Scope and Nature of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) Audit

We have performed audits of the accompanying financial statements of Health Care & Rehabilitation Services of Southeastern Vermont Retirement Plan, an employee benefit plan subject to the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA), as permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) [ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit]. Management has obtained certifications from a qualified institution as of June 30, 2024, and 2023, and for the years ended June 30, 2024, and 2023, stating that the certified investment information, as described in Note 4 to the financial statements, is complete and accurate.

Opinion

In our opinion, based on our audits and on the procedures performed as described in the Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements section—

- the amounts and disclosures in the financial statements referred to above, other than those agreed to or derived from the certified investment information, are presented fairly, in all material respects, in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.

- the information in the financial statements referred to above related to assets held by and certified to by a qualified institution agrees to, or is derived from, in all material respects, the information prepared and certified by an institution that management determined meets the requirements of ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C).

Basis for Opinion

We conducted our audits in accordance with auditing standards generally accepted in the United States of America. Our responsibilities under those standards are further described in the Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements section of our report. We are required to be independent of Health Care & Rehabilitation Services of Southeastern Vermont Retirement Plan and to meet our other ethical responsibilities in accordance with the relevant ethical requirements relating to our audits. We believe that the audit evidence we have obtained is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for our ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit opinion.

Responsibilities of Management for the Financial Statements

Management is responsible for the preparation and fair presentation of these financial statements in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America, and for the design, implementation, and maintenance of internal control relevant to the preparation and fair presentation of financial statements that are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error. Management's election of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit does not affect management's responsibility for the financial statements.

In preparing the financial statements, management is required to evaluate whether there are conditions or events, considered in the aggregate, that raise substantial doubt about Health Care & Rehabilitation Services of Southeastern Vermont Retirement Plan's ability to continue as a going concern for one year after the date the financial statements are available to be issued.

Management is also responsible for maintaining a current plan instrument, including all plan amendments; administering the plan; and determining that the plan's transactions that are presented and disclosed in the financial statements are in conformity with the plan's provisions, including maintaining sufficient records with respect to each of the participants, to determine the benefits due or which may become due to such participants.

We are required to communicate with those charged with governance regarding, among other matters, the planned scope and timing of the audit, significant audit findings, and certain internal control-related matters that we identified during the audit.

The information included in the supplemental schedule, other than that agreed to or derived from the certified investment information, has been subjected to auditing procedures applied in the audit of the financial statements and certain additional procedures, including comparing and reconciling such information directly to the underlying accounting and other records used to prepare the financial statements or to the financial statements themselves, and other additional procedures in accordance with generally accepted auditing standards. For information included in the supplemental schedule that agreed to or is derived from the certified investment information, we compared such information to the related certified investment information.

In forming our opinion on the supplemental schedule, we evaluated whether the supplemental schedule, other than the information agreed to or derived from the certified investment information, including their form and content, are presented in conformity with the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA.

NOTE 1 DESCRIPTION OF PLAN

The following brief description of the Health Care and Rehabilitation Services of Southeastern Vermont ("Company") Retirement Plan ("Plan") is provided for general information purposes only. Participants should refer to the Plan agreement for more complete information.

General

The Plan is a single employer defined contribution plan covering all employees of the Company who normally work 20 hours or more per week upon hire with no eligibility requirements. The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act (ERISA).

On July 1, 2012, the plan was amended to provide for an eligible automatic contribution arrangement. Under the amendment, effective July 1, 2012, all eligible employees are automatically enrolled in the plan. Elective deferral contributions made pursuant to the automatic contribution arrangement shall be pre-tax elective contributions and shall be 2% of compensation. The participant may elect a different percentage or elect not to make elective deferral contributions.

Contributions

Participants are allowed to elect to defer percentages of their salary up to the federal limits in any given tax year. Participants may also contribute amounts representing distributions from other qualified defined benefit or contribution plans, and participants that are 50 years old or older could make additional "catch-up" contributions. Participants direct the investment of their contributions into various investment options offered by the Plan. The Plan currently offers several mutual funds and an unallocated fixed income insurance contract as investment options for participants. The employer may contribute a discretionary match of 100% of employee deferrals of 2-5% of pay.

Participant Accounts

Each participant's account is credited with the participant's voluntary contribution, the Company's matching contribution, investment income and an allocation of the Company's discretionary contribution. Allocations are based on participant account balances.

Vesting

Voluntary participant contributions, and related investment income, are fully vested at all times. Participants own an increasing share of employer matching contributions based on the number of years of service with the Company. A year of service is the total of a Participants' countable periods of service without regard to hours. Participants are 100% vested in the employer matching contributions portion of their accounts after five years of service, 20% per year.

