Scope and Nature of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) Audit

We have performed an audit of the accompanying financial statements of Oklahoma Medical Research Foundation Supplemental Retirement Plan (the "Plan"), an employee benefit plan subject to the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA), as permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C). The financial statements comprise the statements of net assets available for benefits for the years ended June 30, 2024, and 2023, and the related statement of changes in net assets available for benefits for the year ended, June 30, 2024, and the related notes to the financial statements.

Management, having determined it is permissible in the circumstances, has elected to have the audit of the Plan's financial statements performed in accordance with ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) pursuant to 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. As permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C), our audit need not extend to any statements or information related to assets held for investment of the plan (investment information) by a bank or similar institution or insurance carrier that is regulated, supervised, and subject to periodic examination by a state or federal agency, provided that the statements or information regarding assets so held are prepared and certified to by the bank or similar institution or insurance carrier in accordance with 29 CFR 2520.103-5 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA (qualified institution).

Management has obtained a certification from a qualified institution as of and for the years ended June 30, 2024, and 2023, stating that the certified investment information, as described in Note 7 to the financial statements, is complete and accurate.

Accordingly, the objective of an ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit is not to express an opinion about whether the financial statements as a whole are presented fairly, in all material respects, in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.

We are required to communicate with those charged with governance regarding, among other matters, the planned scope and timing of the audit, significant audit findings, and certain internal control-related matters that we identified during the audit.

1. DESCRIPTION OF PLAN

The following description of the Oklahoma Medical Research Foundation Supplemental Retirement Plan (the “Plan”) provides only general information. Participants should refer to the plan agreement for a more complete description of the Plan’s provisions.

General

The Plan was formed effective March 1, 1955 with the last restatement effective July 1, 2019 and the last amendment effective July 1, 2020. It is an Internal Revenue Code (the “Code”) Section 403(b) Defined Contribution Retirement Plan and is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (“ERISA”). The Plan is designed to provide supplemental retirement benefits to eligible employees of Oklahoma Medical Research Foundation (“OMRF”).

Contributions

Participant contributions are made on a tax-deferred basis, unless they are Roth elective deferrals, pursuant to a salary reduction agreement in accordance with Code Section 403(b) and the regulations thereof. Under the salary reduction agreement, the employee’s salary is reduced, and the amount of the reduction is applied as contributions to the investments available under the Plan. Participants may also contribute amounts representing distributions from other qualified defined benefit or contribution plans. Participants direct investment of their contributions into various investment options offered by the Plan. Total annual contributions for any participant will not exceed the amount permitted under section 415 of the Code. Elective deferrals are submitted to the Teachers Insurance and Annuity Association (“TIAA”) and College Retirement Equities Fund (“CREF”), collectively (“TIAA-CREF”). The Plan is funded solely by participant contributions and does not accept contributions from OMRF.

Participant contributions for the year ended June 30, 2024, totaled \$2,673,951 of which \$228,150 is recorded as contributions receivable at the end of the Plan year.

Participant Accounts

As provided in Code Section 403(b), an individual account balance is maintained for each participant, which is credited with the employee’s contributions.

Vesting

Participants are immediately 100% vested in their contributions plus actual earnings thereon.

Participant Loans

Historically, the Plan allowed participants to enter into loan agreements with TIAA using their individual participant account balances as collateral (“plan loans”). The loan proceeds were sourced directly from TIAA, consequently, these loans are not assets of the Plan. Plan loans outstanding at June 30, 2024 and 2023, and not reported as plan assets, totaled \$70,410 and \$78,875, respectively. When a plan loan goes into default, the collateral associated with the loan is segregated and reported in the plan loan default fund (see note 4). New requests for plan loans are no longer allowed by the Plan.

Notes receivable from participants represent loans that are funded directly from a participant's account and recorded at their unpaid principal balance plus any accrued but unpaid interest on the statement of net assets available for benefits. A participant may borrow a minimum of \$1,000 up to a maximum equal to one-half of their vested account balance, but not in excess of \$50,000. Loan terms range from 1-5 years or more if the loan is used to acquire a principle residence. The loans are secured by the balance in the participant's account and bear interest at 8.00 – 9.50 percent, which is commensurate with local prevailing rates. Total notes receivable from participants at June 30, 2024 and 2023 were \$29,398 and \$8,176, respectively. There were no deemed distributions for the year ended June 30, 2024.

