## **INDEPENDENT AUDITORS' REPORT**

To the Plan Administrator, Participants and Beneficiaries of the Newark Academy DC Retirement Plan

### ***Scope and Nature of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) Audit***

We have performed audits of the financial statements of the Newark Academy DC Retirement Plan (the "Plan"), an employee benefit plan subject to the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 ("ERISA"), as permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) (ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit). The financial statements comprise the statements of net assets available for benefits as of June 30, 2024 and 2023, and the related statement of changes in net assets available for benefits for the year ended June 30, 2024, and the related notes to the financial statements.

Management, having determined it is permissible in the circumstances, has elected to have the audits of the Plan's financial statements performed in accordance with ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) pursuant to 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. As permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C), our audits need not extend to any statements or information related to assets held for investment of the Plan (investment information) by a bank or similar institution or insurance carrier that is regulated, supervised, and subject to periodic examination by a state or federal agency, provided that the statements or information regarding assets so held are prepared and certified to by the bank or similar institution or insurance carrier in accordance with 29 CFR 2520.103-5 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA (qualified institution).

Management has obtained certifications from a qualified institution as of June 30, 2024 and 2023, and for the year ended June 30, 2024, stating that the certified investment information, as described in Note C to the financial statements, is complete and accurate.

### ***Opinion***

In our opinion, based on our audits and on the procedures performed as described in the Auditors' Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements section:

- the amounts and disclosures in the accompanying financial statements, other than those agreed to or derived from the certified investment information, are presented fairly, in all material respects, in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.
- the information in the accompanying financial statements related to assets held by and certified to by a qualified institution agrees to, or is derived from, in all material respects, the information prepared and certified by an institution that management determined meets the requirements of ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C).

### ***Basis for Opinion***

We conducted our audits in accordance with auditing standards generally accepted in the United States of America ("GAAS"). Our responsibilities under those standards are further described in the Auditors' Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements section of our report. We are required to be independent of the Plan and to meet our other ethical responsibilities, in accordance with the relevant ethical requirements relating to our audits. ### ***Responsibilities of Management for the Financial Statements***

Management is responsible for the preparation and fair presentation of the financial statements in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America, and for the design, implementation, and maintenance of internal control relevant to the preparation and fair presentation of financial statements that are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error. Management's election of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit does not affect management's responsibility for the financial statements.

## Notes to Financial Statements June 30, 2024 and 2023

### NOTE A - DESCRIPTION OF THE PLAN

The following description of the Newark Academy DC Retirement Plan (the "Plan") provides only general information. Participants should refer to the Plan agreement for a more complete description of the Plan's provisions.

#### [1] General:

The Plan is a defined contribution plan, also known as a tax-sheltered annuity plan, covering all full-time employees, as defined, of Newark Academy (the "School"). All full-time employees that are at least 21 years of age are required to enter the Plan at a mandatory deferral rate of 5% upon the completion of one year of employment with the School. The one-year service requirement is waived for those employees who elect to contribute the 5% deferral upon date of hire or during their first year of employment. If employees opt not to contribute in their first year of employment, the mandatory 5% is effective upon the completion of one year of service. If an employee has previously worked for any 501(c)(3) educational institution which has a 403(b) retirement plan, hours of service with the previous education institution will be credited for vesting purposes.

The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 ("ERISA").

The Plan recordkeeper is TIAA ("Teachers Insurance and Annuity Association of America"). TIAA and CREF ("College Retirement Equities Fund") are the insurance companies for the Plan's non-mutual fund investments, and TIAA, FSB through July 14, 2023 and thereafter TIAA Trust, N.A. is the custodian for the remaining portion of the Plan's investments (mutual funds).

#### [2] Contributions:

Participants must contribute 5% of their pre-tax compensation as a condition of employment beginning at the start of their second year of service. Full time participants may contribute 5% of their pre-tax compensation during their first year of service. In no event may a participant's pre-tax contribution exceed any statutory limitations.

The School contributes 5%, 7.5% or 10% of the employee's compensation, based on the number of years of service the employee has completed, as defined by the Plan.

Participants direct the investment of participant and employer contributions into various investment options offered by the Plan.

