Scope and Nature of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) Audit

We have performed audits of the accompanying financial statements of the 403(b) Thrift Plan for R.A.I.N. Total Care, Inc. (the "Plan"), an employee benefit plan subject to the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 ("ERISA"), as permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) ("ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit"). The financial statements comprise the statements of net assets available for benefits (modified cash basis) as of June 30, 2024 and 2023, and the related statement of changes in net assets available for benefits (modified cash basis) for the year ended June 30, 2023, and the related notes to the financial statements.

Management has obtained certifications from a qualified institution as of June 30, 2024 and 2023 and for the year June 30, 2024, stating that the certified investment information, as described in Note 3 to the financial statements, is complete and accurate.

Opinion

In our opinion, based on our audits and on the procedures performed as described in the Auditors' Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements section:

- The information in the financial statements referred to above related to assets held by and certified to by a qualified institution agrees to, or is derived from, in all material respects, the information prepared and certified by an institution that management determined meets the requirements of ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C).

Basis for Opinion

We conducted our audits in accordance with auditing standards generally accepted in the United States of America. Our responsibilities under those standards are further described in the Auditors' Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements section of our report. We are required to be independent of the Plan and to meet our other ethical responsibilities in accordance with the relevant ethical requirements relating to our audits. We believe that the audit evidence we have obtained is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for our ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit opinion.

Emphasis of Matter - Basis of Accounting

We draw attention to Note 2 of the financial statements, which describes the basis of accounting. The financial statements are prepared on the modified cash basis of accounting, which is a basis of accounting other than accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America. Our opinion is not modified with respect to this matter.

Responsibilities of Management for the Financial Statements

Management is responsible for the preparation and fair presentation of these financial statements in accordance with the modified cash basis of accounting described in Note 2, and for determining that the modified cash basis of accounting is an acceptable basis for the preparation of the financial statements in the circumstances. Management is also responsible for the design, implementation, and maintenance of internal control relevant to the preparation and fair presentation of financial statements that are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error. Management's election of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit does not affect management's responsibility for the financial statements.

Accordingly, the objective of an ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit is not to express an opinion about whether the financial statements as a whole are presented fairly, in all material respects, in accordance with the modified cash basis of accounting.

Notes to Financial Statements
June 30, 2024

1. Description of Plan

The following description of the 403(b) Thrift Plan for R.A.I.N. Total Care, Inc. (the "Plan") is provided for general information purposes only. Participants should refer to the plan document for a more complete description of the Plan's provisions.

General

The Plan was formed on October 1, 2016 and is a defined contribution plan of R.A.I.N. Total Care, Inc. (the "Sponsor" or "Employer") covering all employees, except for the excluded employees noted below. The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 ("ERISA").

Eligibility

For purposes of salary deferral contributions, excluded employees include: non-resident aliens with no United States source income; and those who are classified by the Employer as independent contractors or other non-employees.

For purposes of Employer base contributions, excluded employees include: non-resident aliens with no United States source income; those who are classified by the Employer as independent contractors or other non-employees; employees who are covered under a collective bargaining agreement between the Employer and employee representatives if retirement benefits were subject to good faith bargaining and if 2% or less of the employees covered by that agreement are professionals as defined in Section 1.410(b)-9 of the Internal Revenue Service ("IRS") regulations; employees of R.A.I.N. Home Attendant Services, Inc.; and per diem employees.

There are no age or service requirements to be eligible for salary deferral contributions or Employer base contributions.

Contributions

Each year, participants may contribute up to 100% of their eligible annual compensation, on a pre-tax or Roth basis, as defined by the Plan. Participants who have attained age 50 before the end of the Plan year are eligible to make catch-up contributions. There is an annual limit as to the amount that can be deducted from compensation that is determined by the Internal Revenue Code ("IRC"). Participants may also contribute amounts representing distributions from other qualified retirement plans. Participants direct the investment of their contributions into various investment options offered by the Plan.

The Employer may make base contributions to eligible employees, whether or not they contribute to the Plan, equal to a discretionary percentage determined by the Board of Directors. For the 2024 plan year, the Employer made base contributions equal to 5% of eligible compensation to all eligible employees.

Vesting

Participants are 100% vested in their contributions plus actual earnings thereon. Vesting in the Employer's base contributions are as follows:

All prior service with R.A.I.N, Inc. and R.A.I.N. Home Attendant Services, Inc. are included in the vesting years of service.