Payment of Benefits

Distributions may be paid only when a participant attains age 59 ½, separates from service, dies or becomes disabled. Also available is a "Hardship Distribution" under the plan document and to the extent allowed by the Code.

Investment Options

The Plan's investment options are available through a trust agreement with TIAA-CREF. Upon enrollment in the Plan, a participant may direct employee contributions among investment choices in increments of 1%. Participants may change their investment options on any normal business day.

2. SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of Accounting

The financial statements of the Plan are presented on the accrual basis of accounting in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America (GAAP).

Use of Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with GAAP requires plan management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of plan assets, liabilities, and changes therein and disclosures of contingent assets and liabilities. Actual results could differ from those estimates. Estimates that are particularly susceptible to significant change include the valuation of investments which are exposed to various risks, such as interest rate, credit, and overall market volatility. Due to the level of risk associated with these financial instruments, it is reasonably possible that changes in the values of these assets will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect the amounts reported in the statements of net assets available for benefits.

Investment Valuation and Income Recognition

Investments are reported at fair value, except for fully benefit-responsive investments, which are reported at contract value. Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. See Note 4 for fair value measurement disclosures.

The Plan's fully benefit-responsive investment contract with TIAA-CREF (see Note 5) is valued at contract value, which is the relevant measurement attribute, as it is the amount participants would receive if they were to initiate permitted transactions under terms of the Plan. Contract value equals the accumulated cash contributions and interest credited to the Plan's contracts, and transfers, if any, less withdrawals and transfers, if any.

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. The Plan presents in the statement of changes in net assets available for benefits the net change in the fair value of its investments, which consists of the unrealized and realized appreciation or depreciation on those investments.

Forms of Benefits

The forms of benefit are those offered by the funding vehicles available under the Plan and include the purchase of various types of annuities as well as cash withdrawals. The normal forms of benefit payment, to which a participant is entitled or may elect to receive, include: single life annuities, joint and survivor annuities, cash withdrawals, fixed period annuities, retirement transition benefit, repurchase and such other annuity and withdrawal options as provided under the funding vehicle contract. Benefits are recorded when paid.

Investment Fees and Expenses

Investment fees and expenses, including recordkeeping and distribution fees, are netted with net change in fair value of investments in the statement of changes in net assets available for benefits. Actual investment fees and expenses included in net change in fair value of investments for the year ended June 30, 2024 totaled \$115,480.

3. PLAN TERMINATION

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, OMRF has the right under the Plan to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions of ERISA.

4. FAIR VALUE MEASUREMENTS

The Plan measures fair value in accordance with accounting standards that establish a fair value hierarchy based on the observability of inputs used to measure fair value. These inputs are summarized in the three broad levels listed below:

Level 1: Inputs to the valuation methodology are unadjusted quoted prices for identical assets or liabilities in active markets that the Plan has the ability to access.

Level 2: Significant other observable inputs other than Level 1 prices such as quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities; quoted prices in markets that are not active; or other inputs that are observable or can be corroborated by observable market data.

Level 3: Inputs to the valuation methodology are unobservable and significant to the fair value of measurement.

In many cases, a valuation technique used to measure fair value includes inputs from multiple levels of the fair value hierarchy. The lowest level of significant input determines the placement of the entire fair value measurement in the hierarchy.

Mutual Funds – The fair values of mutual fund investments are determined by obtaining quoted prices on nationally recognized securities exchanges. Mutual fund investments are classified within Level 1 of the valuation hierarchy.

Pooled Separate Account (Real Estate Account) – The Real Estate Account (“REA”) generally invests in real-estate properties and real-estate related investments. The REA’s value is principally derived from the market value of the underlying real-estate holdings or other real-estate related investments.

Real-estate holdings are valued principally using external appraisals, which are estimates of property values based on a professional’s opinion. The REA sometimes holds securities as well. These are generally priced using values obtained from independent pricing sources. Unit values are calculated daily. The REA is measured at fair value using the Net Asset Value (“NAV”) as a practical expedient and has not been classified under the valuation hierarchy.

Plan Loan Default Fund – This fund reports plan assets which serve as collateral for plan loans on which the borrowing participants have not made payments as agreed to in the loan agreement and the loan has gone into default. While plan loans are not assets of the Plan, the collateral associated with the loans are plan assets and are reflected in the overall balance of the TIAA Traditional Annuity. The Plan Loan Default Fund represents that portion of the TIAA Traditional Annuity which have been segregated to report collateral on plan loans in default. This fund is classified within Level 3 of the valuation hierarchy.

