### Report on the Audit of the Financial Statements

#### *Scope and Nature of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) Audit*

We have performed audits of the financial statements of Blue Star Gas Associates 401(k) Profit Sharing Plan, an employee benefit plan subject to the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA), as permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) (ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit). The financial statements comprise the statements of net assets available for benefits as of September 30, 2024, and June 30, 2024, and the related statements of changes in net assets available for benefits for the period from July 1, 2024 through September 30, 2024, and for the year ended June 30, 2024, and the related notes to the financial statements (collectively, the 2024 financial statements).

Management, having determined it is permissible in the circumstances, has elected to have the audits of the 2024 financial statements performed in accordance with ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) pursuant to 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. Management has obtained certifications from a qualified institution as of September 30, 2024, and June 30, 2024, and for the period from July 1, 2024 through September 30, 2024, and for the year ended June 30, 2024, stating that the certified investment information, as described in Note 6 to the financial statements, is complete and accurate.

#### **Opinion**

### ***Basis for Opinion***

#### **Note 1 – Description of Plan**

The following description of the Blue Star Gas Associates 401(k) Profit Sharing Plan (the Plan) provides only general information. Participants should refer to the Plan agreement, as amended, for a more complete description of the Plan's provisions.

**General** – The Plan is a 401(k) salary deferral and profit sharing plan covering substantially all employees of Garberville Gas Corporation, and is subject to provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA). Garberville Gas Corporation (the Company) is the Plan's sponsor and serves as plan administrator.

Effective July 1, 2024, the Plan changed its year end from June 30 to September 30.

**Eligibility** – Employees of the Company are eligible to participate in the Plan upon reaching age 21 and after completing three months of service. Employees become eligible to receive discretionary matching and nonelective contributions following the completion of one year of service.

#### **Contributions**

*Participant contributions* – Each year, participants may contribute between 1% and 90% of pretax annual compensation, as defined in the Plan. Participants may also elect to make Roth contributions utilizing after-tax contributions. Participants who have attained age 50 before the end of the Plan year are eligible to make catch-up contributions. Participants may also contribute amounts representing distributions from other qualified defined benefit or defined contribution plans. The Plan includes an auto-enrollment provision whereby all newly eligible employees are automatically enrolled in the Plan unless they affirmatively elect not to participate in the Plan. Automatically enrolled participants have their deferral rate set at 4% of eligible compensation and their contributions invested in a designated fund until elected otherwise by the participant. Unless elected otherwise by the participant, deferrals are automatically increased annually by 1%, up to a maximum auto-deferral of 10%.

*Employer match and profit sharing contributions* – The Company may elect to make discretionary matching and profit sharing contributions to the Plan. The Company matches 100% of employee contributions, up to 4% of eligible compensation deferred to the Plan. Profit sharing contributions are allocated to participants in the same proportion as a participant's compensation bears to the total of all participants' compensation. For the period from July 1, 2024, through September 30, 2024, the Company made a \$300,000 profit sharing contribution to the Plan. There were no profit sharing contributions made for the year ended June 30, 2024.

Contributions are subject to regulatory limitations.

**Participant accounts** – Each participant's account is credited with the participant's contributions and Company matching contributions, as well as allocations of the Company's profit sharing contributions and Plan earnings. Participant accounts are charged with an allocation of administrative expenses that are paid by the Plan. Allocations are based on participant earnings, account balances, or specific participant transactions, as defined. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant's vested account. Participants direct the investment of their account into various investment options offered by the Plan.

**Vesting** – Participants are vested immediately in their contributions plus actual earnings thereon. Vesting in the Company’s contribution portion of their accounts is based on years of continuous service. Participants vest in the Company’s contributions based on the following schedule:

**Notes receivable from participants** – Participants may borrow from their accounts a minimum of \$1,000 up to a maximum equal to the lesser of \$50,000 or 50% of their vested account balance. The loans are issued by the Plan and secured by the balance in the participant’s account. All loans must be repaid within a period of five years, unless the loan is used to purchase a principal residence, in which case, the loan must be repaid within a reasonable period of time not to exceed fifteen years. Under the terms of the Plan agreement, plan loans will bear a reasonable rate of interest determined by the plan administrator. Principal and interest are paid ratably through semi-monthly payroll deductions. As of September 30, 2024, and June 30, 2024, the rates of interest on outstanding loans ranged from 4.25% to 9.50%, with various maturities through August 2032.

**Payment of benefits** – On termination of service due to severance of employment, death, disability, or retirement, a participant (or their beneficiary) may elect to receive either a lump-sum amount equal to the value of the participant’s vested interest in his or her account. Participants who are required to receive lifetime required minimum distributions may elect to receive their payments in installments. The Plan allows for the automatic distribution of participant account balances that do not exceed \$7,000.

**Forfeitures** – Forfeitures are the nonvested portion of a participant’s account that are lost upon termination of employment. Forfeitures are retained in the Plan, must be used in the subsequent year, and will first be used to pay the Plan’s administrative expenses, with any remaining amount used to reduce future Company contributions. As of September 30, 2024, June 30, 2024 and 2023, forfeited nonvested accounts totaled \$65,269, \$61,046, and \$33,749, respectively. There were no forfeitures used for the period from July 1, 2024, through September 30, 2024. For the year ended June 30, 2024, forfeitures in the amount of \$25,445 were used for payment of administrative expenses.

#### **Note 2 – Summary of Significant Accounting Policies**

**Basis of accounting** – The financial statements have been prepared in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America (GAAP), using the accrual method of accounting.

**Use of estimates** – The preparation of financial statements in conformity with GAAP requires the use of estimates and assumptions that may affect certain amounts and disclosures. Accordingly, actual results could differ from those estimates.

