### **Scope and Nature of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) Audit**

We have performed an audit of the accompanying financial statements of American Torch Tip Company 401(k) Plan, an employee benefit plan subject to the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA), as permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) [ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit]. **NOTE A – DESCRIPTION OF PLAN**

The following description of the American Torch Tip Company (the “Company”) 401(k) Plan (the “Plan”) established March 1, 1993, and subsequently restated August 24, 2009, provides only general information. Users of the financial statements and supplementary schedule should refer to the Plan agreement for a more complete description of the Plan's provisions.

General

The Plan is a defined contribution plan covering all employees of the Company who have one year of service and are aged twenty-one or older. The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA).

Contributions

Each year, participants may contribute from one percent to fifty percent of annual compensation, limited by regulations of the Internal Revenue Code. Participants may also contribute amounts representing distributions from other qualified defined benefit or contribution plans. Participants direct the investment of their contributions into various investment options offered by the Plan. The Company may make a discretionary matching contribution up to 50 percent of a Participant's annual compensation. For the years ended June 30, 2024 and 2023, the Company has elected to match 25 percent of the first 6 percent contributed by participants. Contributions are subject to certain limitations. The Company may also make a discretionary contribution based on an integrated formula designed to provide the top-heavy minimum contribution. The Company has elected not to make this discretionary contribution for the years ended June 30, 2024 and 2023.

Participant Accounts

Each participant's account is credited with the participant's contribution and an allocation of (a) the Company's contribution and (b) Plan earnings and charged with an allocation of administrative expenses. Allocations are based on participant earnings or account balances, as defined. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant's vested account.

Vesting

Participants are vested immediately in their contributions plus actual earnings thereon. Vesting in the Company's discretionary matching contribution portion of their accounts plus actual earnings thereon is based on years of continuous service. A participant is 100 percent vested after six years of credited service.

Participant Note Receivable

Participants may borrow from their fund accounts a minimum of \$500 up to a maximum equal to the lesser of \$50,000 or 50 percent of their account balance. The loans are secured by the balance in the participant's account and bear interest at prime plus two percent. Principal and interest is paid ratably through monthly payroll deductions. Repayments of participant loans vary by participant; however, the repayment period will not exceed five years per Plan documents.

Benefits

Upon termination of service due to death, disability or retirement, a participant may elect to receive an amount equal to the value of the participant's vested interest in his or her account. The form of payment is a lump sum distribution.

Forfeited Amounts

Forfeited non-vested accounts totaled \$2,607 and \$3,884 as of June 30, 2024 and 2023, respectively. These accounts are used to reduce future employer contributions.

**NOTE B – SUMMARY OF ACCOUNTING POLICIES**

Basis of Accounting

The financial statements of the Plan are prepared under the accrual method of accounting.

Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America requires the plan administrator to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities and changes therein, and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

Investment Valuation and Income Recognition

Investments of the Plan are reported at fair value. Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. See Note C for discussion of fair value measurements. The interest in the guaranteed interest account is a fixed amount set forth in the Plan agreement and is carried at contract value (See Note E). The interests in pooled separate accounts are valued at quoted market prices which represent the net asset value of units held by the Plan at the end of each day.

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Net appreciation includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold as well as held during the year.

Notes Receivable from Participants

Notes receivable from participants are measured at their unpaid principal balance plus any accrued but unpaid interest. Delinquent participant loans are reclassified as distributions based upon the terms of the Plan document.

Payment of Benefits

Benefits are recorded when paid.

Administrative Expenses

Certain loan processing expenses and withdrawal expenses are charged directly to the participant by the Principal Financial Group. The Company pays all other administrative expenses of the Plan.

Risk and Uncertainties

The Plan provides the various investment options in any combination of investment securities as elected by each participant. Investment securities are exposed to various risks such as interest rate, market and credit risk. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the values of investment securities will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect participants' account balances and the amounts reported in the statements of net assets available for plan benefits.

**NOTE C – FAIR VALUE MEASUREMENTS**

Financial Accounting Standards Board (FASB) *Accounting Standards Codification (ASC) 820, Fair Value Measurements and Disclosures*, provides the framework for measuring fair value. That framework provides a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (level 1 measurements) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (level 3 measurements). The three levels of the fair value hierarchy under FASB ASC 820 are described as follows:

*Level 1* - Inputs to the valuation methodology are unadjusted quoted prices for identical assets or liabilities in active markets that the plan has the ability to access.

*Level 2* - Inputs to the valuation methodology include quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities in active markets; quoted prices for identical or similar assets or liabilities in inactive markets; inputs other than quoted prices that are observable for the asset or liability; and inputs that are derived principally from or corroborated by observable market data by correlation or other means.

*Level 3* - Inputs to the valuation methodology are unobservable and significant to the fair value measurement.

The asset or liability's fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques used need to maximize the use of observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs.

Following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for assets measured at fair value. There have been no changes in the methodologies used at June 30, 2024 and 2023.

*Mutual Funds* - Valued at the net asset value (NAV) of shares held by the Plan at year end.