The School offers an additional plan, Newark Academy TDA, for participants who wish to contribute more than the mandatory contribution of 5%.

#### [3] Participant accounts:

Each participant's account is credited with the participant's contribution and allocations of (a) the School's contributions and (b) Plan earnings (losses), and may be charged with an allocation of administrative expenses paid by the Plan. Allocations are based on participant earnings, account balances or specific participant transactions, as defined. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant's vested account.

#### [4] Vesting:

Participants are immediately vested in their contributions, plus actual earnings thereon. All employer contributions received by participants are not vested for the first year of service. After meeting the one year of service requirement, participants are fully vested in all employer-matching contributions. If an employee has previously worked for any 501(c)(3) educational institution which has a 403(b) retirement plan, hours of service with the previous education institution will be credited for vesting purposes.

#### NOTE A - DESCRIPTION OF THE PLAN (CONTINUED)

**[5] Participant loans:**

Participant loans are not allowed under the Plan.

**[6] Payment of benefits:**

On termination of service, a participant may elect to receive a lump-sum amount, partial payments and installment payments or purchase an annuity contract equal to the value of the participant's vested interest in his or her account.

**[7] Revenue credit arrangement:**

TIAA provides a list of investment options for which revenue credits are paid to the Plan. This income can be used to pay Plan expenses or can be allocated to participants. For the year ended June 30, 2024, \$37,684 was received by the Plan which is reported as "Other income" and \$7,200 was paid out as investment advisory fees. These items are reflected as such in the statement of changes in net assets available for benefits. At June 30, 2024 and 2023, the account balance was \$18,612 and \$33,237, respectively.

**[8] Forfeitures:**

Forfeitures may arise from excess aggregate contributions and are used to reduce future Plan contributions. During the year ended June 30, 2024, forfeitures of approximately \$11,000 were used for employer contributions. Forfeiture accounts available at June 30, 2024 and 2023 were \$4 and \$10,638, respectively.

#### NOTE B - SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

**[1] Basis of accounting:**

The financial statements are prepared on the accrual method of accounting.

Investments held by a defined contribution plan are required to be reported at fair value, except for fully benefit-responsive investment contracts. Contract value is the relevant measure for the portion of the net assets available for benefits of a defined contribution plan attributable to fully benefit-responsive investment contracts, because contract value is the amount participants normally would receive if they were to initiate permitted transactions under the terms of the Plan.

**[2] Subsequent events:**

The Plan has evaluated subsequent events through April 10, 2025, which is the date the financial statements were available to be issued.

**[3] Investment valuation and income recognition:**

The Plan's investments are reported at fair value (except for fully benefit-responsive investment contracts, which are reported at contract value). Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. See Note D for discussion of fair value measurements. Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Net appreciation in the value of investments includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold, as well as held during the year.

##### [4] Payment of benefits:

Benefits are recorded when paid.

##### [5] Plan expenses:

Substantially all expenses, with the exception of certain investment advisory fees, incurred in connection with the administration of the Plan, are paid by the School. Expenses that are paid by the School are excluded from these financial statements.

##### [6] Use of estimates:

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America requires the Plan administrator to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities and changes therein, and when applicable, disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities at the date of the financial statements. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

#### NOTE C - INVESTMENT CERTIFICATION

The Plan administrator has elected the method of compliance permitted by 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the U.S. Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. Accordingly, as permitted under such election, TIAA and CREF with respect to the Plan's annuity contracts issued by TIAA and/or CREF as of June 30, 2024 and June 30, 2023 and for the year ended June 30, 2024, and TIAA on behalf of TIAA, FSB with respect to the Plan's other investments held as directed trustee or custodian that were recordkept by TIAA as of June 30, 2023 and for the period July 1, 2023 to July 14, 2023 and TIAA on behalf of TIAA Trust, N.A. with respect to the Plan's other investments held as directed trustee or custodian that were recordkept by TIAA as of June 30, 2024 and for the period July 15, 2023 to June 30, 2024, have certified to the completeness and accuracy of all investments and related investment activity in the accompanying statements of net assets available for benefits as of June 30, 2024 and 2023, the statement of changes in net assets available for benefits for the year ended June 30, 2024 and the accompanying supplemental schedule of assets (held at end of year) as of June 30, 2024.

