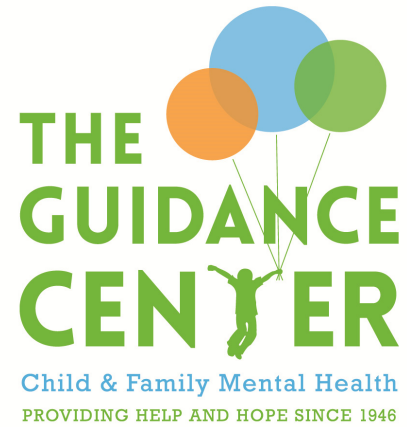

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Independent Auditors' Report

Scope and Nature of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) Audit

We have performed audits of the financial statements of The Guidance Center 403(b) Retirement Plan (the "Plan"), an employee benefit plan subject to the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 ("ERISA"), as permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) ("ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit"). The financial statements comprise the statements of net assets available for benefits as of June 30, 2024 and 2023, and the related statement of changes in net assets available for benefits for the year ended June 30, 2024, and the related notes to the financial statements.

Management, having determined it is permissible in the circumstances, has elected to have the audits of the Plan's financial statements performed in accordance with ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) pursuant to 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. As permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C), our audits need not extend to any statements or information related to assets held for investment of the Plan ("investment information") by a bank or similar institution or insurance carrier that is regulated, supervised, and subject to periodic examination by a state or federal agency, provided that the statements or information regarding assets so held are prepared and certified by the bank or similar institution or insurance carrier in accordance with 29 CFR 2520.103-5 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA ("qualified institution").

Management has obtained a certifications from a qualified institution as of June 30, 2024 and 2023, and for the year ended June 30, 2024 stating that the certified investment information, as described in Note 5 to the financial statements, is complete and accurate.

Opinion

In our opinion, based on our audits and on the procedures performed as described in the Auditors' Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements section:

- the amounts and disclosures in the accompanying financial statements, other than those agreed to or derived from the certified investment information, are presented fairly, in all material respects, in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.

- the information in the accompanying financial statements related to assets held by and certified to by a qualified institution agrees to, or is derived from, in all material respects, the information prepared and certified by an institution that management determined meets the requirements of ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C).

Basis for Opinion

We conducted our audits in accordance with auditing standards generally accepted in the United States of America (“GAAS”). Our responsibilities under those standards are further described in the Auditors’ Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements section of our report. We are required to be independent of the Plan and to meet our other ethical responsibilities, in accordance with the relevant ethical requirements relating to our audits. We believe that the audit evidence we have obtained is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for our ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit opinion.

Responsibilities of Management for the Financial Statements

Management is responsible for the preparation and fair presentation of the financial statements in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America, and for the design, implementation, and maintenance of internal control relevant to the preparation and fair presentation of financial statements that are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error. Management's election of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit does not affect management's responsibility for the financial statements.

In preparing the financial statements, management is required to evaluate whether there are conditions or events, considered in the aggregate, that raise substantial doubt about the Plan's ability to continue as a going concern for one year after the date that the financial statements are issued.

Management is also responsible for maintaining a current Plan instrument, including all Plan amendments, administering the Plan, and determining that the Plan's transactions that are presented and disclosed in the financial statements are in conformity with the Plan's provisions, including maintaining sufficient records with respect to each of the participants, to determine the benefits due or which may become due to such participants.

Auditors' Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements

Except as described in the Scope and Nature of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) Audit section of our report, our objectives are to obtain reasonable assurance about whether the financial statements as a whole are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error, and to issue an auditors' report that includes our opinion. Reasonable assurance is a high level of assurance but is not absolute assurance and therefore is not a guarantee that an audit conducted in accordance with GAAS will always detect a material misstatement when it exists. The risk of not detecting a material misstatement resulting from fraud is higher than for one resulting from error, as fraud may involve collusion, forgery, intentional omissions, misrepresentations, or the override of internal control. Misstatements are considered material if, there is a substantial likelihood that, individually or in the aggregate, they would influence the economic decisions of users made on the basis of these financial statements.