*Pooled Separate Accounts (PSA)* - PSAs of the Plan invest mainly in domestic stocks, international stocks, and mutual funds. The majority of the underlying securities have observable level 1 quoted pricing inputs. While the underlying assets values are quoted prices, the net asset value (NAV) of a separate account is not publicly quoted. ASC 820 allows NAV per share to serve as a practical expedient to estimate the fair value of a PSA as long as certain requirements are met. Its Principal's assessment that the PSAs in the Plan meet those requirements. ASC 820 goes on to state that where NAV is allowed to be used as an estimate of fair value, if the reporting entity has the ability to redeem its investment at NAV as of the measurement date, that investment shall be categorized as a Level 2 fair value measurement. If the investment cannot be redeemed at the measurement date but may be redeemable in the future, but at an uncertain date, the investment shall be categorized as a Level 2 fair value measurement. The PSAs in the Plan can be redeemed at NAV as of the measurement date and are thus categorized as Level 2 fair value measurements.

*Guaranteed investment contract* - Valued at fair value by discounting the related cash flows based on current yields of similar instruments with comparable durations considering the credit-worthiness of the issuer (see note E)

The preceding methods described may produce a fair value calculation that may not be indicative of net realizable value or reflective of future fair values. Furthermore, although the Plan believes its valuation methods are appropriate and consistent with other market participants, the use of different methodologies or assumptions to determine the fair value of certain financial instruments could result in a different fair value measurement at the reporting date.

**NOTE E – INVESTMENT CONTRACTS WITH INSURANCE COMPANY**

The Plan has five benefit-responsive investment contracts (annuity contracts) with the Principal Financial Group (Principal). Principal maintains the contributions in a general account. The account is credited with earnings on the underlying investments and charged for participant withdrawals and administrative expenses. The guaranteed investment contract issuer is contractually obligated to repay the principal and a specified interest rate that is guaranteed to the Plan.

Because the guaranteed investment contract is fully benefit-responsive, contract value is the relevant measurement attribute for that portion of the net assets available for benefits attributable to the guaranteed investment contract. The guaranteed investment contract is presented on the face of the statement of net assets available for benefits at fair value with an adjustment to contract value in arriving at net assets available for benefits. Contract value, as reported to the Plan by Principal, represents contributions made under the contract, plus earnings, less participant withdrawals and administrative expenses. Participants may ordinarily direct the withdrawal or transfer of all or a portion of their investment contract value.

There are no reserves against contract value for credit risk of the contract issuer or otherwise. The fair value of the investment contract at June 30, 2024 and 2023 were \$48,266 and \$52,151, respectively. The crediting interest rate is based on a formula agreed upon with the issuer. There is no minimum crediting interest rate under the terms of the contracts.

The average yields and crediting interest rates are as follows:

The guaranteed investment contract does not permit the insurance company to terminate the agreement prior to the scheduled maturity date.

Certain events limit the ability of the Plan to transact at contract value with the issuer. Such events include the following: (1) amendments to the Plan documents (including complete or partial Plan termination or merger with another Plan), (2) changes to the Plan's prohibition on competing investment options or deletion of equity wash provisions, (3) bankruptcy of the Plan sponsor or other Plan sponsor events that cause a significant withdrawal from the Plan, or (4) the failure of the trust to qualify for exemption from federal income taxes or any required prohibited transaction exemption under ERISA. The plan administrator does not believe that any events which would limit the Plan's ability to transact at contract value with participants are probable of occurring.

**NOTE F – TAX STATUS**

The trust established under the Plan to hold the Plan's assets is qualified pursuant to the appropriate section of the Internal Revenue code (IRC), and, accordingly, the trust's net investment income is exempt from income taxes. The Plan has obtained a favorable tax determination letter from the Internal Revenue Service dated March 31, 2008. Although the Plan has been restated since receiving the determination letter, the plan administrator believes that the Plan is designed and is currently being operated in compliance with the applicable requirements of the IRC and therefore believes that the Plan is qualified and related trust is tax-exempt.

Accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America require Plan management to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan and recognize a tax liability (or asset) if the Plan has taken an uncertain position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by the Internal Revenue Service. The plan administrator has analyzed the tax positions taken by the Plan, and has concluded that as of June 30, 2024, there are no uncertain positions taken or expected to be taken that would require recognition of a liability (or asset) or disclosure in the financial statements. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress. The plan administrator believes it is no longer subject to income tax examinations for years prior to 2021.

**NOTE G – PLAN TERMINATION**

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the Company has the right under the Plan to discontinue its contributions at any time and to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions of ERISA. In the event of Plan termination, participants would become 100 percent vested in their employer contributions.

**NOTE H – RELATED-PARTY TRANSACTIONS**

The Plan invests in pooled separate accounts and guaranteed interest accounts managed by the Principal Financial Group (Principal). Principal is the custodian as defined by the Plan and, therefore, these transactions qualify as party-in-interest transactions. Fees paid by the Plan for administrative services paid to Principal were \$4,053 and \$2,928 for the years ending June 30, 2024 and 2023, respectively.

**NOTE I – EXCESS AND CORRECTIVE CONTRIBUTIONS**

There were \$-0- and \$2,616 in excess contributions for the years ending June 30, 2024 and 2023, respectively, as a result of non-compliance with the 401(k) Actual Deferral Percentage (ADP) nondiscrimination test. During the plan year ended June 30, 2023, a highly compensated employee received a refund for excess contributions that occurred during the prior plan year.