Payment of Benefits

A participant may not make withdrawals from his Participant's Elective Account except for:

- (1) Normal retirement - age 65;
- (2) Death;
- (3) Termination of employment;
- (4) Attainment of age 59 ½; or
- (5) Financial hardship

Distributions will be paid as soon as possible following termination date, except for financial hardship withdrawals which are payable immediately. Distributions are paid to participants in a lump sum or annual payments, including life annuities.

Investment Options

Principal Trust Company is the custodian for the Plan.

Participant Notes Receivable

Participants may borrow from their fund accounts a minimum of \$1,000 up to a maximum equal to the lesser of \$50,000 or 50% of their vested account balance. Loans are generally repaid through payroll deductions in five years or less. The interest rate on participant loans is "Wall Street Journal Prime Rate" plus 1%. Notes receivable from participants totaled \$360,699 and \$313,066 as of June 30, 2024 and 2023, respectively. Notes receivable from participants are stated at their unpaid balances.

Allowance for Doubtful Accounts

The plan considers allowance for doubtful accounts to be amounts that would not be collectible by the plan. All participant loans are secured by vested participant balances. Therefore, there is no allowance for doubtful accounts at June 30, 2024 and 2023.

Forfeited Accounts

Amounts forfeited due to terminations are used to first pay administrative expenses and then to reduce the Company's matching contributions. Forfeitures used during June 30, 2024 and 2023 amounted to \$119,423 and \$73,608, respectively.

NOTE 2 SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES:

The following are the significant accounting policies followed by the Plan:

Basis of Accounting

The Plan's policy is to prepare its financial statements on the accrual basis of accounting; revenues are recognized when earned and expenses are recorded when the obligation is incurred.

Use of Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities and changes therein and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

Investment Valuation and Income Recognition

The Plan's investments are stated at fair value. Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. See Note 7 for discussion of fair value measurements.

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Net appreciation includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold as well as held during the year.

Payment of Benefits

Benefits are recorded when paid.

Operating Expenses

Custodian fees are paid by the Plan.

Subsequent Events

The Plan has evaluated subsequent events through March 31, 2025, the date the financial statements were available to be issued.

NOTE 3 PLAN TERMINATION

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the Company has the right under the Plan to discontinue its contributions at any time and to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions of ERISA. In the event of Plan termination, participants would become fully vested and would be entitled to the full value of their account.

NOTE 4 INFORMATION PREPARED AND CERTIFIED BY CUSTODIAN (UNAUDITED)

The Plan administrator had elected the method of compliance permitted by 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. Principal Trust Company served as the Plan's custodian. They have provided the Plan administrator with certifications as to the completeness and accuracy of cash, investment balances, supplemental schedules, interest and dividend income, realized gains (losses) on the sale of investments and unrealized appreciation (depreciation) of investments in accordance with the Department of Labor Regulations.

NOTE 5 TAX STATUS

The Plan is a non-standardized prototype plan sponsored by the Principal Trust Company. The Recordkeeper has obtained an opinion letter as a volume submitter on the Plan dated March 31, 2017, stating that the form of the plan is acceptable under the Internal Revenue Code (Code). Generally, the Plan administrator and the Plan may rely on the opinion letter received by the Recordkeeper as to the form of the Plan qualifying under the Code (except as otherwise noted in the opinion letter). Additionally, the plan administrator believes that the Plan is currently being operated in compliance with the applicable requirements of the Code and accordingly is tax-exempt.

Accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America require plan management to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan and recognize a tax liability (or derecognize an asset) if the Plan has taken an uncertain position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by the IRC. The plan administrator has analyzed the tax positions taken by the Plan, and has concluded that as of June 30, 2024, there are no uncertain positions taken or expected to be taken that would require recognition of a liability (or de-recognition of an asset) or disclosure in the financial statements. The Plan is subject to routine audit by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress. The federal tax returns for the years ended after June 30, 2021, remain open for potential examination by the Department of Labor.

NOTE 6 RISKS AND UNCERTAINTIES

The Plan invests in various investment securities. Investment securities are exposed to various risks such as interest rate, market and credit risks. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the values of investment securities will occur in the near term and that such change could materially affect participant's accounts and the amounts reported in the statements of net assets available for benefits.

