We have performed audits of the financial statements of Pointers, Cleaners & Caulkers Annuity Fund, an employee benefit plan subject to the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA), as permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) (ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit). The financial statements comprise the statements of net assets available for benefits as of June 30, 2024 and 2023, and the related statements of changes in net assets available for benefits for the years then ended, and the related notes to the financial statements.

Management, having determined it is permissible in the circumstances, has elected to have the audits of Pointers, Cleaners & Caulkers Annuity Fund's financial statements performed in accordance with ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) pursuant to 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. NOTES TO FINANCIAL STATEMENTS JUNE 30, 2024 AND 2023

NOTE 1 – DESCRIPTION OF PLAN

The following description of the Pointers, Cleaners & Caulkers Annuity Fund (the “Plan”) provides only general information. Participants should refer to the Plan document and the Summary Plan Description for a more complete description of the Plan provisions.

General: The Plan is a collectively bargained multi-employer non-contributory defined contribution profit sharing plan established in 1972 (effective August 1, 2009, the Plan was converted from a money purchase to a profit-sharing plan). The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974, as amended (ERISA). The Plan operates as a trust to provide retirement benefits to participants who are covered employees of participating employers under contracts with the Building Waterproofers Association, individual employers signatory to the agreements, and the Bricklayers and Allied Crafts Union Local 1, New York (the “Union”).

Plan Administration: The administration of the Plan is the responsibility of a Board of Trustees comprised of Union and Employer Trustees. The Union Trustees and Employer Trustees have equal voting rights.

Participant accounts are maintained and administered under a deposit contract with the Plan’s trustee, Empower Annuity Insurance Company of America (“EAICA”) is responsible for the custody and management of the Plan’s assets (see Note 7).

Benefits: Participants are entitled to their account balance after completing one hour of service. Upon termination of employment, a participant is able to withdraw up to 50% of their account balance, with the remaining balance being in equal installments (of not less than \$200 per month) over a period of 60, 120 or 180 months.

Funding: Employers make contributions for covered participants based upon hours worked. The contribution rates are determined by the collective bargaining agreement in effect at the time.

The Plan also accepts contributions for employees of the Pointers, Cleaners & Caulkers Pension Fund, and the Union, under separate participation agreements.

Participant Accounts: Each participant’s account is credited with employer contributions made on their behalf plus an allocation of earnings and expenses by Empower Annuity Insurance Company of America. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant’s account.

Vesting: All contributions are vested in each participant’s account upon the completion of one hour of service worked in covered employment. Should the whereabouts of any participant or any person entitled to benefits be unknown or unascertainable after reasonable inquiry, for a period of three (3) Plan years following the termination from covered employment or the death of a participant, the balance of the participants’ account shall be forfeited and first applied to Plan administrative expenses and any excess treated as a gain to the Plan.

Other: Although they have not expressed any intention to do so, the Plan’s Board of Trustees, as Sponsor, has the right under the Plan to modify benefits provided to participants and to terminate the Plan. The Plan may be completely or partially terminated at any time by the Board of Trustees, subject to the provisions set forth in ERISA.

NOTE 2 – SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of Accounting: The financial statements were prepared under the accrual method of accounting.

Benefits paid: Benefit payments to participants are recorded upon distribution.

NOTE 2 – SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES (continued)

Investment Valuation and Income Recognition: Investments are reported at fair value, except for fully benefit-responsive investment contracts, which are reported at contract value. Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. See Note 8 for a discussion of fair value measurements.

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Net appreciation includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold as well as held during the year. Unrealized gains or losses are the differences between the fair value of the investments held at year-end and those held at the beginning of the year. Realized gains or losses on the sale of investments are based on the historical costs of the individual investments sold for financial reporting purposes, whereas the revalued cost (fair value at the beginning of the year) is used for determining the realized gain or loss for Form 5500 purposes.

Employer Contributions: Employer contribution income and receivables do not include estimates of amounts due from employers where remittance reports were not received by the Plan office (unless shop steward reports are available) or for amounts due but unpaid as a result of disputed payroll audits, or for contributions held in the general operating account that have not been identified by the Plan. Contribution income is presented net of uncollectible amounts.