Our audits did not extend to the certified investment information, except for obtaining and reading the certification, comparing the certified investment information with the related information presented and disclosed in the financial statements, and reading the disclosures relating to the certified investment information to assess whether they are in accordance with the presentation and disclosure requirements of accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.

Accordingly, the objective of an ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit is not to express an opinion about whether the financial statements as a whole are presented fairly, in all material respects, in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.

We are required to communicate with those charged with governance regarding, among other matters, the planned scope and timing of the audit, significant audit findings, and certain internal control-related matters that we identified during the audit.

Other Matters - Supplemental Schedule Required by ERISA

The Supplemental Schedule of Assets (Held at End of Year) as of June 30, 2024 is presented for purposes of additional analysis and is not a required part of the financial statements but is supplementary information required by the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. Such information is the responsibility of management and was derived from and relates directly to the underlying accounting and other records used to prepare the financial statements. The information included in the supplemental schedule, other than that agreed to or derived from the certified investment information, has been subjected to auditing procedures applied in the audits of the financial statements and certain additional procedures, including comparing and reconciling such information directly to the underlying accounting and other records used to prepare the financial statements or to the financial statements themselves, and other additional procedures in accordance with GAAS. For information included in the supplemental schedule that agreed to or is derived from the certified investment information, we compared such information to the related certified investment information.

In forming our opinion on the supplemental schedule, we evaluated whether the supplemental schedule, other than the information agreed to or derived from the certified investment information, including their form and content, are presented in conformity with the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA.

NOTE 1 - DESCRIPTION OF PLAN

The following description of The Guidance Center 403(b) Retirement Plan (the “Plan”) provides only general information. Participants should refer to the Plan agreement for a more complete description of the Plan’s provisions.

General - The Plan was adopted on January 1, 1998 and is a defined contribution plan covering all eligible employees of The Guidance Center (the “Organization” or “Sponsor”). The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act (“ERISA”) of 1974 and subsequent amendments. However, as a 403(b) plan, it is not covered by title IV of ERISA and therefore, benefits are not insured by the Pension Benefit Guaranty Corporation.

Plan administration - The Plan is a prototype plan offered by Mutual of America Life Insurance Company (the “Recordkeeper”, and the “Custodian”), who is responsible for maintaining individual participant account balances and holding investments. The Organization performs as the Plan administrator and is responsible for oversight of the Plan and for monitoring investment activity.

Participation - An employee is eligible to participate in the Plan for purposes of 403(b) participant contributions on the employee’s first day of employment with the Organization. There are no minimum age or service requirements to make contributions. Employees are eligible for matching Sponsor contributions upon completion of one year of service, or at least 1,000 hours during the 12-month period immediately following their date of hire. Participants are eligible for matching on the first day of the calendar month coinciding with or following satisfaction of the service requirements.

Tax status - The Plan has been designed to qualify under Section 403(b) of the Internal Revenue Code (the “IRC”). The Plan administrator believes that the terms of the Plan have been prepared to conform with the written plan requirements of Regulation 1.403(b)-3 of the IRC. The Plan is required to operate in conformity with the IRC to maintain the tax-exempt status for Plan participants under section 403(b).

Contributions - Contributions to the Plan include (i) salary reduction contributions authorized by participants, (ii) matching contributions made by the Organization, (iii) discretionary contributions made by the Organization, and (iv) rollovers by new participants from other qualified plans.

NOTE 1 - DESCRIPTION OF PLAN, Continued

Participant contributions - Participant salary reduction contributions to the Plan may be deferred as a flat amount or as a percentage of regular compensation. However, the total of these contributions may not, in any calendar year, exceed limitations set by the IRC. All contributions to participant accounts are participant-directed. Participant balances must be allocated among the pooled separate accounts or guaranteed investment contract specified by the Plan in whole percentages. Participants may make changes to investment elections and allocations at their discretion. Eligible employees who will reach age 50 before the end of any Plan year are eligible to make catch-up contributions in accordance with provisions of the IRC. Such catch-up contributions are not taken into account for purposes of calculating matching Sponsor contributions.