#### NOTE D - FAIR VALUE MEASUREMENTS

The Financial Accounting Standards Board's ("FASB") Accounting Standards Codification ("ASC") 820, *Fair Value Measurements and Disclosures*, provides the framework for measuring fair value. The framework provides a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (Level 1 measurements), and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (Level 3 measurements). The three levels of the fair value hierarchy are described as follows:

*Level 1* – Inputs to the valuation methodology are unadjusted quoted prices for identical assets or liabilities in active markets that the Plan has the ability to access.

*Level 2* – Inputs to the valuation methodology include: (1) quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities in active markets; (2) quoted prices for identical or similar assets or liabilities in inactive markets; (3) inputs other than quoted prices that are observable for the asset or liability; or (4) inputs that are derived principally from or corroborated by observable market data by correlation or other means. If the asset or liability has a specified (contractual) term, the Level 2 input must be observable for substantially the full term of the asset or liability.

*Level 3* – Inputs to the valuation methodology are unobservable and significant to the fair value measurement.

#### **NOTE D - FAIR VALUE MEASUREMENTS (CONTINUED)**

The asset's or liability's fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques used need to maximize the use of observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs.

Following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for assets measured at fair value. There have been no changes in the methodologies used at June 30, 2024 and 2023.

Mutual Funds – Valued at the daily closing price as reported by the fund. Mutual funds held by the Plan are open-ended mutual funds that are registered with the Securities and Exchange Commission (“SEC”). These funds are required to publish their daily net asset value (“NAV”) and to transact at that price. The mutual funds held by the Plan are deemed to be actively traded.

Nuveen Mutual Funds – The funds invest principally in equity securities, fixed-income instruments, other mutual funds and short-term instruments in accordance with each fund's investment objectives. Fund holdings are generally valued using market quotations or prices obtained from independent pricing services. Shares of Nuveen funds are valued at NAV. Certain funds charge a 2% redemption fee on redemptions of shares occurring within 60 days of the initial purchase date. The funds impose a restriction whereby a participant is locked out of a fund for 90 days if the participant has a purchase, sale or repurchase within a fund and is made within a 60-day period, for the majority of these funds.

The TIAA Real Estate Account – The TIAA Real Estate Account is a pooled separate account/insurance company separate account (“PSA”). This is a variable annuity product valued at NAV per accumulation unit, as a practical expedient to measure fair value, based on the market value of the underlying real estate holdings or other real estate-related investments. Real estate holdings are valued principally utilizing external appraisals, which are estimates of property values based on the assessment of specialists and reported by TIAA. The TIAA Real Estate Account sometimes holds securities as well, and these are generally priced using values obtained from independent pricing sources. Transactions out are limited to one per calendar quarter. The TIAA General Account provides the Real Estate Account with a liquidity guarantee.

CREF Accounts – CREF Accounts are variable annuity accounts. Each CREF Account is a separate portfolio with its own investment objective and strategies. Investments in a CREF Account enable a unit holder to acquire units whose accumulation unit value, or NAV used as a practical expedient to measure fair value, is calculated each business day. The value of a unit holder's investment rises and falls with the returns on the underlying assets. The Accounts invest principally in equity securities, fixed income instruments and short-term investments in accordance with each portfolio's investment objectives. The strategy of these investments is generally embedded in the name of the particular investment as shown on the supplemental schedule of assets (held at end of year). The name typically includes the investment style and/or market capitalization. Account investments are primarily valued using market quotations or prices obtained from independent pricing sources that may employ various pricing methods to value the investments including matrix pricing. The funds impose a restriction whereby a participant is locked out of a fund for 90 days if the participant has a purchase, sale or repurchase within a fund and is made within a 60-day period, other than for the CREF Money Market Fund.

The CREF Money Market – The CREF Money Market Account's portfolio securities are valued using their amortized cost. This valuation method does not factor in unrealized gains or losses on the Account's portfolio securities. Amortized cost valuation involves first valuing a security at its cost, and thereafter assuming a constant amortization to maturity of any discount or premium, regardless of the impact of fluctuating interest rates on the security's market value.

