Note 1 - Description of the Plan

The following brief description of the St. Mark's School Retirement Savings Plan (the Plan) is provided for general information purposes only. Participants should refer to the plan agreement for a more complete description of the Plan's provisions.

General - The Plan, established on November 1, 1927, is a defined contribution plan subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA). Employees of St. Mark's School of Southborough, Inc. (the School), except student employees and employees who normally work less than twenty hours a week, are eligible to participate in the Plan on the first day of employment with the School. The School is the plan sponsor and the plan administrator. Charles Schwab Trust Bank ("Charles Schwab"), TIAA, Trust, N.A ("TIAA Trust") and Fidelity Management Trust Company ("Fidelity") are the custodians of the Plan. USI Consulting Group, Teachers Insurance and Annuity Association (TIAA) and College Retirement Equities Fund (CREF), insurance carriers, are the third-party administrators who maintain individual participant account records and advise the Plan on other matters related to the operations of the Plan.

Contributions - Participants may elect to defer a portion of their eligible compensation as contributions to the Plan up to the maximum permitted by the Internal Revenue Code. Participants who have attained age 50 before the end of the plan year are eligible to make catch-up contributions. Participants may also make rollover contributions representing distributions from other qualified plans. Each year, the School makes non-discretionary contributions to the Plan. To be eligible for the non-discretionary contributions, the employees must have completed one year of service (1,000 hours of service) and have attained the age of 18. Contributions are subject to certain limitations and eligibility requirements apply to such contributions. For the year ended June 30, 2024, the School made contributions totaling \$1,334,171. The School's non-discretionary contributions are equal to 10% to 13% of the participant's eligible compensation. The contribution percentage is based on the participant's years of service as follows.

<u>Years of Service</u>	<u>Contribution Percentage</u>
Less than or equal to 10 years	10%
Greater than 10 years but less than or equal to 15 years	11%
Greater than 15 years but less than or equal to 20 years	12%
Greater than 20 years	13%

Participant Accounts - Each participant account is credited with (a) the participant's elective deferral contributions, (b) employer non-discretionary contributions, (c) earnings, and (d) expenses. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant's vested account.

Vesting - Participants are immediately fully vested in their elective deferral contributions, the School's contributions, and actual earnings thereon.

Investment Options - Upon enrollment in the Plan, and at any time during the plan year, participants may direct the investment of their elective deferral contributions, as well as the School's contributions, into various mutual funds, a pooled separate account, variable annuity accounts, a guaranteed income fund and investment and annuity contracts offered by the Plan. Participants may reallocate their funds or redirect new contributions on a daily basis among any of the offered funds.

Note 1 - Description of the Plan (Continued)

Notes Receivable from Participants - Notes receivable from participants are issued by Charles Schwab. Participants may borrow from their accounts a minimum of \$1,000 up to the lesser of \$50,000 or 50% of their vested account balance. The notes are secured by the balance in the participant's account and bear interest at the Prime rate plus 1%. Principal and interest are paid ratably through payroll deductions. Generally, notes must be repaid within five years unless being used to purchase a primary residence. Participants may have only one note outstanding at a time. No allowance for credit losses has been recorded as of June 30, 2024 and 2023.

Payment of Benefits - Upon termination of service, retirement, disability or death, participants or beneficiaries are entitled to a distribution equal to the total value of the participant's vested account. A participant or beneficiary may elect to receive the value of the vested account in a lump-sum cash payment, installments, or an annuity option that is available under the applicable funding vehicle. Annuities are purchased through TIAA and CREF. Such annuities are fully guaranteed by TIAA and CREF and therefore, excluded from plan assets. Terminated participant account balances less than \$5,000 can be automatically distributed by the plan administrator without the participant's consent if the participant does not elect to have such distribution paid directly to an eligible retirement plan specified by the participant in a direct rollover or to receive the distribution directly.

Participants may withdraw from their deferral accounts upon certain hardship situations defined in the Plan. Participants may withdraw from all vested accounts upon attainment of age 59-1/2. Participants are limited to two in-service withdrawals in a plan year.