Sponsor contributions - The Sponsor has elected to make matching contributions to the participants' accounts, as defined by the Plan. The Sponsor makes a matching contribution of 100% of the participant's elective deferral amount, up to 4% of the participant's eligible compensation. The Plan also allows for employer discretionary matching contributions, which are determined each Plan year by the Sponsor's Board of Directors. For the year ended June 30, 2024, the Sponsor made no discretionary profit sharing contributions to the Plan.

Participant accounts - Separate accounts are maintained for each participant's deferred compensation, rollover contributions and the Sponsor's matching and discretionary contributions. All gains, income, or losses are allocated separately to each participant's account, based on the performance of the investments within that account. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant's vested account. Participants may direct their contributions into any or all of the investment accounts with the Custodian.

Vesting - Participants are immediately vested in their contributions, plus actual earnings thereon. Vesting in the Sponsor's contributions, plus actual earnings thereon, is based on years of continuous service, as follows:

Notes receivable from participants - Mutual of America Life Insurance Company provides loans directly from Mutual of America funds and is not distributed from the participant's vested balance. The participant's vested balance is used to collateralize the participant loan and the funds are transferred, within the Plan assets, to the participant's interest accumulation account. Participants may borrow from their fund accounts a minimum of \$1,000 up to a maximum equal to the lesser of \$50,000 or 50% of their vested account balance. Principal and interest are paid directly to Mutual of America Life Insurance Company in equal periodic payments through salary reduction. Generally, notes mature within five years unless the note is for the purchase of a personal residence. Outstanding notes receivable from participants was \$81,165 and \$117,007 at June 30, 2024 and 2023, respectively.

Payment of benefits - Upon termination of service due to death, disability or retirement, a participant may elect to receive either a lump-sum distribution, a series of installments or direct transfer to either an Individual Retirement Account or a qualified retirement plan. For termination of services for other reasons, a participant may receive the value of the participant's vested interest in their account as a lump sum distribution. Participants who are 100% vested and 59 ½ years of age may take an in-service withdrawal of all or a portion of the value of their vested account once each Plan year.

Hardship withdrawals - In the event a participant experiences a financial hardship as defined in the Plan agreement, the participant may be eligible to request a hardship withdrawal. Hardship withdrawals amounted to \$16,000 for the year ended June 30, 2024. There were no hardship withdrawals for the year ended June 30, 2023.

Forfeitures - Non-vested Sponsor contributions forfeited by participants upon termination are available to reduce future payments of the Sponsor's matching contributions. The total available forfeiture balance to reduce Sponsor contributions as of June 30, 2024 and 2023 were \$38,517 and \$17,073, respectively. There were no material forfeited non-vested amounts used during the 2024 and 2023 years to reduce Sponsor contributions.

Plan termination - Although it has not expressed an intent to do so, the Sponsor reserves the right under the Plan to cease contributions and terminate the Plan, subject to action by the Sponsor's Board of Directors and to the provisions of ERISA and the IRC. Upon termination of the Plan, all participants become 100% vested in their accounts.

NOTE 2 - SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of presentation - The accompanying financial statements have been prepared on the accrual basis of accounting, in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America, consistent with reporting in Form 5500.

Use of estimates - The preparation of financial statements in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America requires the Plan's administrator to make estimates and assumptions that affect the amounts reported in the financial statements and accompanying notes. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

Valuation of investments - Investments are reported at fair value (except for fully-benefit responsive investment contracts, which are reported at contract value). Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date.

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend rate. Net appreciation (depreciation) includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold as well as held during the year.

Fair value measurements - The Plan measures fair value under a framework that utilizes a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (level 1 measurements) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (level 3 measurements). The three levels of inputs which prioritize the inputs used in measuring fair value are:

Level 1: Inputs to the valuation methodology are unadjusted quoted prices for identical assets or liabilities in active markets that the Plan has the ability to access.

Level 2: Inputs to the valuation methodology include:

- Quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities in active markets;
- Quoted prices for identical or similar assets or liabilities in inactive markets;
- Inputs other than quoted prices that are observable for the asset or liability;
- Inputs that are derived principally from or corroborated by observable market data by correlation or other means.

