Opinion on the Financial Statements

Note 1: Description of the Plan

The following description of the Speedway Retirement Readiness Plan (the Plan) provides only general information. Participants should refer to the *Plan Document* for a more complete description of the Plan's provisions, which is available from Plan management.

General

On May 14, 2021, 7-Eleven acquired Speedway LLC from Marathon Petroleum Corporation. As a result of the completion of this acquisition, with respect to the Plan participants who were employees of Speedway LLC and its affiliates, effective May 14, 2021, the Plan was established. The Plan is a participant-directed, defined contribution plan subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974, as amended (ERISA), whose purpose is to provide retirement benefits for employees of Speedway, LLC, now a subsidiary of 7-Eleven, Inc. (7-Eleven, the Company, or the Plan Sponsor/Administrator) excluding those whose employment is covered by a collective bargaining agreement, nonresident aliens who do not receive earned income from sources within the United States, and independent contractors. The Plan is administered by the Company. Certain officers of the Company have been appointed as members of the Investment Committee of the Plan.

Transfer of Plan Assets

On December 30, 2022, the 7-Eleven Inc. Profit Sharing/401(k) Plan assets were transferred in-kind into the Plan. Effective January 1, 2023, Plan assets amounting to \$886,913,148 were transferred in-kind into the 7-Eleven Inc. 401(k) Plan.

Contributions

Each year, participants may contribute up to 75% of pretax annual compensation, as defined in the Plan Document. Participants who have attained age 50 before the end of the plan year are eligible to make catch-up contributions. Participants may also contribute amounts representing distributions from other qualified defined benefit or defined contribution plans (rollover). Participants direct the investment of their contributions into various investment options offered by the Plan. All contributions are subject to Plan restrictions and limitations under the Internal Revenue Code (the Code), including the annual compensation limit under Section 401(a)(17) of the Code. Participants may also make rollover contributions or direct-plan transfer contributions in accordance with the terms of the Plan.

The Plan Sponsor has elected to contribute 117% of the first 6% of eligible compensation that a participant contributes to the Plan. The Plan Sponsor also makes non-elective contributions on behalf of eligible Speedway LLC employee participants in an amount equal to 3.5% of their eligible pay.

Participant Accounts

Each participant's account is credited with the participant's contributions, interest on individual participant loans outstanding (if any), and allocations of Company's discretionary contributions, Plan investment earnings (losses), and Plan expenses, as defined by the Plan Document. Participant accounts are adjusted as of the close of each business day (or as frequently as an updated value is available) for investment gains or losses based on the closing daily value of the units owned by a participant. Participants are fully vested in both participant contributions and the Company's discretionary contributions when made. Accordingly, a participant is entitled to the full value of their account, as adjusted for earnings or losses.

Vesting

Participants are vested immediately in their contributions and Company matching contributions plus actual earnings thereon. Vesting in the Company's nonelective contribution portion of their accounts is based on years of continuous service. A participant is 100% vested after 3 years of credited service.

Notes Receivable from Participants

Participants may borrow from their fund accounts a minimum of \$500 up to a maximum equal to the lesser of \$50,000 or 50% of their account balance. The loans are secured by the balance in the participant's account and bear interest at rates commensurate with local prevailing rates as determined by Plan management. Principal and interest are paid ratably through monthly payroll deductions.

Payment of Benefits

Upon separation of service due to death, disability, retirement or termination of employment, a participant may elect to receive a lump-sum amount equal to the value of the participant's vested interest in his or her account.

Forfeited Accounts

The non-vested balance in a participant's account is forfeited upon termination of service. Forfeitures may be used to reduce plan expenses and future Company contributions. At January 1, 2023, and December 31, 2022, forfeited nonvested accounts totaled \$0 and \$323,271, respectively.

Plan Termination

Although it has not expressed an intention to do so, the Plan Sponsor has the right under the Plan to discontinue its contributions at any time and to terminate the Plan, subject to the provisions of ERISA. In the event of plan termination, participants will become 100% vested in their accounts.