Plan Amendment and Termination - The Plan may be amended at any time by the Board of Directors, provided that no such amendment may deprive participants of their vested benefits. Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the plan sponsor has the right under the Plan to discontinue its contributions at any time and to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions of ERISA. In the event of plan termination, all participants will remain 100% vested in their accounts.

Administrative Expenses - Generally, the Plan Sponsor pays administrative expenses relating to the Plan except for management fees and operating expenses which are borne by the participants. Administrative expenses paid by participants amounted to \$42,633 for the year ended June 30, 2024.

Management fees and certain operating expenses charged to the Plan for investments are deducted from income earned daily and are not separately reflected. Accordingly, management fees and operating expenses are reflected as a reduction of net appreciation in the fair value of investments. Management fees and operating expenses amounted to \$68,412 for the year ended June 30, 2024. Certain operating expenses, participant distribution fees, participant loan fees, and investment and recordkeeping fees, are separately reflected and paid by the participants directly.

Unallocated Account - The Plan receives an expense reimbursement credit from Charles Schwab each year in which the funds are included in an unallocated account. At June 30, 2024 and 2023, the Plan had unallocated amounts of \$15,075 and \$15,966, respectively. These funds can be used to reduce plan expenses related to the administration of the Plan or to reduce future employer contributions. The unallocated account is invested in the Pioneer US Government Money Market Fund. For the year ended June 30, 2024, \$16,092 from the unallocated account was used to reduce employer contributions.

Note 2 - Summary of Significant Accounting Policies

Basis of Accounting - The financial statements of the Plan are prepared under the accrual method of accounting in conformity with U.S. generally accepted accounting principles.

Estimates - The preparation of financial statements in conformity with U.S. generally accepted accounting principles requires the plan administrator to make estimates and assumptions that affect certain reported amounts of assets, liabilities, and changes therein and disclosures of contingent assets and liabilities at the date of the financial statements and the reported amounts of revenues and expenses during the reporting period. Actual results may differ from those estimates.

Investment Valuation and Income Recognition - Investments are reported at fair value in these financial statements, except for the fully benefit responsive investment contract, which is reported at contract value. Fair value is measured in accordance with U.S. generally accepted accounting principles as more fully described in Note 4. Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Net appreciation/depreciation includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold as well as held during the year.

The Plan has fully benefit responsive and non-benefit responsive investment contracts with TIAA. Non-benefit responsive contracts are recorded at fair value due to the restrictions on withdrawals from the contract.

Fully benefit responsive contracts held by a defined-contribution plan are reported at contract value. Contract value is the relevant measurement attribute for that portion of the net assets available for benefits of a defined-contribution plan attributable to fully benefit responsive investment contracts because contract value is the amount participants would receive if they were to initiate permitted transactions under the terms of the plan.

Unit Values - Individual participant accounts for the pooled separate account are maintained on a unit value basis. Participants do not have beneficial ownership in the specific underlying securities or other assets in the trust but do have an interest therein represented by units which are valued daily. The trust earns interest which is automatically reinvested in additional units. Generally, contributions to and withdrawals from the trust are converted to units by dividing the amount of such transactions by the unit values as last determined and the participants' accounts are charged or credited with the number of units properly attributable to each participant.

Notes Receivable from Participants - Notes receivable from participants are measured at their unpaid principal balance plus any accrued but unpaid interest. The notes are secured by the balance in the participant's account. Delinquent notes receivable are reclassified as distributions in accordance with the terms of the plan document.

Payment of Benefits - Benefits are recorded when paid.

Subsequent Events - The date to which events occurring after June 30, 2024 have been evaluated for possible adjustment to the financial statements or disclosure is the date of the Independent Auditor's Report which is the date the financial statements were available to be issued.

Note 3 - Certified Information

Certain information related to investments disclosed in the accompanying financial statements and ERISA-required supplemental schedule, including investments, at fair value, and fully benefit responsive investment contracts, at contract value, at June 30, 2024 and 2023, realized and unrealized appreciation in fair value of investments, interest and dividend income for the year ended June 30, 2024, was obtained by management and agreed to or derived from information certified as complete and accurate by TIAA and CREF (the insurance carriers of the Plan), Charles Schwab Trust Bank, and Fidelity Management Trust Company (the custodians of the Plan).