Forfeitures

If a participant terminates employment and is less than 100% vested in their Employer contributions, the participant will forfeit the non-vested portion of their account. Forfeited non-vested amounts are used to reduce future Employer contributions. At June 30, 2024 and 2023, the forfeited non-vested accounts totaled \$11,910 and \$2. During 2024, \$44,706 of forfeitures were used to reduce Employer contributions.

Participant Accounts

Each participant's account is credited with the participant's contribution and allocations of (a) the Employer's contributions and (b) Plan earnings (losses). Allocations were based on participant earnings, account balances, or specific participant transactions, as defined. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant's vested account. All investments are participant directed.

Payment of Benefits

Upon termination of service due to death, disability or retirement, a participant could elect to receive either a lump-sum amount equal to the value of the participant's vested interest in his or her account, or annual installments over a ten-year period. For termination of service due to other reasons, a participant could receive the value of the vested interest in his or her account as a lump-sum distribution.

Loans to Participants/Collateralized Assets

A participant may elect to take out a loan subject to the rules and limitations of the Plan and the terms of the applicable contract. Only one loan may be made in any twelve consecutive month period.

Loans to Participants/Collateralized Assets (continued)

The Plan offers a loan feature whereby a participant (borrower) enrolled in the Plan may borrow a minimum amount of \$1,000 up to a maximum of 50% of his/her vested balance or \$50,000 (whichever is less). Loans to the participant are made directly from Mutual of America Life Insurance Company. The participant's account is not reduced by the loan amount, but serves as security for the loan, the loan amount is moved into a fixed income collateral account within the borrower's account. The loan must be repaid directly to Mutual of America Life Insurance Company within a five-year period in substantially equal payments (not less frequently than quarterly). The five-year repayment period will not apply to a loan that is used to acquire a principal residence of the borrower.

If the borrower does not repay the loan and related interest due in accordance with the schedule set forth in the promissory note or other writing permitted by applicable law representing the loan, their loan will be deemed in default. Defaults in loans are treated as a distribution at the time of default against the participant's account.

At June 30, 2024 and 2023, total principal balances due amounted to \$99,369 and \$65,536 which also represents a collateralization of participant accounts. Of these loan balances, there were none in default as of June 30, 2024 and 2023. At June 30, 2024, the loans interest rates ranged from 5.85% to 4.60% with maturities through 2028.

Expenses

Certain expenses of maintaining the Plan may be paid by the Employer and are excluded from these financial statements. Certain administration fees are charged directly to the participant's account and are included in administrative expenses. Investment related expenses are included in net appreciation in value of investments.

2. Summary of Significant Accounting Policies

Basis of Accounting

The accounts of the Plan are maintained, and the accompanying financial statements have been prepared, on the modified cash basis, which is a basis of accounting other than accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America ("U.S. GAAP"). Under this basis, investment income is recognized when received and disbursements are recognized when made, except for investments which are reflected at fair value. Accordingly, the financial statements are not intended to present the net assets available for benefits and changes in net assets available for benefits of the Plan in conformity with U.S. GAAP

Use of Estimates

The preparation of financial statements requires management to make certain estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities and changes therein, and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

Fair Value Measurements

The Plan follows U.S. GAAP guidance on *Fair Value Measurements* which defines fair value and establishes a fair value hierarchy organized into three levels based upon the input assumptions used in pricing assets. Level 1 inputs have the highest reliability and are related to assets with unadjusted quoted prices in active markets. Level 2 inputs relate to assets with other than quoted prices in active markets which may include quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities or other inputs which can be corroborated by observable market data. Level 3 inputs are unobservable and are used to the extent that observable inputs do not exist. As of June 30, 2024, the Plan's investments, that were valued at fair value, were valued using level 2 inputs.

Investment Valuation and Income Recognition

All of the Plan's investments are stated at fair value except for the insurance company general account, which is stated at contract value. Investments in separate accounts are reported at fair value as reported to the Plan by the insurance company, which represents the fair value of the underlying investments comprising the accounts. The insurance company general account is valued at contract value, which represents contributions made under the contract, plus interest credited, less benefits paid and expenses.

Purchase and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Net appreciation in value of investments includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold as well as held during the year. Interest is recorded when received.

Payment of Benefits

Benefits are recorded when paid.