NOTE 7 FAIR VALUE MEASUREMENTS

The Plan has implemented *Fair Value Measurements*. This established fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (level 1 measurements) and the low priority to unobservable inputs (level 3 measurements). The three levels of fair value hierarchy under are described below:

- Level 1- Unadjusted quoted prices in active markets that are accessible at the measurement date for identical, unrestricted assets or liabilities:

- Level 2- Quoted prices in markets that are not considered to be active or financial instruments for which all significant inputs are observable, either directly or indirectly:

- Level 3- Prices or valuations that require inputs that are both significant to the fair value measurement and unobservable.

A financial instrument's level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement.

The following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for assets measured at fair value. There have been no changes in the methodologies used at June 30, 2024 and 2023.

Mutual funds: Valued at quoted market prices on an active exchange.

Mutual Funds: Valued at the daily closing price as reported by the fund. Mutual funds held by the Plan are open-end mutual funds that are registered with the Securities and Exchange Commission. These funds are required to publish their daily net asset value (NAV) and to transact at that price. The mutual funds held by the Plan are deemed to be actively traded.

The methods described above may produce a fair value calculation that may not be indicative of net realizable value or reflective of future fair values. Furthermore, while the Plan believes its valuation methods are appropriate and consistent with other market participants, the use of the different methodologies or assumptions to determine the fair value of certain financial instruments could result in a different fair value measurement at the reporting date.

NOTE 8 INVESTMENT CONTRACT WITH INSURANCE COMPANY

The Plan has a benefit responsive investment contract with the Principal Trust Company. The Principal Trust Company maintains the contributions in a general account. The account is credited with earnings on the underlying investments and charged for participant withdrawals and administrative expenses. The group annuity contract issuer is contractually obligated to repay the principal and specified interest rate that is guaranteed to the Plan. The methodology for calculating the interest crediting rate is defined in Article I, Section 2 of the contract under the term "Composite Crediting Rate." Under the terms of the existing contract, the Composite Crediting Rate is currently reset on a semiannual basis and will never be less than the Guaranteed Minimum Interest Rate.

Changes in future interest crediting rates will not affect the amount reported on the statement of net assets available for benefits representing the adjustment for the portion of net assets attributable to fully benefit-responsive investment contracts from fair value to contract value as fair value is considered book value less early withdrawal charge.

Because the group annuity contract is fully benefit responsive, contract value is the relevant measurement attribute for that portion of the net assets available for benefits attributable to the group annuity contract. Contract value, as reported to the Plan by the Principal Trust Company, represents contributions made under contract, plus earnings, less participant withdrawals and administrative expenses. Participants may ordinarily direct the withdrawal or transfer of all or a portion of their investment at contract value.

There are no reserves against contract value for credit risk of the contract issuer. Such events include the following: (1) amendments to the plan documents (including complete or partial plan termination or merger with another plan), (2) changes to the plan's prohibitions on competing investment options or deletion of equity wash provisions, (3) bankruptcy of the plan sponsor or other plan sponsor events (for example, divestitures or spin-offs of a subsidiary) that cause a significant withdrawal from the plan, or (4) the failure of the trust to qualify for exemption from federal income taxes or any required prohibited transaction exemption under Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974.

The Plan administrator does not believe that the occurrence of any such value event, which would limit the Plan's ability to transact at contract value with participants, is probable.

The group annuity contract charges a 5% withdrawal charge to terminate the agreement prior to the scheduled maturity date.

The Principal Fixed Income Option is a single group annuity contract with a fixed rate of interest. It is not a portfolio of contracts whose yields are based on changes in fair value of underlying assets as would be found in a Stable Value fund. As a result, the average yield earned by the plan is the yield earned (i.e. interest credited) on the group annuity contract.

NOTE 9 ADMINISTRATIVE EXPENSES AND PARTY IN INTEREST TRANSACTION

Certain administrative expenses are paid by the sponsor on behalf of the Plan. Administrative expenses for record keeping paid by the Plan for the years ended June 30, 2024, and 2023 were \$116,227 and \$108,137, respectively. During the years ending June 30, 2024, and 2023, \$80,938 and \$72,910, respectively, of the administrative fees were reduced by revenue sharing arrangement. The revenue sharing benchmark is adjusted every 3-5 years based on size and metrics of the plan.

Certain plan investments are managed by Principal Life Insurance Company investments. Principal Life Insurance Company is the custodian for the plan and performs record keeping services for the plan and therefore these transactions qualify as party in interest transactions. Principal Life Insurance Company received direct compensation of \$116,227 and \$108,137 for the years ended June 30, 2024, and 2023 respectively for record keeping. Principal Life Insurance Company also received indirect compensation.
