As permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C), our audits need not extend to any statements or information related to assets held for investment of the Plan (investment information) by a bank or similar institution or insurance carrier that is regulated, supervised, and subject to periodic examination by a state or federal agency, provided that the statements or information regarding assets so held are prepared and certified to by the bank or similar institution or insurance carrier in accordance with 29 CFR 2520.103-5 of the DOL's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA (qualified institution).

Management has obtained certifications from qualified institutions as of June 30, 2024 and 2023, and for the year ended June 30, 2024, stating that the certified investment information, as described in Note C to the financial statements, is complete and accurate.

Opinion

In our opinion, based on our audits and on the procedures performed as described in the Auditors' Responsibilities for the Audit section:

- The amounts and disclosures in the accompanying financial statements, other than those agreed to or derived from the certified investment information, are presented fairly, in all material respects, in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America (U.S. GAAP).
- The information in the accompanying financial statements related to assets held by and certified to by a qualified institution agrees to, or is derived from, in all material respects, the information prepared and certified by an institution that management determined meets the requirements of ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C).

Basis for Opinion

We conducted our audits in accordance with auditing standards generally accepted in the United States of America (U.S. GAAS). Our responsibilities under those standards are further described in the Auditors' Responsibilities for the Audit section of our report. We are required to be independent of the Plan and to meet our other ethical responsibilities, in accordance with the relevant ethical requirements relating to our audits. We believe that the audit evidence we have obtained is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for our ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit opinion.

Responsibilities of Management

Management is responsible for the preparation and fair presentation of the financial statements in accordance with U.S. GAAP, and for the design, implementation, and maintenance of internal control relevant to the preparation and fair presentation of financial statements that are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error. Management's election of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit does not affect management's responsibility for the financial statements.

In preparing the financial statements, management is required to evaluate whether there are conditions or events, considered in the aggregate, that raise substantial doubt about the Plan's ability to continue as a going concern within one year after the date that the financial statements are available to be issued.

Management is also responsible for maintaining a current plan instrument, including all plan amendments, administering the Plan, and determining that the Plan's transactions that are presented and disclosed in the financial statements are in conformity with the Plan's provisions, including maintaining sufficient records with respect to each of the participants, to determine the benefits due or which may become due to such participants.

Auditors' Responsibilities for the Audit

Except as described in the Scope and Nature of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) Audit section of our report, our objectives are to obtain reasonable assurance about whether the financial statements as a whole are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error, and to issue an auditors' report that includes our opinion. Reasonable assurance is a high level of assurance but is not absolute assurance and therefore is not a guarantee that an audit conducted in accordance with U.S. GAAS will always detect a material misstatement when it exists. The risk of not detecting a material misstatement resulting from fraud is higher than for one resulting from error, as fraud may involve collusion, forgery, intentional omissions, misrepresentations, or the override of internal control. Our audits did not extend to the certified investment information, except for obtaining and reading the certification, comparing the certified investment information with the related information presented and disclosed in the financial statements, and reading the disclosures relating to the certified investment information to assess whether they are in accordance with the presentation and disclosure requirements of U.S. GAAP.

Accordingly, the objective of an ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit is not to express an opinion about whether the financial statements as a whole are presented fairly, in all material respects, in accordance with U.S. GAAP.

We are required to communicate with those charged with governance regarding, among other matters, the planned scope and timing of the audit, significant audit findings, and certain internal control-related matters that we identified during the audit.

Other Matters

Supplemental Schedule Required by ERISA

The information included in the supplemental schedule, other than that agreed to or derived from the certified investment information, has been subjected to auditing procedures applied in the audit of the financial statements and certain additional procedures, including comparing and reconciling such information directly to the underlying accounting and other records used to prepare the financial statements or to the financial statements themselves, and other additional procedures in accordance with U.S. GAAS. For information included in the supplemental schedule that agreed to or is derived from the certified investment information, we compared such information to the related certified investment information.

NOTE A - DESCRIPTION OF PLAN

The following description of The Chambersburg Hospital 401(a) Plan & Trust (the Plan) provides only general information. Participants should refer to the plan document for a more complete description of the Plan's provisions.

General

The Plan is a defined contribution plan covering the bargaining unit employees of WellSpan Health (Plan Sponsor), except for leased employees and employees who were grandfathered into The Chambersburg Hospital Pension Plan for Union Represented Employees (the Pension Plan). Employees become a participant in the Plan once they have reached one year of service and 21 years of age. The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA).