Note 4 - Fair Value Measurements

Fair value is defined under U.S. generally accepted accounting principles as the exchange price that would be received for an asset or paid to transfer a liability (an exit price) in the principal or most advantageous market for the asset or liability in an orderly transaction between market participants on the measurement date. The Plan is required to maximize the use of observable inputs, minimize the use of unobservable inputs, and disclose in the form of an outlined hierarchy the details of such fair value measurements. The hierarchy of valuation techniques is based on whether the inputs to fair value measurements are considered to be observable or unobservable in a marketplace. Observable inputs reflect market data obtained from independent sources, while unobservable inputs reflect the Plan's market assumptions. The hierarchy requires the use of observable market data when available. These inputs have created the following fair value hierarchy:

Level 1 - Quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities.

Level 2 - Observable inputs other than those included in Level 1. For example, quoted prices for similar assets in active markets or quoted prices for identical assets in inactive markets.

Level 3 - Unobservable inputs reflecting management's own assumptions about the inputs used in estimating the value of the assets.

Following is a description of the Plan's valuation methodologies for assets measured at fair value. There have been no changes in the methodologies used at June 30, 2024 and 2023.

Mutual Funds

These investments are public investment vehicles valued using the Net Asset Value ("NAV") provided by the administrator of the fund and calculated at the close of business on the NYSE. The NAV is based on the value of the underlying assets owned by the fund, minus its liabilities, and then divided by the number of shares outstanding. Investments in mutual funds are classified within Level 1 of the valuation hierarchy.

Variable Annuity Accounts

The eight CREF investment options are registered investment companies which invest principally in equity securities, fixed-income instruments, and short-term investments in accordance with each portfolio's investment objectives. The fair values of accumulation units held by the Plan in CREF variable annuity contracts are based on each account's daily Net Asset Value ("NAV") as reported on NASDAQ or on the issuers' website. Investments in CREF variable annuities are classified within Level 1 of the valuation hierarchy. There is a lock up period of 90 days if a purchase, sale and repurchase within that account is made within a 60-day period, other than for the CREF money market account.

Pooled Separate Account

The participants units held in pooled separate account, TIAA Real Estate, are based on their net asset values, as reported on NASDAQ. The value is principally derived from the market value of the underlying real estate holdings or other real estate-related investments. Investments in TIAA Real Estate are classified within level 1 of the valuation hierarchy. Transfers out of the TIAA Real Estate account are limited to one per calendar quarter.

Investment and Annuity Contracts

The TIAA Traditional Annuity - Non-Benefit Responsive is a fixed annuity contract fully and unconditionally guaranteed by TIAA. This Traditional Annuity is offered through a Retirement Annuities (RA) contract and is a non-benefit responsive contract reported at fair value which approximates contract value according to TIAA. Investments in the TIAA Traditional Annuity - Non-Benefit Responsive are classified within Level 3 of the valuation hierarchy.

Note 5 - Fully Benefit Responsive Investment Contracts

The Plan has investments in the TIAA Traditional Supplemental Retirement Annuities (“SRA”) and Group Supplemental Retirement Annuity (“GSRA”) which are fully benefit responsive investment contracts. These investments are guaranteed annuity accounts backed by the claims-paying ability of TIAA. They guarantee the principal and contractually specified minimum interest rate, plus the opportunity for additional amounts in excess of the guaranteed rate. The additional amounts are declared on a year-by-year basis by the TIAA Board of Trustees. TIAA maintains the contributions in a general account. The account is credited with earnings on the underlying investments and charged for participant withdrawals and administrative expenses. The guaranteed investment contract issuer is contractually obligated to repay the principal and a specified interest rate that is guaranteed to the Plan. There are no reserves against contract value for credit risk of the contract issuer or otherwise.

The crediting interest rate is based on the net investment earnings rate of certain TIAA assets, accounting for targets for expenses, risks, and contract liquidity. Such interest rates are reviewed monthly for funds deposited during the year and then set at year end for each vintage.