Use of Estimates: The preparation of financial statements in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America requires Plan management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities at the date of the financial statements and the reported amounts of revenues and expenses during the reporting period. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

NOTE 3 – PROCEDURE ON TERMINATION

While it is the present intention to continue the Plan indefinitely, the Board of Trustees reserves the right to terminate the Plan at any time. Each participant shall have a non-forfeitable right to his or her account under the Plan except as otherwise stated in the Plan and authorized by law, subject to the provisions of ERISA.

NOTE 4 – TAX STATUS

The Plan is a qualified Plan under Section 401(b) of the IRC, and the Trust is exempt from federal income taxes under provisions of Section 501(a). The Internal Revenue Service (the "IRS") has determined and informed the Plan by letter dated September 10, 2015, that the Plan and related trust are designed in accordance with applicable sections of the IRC. The Plan's management believes that the Plan as designed is currently being operated in compliance with the applicable provisions of the IRC and, therefore, believes that the related trust is tax exempt. Consequently, no provision for income tax has been included in the Plan's financial statements.

NOTE 5 – RISKS AND UNCERTAINTIES

Due to various risks (e.g., interest rate, market, and credit risks) associated with certain investments and the level of uncertainty related to changes in the value of investments, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the values of investments will occur in the near term that could materially affect the amounts reported in the statement of net assets available for benefits.

NOTE 6 – CONCENTRATION OF CREDIT RISK

Financial instruments that subject the Plan to concentration of credit risk include cash and short-term investments. While the Plan attempts to limit any financial exposure, its cash deposit balances may, at times, exceed federal insured limits. The Federal Deposit Insurance Corporation does not cover short-term investments.

Contributions receivable of \$6,627,651 (2024) and \$6,928,626 (2023) include amounts from employers totaling \$0 and \$396,253, respectively which represent 5% or more of the total receivable (0% and 6% of the total receivable at June 30, 2024 and 2023). Additionally, of the \$6,627,651 receivable at June 30, 2024, approximately 10% remain uncollected as of the date of the audit report.

NOTE 7 – INVESTMENT CONTRACT

The Plan is party to a traditional fully benefit-responsive guaranteed investment contract with Empower Annuity Insurance Company of America (“EAICA”), totaling \$83,364,729 for June 30, 2024, and \$76,506,677 for June 30, 2023.

Empower maintains the contributions in a general account. The account is credited with earnings on the underlying investments and charged for participant withdrawals and administrative expenses. The insurance company is contractually obligated to repay the principal and a specified interest rate that are guaranteed to the Plan. The crediting rate is based on a formula established by the insurance company but may not be less than 0%. The crediting rate is reviewed on a semi-annual basis for resetting. The guaranteed investment contract does not permit the insurance company to terminate the agreement prior to the scheduled maturity date.

The contract meets the fully benefit-responsive investment contract criteria and therefore is reported at contract value. Contract value is the relevant measure for fully benefit-responsive investment contracts because this is the amount received by participants if they were to initiate permitted transactions under the terms of the Plan. Contract value, as reported to the Plan by the insurance company, represents contributions made under the contract, plus earnings, less participant withdrawals, and administrative expenses. Participants may ordinarily direct the withdrawal or transfer of all or a portion of their investment at contract value.

The Plan's ability to receive amounts due is dependent on the issuer's ability to meet its financial obligations. The issuer's ability to meet its contractual obligations may be affected by future economic and regulatory developments.

Certain events might limit the ability of the Plan to transact at contract value with the issuer. Such events include (1) amendments to the Plan documents (including complete or partial Plan termination or merger with another plan), (2) changes to the Plan's prohibition on competing investment options or deletion of equity wash provisions, (3) bankruptcy of the Plan sponsor or other Plan sponsor events (for example, divestitures or spinoffs of a subsidiary) that cause a significant withdrawal from the Plan, or (4) the failure of the trust to qualify for exemption from federal income taxes or any required prohibited transaction exemption under ERISA (5) premature termination of the contract. No events are probable of occurring that might limit the ability of the Plan to transact at contract value with the contract issuers and that also would limit the ability of the plan to transact at contract value with the participants.