Investment Contract with Insurance Company (Non-Fully Benefit-Responsive) - The non-fully benefit-responsive fixed annuity contracts, composed entirely of the TIAA Traditional Annuity Contracts, are reported at fair value, which is approximated by contract value. TIAA-CREF asserts that, based on two theories, contract value approximates fair value. A fair value estimate of this investment has not been provided to the Plan, other than on a cost-based approach. However, TIAA-CREF has used a quantitative model for this investment as a whole, to demonstrate that a discounted cash flows return supports one of its two theories of why the contract value approximates fair value. The other theory is based upon participant investments to this fund, by choice, represents willing market participation and orderly transactions. Management is unable to conclude whether there may be a material difference between contract value and fair value using a discounted cash flows model for the investment. Management has reviewed the Plan’s investments in the TIAA Traditional Annuity and determined, based on the evaluation of the credit ratings and other financial data pertaining to the issuer, that it agrees with TIAA-CREF’s assessment that contract value approximates fair value, as of the Plan’s year end. The TIAA Traditional Annuity Contracts are not available for sale or transfer on any securities exchange and therefore, are classified within Level 3 of the valuation hierarchy. The fixed annuity contracts are subject to various restrictions.

5. FULLY BENEFIT-RESPONSIVE ANNUITY CONTRACTS

Certain traditional annuity investment contracts meet the fully benefit-responsive criteria and therefore are reported at contract value. As previously discussed, contract value is the relevant measure for fully benefit-responsive investment contracts because this is the amount received by participants if they were to initiate permitted transactions under terms of the Plan. Contract value, as reported by TIAA-CREF, equals the accumulated cash contributions, interest credited to the Plan's contracts, transfers, if any, less withdrawals, if any. The Plan's ability to receive amounts to meet its contractual obligations may be affected by future economic and regulatory developments.

Under the terms of the contract, TIAA-CREF reserves the right to apply a 1.5% surrender charge to transfers and lump-sum benefits from these traditional annuity investment accounts if such transaction occurs during a period of time in which TIAA-CREF has determined that coordinated transactions are occurring. Coordinated transactions will be deemed to be occurring if TIAA-CREF becomes aware that within 12 months prior to TIAA's receipt of a request to begin payments or at any time after TIAA-CREF's receipt of such request, the contract holder, plan sponsor, employer, or any other party has engaged in an effort to coach or encourage groups of participants to request internal transfers, or lump-sum benefits from their traditional annuity accumulation. As of June 30, 2024, plan management believes no such events have occurred.

6. TAX STATUS

The plan obtained its latest determination letter on August 7, 2017, in which the Internal Revenue Service stated that the Plan, as then designed, was in compliance with the applicable requirements of the Internal Revenue Code. The Plan has been amended since receiving the determination letter. However, the plan administrator and the Plan's tax counsel believe that the Plan is currently designed and being operated in compliance with the applicable requirements of the Internal Revenue Code. The plan administrator believes the Plan is no longer subject to income tax examinations for years prior to 2021.

7. INFORMATION CERTIFIED BY TRUSTEE (UNAUDITED)

The plan administrator has elected the method of annual reporting compliance permitted by 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. Accordingly, TIAA-CREF, the trustee of the Plan, has certified that the following data included in the accompanying financial statements and supplemental schedule is complete and accurate:

- Investments at fair value, fully benefit responsive investment contract at contract value, and notes receivable from participants, as shown in the statements of net assets available for benefits as of June 30, 2024 and 2023.
- Net change in fair value of investments, interest and dividend income, and other plan income, as shown in the statement of changes in net assets available for benefits for the year ended June 30, 2024.
- Schedule H, Line 4i – schedule of assets (held at end of year) as of June 30, 2024.

The Plan's independent accountants did not perform auditing procedures with respect to this information, except for comparing such information to related information included in the financial statements.

8. PARTIES-IN-INTEREST TRANSACTIONS

Certain of the investment securities are managed by TIAA-CREF and therefore qualify as party-in-interest transactions.

9. SUBSEQUENT EVENTS

The Plan's management has evaluated subsequent events through April 8, 2025, the date the financial statements were available to be issued. There were no subsequent events requiring recognition or disclosure.
