Scope and Nature of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) Audit

We have performed an audit of the accompanying financial statements of Community Residences, Inc. Retirement and 401(k) Plan (the Plan), an employee benefit plan subject to the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA), as permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C). NOTE 1 – DESCRIPTION OF PLAN

The following description of Community Residences, Inc. (the Company) Retirement and 401(k) Plan (the Plan) provides only general information. Participants should refer to the Plan agreement for a more complete description of the Plan's provisions.

General

The Plan is a defined contribution plan covering all eligible employees of the Company. The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA).

Eligibility

The Plan allows employees who have completed six months of service and are age 18 or older to participate in the Plan and make pre-tax and Roth salary deferrals, receive discretionary employer match contributions and rollover contributions. In addition, employees who have completed one year of service, are age twenty-one or older and are employees on the last day of the Plan year are eligible to receive discretionary employer profit sharing contributions. Certain classes of employees, such as union employees, nonresident aliens, highly compensated employees, leased employees, part-time employees, temporary employees and seasonal employees are excluded employees and not eligible to participate in the Plan. In June 2023, the Plan changed custodians. Upon the change in custodians, the Plan was amended to change the age requirement for employee contributions and employer matching contributions from age 18 to age 21.

Contributions

Effective June 1, 2023, participants may contribute up to 90% of compensation. Participants may also contribute amounts representing distributions from other qualified plans (rollovers). During the period July 1, 2022 through May 31, 2023, participants could contribute the maximum amount allowed under the Internal Revenue Code (IRC) of pre-tax and after tax (or both) annual compensation, as defined in the Plan. The Plan's discretionary matching contribution is equal to 10% of the first 8% of base compensation a participant contributed to the Plan.

Each year, at the discretion of the Board of Directors, the Company may make a nonelective contribution to the Plan for all eligible participants. The contribution is allocated to the accounts of eligible participants on the basis of the ratio that each eligible participant's compensation bears to the total compensation of all participants for the Plan year. For the Plan year ended June 30, 2024, the Board did not approved a nonelective contribution.

All contributions are subject to certain limitations under the Internal Revenue Code.

Participant Accounts

The Plan has an auto enroll feature that is 2% of participants' compensation.

Each participant's account is credited with an allocation of the Company's contribution as well as earnings or loss on the participant's account balances from the Company's contribution, their salary deferral contributions and their rollover account contributions. Earnings of each participant's investments are credited to their accounts based on the earnings (loss) of the investments directed by the participants. Non-vested account balances which have been forfeited by plan participants may also be reallocated to current Plan participants at the plan administrator's discretion. Please refer to Forfeitures in Note 2 for further discussion of the disposition of these balances.

The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant's vested account.

Vesting

Participants are vested immediately in their contributions, plus actual earnings thereon.

Vesting in the Company's contribution portion and net earnings is based on years of continuous service as follows:

Participant Loans

Participant loans are not allowed to be made.

Hardship Withdrawals

In the event of financial hardship, as defined under the Plan and under Internal Revenue Service rules, participants are permitted to receive hardship withdrawals of a portion of their elective deferral account balance.

Payments of Benefits

Upon termination of employment for any reason, participants may elect to receive a lump-sum distribution of their vested account balance. Participants may also elect to receive monthly, quarterly, semi-annual or annual installments over a period of not more than the participant's assumed life expectancy (or the participant's and their beneficiaries' assumed life expectancy).

On termination of service for any reason, participants with a vested account balance less than \$1,000 will receive a lump-sum amount equal to the value of the participant's vested interest in their account. For terminated participants with a vested account balance less than \$5,000, the plan administrator will make a direct rollover of the participant's account to an individual retirement account designated by the plan administrator. Participants with a vested account greater than \$5,000 may defer payment of benefits until a later date.

Investment Options

Participants direct the investment of all contributions into various investment options offered by the Plan.

The Plan currently offers various investment options consisting of mutual funds and a stable value fund investment option offered by the Plan which provides a guaranteed rate of interest.

Prior to switching custodians in June 2023 the Plan offered several investment options in equity funds, bond funds, money market funds, target funds, balanced funds and real estate funds. Based upon the participants' investment selections, the Plan purchased units accordingly which are held in Voya Retirement Insurance and Annuity Company's Separate Account D (pooled separate account). Participants could have also elected to maintain investments in Voya Retirement Insurance and Annuity Company's traditional investment contract accounts which provides a guaranteed rate of interest.