In addition, certain events allow the issuer to terminate the contract with the Plan and settle at an amount different from contract value. Such events include (1) an uncured violation of the Plan's investment guidelines, (2) a breach of material obligation under the contract, (3) a material misrepresentation, (4) a material amendment to the agreement without the consent of the issuer.

NOTE 8 – FAIR VALUE MEASUREMENTS

Financial Accounting Standards Board (FASB) *Accounting Standards Codification* (ASC) 820, *Fair Value Measurements and Disclosures*, provides the framework for measuring fair value. That framework provides a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (Level 1 measurements) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (Level 3 measurements).

The three levels of the fair value hierarchy under FASB ASC 820 are described as follows:

- Level 1: Inputs to the valuation methodology are unadjusted quoted prices for identical assets or liabilities in active markets that the plan has the ability to access.
- Level 2: Inputs to the valuation methodology include:
 - Quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities in active markets.
 - Quoted prices for identical or similar assets or liabilities in inactive markets.
 - Inputs other than quoted prices that are observable for the asset or liability.
 - Inputs that are derived principally from or corroborated by observable market data by correlation or other means.

If the asset or liability has a specified (contractual) term, the level 2 input must be observable for substantially the full term of the asset or liability.

- Level 3: Inputs to the valuation methodology are unobservable and significant to the fair value measurement.

The asset's or liability's fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques used need to maximize the use of observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs.

NOTE 8 – FAIR VALUE MEASUREMENTS (continued)

The following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for assets at fair value. There have been no changes in the methodologies used at June 30, 2024 and 2023.

Interest bearing cash: Interest bearing cash, which is readily convertible into cash, is carried at cost, which approximates fair value.

Registered investment companies: Certain registered investment companies are valued at the closing price, reported in the active market on which they are traded. Others are valued at estimated fair value as determined by the investment manager based on the market value and estimated fair value of the underlying investments in the portfolio. In establishing the fair value of these investments, the investment manager takes into consideration information about the net asset value of shares held by the Plan at year end.

Partnership/joint ventures, common/collective trusts, pooled separate accounts, 103-12 investment entities, and other: Valued at net asset value (NAV) of units held (or its equivalent, such as member units or an ownership interest in partners' capital). The NAV or its equivalent is used as a practical expedient to estimate fair value. The NAV or its equivalent is based on the fair value of the underlying investments held by the fund less its liabilities. This practical expedient is not used when it is determined to be probable that the Plan will sell the investment for an amount different than the reported NAV or its equivalent.

The preceding methods may produce a fair value calculation that may not be indicative of net realizable value or reflective of future fair values. Furthermore, although the plan believes its valuation methods are appropriate and consistent with other market participants, the use of different methodologies or assumptions to determine the fair value of certain financial instruments could result in a different fair value measurement at the reporting date.

The common/collective trusts, pooled separate accounts and 103-12 investment entities are measured at fair value by using the NAV practical expedient and file U.S. Department of Labor Form 5500 as a direct filing entity (DFE). Accordingly, disclosure of the significant investment strategies for these entities is not required.

NOTE 9 – RELATED PARTY AND PARTY IN INTEREST TRANSACTIONS

Most common general and administrative expenses (rent, payroll, equipment, stationery and printing, utilities, and some general professional fees) of the Plan are paid by the Pointers, Cleaners and Caulkers Pension Fund general operating account. The amounts are then allocated based on an allocation study of usage and estimated time and space formulas. The general operating account also collects and remits certain contribution income on behalf of the Plan. (See clearance account and contribution exchanges below).

The Plans are administered under the direction of the administrator of the Bricklayers Fringe Benefit Funds, B.A.C. Local 1 N.Y.

Plan investments include its investment contract with Empower Annuity Insurance Company of America, a fiduciary of the Plan and, therefore, these transactions qualify as party-in-interest transactions. Empower Annuity Insurance Company of America agreed to reimburse the Plan \$240 per participant per year for administrative expenses incurred by the Plan. Prudential deducts this from Plan participants' accounts on a quarterly basis and remits it to the Plan. Total reimbursements of plan expenses were \$712,435 and \$695,258 as of June 30, 2024 and 2023, respectively.