Accumulation units in CREF Accounts are transacted at the accumulation unit value. Participants will be locked out of a CREF Account for 90 days if a purchase, sale, and repurchase within that Account is made within a 60-day period, other than for the CREF Money Market Account.

TIAA Access Annuities – TIAA Access Annuities are separate accounts of TIAA and are variable annuities registered with the SEC as investment companies under the Investment Company Act of 1940. They operate as unit investment trusts and invest in shares of underlying mutual funds. Contributions to TIAA Access Annuities buy accumulation units whose value is calculated daily. The accumulation units are valued at NAV as a practical expedient to measure fair value. The value of a participant's investment rises and falls with the return on the underlying assets. The strategy of these investments is generally embedded in the name of the particular investment as shown on the supplemental schedule of assets (held at end of year). The name typically includes the investment style and/or market capitalization. There are no redemption fees or restrictions.

The preceding methods described may produce a fair value calculation that may not be indicative of net realizable value or reflective of future fair values. Furthermore, although the Plan believes its valuation methods are appropriate and consistent with other market participants, the use of different methodologies or assumptions to determine the fair value of certain financial instruments could result in a different fair value measurement at the reporting date.

(A) Certain investments that are measured at fair value using the NAV per share (or its equivalent) practical expedient have not been classified in the fair value hierarchy. #### Changes in Fair Value Levels

The availability of observable market data is monitored to assess the appropriate classification of financial instruments within the fair value hierarchy. Changes in economic conditions or model-based valuation techniques may require the transfer of financial instruments from one fair value level to another.

#### NOTE E - INVESTMENTS AT CONTRACT VALUE

The TIAA Stable Value is a fixed-rate annuity contract that provides a guaranteed minimum rate of interest between 1% and 3% (before deductions for contract fees), with the potential for crediting of additional interest above the guaranteed minimum if approved by the TIAA Board of Trustees. Contributions are deposited into a non-unitized separate account. The TIAA Stable Value is immediately liquid to a participant for withdrawals and transfers and does not have withdrawal restrictions (except that immediate transfers cannot be made to competing investment options pursuant to the contract's equity wash provisions, as defined). Transfers may be made to a competing fund following a 90-day waiting period after being transferred to a non-competing fund. In addition, transfers into the TIAA Stable Value may not be made for 30 days following a transfer out. A plan's investment in the TIAA Stable Value is reported at contract value in all plan and participant reporting. Contract value equals the accumulated cash contributions, interest credited and transfers, if any, less any withdrawals and transfers. Plan sponsors choosing to terminate a plan's investment in the TIAA Stable Value contract will receive contract value in, at most, two years. If the two-year payout applies, a discontinuance fee will be assessed, which has the effect of reducing the interest credited during the two-year period by, at most, 75 basis points.

The TIAA Traditional Annuity is a fixed-rate annuity contract that is fully and unconditionally guaranteed by TIAA. The guarantees and returns of the TIAA Traditional Annuity are backed by TIAA's claims-paying ability. Liquidity restrictions apply to the TIAA Traditional Annuity under certain types of annuity contracts. The TIAA Traditional Annuity provides a guarantee of principal, a guaranteed minimum rate of interest (generally 3%, or for Retirement Choice ("RC") and Retirement Choice Plus ("RCP"), between 1% and 3%) and the potential for additional interest if declared by TIAA.

#### **NOTE E - INVESTMENTS AT CONTRACT VALUE (CONTINUED)**

Additional interest, when declared, remains in effect for the “declaration year,” which begins each March 1st. Additional interest is not guaranteed for future years. Contributions to a participant’s account purchase a guaranteed amount of lifetime annuity income. When a participant’s account in the TIAA Traditional Annuity is annuitized based on available options, the present value of the stream of payments is equal to the account balance. The subsequent stream of annuity payments occurs outside of the Plan and does not represent an obligation of the Plan. The TIAA Traditional Annuity is fully benefit-responsive and is reported at contract value. The contract value equals the accumulated cash contributions, interest credited to the contracts and transfers, if any, less any withdrawals and transfers. The TIAA Traditional Annuity is not available for sale or transfer on any securities exchange.