Evaluation of Subsequent Events

Subsequent events have been evaluated through the audit report date, the date the financial statements were available to be issued.

NOTE 2 – ORGANIZATION AND SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Summary of Significant Accounting Policies:

Basis of Accounting and Presentation

The financial statements of the Plan are prepared on the accrual basis of accounting in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.

Use of Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities and changes therein, and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

Investment Valuation and Income Recognition

Investments are reported at fair value (except for fully benefit-responsive investment contracts, which are reported at contract value). Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. The Plan's Board of Directors determines the Plan's valuation policies utilizing information provided by the investment advisers, custodians and insurance company. See Note 3 for discussion of fair value measurements and Note 5 for contract with insurance company.

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Net appreciation (depreciation) in fair value of investments includes the Plan's gains and (losses) on investments bought and sold as well as held during the year.

Employer Contribution Receivable

Employer contribution receivable is measured at the amount owed to participants by the Company at June 30, 2024 and 2023.

Payment of Benefits

Benefits are recorded when paid.

Forfeitures

The plan instrument provides that the plan administrator may apply forfeited non-vested accounts of terminated participants against the amount of the employer contribution that is payable to the Plan. The plan administrator may first, at their discretion, utilize the forfeitures to pay Plan expenses or to restore the non-vested accounts of prior terminated participants who return to the Company in certain circumstances as defined in the Plan. At the discretion of the Company's Board of Directors, the Company may increase the employer contribution to the Plan in an amount equal to the net forfeitures of the Plan or pay for Plan expenses.

For the year ended June 30, 2024, \$47,817 forfeited non-vested account balances were used to pay for Plan expenses or to reduce employer contributions. At June 30, 2024 and 2023, forfeited non-vested accounts totaled \$147,385 and \$120,844, respectively.

Expenses

The plan sponsor pays substantially all administrative costs of the Plan which include third party administrator fees, record keeping by the investment custodian and the Plan audit fees. The participants of the Plan are charged a processing fee by the third party administrator for the processing of distributions to the participants. These fees are deducted from the participants' self-directed accounts. The Plan also pays indirect fees that are netted against the change in fair value of investments.

NOTE 3 – FAIR VALUE MEASUREMENTS

The framework for measuring fair value provides a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (level 1) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (level 3). The three levels of the fair value hierarchy under FASB ASC 820 are described as follows:

Level 1 Inputs to the valuation methodology are unadjusted quoted prices for identical assets or liabilities in active markets that the Plan has the ability to access;

Level 2 Inputs to the valuation methodology include:

- quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities in active markets;
- quoted prices for identical or similar assets or liabilities in inactive markets;
- inputs other than quoted prices that are observable for the asset or liability;
- inputs that are derived principally from or corroborated by observable market data by correlation or other means.

If the asset or liability has a specified (contractual) term, the level 2 input must be observable for substantially the full term of the asset or liability.

Level 3 Inputs to the valuation methodology are unobservable and significant to the fair value measurement.

The asset's or liability's fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques used need to maximize the use of observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs.

The following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for assets measured at fair value. There have been no changes in the methodology used at June 30, 2024 or 2023.

Pooled Separate Accounts: Valued at their accumulation unit value (AUV). The separate account is valued daily as the number of accumulation units held multiplied by the AUV. The AUV is first established when a new fund starts and is then determined daily based on the net asset value of shares of the underlying fund, the fund's dividends and the contract's separate account charges.

Mutual Funds: Valued at their daily closing price as reported by the fund. Mutual funds held by the Plan are open-end mutual funds that are registered with the Securities and Exchange Commission. These funds are required to publish their daily net asset value (NAV) and to transact at the price. The mutual funds held by the Plan are deemed to be actively traded.

NOTE 5 – FULLY BENEFIT-RESPONSIVE INVESTMENT CONTRACTS

The Plan held a portfolio of investment contracts that were comprised of traditional investment contracts through Reliance Trust Company, effective June 12, 2023. The Plan offered a traditional investment contract through Voya Retirement Insurance and Annuity Company July 1, 2022 through June 12, 2023. These contracts meet the fully benefit-responsive investment contract criteria and therefore are reported at contract value. Contract value is the relevant measure for fully benefit-responsive investment contracts, because this is the amount received by participants if they were to initiate permitted transactions under the terms of the Plan. Contract value represents contributions made under each contract; plus earnings, less participant withdrawals and administrative expenses. The following represents the disaggregation of contract value between types of investment contracts held by the Plan.