If the asset or liability has a specified (contractual) term, the level 2 input must be observable for substantially the full term of the asset or liability.

Level 3: Inputs to the valuation methodology are unobservable and significant to the fair value measurement.

The asset's or liability's fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques used need to maximize the use of observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs.

Guaranteed investment contract - The Plan invests in benefit-responsive guaranteed investment contract with the Custodian. The Custodian maintains the contributions in a general account. The account is credited with earnings on the underlying investments and charged for participant withdrawals and administrative expenses. The guaranteed investment contract issuer is contractually obligated to repay the principal and a specified interest rate that is guaranteed to the Plan.

The guaranteed investment contract meets the fully benefit-responsive investment contract criteria, therefore contract value is the relevant measurement attributed for the portion of the net assets available for benefits attributable to the guaranteed investment contract. Contract value, as reported to the Plan by the Custodian, represents contributions made under the contract, plus earnings, less participant withdrawals and administrative expenses. Participants may ordinarily direct the withdrawal or transfer of all or a portion of their investment at contract value.

There are no reserves against contract value for credit risk of the contract issuer or otherwise. The crediting interest rate is agreed upon with the issuer.

Certain events limit the ability of the Plan to transact at contract value with the issuer. Such events include the following: (1) amendments to the Plan documents (including complete or partial Plan termination or merger with another plan), (2) changes in the Plan's prohibition on competing investment options or deletion of equity wash provisions, (3) bankruptcy of the Plan Sponsor or other Plan Sponsor events (for example, divestitures or spin-offs of a subsidiary) that cause a significant withdrawal from the Plan, or (4) the failure of the trust to qualify for exemption from federal income taxes or any required prohibited transaction exemption under ERISA. The Plan administrator does not believe that any events which would limit the Plan's ability to transact at contract value with participants are probable.

The guaranteed investment contract do not permit the insurance company to terminate the agreement prior to the scheduled maturity date.

Realized and unrealized appreciation (depreciation) - Realized and unrealized appreciation (depreciation) is based on the contract and market values of the assets at the end of the Plan year compared to the contract and market values of the assets at the beginning of the Plan year, or at the time of purchase for assets purchased/exchanged during the Plan year. In the Statement of Changes in Net Assets Available for Benefits, the Plan presents the net appreciation or depreciation in the fair value of investments, which consists of realized gains or losses and unrealized market value appreciation or depreciation of investments.

Notes receivable from participants - Notes receivable from participants are measured at their unpaid principal balance plus any accrued but unpaid interest. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Related fees are recorded as administrative expenses and are expensed when incurred. No allowance for credit losses has been recorded as of June 30, 2024 and 2023. If a participant ceases to make loan repayments and the Plan administrator deems the participant loan to be in default, the participant loan balance is reduced and a benefit payment is recorded. Outstanding notes receivable from participants as of June 30, 2024, bear interest rates between 3.25% and 5.85%, and mature through September 2037.

Participant distributions - Benefits paid to participants are recorded when paid.

Plan expenses - Non-investment costs and most administrative expenses of the Plan are paid by the Sponsor, which is a party-in-interest. These expenses are not reflected in the accompanying financial statements and constitute exempt transactions under ERISA. Investment service fees are paid by the Plan and are netted against the related investment income. Certain administrative expenses are also paid by the Plan.

Income taxes - Accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America require Plan management to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan and recognize a tax liability if the Plan has taken an uncertain position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by the taxing authorities. The Plan administrator has analyzed the tax positions taken by the Plan, and has concluded that as of June 30, 2024 and 2023, there are no uncertain positions taken or expected to be taken that would require recognition of a liability (or asset) or disclosure in the financial statements. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress. The Plan administrator believes it is no longer subject to income tax examinations for years prior to 2020.

Risks and uncertainties - The Plan invests in various investment securities. Investment securities are exposed to various risks, such as interest rate, market, and credit risks. Market risks include global events which could impact the value of investment securities, such as pandemic or international conflict. Due to the level of risks associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the values of investment securities will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect participants' account balances and the amounts reported in the Statements of Net Assets Available for Benefits.