Contributions

The Plan does not allow for employee contributions. Employer matching contributions are made with respect to employee contributions deferred under the Chambersburg Hospital Bargaining 403(b) Plan (the 403(b) Plan). For participants whose employment commencement date occurs on or before July 1, 2018, the matching contribution percentage is based on the participant's hire date, their combined age and years of service as of July 1, 2008, and the amount the participant is contributing to the 403(b) Plan. For participants whose employment commencement date occurs after July 1, 2018 and who are not current participants in the Pension Plan, the matching contribution percentage is based on the amount the participant is contributing to the 403(b) Plan. Additional discretionary employer non-elective contributions are made to certain participants as a fixed income guarantee, pursuant to the Collective Bargaining Agreement covering participants in the Plan. For the year ended June 30, 2024, the Plan Sponsor made a \$1,488,898 employer matching contribution and a \$5,710 employer non-elective contribution to the Plan.

Contributions are subject to certain Internal Revenue Service (IRS) limitations.

Participant Accounts

Each participant's account is credited with (a) the employer matching contributions, (b) an allocation of the employer's non-elective contribution, (c) an allocation of investment earnings or losses based on the participant's directed investment accounts, and (d) charged with an allocation of administrative expenses. Allocations are based on participant earnings, account balances, or specific participant transactions, as defined by the plan document. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant's vested account. Each participant directs the investments for their account.

Vesting and Forfeitures

Participants become 100% vested after three years of continuous credited service. Participants are zero percent vested prior to the completion of three years of continuous credited service.

Vesting and Forfeitures - continued

Forfeited non-vested accounts, if any, shall be applied to pay administrative expenses or reduce the employer contributions no later than the following plan year. Forfeited non-vested accounts at June 30, 2024 and 2023 were \$34,650 and \$9,952, respectively. For the year ended June 30, 2024, forfeitures of \$14,666 were used to pay administrative expenses.

Payment of Benefits

Upon termination of employment, if a participant's vested interest in their account exceeds \$1,000, no distribution shall be made to the participant before they reach the age of normal retirement or receipt of consent to pay out by the participant, if applicable. The vested account balance is paid out in the form of a lump sum distribution.

Transfer Out

At an eligible participant's election, the Plan allows for matching contributions, non-elective contributions and associated earnings, to the extent vested, be transferred to the Pension Plan upon the earlier of (1) the participant's completion of five years of participation in the Plan or (2) the second anniversary of the allocation of such matching contributions or earnings, as applicable. Only amounts that were invested 100% in the general fixed account will be eligible for transfer. This transfer is irrevocable and may not be moved from the Pension Plan back to the Plan after the transfer has occurred. For the year ended June 30, 2024, a transfer of \$590,476 was made to the Pension Plan.

NOTE B - SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of Accounting

The financial statements are prepared on the accrual basis of accounting.

Payment of Benefits

Benefits payments to participants and beneficiaries are recorded when paid.

Investment Valuation and Income Recognition

The Plan's investments are reported at fair value (except for the fully benefit responsive investment contract, which is reported at contract value). Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. Fair value measurements are discussed in Note D. Purchases and sales are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest income is credited to participant guaranteed accounts based on the rate communicated to the Plan; rates are generally adjusted on an annual basis. Net appreciation includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold as well as held during the year. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Interest income is recorded on an accrual basis.

NOTE B - SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES - continued

Risks and Uncertainties

The Plan provides for various investment options. Investment securities of the Plan are exposed to various risks, such as interest rate, market and credit. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities and the level of uncertainty related to changes in value of investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in risks in the near-term would materially affect participant's account balances and the amounts reported in the statements of net assets available for benefits and the statement of changes in net assets available for benefits. As of June 30, 2024 and 2023, two investment funds represented approximately 41% and 40% of the total investments, respectively.

Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America (U.S. GAAP) requires the Plan Administrator to make estimates and assumptions that affect certain reported amounts and disclosures. Accordingly, actual results may differ from those estimates.

NOTE C - INVESTMENTS

The Plan's investments are held in trust and administered by Empower Trust Company, LLC and Empower Annuity Insurance Company of America (the trustee and custodian, respectively), as of June 30, 2024 and 2023. The investments and investment income disclosed in the accompanying financial statements and supplemental schedule (Schedule of Assets Held) were obtained or derived from information supplied to the Plan Administrator and certified as complete and accurate by the trustee and custodian.

NOTE D - FAIR VALUE MEASUREMENTS

The Financial Accounting Standards Board Accounting Standards Codification 820, *Fair Value Measurements and Disclosures*, establishes a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. This hierarchy consists of three levels: Level 1 inputs consist of unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets and have the highest priority, Level 2 inputs consist of observable inputs other than quoted prices for identical assets, and Level 3 inputs consist of unobservable inputs for identical assets and have the lowest priority. The Plan uses valuation techniques based on the available inputs to measure the fair value of its investment. When available, the Plan measures fair value using Level 1 inputs because they provide the most reliable evidence of fair value. Level 3 inputs are used only when Level 1 and Level 2 inputs are not available.