Note 2: Summary of Significant Accounting Policies

Basis of Accounting

The financial statements of the Plan are prepared on the accrual basis of accounting in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America (U.S. GAAP).

Use of Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with U.S. GAAP requires Plan management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets, liabilities, and changes therein, and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities at the date of the financial statements. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

Investment Valuation and Income Recognition

Investments are reported at fair value. Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. See Note 4 for discussion of fair value measurements.

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest income is recorded on an accrual basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Net appreciation/(depreciation) includes the Plan's gains/losses on investments bought and sold as well as held during the period.

Notes Receivable from Participants

Notes receivable from participants represents participant loans that are recorded at their unpaid principal balance plus any accrued but unpaid interest. Interest income on notes receivable from participants is recorded on an accrual basis. Related fees are recorded as administrative expenses and are expensed when they are incurred. No allowance for credit losses has been recorded as of January 1, 2023, and December 31, 2022. If a participant ceases to make loan repayments and Plan management deems the participant loan to be a distribution, the participant loan balance is reduced, and a benefit payment is recorded.

Payment of Benefits

Benefits paid directly to participants are recorded when paid.

Administrative Expenses

Certain expenses of maintaining the Plan are paid by the Plan, unless otherwise paid by the Plan Sponsor. Expenses that are paid by the Plan Sponsor are excluded from these financial statements. Fees related to the administration of notes receivable from participants are charged directly to the participant's account and are included in administrative expenses. Investment related expenses are included in net appreciation/(depreciation) in fair value of investments.

Note 3: Investments and Related Investment Income or Loss (Certified by Trustee)

Information related to investments as of December 31, 2022, and the related investment income for the year ended December 31, 2022, was certified by Fidelity Management Trust Company (Fidelity), the trustee of the Plan, as permitted by Regulation 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor's (DOL) Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA.

Note 4: Fair Value Measurements and Disclosures

The fair value measurement accounting literature establishes a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. This valuation hierarchy is based on transparency of inputs to the valuation of assets and liabilities on the measurement date. The three levels of the fair value hierarchy under FASB Accounting Standards Codification (ASC) 820 are defined as follows:

- Level 1 Inputs consist of unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities.
- Level 2 Inputs consist of quoted prices in active markets for similar assets or liabilities, or quoted prices for identical or similar assets or liabilities in non-active markets, or inputs other than quoted prices that are observable for the asset or liability.
- Level 3 Inputs are unobservable inputs for the asset or liability that are not corroborated by market data and may be used with internally developed methodologies that result in management's best estimate of fair value.

A financial instrument's level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement.

The following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for Plan investments measured at fair value. The methods described below may produce a fair value calculation that may not be indicative of net realizable value or reflective of future fair values. Furthermore, although the Plan believes its valuation methods are appropriate and consistent with other market participants, the use of different methodologies or assumptions to determine the fair value of certain financial instruments could result in a different fair value measurement at the reporting date.

Mutual funds – Valued at the daily closing price as reported by the fund. Mutual funds held by the Plan are open-ended mutual funds that are registered with the Securities and Exchange Commission (SEC). These funds are required to publish their daily net asset valuation and to transact at that price. The mutual funds held by the Plan are deemed to be actively traded.

BrokerageLink® Investments – Participants can open a self-directed brokerage account within the Plan that allows participants to buy and sell stocks, corporate bonds, treasury securities, and other securities on the active market. These securities are valued using a market approach at the closing price reported in an active market and are therefore considered Level 1.