Subsequent events - Subsequent events have been evaluated by the Sponsor through April 14, 2025 which is the date these financial statements were available to be issued.

NOTE 3 - INVESTMENTS AND FAIR VALUE MEASUREMENTS

The following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for the investments, including the general measurement of such instruments pursuant to the fair value hierarchy. There have been no changes in methodologies used as of June 30, 2024 and 2023.

Pooled separate accounts - The fair values of participation units held in pooled separate accounts are based on the net asset values reported by the fund managers as of financial statement dates and recent transaction prices. The objective of each of the subaccounts of the Mutual of America Life Insurance Company pooled separate accounts is to invest in a single, open-ended mutual fund which is generally identified in the name of the pooled separate subaccount. Each pooled separate sub-account provides for daily redemptions by the Plan with no advance notice requirements, and has redemption prices that are determined by the fund's net asset value ("NAV") per unit. The pooled separate accounts are measured at fair value using NAV (or its equivalent) as a practical expedient. These investments have no unfunded commitments.

The preceding methods described may produce a fair value calculation that may not be indicative of net realizable value or reflective of future fair values. Furthermore, although the Plan administrator believes its valuation methods are appropriate and consistent with other market participants, the use of different methodologies or assumptions to determine the fair value of certain financial instruments could result in a different fair value measurement at the reporting date.

As of June 30, 2024 and 2023, all fair value investments were valued using NAV as a practical expedient, and accordingly, no fair value hierarchy table was presented.

During the year ended June 30, 2024, the Plan's investments (including gains and losses on investments bought and sold, as well as held during the year) appreciated in value by \$1,467,028.

Guaranteed investment contract with an insurance company - The following represents the disaggregation of contract value between types of investment contract held by the Plan as of June 30:

The traditional investment contract held by the Plan are guaranteed investment contract. The contract issuer is contractually obligated to repay the principal and interest at a specified interest rate that is guaranteed to the Plan. The crediting rate is based on a formula established by the contract issuer but may not be less than a designated percent.

The Plan's ability to receive amounts due in accordance with fully benefit-responsive investment contracts is dependent on the issuer's ability to meet its financial obligations. The issuer's ability to meet its contractual obligations may be affected by future economic and regulatory developments.

NOTE 4 - PARTIES-IN-INTEREST TRANSACTIONS

Parties-in-interest, by definition, include a Plan sponsor or employee, fiduciaries (including those who provide investment advice or who have discretionary control over Plan assets), and those who provide services to the Plan.

As described in Note 2, under notes receivable from participants Mutual of America Life Insurance Company provides plan loans to participants, which are secured by contracts and custodial accounts issued by this provider. Mutual of America Life Insurance Company is the Recordkeeper and Custodian for the Plan and, therefore, these transactions qualify as exempt party-in-interest transactions. Plan investments include shares in pooled separate accounts and a guaranteed investment contract managed by the Custodian as of June 30, 2024 and 2023. Transactions with these entities qualify as exempt party-in-interest transactions under ERISA.

Fees incurred by the Plan for the investment in management services are included in the net appreciation in fair value of the investments, as they are paid through revenue sharing, rather than a direct payment. As described in Note 2, the Plan paid Plan expenses to the Recordkeeper of \$1,221 during the year ended June 30, 2024, which was not covered by revenue sharing. The Plan's Sponsor pays directly any other fees related to the Plan's operations.

NOTE 5 - INFORMATION CERTIFIED BY THE CUSTODIAN OF PLAN ASSETS (Unaudited)

Management has elected to have the audits of the Plan performed in accordance with ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) pursuant to 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. Accordingly, Mutual of America Life Insurance Company, the Custodian of the Plan, has certified that the following investment information is complete and accurate:

- All amounts included as investments and notes receivable from participants in the Statements of Net Assets Available for Benefits as of June 30, 2024 and 2023;
- Investment income included in the Statement of Changes in Net Assets Available for Benefits for the year ended June 30, 2024; and
- All information in the Supplemental Schedule of Assets (Held at End of Year), as of June 30, 2024.