The TIAA Traditional Annuity within the RCP contracts have no liquidity restrictions. The TIAA Traditional Annuity holdings within the Retirement Annuity (“RA”) and RC contracts have liquidity restrictions.

The RA contract does not allow lump-sum cash withdrawals, and transfers must be spread over a period of ten annual installments.

For the RC contracts, transfers and withdrawals from the TIAA Traditional Annuity are limited. Withdrawals must be taken in 84 monthly installments made in 120 days following termination of employment (transfer payout annuity), except that a lump-sum distribution is available if permitted under the Plan in the 120-day period following termination of employment, with a 2.5% surrender charge. The contract value equals the accumulated cash contributions and interest credited to the contract, less any withdrawals. The transfer payout annuity allows participants to transfer or withdraw their TIAA Traditional Annuity in ten annual installments.

The Plan’s ability to receive amounts due in accordance with fully benefit-responsive investment contracts is dependent on the third-party issuer’s ability to meet its financial obligations. The issuer’s ability to meet its contractual obligations may be affected by future economic and regulatory developments.

No events are probable of occurring that might limit the ability of the Plan to transact at contract value with the contract issuers and that also would limit the ability of the Plan to transact at contract value with the participants.

#### **NOTE F - TAX STATUS**

The Plan has adopted a Volume Submitter 403(b) Plan sponsored by TIAA. On August 7, 2017, the Internal Revenue Service (“IRS”) stated in an advisory letter that the Volume Submitter adopted by the Plan, as then designed, was in compliance with applicable requirements of the Internal Revenue Code (“IRC”) and, therefore, the related accounts are exempt from taxation. The Plan has been amended since receiving the letter. However, the Plan administrator believes that the Plan is currently designed and being operated in compliance with the applicable requirements of the IRC. Therefore, the Plan administrator believes that the Plan is qualified and the related accounts are tax-exempt.

Accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America require Plan management to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan and recognize a tax liability (or asset) if the Plan has taken an uncertain position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by a government authority. The Plan administrator has analyzed the tax positions taken by the Plan, and has concluded that as of June 30, 2024 and 2023, there are no uncertain positions taken or expected to be taken that would require recognition of a liability or disclosure in the financial statements. The Plan is subject to routine examinations by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no examinations for any tax periods in progress.

#### **NOTE G - RELATED PARTY TRANSACTIONS AND PARTY-IN-INTEREST TRANSACTIONS**

A substantial portion of Plan investments are fixed and variable annuities, a pooled separate account and mutual funds sponsored by TIAA, CREF and TIAA, FSB through July 14, 2023, and thereafter TIAA Trust, N.A. TIAA is the Plan's recordkeeper, TIAA and CREF are the Plan's insurance companies and TIAA, FSB through July 14, 2023, and thereafter TIAA Trust, N.A is the custodian of certain Plan investments; therefore transactions related to these investments qualify as party-in-interest transactions. For the year ended June 30, 2024, administrative, advisory and auditing fees totaling \$16,925 were paid by the Plan, which are party-in-interest transactions.

#### **NOTE H - RISKS AND UNCERTAINTIES**

The Plan invests in various investment securities. Investment securities are exposed to various risks, such as interest rate, market and credit risks, as well as risks related to the financial strength of the insurance company. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the values of investment securities will occur in the near term, and that such changes could materially affect the participants' account balances and the amounts reported in the statements of net assets available for benefits.

Volatility in the financial markets may significantly impact the subsequent valuation of the Plan's investments. Accordingly, the valuation of investments at June 30, 2024 may not necessarily be indicative of amounts that could be realized in a current market exchange.

#### **NOTE I - PLAN TERMINATION**

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the School has the right under the Plan to discontinue its contributions at any time and to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions of ERISA.

#### **NOTE J - MUTUAL FUND FEES**

Investments in mutual funds are subject to sales charges in the form of front-end loads, back-end loads or 12b-1 fees. 12b-1 fees, which are ongoing fees allowable under Section 12b-1 of the Investment Company Act of 1940, are annual fees deducted to pay for marketing and distribution costs of the funds. These fees are deducted prior to the allocation of the Plan's investment earnings activity, and thus not separately identifiable as an expense.