Common collective trusts (CCTs) – Valued at the net asset value (NAV) of the shares held by the Plan at year-end. The CCTs are State Street Global Advisors Trust Company Target Date Funds Class W (Income, 2020, 2025, 2030, 2035, 2040, 2045, 2050, 2055 2060 and 2065). CCTs seek active return with a shift to current income and some capital appreciation over time as each fund approaches and passes the target retirement date. The funds invest in a combination of equity, fixed income, real estate and short-term State Street Global, N.A. Commingled Pension Trust Fund vehicles. The per unit NAV of each Fund is determined each business day. Issuances and redemptions of units may be made on such days, based upon the NAV per unit as of the valuation date last preceding the date on which such order to contribute or redeem assets is received. There are no significant redemption restrictions.

Stable value funds – Valued at the NAV of the shares held by the Plan at year-end, which is based on the fair value of the underlying investments using information reported by the investment advisor at year-end. This category is comprised of two funds:

- (1) Goldman Sachs Stable Value Collective Trust is a separate investment trust within the Collective Trusts managed by The Goldman Sachs Trust Company, N.A., which invests in stable value investment contracts that seek to preserve capital and stability of principal while earning interest income and maintain a stable NAV of \$1 per share. NAV is determined daily and there are no significant redemption restrictions on this investment.
- (2) Vanguard Retirement Saving Trust IV (VRST IV) is a separate investment trust within the Collective Trusts managed by Vanguard Fiduciary Trust Company, which invests solely in the Vanguard Retirement Savings Master Trust and provides for the collective investment of assets of tax-exempt pension and profit-sharing plans. VRST IV maintains a stable net asset value (NAV) of \$1 per share determined daily and there are no significant redemption restrictions on this investment.

The preceding methods described may produce a fair value calculation that may not be indicative of net realizable value or reflective of future fair values. Furthermore, although the Plan believes its valuation methods are appropriate and consistent with other market participants, the use of different methodologies or assumptions to determine the fair value of certain financial instruments could result in a different fair value measurement at the reporting date.

The availability of observable market data is monitored by management to assess the appropriate classification of investments both within and outside the fair value hierarchy. In instances where a transfer is required from one level to another because of re-evaluation of inputs or change in economic conditions, the transfer is reported at the beginning of the reporting period. Management considers the significance of transfers between levels based on the nature of and size of the transfer related to total net assets available for benefits.

Note 5: Related-Party Transactions and Party-In-Interest Transactions

Fidelity Management Trust Company, the Plan's trustee and recordkeeper, manages certain plan investments and, therefore, these transactions qualify as party-in-interest transactions; however, they are exempt from the prohibited transactions rules under ERISA.

Note 6: Risks and Uncertainties

The Plan invests in various investment securities that are exposed to various risks such as interest rates, market, and credit risks. Market values of investments may decline for a number of reasons, including changes in prevailing market and interest rates, increases in defaults, and credit rating downgrades. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in values of investment securities will occur in the near term and that some changes could materially affect participant account balances, and the assets reported in the Statement of Net Assets Available for Benefits.

Note 7: Plan Tax Status

Effective May 14, 2021, the Plan adopted a non-standardized prototype defined contribution profit sharing plan with Internal Revenue Code (IRC) Section 401(k) Cash or Deferred Arrangement (CODA) which received a favorable opinion letter from the Internal Revenue Service dated March 31, 2014. The Plan has been amended since receiving the determination letter. However, Plan management believes that the plan is currently designed and being operated in compliance with the applicable requirements of the IRC.

GAAP requires the Plan Administrator to evaluate uncertain tax positions taken by the Plan and to recognize a tax liability (or asset) when the position is more likely than not, based on the technical merits, to be sustained upon examination by the IRS. The Plan Administrator has analyzed the tax positions taken by the Plan and has concluded that as of January 1, 2023, there were no uncertain positions taken or expected to be taken that would require recognition of a liability (or asset) or disclosure in the financial statements. The Plan has recognized no interest or penalties related to uncertain tax positions. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress.

Note 8: Subsequent Events

In preparing the accompanying financial statements, Plan management has reviewed all known events that have occurred after January 1, 2023, and through April 9, 2025, which is the date the financial statements were available to be issued, for inclusion in the financial statements and footnotes.