Certain conditions may limit the ability of the Plan to transact at contract value with TIAA. Such circumstances include but are not limited to market value adjustments, surrender charges, plan termination, plan merger and certain other employer-initiated events. The Plan administrator does not believe that the occurrence of such events that would limit the Plan’s ability to transact at contract value with Plan participants is probable. The contract does not permit the insurance company to terminate the agreement prior to the scheduled maturity date. Because the SRA and GSRA contracts are fully benefit responsive, contract value is the relevant measurement attribute for that portion of the net assets available for benefits. Participants may ordinarily direct the withdrawal or transfer of all or a portion of their investment at contract value. The guaranteed interest rate is 3% for the Plan years ended June 30, 2024 and 2023. Investment in TIAA Traditional fully benefit responsive investment contracts amounted to \$1,033,711 and \$1,134,403 at June 30, 2024 and 2023, respectively.

Note 6 - Guaranteed Income Fund

The Plan has a benefit responsive investment contract with Prudential Retirement Insurance and Annuity Company ("PRIAC"). Amounts contributed to this contract are deposited in PRIAC's general account. Payment obligations and the fulfillment of any guaranteed specific in the group annuity contract are insurance claims supported by the full faith and credit of PRIAC. This guaranteed income fund is considered an evergreen group annuity contract with no maturity date. There are not any events that allow the issuer to terminate the contract, and which require the plan sponsor to settle at an amount different than contract value. There are no reserve against contract value for credit risk of the contract issuer or otherwise. The value of the guaranteed income fund at June 30, 2024 and 2023 was \$226,277 and \$235,397, respectively.

Note 7 - Notes Receivable from Participants

As of June 30, 2024, notes receivable from participants bear interest at rates ranging from 4.25% to 9.50%, with maturity dates ranging through October 2028. As of June 30, 2023, notes receivable from participants bear interest at rates ranging from 4.25% to 9.00%, with maturity dates ranging through April 2028.

Note 8 - Risks and Uncertainties

The Plan invests in various investment securities. Investment securities are exposed to various risks, such as interest rate, market, and credit risks. Market risks include global events which could impact the value of investment securities, such as a pandemic or international conflict. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in values of investment securities will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect participants' account balances and the amounts reported in the statements of net assets available for benefits.

Note 9 - Related Party Transaction

Certain plan investments including a pooled separate account, variable annuity accounts, investment and annuity contracts, mutual funds, and a guaranteed income fund are managed by TIAA and CREF, the insurance carriers and record-keeper of the Plan, and a mutual fund is managed by Fidelity Management Trust Company, a custodian of the Plan. Accordingly, certain transactions qualify as party-in-interest transactions. During the plan year ended June 30, 2024, fees from notes receivable from participants, maintenance fees, and other administrative expenses totaling \$42,633 were charged to participant accounts and paid to the Plan's custodians and recordkeepers. Investment management services and record keeping fees of \$68,412 have been paid to TIAA and CREF and recorded as a reduction of net appreciation in fair value of investments. Notes receivable from participants also qualify as party-in-interest transactions. The plan sponsor elects to pay certain other administrative expenses.

Note 10 - Tax Status

During 2019, the Plan was restated to utilize an ERISA 403(b) Volume Submitter Plan document. The volume submitter plan being utilized obtained its latest determination letter on March 31, 2017 in which the Internal Revenue Service stated that the Plan, as then designed, was in compliance with the applicable requirements of the Internal Revenue Code. Since that date, the Plan has been amended and restated. The plan administrator and the Plan's tax counsel believe that the Plan is currently designed and being operated in compliance with the applicable requirements of the Internal Revenue Code and that the Plan was qualified as of the financial statement date. Therefore, no provision for income tax has been included in the Plan's financial statements.

In determining the recognition of uncertain tax positions, the Plan applies a more-likely-than-not recognition threshold and determines the measurement of uncertain tax positions considering the amounts and probabilities of the outcomes that could be realized upon ultimate settlement with taxing authorities. As of June 30, 2024, the Plan has no uncertain tax positions that qualify for either recognition or disclosure in the financial statements. The Plan is generally subject to potential examination by taxing jurisdictions for the prior three years. There are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress.
