Opinion

We have audited the accompanying financial statements of Texas Pipe Trades Health Benefit Plan (the Plan), an employee benefit plan subject to the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA), which comprise the statements of benefit obligations and net assets available for benefits as of June 30, 2024 and 2023 and the related statement of changes in benefit obligations and net assets available for benefits for the year ended June 30, 2024, and the related notes to the financial statements.

In our opinion, the financial statements referred to above present fairly, in all material respects, the benefit obligations and net assets available for benefits of the Plan as of June 30, 2024 and 2023, and the changes in its benefit obligations and net assets available for benefits for the year ended June 30, 2024, in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States.

Basis for Opinion



NOTE A DESCRIPTION OF PLAN

Texas Pipe Trades Health Benefit Plan ("the Plan") was established for the purposes of providing for medical (hospital, surgical, major medical), health care, sickness, accident, prescription drug benefits, dental benefits, vision benefits and life insurance for eligible participants and their dependents. Payments are subject to the determination of the Trustees concerning the particular type or types of benefits to be provided. The Plan was created to comply with the requirements of Section 302 (C)(5)(A)(B) of the Labor Management Relations Act of 1947, as amended and with the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA), relating to welfare benefits.

It is intended that the Plan shall continue in perpetuity. However, the Plan may be terminated when there is no longer in effect an agreement between any of the employers and any Local Union which requires employer payments for the purposes provided in the Trust Agreement.

In the event of termination of the Plan, the Trustees shall abide by the termination provisions of ERISA and may, should the Trustees feel it advisable, petition the proper court for the appointment of an independent trustee. No part of the Plan shall ever revert to or be payable to any employer or other party hereto, nor to any employee except in the form of benefits equivalent or similar to those provided in the Trust Agreement.

NOTE B REPORTING AND SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

The principal accounting policies followed by the Plan are as follows:

Accounting Records – The accounting records of the Plan are maintained on the accrual basis for financial reporting purposes. Interest and dividend income are recognized when earned.

Employers' Contributions – Employers' contributions are payable to the Plan by employers of members of affiliated unions based on the number of hours of covered employment worked by each member. The contribution rate is \$5.75 per hour worked for all participants. During the year ended June 30, 2024 three employers' contributions amounted to approximately \$20,646,000 or 37% of total Contributions.

Medical Benefits – Covered medical benefits are paid on behalf of eligible members and their dependents as provided for in the Plan Document. A general description of covered medical and disability benefits is included in Note A.

Eligibility Requirements – Eligibility requirements are determined by the Joint Board of Trustees. Basic month-to-month eligibility requirements in effect during the year ended June 30, 2024 are summarized as follows:

Initial eligibility is established on the first day of the second month immediately following the month during which the member has worked at least 580 hours of covered employment within nine months.

NOTE B REPORTING AND SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES (CONTINUED)

Hours are accumulated in a member's hour bank based on hours of covered employment worked in excess of 145 hours during a qualifying month. A member's hour bank is limited to a maximum of 580 hours.

Continued eligibility is maintained by a member working 145 hours of covered employment during subsequent months. If the member does not work 145 hours of covered employment, the member may utilize covered employment hours accumulated in the member's hour bank.

Contributions Receivable – Employers' contributions receivable are recognized for contributions for payroll periods prior to the fiscal year end of the Plan but not received by the Plan until after fiscal year end.

Valuation of Investments – Investments are stated at fair value. Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. In accordance with the policy of stating investments at fair value, net investment gain or loss is included in the carrying value of related investments in the statements of benefit obligations and net assets available for benefits and the changes in the net investment gain or loss are reflected in the statement of changes in benefit obligations and net assets available for benefits.

Estimates – The preparation of financial statements in conformity with generally accepted accounting principles in the United States (GAAP) requires the Plan Administrator to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets, liabilities, benefit obligations and changes therein, claims incurred but not reported, eligibility credits, claims payable, and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

Risks and Uncertainties – The Plan invests in various securities which are exposed to various risks, such as interest rate, market and credit risks. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities and the level of uncertainty related to changes in the value of investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in risks in the near term could materially affect the amounts reported in the statements of benefit obligations and net assets available for benefits and the statement of changes in benefit obligations and net assets available for benefits.

The claims incurred but not reported liability, hour bank and eligibility liabilities, and health reimbursement account liabilities are reported based on certain assumptions pertaining to claims experience, interest rates, inflation rates, and employee demographics all of which are subject to change. Due to uncertainties inherent in the estimation and assumptions process, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in these estimates and assumptions in the near term could be material to the financial statements.

Concentration of Market Risk – Contributions paid to the Plan are directly affected by the level of construction activity within the Dallas, Texas area. Therefore, the Plan could suffer the risk of loss of contributions should the Dallas area suffer an economic downturn.

Subsequent Events – The Plan has evaluated subsequent events through April 11, 2025, the date the financial statements were available to be issued. No subsequent events occurred, which require adjustment or disclosure to the financial statements at June 30, 2024.