Subsequent Events Evaluation by Management

Management has evaluated subsequent events for disclosure and/or recognition in the financial statements through the date that the financial statements were available to be issued, which date is April 14, 2025.

3. Information Certified (Unaudited)

Certain information related to investments disclosed in the accompanying financial statements and ERISA-required supplemental Schedule H, Part IV, Line 4i – Schedule of Assets (Held at End of Year) (modified cash basis) including investments held at June 30, 2024 and 2023, and the net appreciation in fair value of investments and interest for the year ended June 30, 2024, was obtained by management and agreed to or derived from information certified as complete and accurate by Mutual of America Life Insurance Company, a qualified institution.

4. Insurance Company General Account

Amounts placed in the Mutual of America Interest Accumulation Account are credited with interest at a rate determined by Mutual of America Life Insurance Company (“Mutual of America”). Mutual of America guarantees to credit interest for the life of the contract to amounts in the Interest Accumulation Account of the general account at a rate of at least equal to the greater of: (1) any contractual minimum guarantee provided by the contract; or (2) the minimum rate required by applicable state law or, if no state law minimum rate is applicable to a contract, the minimum guaranteed credited interest rate will be set pursuant to National Association of Insurance Commissioners (“NAIC”) standard non-forfeiture law. The NAIC minimum rate is determined in accordance with a formula, and cannot be less than 1.00% or more than 3.00% in any event. Mutual of America determines whether the application of the formula will change the minimum guaranteed rate each November, and any change is effective the following January 1 for that calendar year. The interest rate under that contract will not go below that amount regardless of the minimum rate that is set for a calendar year. In Mutual of America’s sole discretion, they may credit a higher rate of interest to a participant’s contract in the general account, although they are not obligated to credit interest in excess of the minimum guaranteed rate. Mutual of America compounds interest daily on the contract amounts in the general account to produce an effective annual yield that is equal to the stated interest rate.

The principal and previously credited interest is guaranteed by Mutual of America. This guarantee is subject to Mutual of America's financial strength and claims-paying ability. The credit risk of the issuer was evaluated by nationally recognized statistical rating agencies as follows: A.M. Best (A as of February 2023), Standard and Poor’s (A as of December 2022), and Fitch (A- as of March 2024).

The Mutual of America Interest Accumulation Account represents approximately 23% and 26% of the net assets available for benefits as of June 30, 2024 and 2023.

5. Plan Termination

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the Employer has the right under the Plan to discontinue its contributions at any time and to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions of ERISA. In the event of Plan termination, participants become 100% vested in their Employer contributions.

6. Tax Status

On March 31, 2017 the Internal Revenue Service (“IRS”) issued an opinion letter to the plan document preparer, indicating that the Plan, as then designed, qualifies under Section 403(b) of the IRC. The plan administrator believes that the Plan is currently designed and being operated in compliance with the applicable requirements of the IRC.

U.S. GAAP require plan management to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan and recognize a tax liability if the Plan has taken an uncertain position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by the IRS. The Plan is subject to routine examinations by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no examinations for any tax periods in progress.

7. Party-in-Interest Transactions

All investments of the Plan are managed by Mutual of America Life Insurance Company, the custodian and record-keeper of the Plan. Therefore, these transactions qualified as exempt party-in-interest transactions under ERISA. During the plan year ended June 30, 2024 fees in the amount of \$4,374 were paid to Mutual of America for plan related services.

8. Non-Exempt Party-in-Interest Transactions

During the plan year end June 30, 2024, certain participants’ contributions totaling \$3,770 were remitted by the Employer to the Plan later than required by Department of Labor Regulation 2510.3-102. Pursuant to the guidance issued by the Department of Labor, lost earnings were calculated and contributed to the Plan for affected participants by the Employer during the Plan year ending June 30, 2025.

9. Risks and Uncertainties

The Plan invests in various investment securities. Investment securities are exposed to various risks such as interest rate, market, and credit risks. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the values of investment securities will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect participants’ account balances and the amounts reported in the statements of net assets available for benefits (modified cash basis).

Global and domestic economic uncertainty has resulted in significant volatility in financial markets. This volatility has affected, and may continue to affect, the value of the Plan's net assets available for benefits. The effects of economic and market conditions subsequent to June 30, 2024 are not reflected in these financial statements and future effects on the Plan's net assets available for benefits cannot be predicted.
