention of management that require recognition or disclosure.

3. BENEFIT OBLIGATIONS

Benefits payable represent amounts reported at year-end, which have not yet been paid from the net assets of the Fund. There were no changes in the assumptions used to calculate benefits payable from the prior year.

4. TAX STATUS

The Internal Revenue Service ("IRS") has determined and informed the Sponsor by a letter dated October 22, 2004, that the Fund's Trust Agreement, as then designed, was in accordance with applicable sections of the Internal Revenue Code ("IRC") and that the trust was exempt from federal income taxation under Section 501(a) of the IRC, as described at Section 501(c)(9). The Fund has been amended since receiving the letter, however, the Sponsor believes that the trust is designed and is currently being operated in compliance with the applicable provisions of the IRC and the trust remains exempt from federal income tax.

Accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America require management of the Fund to evaluate tax positions taken and recognize a tax liability if the trust has taken an uncertain position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by the IRS. Management has evaluated the tax positions taken by the trust and concluded that as of June 30, 2024 and 2023 there are no uncertain positions taken or expected to be taken that would require recognition in the financial statements. The Fund is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits in progress for any tax periods. In addition, there have been no tax related interest or penalties for periods presented in these financial statements.

5. FUND TERMINATION

Although, it has not expressed any intention to do so, the Sponsor has the right under the Fund to modify the benefits provided to active participants, to discontinue its contributions at any time, and to terminate the Fund subject to the provisions set forth in ERISA. If the Sponsor terminates or partially terminates the Fund, it will pay the benefits that the participants are entitled to receive under the terms of the Fund.

6. RISKS AND UNCERTAINTIES

The Fund maintains cash accounts at a high-quality financial institution located in the United States of America. While the Fund attempts to limit any financial exposure, its deposit balances may, at times, exceed federally insured limits. A collection loss associated with the financial institution could have a significant adverse effect on the net assets and changes in net assets of the Fund.

1. DESCRIPTION OF THE FUND

General

The National Hockey League Health Fund (the “Fund”) was established July 1, 2002, to serve as a contributory funding medium for certain benefits provided by the National Hockey League (the “Sponsor”) under the National Hockey League Health Fund. The Fund provides health, dental and vision benefits to Fund participants and eligible dependents. Information on eligibility requirements and benefit levels can be found in the Summary Plan Description. The Fund is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act (“ERISA”) of 1974. The Fund commenced providing benefits to participants on July 1, 2003.

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The Fund covers the Sponsor’s active and certain retired U.S. League staff, on-ice officials, and certain team employees both active and retired, together with their dependents for all reasonable and customary medical expenses. There is no overall limit to the benefits which may be claimed under this Fund.

The dental plan covers the Sponsor’s U.S. League staff, past and present officials, and certain team employees, together with their dependents, for all eligible dental expenses that are not related to occupational injury or disease.

Insurance Coverage

The Fund purchased a Cigna health reinsurance program, known as Cash Management Program, which is an experience rated contract with the health insurance provider (“Provider”). The Cash Management Program provides the Fund with certain cash flow advantages in funding the obligations arising from the Fund’s group insurance account. Under the terms of the Cigna Cash Management Program, the Provider is responsible for any run out claims, claims incurred but not reported and related expenses. The Cash Management Program includes a built-in experience protection benefit which is designed to limit the Fund’s exposure to paying benefits on a monthly and annual aggregate basis. In 2024 and 2023, the Fund received refunds from the Cash Management Program totaling \$2,597,839 and \$1,972,765, respectively, realized as a reduction of benefits paid.

Effective January 1, 2017, the Fund moved all Canadian participants into a Cigna Global policy managed by Cigna Life Insurance Company of Canada. The Cigna Global plan is a stand-alone, fully-insured global health plan.

Effective January 1, 2017, the Fund implemented a stand-alone, fully-insured vision plan with a benefit provider, Eyemed. The plan is underwritten by Fidelity Security Life Insurance Company and has the same eligibility as the medical and dental plans.

2. SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of Accounting

The accompanying financial statements have been prepared on the accrual basis of accounting, in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.