**Investment valuation** – The investments are reported at fair value. The Plan's custodian, Empower Trust Company, LLC, certifies the fair value of all investments. If available, quoted market prices are used to value investments.

Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability (the exit price) in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. See Note 3 for discussion of fair value measurements.

**Income recognition** – Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. The net appreciation in fair value of investments consists of both the realized gains and losses and unrealized appreciation and depreciation of those investments.

**Contributions** – Contributions from participants and corresponding matching contributions are recorded in the year in which the related participant compensation is earned.

**Notes receivable from participants** – Notes receivable from participants are measured at their unpaid principal balance plus any accrued but unpaid interest. Delinquent notes receivable from participants are reclassified as distributions upon the occurrence of a distributable event, based on the terms of the Plan agreement.

**Payment of benefits** – Benefits are recorded when paid.

**Expenses** – Certain expenses of maintaining the Plan are paid directly by the Company and are excluded from these financial statements. Administrative expenses paid by the Plan may include notes receivable and distribution fees charged to participants' accounts and administrative Plan fees. Investment-related expenses are included in net appreciation in fair value of investments.

**Subsequent events** – Subsequent events are events or transactions that occur after the statement of net assets available for benefits date but before the financial statements are available to be issued. The Plan recognizes in the financial statements the effects of all subsequent events that provide additional evidence about conditions that existed at the date of the statement of net assets available for benefits, including the estimates inherent in the process of preparing the financial statements. The Plan's financial statements do not recognize subsequent events that provide evidence about conditions that did not exist at the date of the statement of net assets available for benefits but arose after the statement of net assets available for benefits date and before the financial statements are available to be issued.

The Plan has evaluated subsequent events through April 8, 2025, which is the date the financial statements were available to be issued.

#### Note 3 – Fair Value Measurements

The framework for measuring fair value provides a hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (Level 1) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (Level 3).

The three levels of the fair value hierarchy are described as follows:

**Level 1** – Inputs to the valuation methodology are unadjusted quoted prices for identical assets or liabilities the Plan has the ability to access.

**Level 2** – Inputs to the valuation methodology include quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities in active markets; quoted prices for identical or similar assets or liabilities in inactive markets; inputs other than quoted prices that are observable for the asset or liability; and inputs that are derived principally from or corroborated by observable market data by correlation or other means. If the asset or liability has a specified (contractual) term, the Level 2 input must be observable for substantially the full term of the asset or liability.

**Level 3** – Inputs to the valuation methodology are unobservable and significant to the fair value measurement.

The asset or liability's fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques maximize the use of relevant observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs.

Following is a description of the valuation techniques used for assets measured at fair value. There have been no changes in the techniques used at September 30, 2024, June 30, 2024 and 2023.

*Registered investment companies (mutual funds)* – Valued at the daily closing price as reported by the fund. These funds are required to publish their daily net asset value (NAV) and to transact at that price. The funds held by the Plan are deemed to be actively traded. Mutual funds held by the Plan are open-end mutual funds that are registered with the U.S. Securities and Exchange Commission.

*Collective trusts and stable value fund* – Units held in the stable value fund and collective trusts are valued using the NAV practical expedient of the funds as reported by the fund managers. The NAV practical expedient is based on the fair value of the underlying assets owned by the funds, minus its liabilities, and then divided by the number of units outstanding. The NAV practical expedient is not used when it is determined to be probable that the fund will sell the investment for an amount different than the NAV practical expedient.

The valuation methods used by the Plan may produce a fair value calculation that may not be indicative of net realizable value or reflective of future fair values. Furthermore, although the Plan believes its valuation methods are appropriate and consistent with other market participants, the use of different methodologies or assumptions to determine the fair value of certain financial instruments could result in a different fair value measurement at the reporting date.

#### **Note 4 – Tax Status**

The Plan has adopted a pre-approved plan document that received a favorable opinion letter from the Internal Revenue Service dated November 14, 2022, which stated that the Plan, as then designed, was in accordance with applicable sections of the Internal Revenue Code (IRC). Although the Plan has been amended since the date of the opinion letter, the plan administrator believes that the Plan is designed, and is currently being operated, in compliance with the applicable requirements of the IRC and, therefore, believes that the Plan is qualified, and the related trust is tax-exempt.

In accordance with guidance on accounting for uncertainty in income taxes, the plan administrator has evaluated the Plan's tax positions and does not believe the Plan has any uncertain tax positions that require disclosure or adjustment to the financial statements. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress.

#### **Note 5 – Risks and Uncertainties**

The Plan invests in various investment securities. Investment securities are exposed to various risks, such as interest rate, market volatility, and credit risks. It is reasonably possible, given the level of risk associated with investment securities, that changes in the values of the investments in the near term could materially affect a participant's account balance and the amounts reported in the statements of net assets available for benefits.

#### **Note 6 – Information Certified by the Custodian**

The plan administrator has elected the method of compliance permitted by 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. Accordingly, Empower Trust Company, LLC, the custodian of the Plan, has certified to the completeness and accuracy of the following:

- Investments and notes receivable from participants reflected on the accompanying statements of net assets available for benefits as of September 30, 2024, June 30, 2024 and 2023.
- Net appreciation in fair value of investments, dividends, and interest, and interest income on notes receivable from participants reflected on the accompanying statements of changes in net assets available for benefits for the period from July 1, 2024, through September 30, 2024, and for the year ended June 30, 2024.
- Investments reflected on the schedule of assets (held at end of year) as of September 30, 2024, and June 30, 2024.

#### **Note 7 – Party-in-Interest Transactions**

The Plan paid expenses related to the Plan's operations and investment management to various service providers.