NOTE C CASH AND CREDIT RISK

At June 30, 2024 the Plan had approximately \$8,222,000 in cash balances that exceeded the FDIC limits. It is the Plan's practice to utilize high quality financial institutions to minimize credit risk.

NOTE D BENEFIT OBLIGATIONS

Claims Incurred but not Reported – The June 30, 2024 and 2023 benefit obligations for claims incurred but not reported (IBNR) are estimated by the Plan's consultant (Ryan Benefits, Inc.). The IBNR estimate was based upon the claims experience of the Plan during the years ended June 30, 2024 and 2023. The Plan has obtained stop loss insurance coverage for individuals with annual claims exceeding \$350,000. During the year ended June 30, 2024 there were approximately \$1,300,000 in medical claims that exceeded stop loss limits.

The accumulated eligibility credits also include group life insurance premiums for a period of time subsequent to June 30, 2024 and 2023 for those participants who have accumulated a sufficient number of hours and may be unemployed. The group life insurance premiums provide death benefits payable to members' beneficiaries.

Estimated Eligibility Liability – Participants are allowed to accumulate up to 580 hours in an "hour bank" based on hours worked in excess of 145 hours per month that can provide future eligibility. A liability has been recorded to reflect insurance premiums and claims payable in the future based on hour bank accumulated eligibility.

Health Reimbursement Account Liability – The health reimbursement account (HRA) contribution rate is \$.25 to \$.50 per hour worked. Reciprocal contributions received in excess of the hourly contribution rate are credited to the individual members HRA account. The HRA provides monies to meet plan deductibles, coinsurance, COBRA premiums, vision, dental and orthodontic expenses. Any unused portions of the members account balance are carried over to the subsequent plan year. The members account balance is forfeited upon termination from the plan. The HRA liability represents amounts deposited by participants as of June 30, 2024 and 2023.

The value of the above liabilities is based on the Ryan Benefits projection of the costs that are expected to exist during the eligibility period that immediately follows the end of the Plan year. This is true even though the actual payouts for benefit accruals for at least some participants are likely to take place during a later period. The projections do not take into account any interest earnings or interest costs during the payout period and therefore, do not represent a present value estimate. The consultant has considered present value calculations and other adjustments and has determined that they are not applicable. Any such adjustments would be of a magnitude smaller than the expected error in their calculations of the obligation and because of their immateriality, they are not applied.

NOTE E INCOME TAX STATUS

The Internal Revenue Service has ruled that the Plan qualifies under Section 501(c)(9) of the Internal Revenue Code and is, therefore, not subject to tax under present income tax laws. The Plan received a favorable determination letter dated November 17, 1980 from the Internal Revenue Service. The Plan has been amended since receiving the determination letter. The Trustees are of the opinion that the Plan continues to be exempt from federal income taxes and continues to conform to the requirements of ERISA.

The Plan believes that all significant tax positions utilized by the Plan will more likely than not be sustained upon examination. As of June 30, 2024, the tax years that remain subject to examination by the major tax jurisdictions under the statute of limitations are from the fiscal year 2021 forward (with limited exceptions). Tax penalties and interest, if any, would be accrued as incurred and would be classified as tax expense in the statement of changes in benefit obligations and net assets available for benefits.

Fees paid during the year for legal, accounting, administrative, actuarial, and other professional services were rendered by parties-in-interest.

NOTE H FAIR VALUE DISCLOSURES

GAAP provides a framework for measuring fair value using a hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value based upon whether the inputs to those valuation techniques are observable or unobservable. This hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical financial instruments and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs. Valuation techniques maximize the use of observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs. The financial instrument's fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement.

These inputs are summarized in the three levels listed below:

Level 1 – Inputs to valuation methodology are unadjusted quoted prices for identical assets or liabilities in active markets that the Plan has the ability to access.

Level 2 – Other significant observable inputs (including quoted prices in active or inactive markets for similar financial instruments), or other inputs that are observable or can be corroborated by observable market data for substantially the full term of the financial instruments.

Level 3 – Unobservable inputs that are supported by little or no market activity and that are significant to the fair value of the financial instruments. The fair value of Level 3 financial instruments is determined using pricing models, discounted cash flow methodologies, or similar techniques, as well as instruments for which the determination of fair value requires significant management judgment or estimation.

Following is a description of the valuation technique used for investments measured at fair value. There have been no changes in the technique used during fiscal 2024 and 2023.

Mutual funds and money market funds are valued at the quoted market prices of shares held by the Plan at year end.

The preceding method described may produce a fair value calculation that may not be indicative of net realizable value or reflective of future fair values. Furthermore, although the Plan believes its valuation technique is appropriate and consistent with other market participants, the use of different techniques or assumptions to determine the fair value of certain financial instruments could result in a different fair value measurement at the reporting date.