Use of Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America requires the Fund’s management to make estimates and assumptions which affect the reported amounts of assets, liabilities and benefit obligations, and the disclosures of contingencies, if any, at the date of the financial statements and changes therein during the reporting period. Actual results may differ from those estimates.

Cash Equivalents

All highly liquid investments with maturities of three months or less when purchased are considered cash equivalents.

Funds Withheld

In accordance with the terms of the Supplemental Premium Agreement with Cigna, the Provider withholds a portion of the contributions due to the Fund. These funds are withheld to secure the payment of major medical and dental benefits. If the Fund were to terminate, any unused portion of the funds withheld would be returned to the Fund following the period of processing run-out claims.

Contributions Receivable

Employer and participant contributions are accrued based upon an analysis of remittance reports and subsequent cash receipts and are recognized as revenue in the time period in which they are earned. The carrying amount of contributions receivable is reduced by an allowance for credit losses including past collection experience, industry standards, current economic conditions, and expected future economic conditions. The allowance was set as \$0 as of July 1, 2023, and June 30, 2024.

Recognition of Benefits

Benefits are recognized when paid.

Accounting Principles Adopted

Credit Losses

In June 2016, the Financial Accounting Standards Board (FASB) issued an Accounting Standards Update (ASU) Update 2016-13, *Financial Instruments – Credit Losses* (Topic 326) amending the accounting for credit losses on financial statements. This methodology replaced the incurred loss methodology with expected credit losses using a wide range of reasonable and supportable information. The amendment affects loans, debt securities, trade receivables, net investments in leases, off-balance-sheet credit exposure and other financial instruments recorded at amortized cost. The Plan adopted the new standard effective July 1, 2023, using the modified retrospective approach. Upon adoption, there was no cumulative effect adjustment to the opening balance of net assets.

Claims Administration

Claims administration fees are recognized on a pro-rata basis over the applicable policy period. Any amounts remaining unpaid at the period end are accrued in the period they are incurred.

Subsequent Events

In preparing these financial statements, management of the Fund has evaluated events and transactions that occurred after June 30, 2024 for potential recognition or disclosure in the financial statements. These events and transactions were evaluated through March 27, 2025, the date that the financial statements were available to be issued and no items have come to the attention of management that require recognition or disclosure.

3. BENEFIT OBLIGATIONS

Benefits payable represent amounts reported at year-end, which have not yet been paid from the net assets of the Fund. There were no changes in the assumptions used to calculate benefits payable from the prior year.

4. TAX STATUS

The Internal Revenue Service ("IRS") has determined and informed the Sponsor by a letter dated October 22, 2004, that the Fund's Trust Agreement, as then designed, was in accordance with applicable sections of the Internal Revenue Code ("IRC") and that the trust was exempt from federal income taxation under Section 501(a) of the IRC, as described at Section 501(c)(9). The Fund has been amended since receiving the letter, however, the Sponsor believes that the trust is designed and is currently being operated in compliance with the applicable provisions of the IRC and the trust remains exempt from federal income tax.

Accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America require management of the Fund to evaluate tax positions taken and recognize a tax liability if the trust has taken an uncertain position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by the IRS. Management has evaluated the tax positions taken by the trust and concluded that as of June 30, 2024 and 2023 there are no uncertain positions taken or expected to be taken that would require recognition in the financial statements. The Fund is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits in progress for any tax periods. In addition, there have been no tax related interest or penalties for periods presented in these financial statements.

5. FUND TERMINATION

Although, it has not expressed any intention to do so, the Sponsor has the right under the Fund to modify the benefits provided to active participants, to discontinue its contributions at any time, and to terminate the Fund subject to the provisions set forth in ERISA. If the Sponsor terminates or partially terminates the Fund, it will pay the benefits that the participants are entitled to receive under the terms of the Fund.

6. RISKS AND UNCERTAINTIES

The Fund maintains cash accounts at a high-quality financial institution located in the United States of America. While the Fund attempts to limit any financial exposure, its deposit balances may, at times, exceed federally insured limits. A collection loss associated with the financial institution could have a significant adverse effect on the net assets and changes in net assets of the Fund.