The following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for investments measured at fair value. There have been no changes to the methodologies used at June 30, 2024 and 2023.

Mutual Funds: Valued at the daily closing price as reported by the fund. Funds held by the Plan are open-end mutual funds that are registered with the Securities and Exchange Commission. These funds are required to publish their daily net asset value and to transact at that price. The funds held by the Plan are deemed to be actively traded.

Self-Directed Brokerage Accounts: Primarily consist of mutual funds and common stocks that are valued on the basis of readily determinable market prices and are actively traded.

Investment in General Account. Reported at contract value, which approximates fair value. The Plan invests in a general account with Voya, which seeks to hold the principal value of the account stable through all market conditions. The account is credited daily with declared rates of interest and is subject to minimum contractual guarantees, which are communicated to the Plan. Withdrawals from the account are limited to a certain percentage of the account value or paid in installments. The credited interest rate, account balance and formulas upon which payments may be based are observable through the contract with Voya.

NOTE E - GUARANTEED INSURANCE CONTRACT WITH INSURANCE COMPANY

The Plan is invested in a fully benefit-responsive investment contract with Empower Annuity Insurance Company of America provided under a group annuity contract called the Empower Select Guaranteed Fund (formerly the Great-West Select Guaranteed Fund).

Because the contract is fully benefit-responsive, contract value is the relevant measurement attribute for that portion of the net assets available for benefits attributable to the contract. Contract value represents contributions made under the contract, plus earnings, less participant withdrawals and administrative expenses. Participants may ordinarily direct the withdrawal or transfer of all or a portion of their investment at contract value. There are no reserves against contract value for credit risk of the contract issuer or otherwise.

The crediting interest rate is based on a formula agreed upon with the issuer, but it may not be less than 1.00%. Such interest rates are reviewed on an annual basis for resetting. The guaranteed contract does not permit the insurance company to terminate the agreement prior to the scheduled maturity date.

The average yields of the guaranteed investment contract are as follows as of December 31:

Certain events may limit the ability of the Plan to transact at contract value with the issuer. Such events include the following: (1) amendments to the plan documents (including complete or partial plan termination or merger with another plan), (2) changes to the Plan's prohibition on competing investment options or deletion of equity wash provisions, (3) bankruptcy of the Plan Sponsor or other Plan Sponsor events (for example, divestitures or spin-offs of a subsidiary) that cause a significant withdrawal from the Plan, or (4) the failure of the trust to qualify for exemption from federal income taxes or any required prohibited transaction exemption under ERISA. The Plan Administrator does not believe that the occurrence of any event that would limit the Plan's ability to transact at contract value with participants is probable of occurring.

NOTE F - PLAN TERMINATION

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the Plan Sponsor has the right under the Plan to discontinue its contributions at any time and to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions of ERISA. Should the Plan terminate at some future time, participants would become fully vested in their employer contributions.

NOTE G - PLAN TAX STATUS

The Plan's volume submitter plan document obtained its latest advisory letter on June 30, 2020, in which the IRS stated that the Plan, as then designed, was in compliance with the applicable sections of the Internal Revenue Code (IRC). The prototype has been amended since receiving the advisory letter for various amendments. However, the Plan Administrator believes that the Plan is currently designed and being operated in compliance with the applicable sections of the IRC. Therefore, no provision for income taxes has been included in the Plan's financial statements.

U.S. GAAP requires plan management to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan and recognize a tax liability if the Plan has taken an uncertain position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by applicable taxing authorities. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress. The Plan Administrator believes the Plan is no longer subject to income tax examinations for fiscal years prior to 2021.

NOTE H - TRANSACTIONS WITH PARTIES-IN-INTEREST

Certain plan investments are managed by the trustee and custodian of the Plan and, therefore, these transactions qualify as party-in-interest transactions. Transactions resulting in plan assets being transferred to or used by a related party are prohibited under ERISA unless a specific exemption exists. The trustee and custodian are parties-in-interest as defined by ERISA as a result of investing plan assets in its funds and accounts and providing investment management services. However, these transactions are exempt under Section 408(b)(8) and are not prohibited by ERISA.

Certain expenses of maintaining the Plan are paid by the Plan, unless otherwise paid by the Plan Sponsor. Expenses that are paid by the Plan Sponsor are excluded from these financial statements. Investment-related expenses are included in net appreciation of fair value of investments.

NOTE I - CONCENTRATION OF CASH AND SECURITIES RISK

The Plan maintains its balances in a brokerage institution, which at times may exceed the Securities Investor Protection Corporation limits up to \$500,000 for balances (with a limit of \$250,000 for cash). The Plan has not experienced any losses in such accounts and believes it is not exposed to any significant credit risk on cash and securities.