For traditional investment contracts, the Plan owns only the contract itself. Traditional investment contracts are designed to accrue interest based on crediting rates established by the contract issuers.

The traditional investment contract through Reliance Trust Company that are held by the Plan are a guaranteed investment contract. The contract issuer is contractually obligated to repay the principal and interest at a specified interest rate that is guaranteed to the Plan. The crediting rate is based on a formula established by the contract issuer but may not be less than 1%. The contract cannot be terminated before the scheduled maturity date.

The traditional investment contracts through Voya Retirement Insurance and Annuity Company that were held by the Plan were guaranteed investment contracts. The contract issuer is contractually obligated to repay the principal and interest at a specified interest rate that is guaranteed to the Plan. The crediting rate is based on a formula established by the contract issuer but may not be less than 1% or more than 3% based on the contract agreement. The contracts cannot be terminated before the scheduled maturity date.

The Plan's ability to receive amounts due in accordance with fully benefit-responsive investment contracts is dependent on the third-party issuer's ability to meet its financial obligations. The issuer's ability to meet its contractual obligations may be affected by future economic and regulatory developments.

The following events might limit the ability of the Plan to transact at contract value with the contract issuers:

1. The Plan's failure to qualify under Section 401(a) of the Internal Revenue Code or the failure of the trust to be tax-exempt under Section 501(a) of the Internal Revenue Code.
2. Premature termination of the contracts.
3. Plan termination or merger.
4. Changes to the Plan's prohibition on competing investment options.
5. Bankruptcy of the plan sponsor or other plan sponsor events (for example divestitures or spinoffs of a subsidiary) that significantly affect the Plan's normal operations.

No events are probable of occurring that might limit the ability of the Plan to transact at contract value with the contract issuers and that also would limit the ability of the Plan to transact at contract value with the participants.

In addition, the following events allow the issuer to terminate the contracts with the Plan and settle at an amount different from contract value:

1. An uncured violation of the Plan's investment guidelines.
2. A breach of material obligation under the contract.
3. A material misrepresentation.
4. A material amendment to the agreements without the consent of the issuer.

NOTE 6 – RELATED PARTY TRANSACTIONS AND PARTY-IN-INTEREST TRANSACTIONS

Reliance Trust Company is the investment custodian of the Plan as of June 30, 2024. As a provider of services to the Plan, Reliance Trust Company is considered a party-in-interest as defined under ERISA. Reliance Trust Company received fees for their services from the Company.

ADP, Inc. is the recordkeeper and third party administrator from June 12, 2023 to June 30, 2023. As a provider of services to the Plan, ADP, Inc. is considered a party-in-interest under ERISA. ADP, Inc. received fees for its services from the Company and transaction fees from plan participants.

Strategic Plan Services, LLC is the investment advisor of the Plan as of June 30, 2024. As a provider of services to the Plan, Cetera Advisors LLC is considered a party-in-interest under ERISA. Cetera Advisors LLC received fees for its services from the Company.

All of these party-in-interest transactions are exempt from the prohibited transaction rules of ERISA.

NOTE 7 – PLAN TERMINATION

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the Company has the right under the Plan to discontinue its contributions at any time and to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions of ERISA. In the event of Plan termination, participants would become 100% vested in their employer contributions.

NOTE 8 – TAX STATUS

The Plan is based on the Non-Standardized Pre-Approved Profit Sharing Plan of ADP, LLC, which received a determination letter from the Internal Revenue Code (IRC) dated October 6, 2020. Although the Plan has been amended since the effective date of the determination letter, the plan administrator believes the Plan is qualified and the related trust in tax-exempt based on the advice of the Plan's third party administrator.

Accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America require the plan administrator to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan and recognize a tax liability for any uncertain position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by the IRS. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress.

NOTE 9 – PLAN AMENDMENTS

Effective June 1, 2023, Community Residences, Inc. Retirement and 401(k) Plan formally amended the Plan to change the eligibility service requirement for discretionary employer profit sharing contributions from one year to six months.

NOTE 10 – RISKS AND UNCERTAINTIES

The Plan participants invest in various investment options offered by the Plan. Investment options offered in the Plan are subject to various risks, such as interest rate, market value and credit risks. Market risks include global events which could impact the value of investments securities, such as pandemics, international conflicts or financial institution collapses. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the values of investment securities will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect participants' account balances and the amounts reported in the statements of net assets available for benefits.
